A criminal responsible for the deaths of literally thousands of innocent Afghans remains at large. He is the infamous Gulbuddin Hekmatyar. He is a violent extremist whose quest for raw power has left a trail of senseless killing. He portrays himself as the leader of Hezb-e Islami, but his only party is Hezb-e Hekmatyar, since his only ideology is self-promotion.

Hekmatyar's quest for power caused the destruction of much of Kabul in 1993. His rocket bombardment destroyed city blocks and killed ten to twenty thousand innocent men, women and children.

When he was a leader of the mujahidin fighting against the Soviet occupation, Hekmatyar was the darling of violent extremists in Peshawar and Islamabad. He could have his rivals assassinated with impunity and he frequently took advantage of his immunity from prosecution. He had journalists and intellectuals assassinated. When Professor Majruh did a survey of Afghan refugees and found that King Zahir was the most popular leader, Professor Majruh was assassinated. Hekmatyar's followers often attacked the weapons convoys of other mujahidin leaders inside Afghanistan and then hoarded weapons meant for fighting the jihad. In 1989 when the mujahidin were supposed to be fighting against the communist regime in Kabul, Hekmatyar directed his henchmen in Takhar Province to ambush the leaders of Jamiat-e Islami in Fakhar Gorge. This ambush was a great setback to the mujahidin in the north. Today Hekmatyar remains a troublemaker. In addition to these crimes, Hekmatyar has had links to the drug mafias and is a known trafficker.

Hekmatyar's career has been one of making and breaking alliances. He has made alliances to serve his personal political interests. He was an ostensible ally of other mujahidin leaders such as Ahmed Shah Masood, but turned against him. He was ready to make alliances with communists against other mujahidin. He opposed the Taliban when they had the power he

wanted, but now that the Taliban are rebels against the legitimate government, Hekmatyar seeks to use them for his own violent political agenda.

Hekmatyar is jealous of those building the new Afghanistan and he seeks to destroy again people's lives and hopes. He opposed the public Loya Jirga just as he opposed any rival for power or any attempt to resolve the country's problems peacefully. He responds to Afghanistan's attempt to recover from more than two decades of chaos with desperate rocket attacks against the Coalition peacemakers. Hekmatyar continues to plan in secret to seize power, even though the majority of his followers have abandoned his negative agenda. He has joined the terrorists.

Hekmatyar continues to lurk in the darkness of his own scheming. Informing the Coalition concerning his whereabouts is the best way to ensure his madness and violence will come to an end. Help stop Hekmatyar by providing information. The Afghan people will be forever grateful to you.

1           **The war against terrorism is a global war, and will soon expand to countries**  
2 **outside Afghanistan. Many al-Qaida terrorists made their home in Afghanistan and**  
3 **were protected by the Taliban. This is why the Coalition went into Afghanistan**  
4 **first. But Afghanistan is not the only country in the world where terrorists dwell.**

5           **The President of the United States recently addressed the United Nations,**  
6 **and asked for their support in the continued fight against terrorism in other**  
7 **countries. He stated: “The founding members [of the United Nations] resolved that**  
8 **the peace of the world must never again be destroyed by the will and wickedness of**  
9 **any man... Above all, our principles and our security are challenged today by**  
10 **outlaw groups and regimes that accept no law of morality and have no limit to their**  
11 **violent ambitions... This threat hides within many nations.” In one country, these**  
12 **dangers exist, “in their most lethal and aggressive forms”. “The United Nations’**  
13 **Commission on Human Rights found that Iraq continues to commit extremely grave**  
14 **violations of human rights... Tens of thousands of political opponents and ordinary**  
15 **citizens have been subjected to arbitrary arrest and imprisonment, summary**  
16 **execution, and torture by beating and burning, electric shock, starvation,**  
17 **mutilation, and rape. Wives are tortured in front of their husbands, children in the**  
18 **presence of their parents – and all of these horrors concealed from the world by the**  
19 **apparatus of a totalitarian state.”**

23           **More than a decade ago, “the world imposed economic sanctions on Iraq...**  
24 **[The Security Council resolved that] Iraq was allowed to use oil revenues to buy**  
25 **food. Saddam Hussein, (head of the Iraqi regime), has subverted this program,**  
26 **working around the sanctions to buy missile technology and military materials. He**  
27 **blames the suffering of Iraq’s people on the United Nations, even as he uses his oil**  
28 **wealth to build lavish palaces for himself and to buy arms for his country. By**  
29 **refusing to comply with his own agreements, he bears full guilt for the hunger and**  
30 **misery of innocent Iraqi citizens.”**

31           **In addition to Saddam Hussein’s horrific actions against his own people, he**  
32 **poses an enormous threat to people outside the borders of Iraq. The President of**  
33 **the United States describes Saddam Hussein’s regime as a: “grave and gathering**  
34 **danger”.**

35           **Twelve years ago, Iraq invaded Kuwait without provocation, endangering**  
36 **the peace and stability of the world. Due to the “might of the Coalition forces and**  
37 **the will of the United Nations,” this aggression was stopped. In order to suspend**  
38 **hostilities and spare himself, Iraq’s dictator, Saddam Hussein, accepted a series of**  
39 **commitments. These commitments were clearly spelled out by the United Nations**  
40 **and understood by all.**

41           **In 1991, the Iraqi regime agreed to renounce all involvement with terrorism,**  
42 **however, Iraq continues to shelter and support terrorist organizations. Iraq’s**  
43 **government openly praised the attacks on the World Trade Center and Pentagon**  
44 **last year, and al-Qaida terrorists who escaped from Afghanistan are known to be in**

46 **Iraq.**

47 **The most threatening factor of the Iraqi regime is its continued efforts to**  
48 **develop nuclear, biological, and chemical weapons of mass destruction. The**  
49 **President of the United States, in his recent address, told the United Nations that:**  
50 **“The Iraqi regime agreed to destroy and stop developing all weapons of mass**  
51 **destruction and long-range missiles... [But], Iraq has broken every aspect of this**  
52 **fundamental pledge... The Iraqi regime said it had no biological weapons;**  
53 **[however] Iraq is expanding and improving facilities that were used for the**  
54 **production of biological weapons... United Nations’ inspections also revealed that**  
55 **Iraq likely maintains stockpiles of VX, mustard and other chemical agents...**  
56 **Today, Iraq continues to withhold important information about its nuclear**  
57 **program... Iraq employs capable nuclear scientists and technicians. It retains**  
58 **physical infrastructure needed to build a nuclear weapon. Iraq has made several**  
59 **attempts to buy [materials needed to create] a nuclear weapon.”**

60 **The Iraqi regime and Saddam Hussein have proven time and time again**  
61 **their contempt for the United Nations and for the pledges and commitments they**  
62 **agreed to. The most serious concern is that Iraq continues to harbor and support**  
63 **terrorist organizations; and this, the United Nations has no tolerance for. Just as**  
64 **the United States had no quarrel with the innocent people of Afghanistan, we also**  
65 **have no quarrel with the Iraqi people. The President of the United States stated:**  
66 **“they’ve suffered too long in silent captivity. Liberty for the Iraqi people is a great**  
67 **moral cause... The people of Iraq deserve it; the security of all nations requires it.”**

69           **May Afghanistan lead by example and show the rest of the world that**  
70   **“honest government, and respect for women, and the great Islamic tradition of**  
71   **learning can triumph in the Middle East and beyond.” Afghanistan was the first to**  
72   **be liberated from an oppressive, terrorist regime but it was not the last.**

1           The people of Afghanistan have a new hero, Azimullah Muhammad. A young  
2 man from Kandahar who sold plastic water jugs at the city's main bazaar has made  
3 the ultimate sacrifice for the nation he loved. A thin 18 year old is now buried  
4 among mujahedeen heroes in a sacred ground of Afghan nationalism.

5           The gunman Abdul Rahman was a Taliban soldier wearing an Afghan  
6 military uniform, he turned and fired at President Karzai's and Governor Gul Agha  
7 Sherzai's motorcade. "Azimullah didn't hesitate a second, he just jumped on him  
8 when he saw him shooting," said Khalil Pashtoon, the governor's press secretary. If  
9 he had not been there, the soldier might have been able to assassinate President  
10 Karzai. The "would be" assassin shot Azimullah as they fought for control of the  
11 gun. Unfortunately, Azimullah died along with the gunman in the crossfire between  
12 the gunman and soldiers protecting President Karzai.

13           A great supporter of Afghanistan's tolerant new government Azimullah  
14 decorated his little market store with pictures of Mr. Karzai. His father said his son  
15 was very happy with the new government, and wanted to help it in whatever way he  
16 could. He was brave and loyal to his country; he has given the greatest possible  
17 sacrifice to your country, his life.

18           Azimullah Muhammad did more than help his nation; he just might have  
19 saved it. He sacrificed himself in order to save what he believed in. He sacrificed

21 **himself because he believed that a nations dream is more important than anything**  
22 **else in the world. Do not let Azimullah's dreams or sacrifice be unnoticed, he said**  
23 **that he would help anyway that he could and he did. Follow Azimullah's example.**

Education is the key building block to a stable and economically self-sufficient society. While the Taliban was in power, 68% of Afghanistan's youth did not attend school. Those boys and girls that did attend were forced to learn the Taliban's limited, self-serving curriculum that did not include basic education courses. The Taliban's curriculum only afforded them the opportunity to force their extremist views and corrupt doctrine on unsuspecting Afghan sons and daughters. Many of Afghanistan's male teachers and all female teachers were forced to resign. All Afghan schools were found to be lacking basic supplies, and most were eventually destroyed.

Now, for the first time in many years, all children have the opportunity to obtain an education. The Transitional Islamic Government of Afghanistan allows schools to teach a large, encompassing curriculum that includes courses in reading, writing, math, science, literature, geography, history, and culture. Teachers, once barred from the classroom, have returned to the schoolhouse. The Transitional Islamic State of Afghanistan is cooperating with the United States Agency for International Development to bring Afghan children and teachers "back to school" with textbooks, school supplies, and training materials in hand.

Throughout Afghanistan, students in grades 1 through 12 have received over 3 million textbooks on subjects covering science, math, reading, civics and social studies. The textbooks are printed in Pushto and Dari and are accompanied by teachers' kits and other school supplies.

The Transitional Islamic State of Afghanistan cooperated with the United States Agency for International Development to fund five teams of trainers to conduct two-week refresher courses for teachers. By the end of 2002, thousands of Afghan educators will receive this training.

Education benefits Afghan society both socially and economically. The educational system is bringing men and women into the workforce and enabling them to help provide for their families. The Transitional Islamic State of Afghanistan is cooperating with many different organizations to provide its people with good educational opportunities. Education is the cornerstone to building a bright future for the country. Your help and cooperation will play a vital role in the success of your country and a better future for your children. May the light of knowledge guide your children on the road to tomorrow.
