MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Foreign Claim Investigation, Claim # 05-OEF-0262/878 (b)(6)

**1. Identifying Information.**

- a. Claimant: The claimant is a local national, Mr. (b)(6) (hereinafter "the claimant"), living in Afghanistan.
- b. Amount: The claimant filed a claim for \$30,000.00 on 24 May 2005.
- c. The claimant states that on approximately 9 or 10 May, the date is uncertain, the claimant's brother was riding a bicycle near the bazaar at Kampany village, Paghman district. A US military HMMWV struck the claimant's brother, killing him. The claimant wants the U.S. Government to compensate him and his family for the wrongful death of his brother.
- d. Investigation Completed: 1 August 2005.

2. **Jurisdiction.** This claim is presented for consideration under the Foreign Claims Act, 10 U.S.C. §2734. The claimant filed his claim in a timely manner in the form of an SF 95. The claimant is a foreign national and the next-of-kin of the deceased. The claimant is a proper claimant under the Foreign Claims Act IAW DA PAM 27-162.

**3. Statement of Facts.**

- a. On 21 April, 2005 (according to CID reports, however the claimant gave a date of 9 or 10 May) a local national named (b)(6) was riding a bicycle near a US convoy. The convoy belonged to the Parwan PRT, based at BAF. What happened next is unclear. The claimant states that the HMMWVs were driving too close to his brother, and that the side view mirror of one of the trucks struck his brother in the head. The results of a Commander's Inquiry conducted by the Parwan PRT argue differently. They state that the HMMWV was proceeding at a prudent speed when the deceased suddenly turned in front of the vehicle. In other words, the accident was unavoidable and was caused by the decedent.
- b. The claimant submitted an SF 95 indicating damages of \$30,000.00. This amount was claimed for the wrongful death of his brother

**4. Legal Analysis.**

- a. Legal Rules. Under AR 27-20, para. 10-3, the incident that forms the basis for the claim must arise in a foreign country and be a result of either noncombat activities of the U.S. armed forces or the negligent or wrongful acts of civilian employees or military members. "Noncombat activity" is defined in the Glossary of AR 27-20, as "authorized activities essentially military in nature, having little parallel in civilian pursuits, which historically have been considered as furnishing the proper basis for payment of

claims. Activities excluded are those incident to combat, whether in time of war or not, and use of military personnel and civilian employees in connection with civil disturbances.”

b. Application of Rules. In this case, the claim arose in Afghanistan, a foreign country. While negligence by either party is not clear in this claim, the 3-member FCC found that there was some significant negligence on the part of the United States. This consisted of failing to keep a proper lookout in a highly populated bazaar area, and perhaps excess speed. The FCC did find contributory negligence on the part of the decedent, in turning in front of the HMMWV.

5. Damages.

a. The claimant’s brother lost his life as a result of this incident. Based on projected income calculations, as well as an examination of the life expectancy of an Afghani male in his late twenties, and taking into account the negligence of the decedent, it was decided to award \$4000.00.

b. SF95. While the claimant has claimed \$30,000.00, this amount was found to be unjustified by the totality of the circumstances.

6. Proposed Settlement or Action. This claim is payable under the Foreign Claims Act because the death of the claimant’s brother occurred, in part, as a result of a U.S. military member’s negligent conduct. This claim should be settled in the amount of \$4000.00, converted to Afghani, because this amount is reasonable, taking into account the contributory negligence of the decedent.

SUBJECT: Commander's Inquiry – Traffic Accident and Death of Local National


1. This Commander's Inquiry is required to determine if there was negligence involved in the death of a Local National, [REDACTED (b)(6)], based on a preponderance of the evidence.
2. FINDINGS: After conducting this investigation, I have determined that based upon a preponderance of the evidence, that there was no negligence involved by U. S. Military personnel. That this was a traffic accident caused by the deceased, while riding a bicycle, turning in front of the second HMMWV in a two vehicle convoy without any warning. This sudden turn did not allow the driver time to avoid hitting the bicyclist. The driver took evasive action to avoid hitting the bicyclist, but due to the short distance the deceased was hit with the passenger side mirror. I base this decision on two reasons: (1) All of the personnel in the two HMMWVs who had the ability to know the current speed of the vehicle stated that they were going no faster than 25 – 35 mph. Based on the evidence collected and analyzed by the Traffic Accident Investigation section of the Military Police, the speed of the HMMWV was 17 mph at the time of the skid. Based upon information from a Traffic Accident Investigator, the margin for error in this technology is +/- 5 mph. This speed, 13 – 22 mph is clearly not excessive for the area, road conditions and amount of traffic that was present at that time. (2) The statements of the two people who could see the accident take place, the driver PFC [REDACTED (b)(3), (b)(6)] and the TC SGT [REDACTED (b)(3), (b)(6)] both stated that the deceased while riding a bicycle turned in front of the HMMWV without warning. The LN interpreter who was riding in the HMMWV substantiates this information. The interpreter stated that when he was attending to the bicyclist that LN witness's told him that the man cut right in front of the HMMWV.

7. SUMMARY OF INCIDENT: On 21 April, 2005, at approximately 0915 local, the (b)(2)High convoy (2 vehicles) was traveling north on ring road. About 5 km north of Charikar, the PTAT HMMWV, driven by PFC (b)(3), (b)(6) had a collision with a local Afghan on a bicycle. They were in the rear vehicle and I (SSG (b)(3), (b)(6)) was in the front vehicle with my team. The rear vehicle called on the radio and we came back to their location. The local was lying on the side of the road and looked like he was conscious, but had labored breathing. With the help of our interpreter (b)(3), (b)(6) we decided to drive him to the hospital in Charikar. So we loaded the injured man and one local policeman also rode with us to Charikar. Once at the hospital, the medical people took over. They gave him an IV and decided they would take him to the hospital in Kabul. The Charikar police also showed up and started asking us questions about who we were and what happened. They wanted us to give a written statement. We only told them briefly what happened and said we were from the Parwan PRT. After the medical people said that their ambulance was currently in Kabul and that they would just get a cab to take him to Kabul, we decided it would be best to personally take him to the hospital on BAF. We asked the Charikar police to get one of their police vehicles so the local could lay down in it, but they would not. So we got a cab, loaded him into it and we escorted the cab back to BAF. We arrived at BAF at approximately 1030 local. From there, 1LT (b)(3), (b)(6) took him to the Egyptian hospital. Later the man was transferred to the American hospital. I was the convoy commander for this mission.
