SUBJECT: Request for goodwill payment for the death of (b)(3),(b)(6)

1. (b)(6) was killed on 02AUG06 by C/1-8 Infantry. At the time we believed he was fleeing from Coalition Forces because he was involved in IED activity that had occurred earlier that morning. After the incident was over, it was determined that he was in fact not a terrorist and in reality was merely fleeing because he was engaging in other, non-terrorism criminal activities.

2. Though (b)(3),(b)(6) was engaging in criminal activities when he was killed, his family should still be paid a goodwill payment (b)(6), (b)(5) (b)(5), (b)(6)

Summary Sheet:

On 020830AUG06, 1/C/1-8 IN was returning from an IED site vicinity (b)(2)High (Refer to SIGACT (b)(2)High, enroute to (b)(2)High vicinity (b)(2)High (west of the city of Balad). SSG (b)(3),(b)(6) (TC in the lead vehicle) observed several black market fuel vendors in front of the (b)(6) gas station (b)(2)High). The Platoon Leader (LT (b)(3),(b)(6)) ordered the platoon to cordon off the vehicles and stores, in order to confiscate illegal fuel and question the local vendors. After the platoon established blocking positions, SSG (b)(3),(b)(6) reported that a bongo truck was moving at a high rate of speed away from the other vehicles within the cordon. All of the other local national vehicles in the cordon were stopped, had shut down their engines, and the drivers exited their vehicles, in compliance with the instructions of the patrol.

SSG (b)(3),(b)(6) began to pursue the bongo truck in an attempt to interdict it and determine if the driver was involved with black-marketing or involved with the emplacement of one of the two IEDs that occurred earlier that morning destroying a US HET (Refer to SIGACT (b)(2)High SIGACT (b)(2)High).

The bongo truck did not respond to audible and visual instructions to stop, in the form of hand and arm signals, showing of weapons, and yelling to stop in both English and Arabic. LT (b)(3),(b)(6) directed that SSG (b)(3),(b)(6) assist SSG (b)(3),(b)(6) in the pursuit. At this point, SSG (b)(3),(b)(6)

(b)(2)High (b)(2)High SSG (b)(3),(b)(6) (b)(2)High (b)(2)High

(b)(2)High, 1LT (b)(3),(b)(6) directed that SSG (b)(3),(b)(6) fire a disabling burst into the engine of the bongo truck.

SSG (b)(3),(b)(6) engaged the bongo truck engine compartment with a burst of M240 (6-10 rds). The bongo truck then crashed into a Mercedes dump truck. The vehicle was searched by SSG (b)(3),(b)(6), who determined that the driver had been hit twice by ricochet rounds, once in the left wrist, and once in neck. The patrol could not determine if the ricochet rounds or the impact of the crash killed the local national. After a search of the vehicle was conducted, the bongo truck contained several full fuel cans, but no IED materials were found.
