Respected Sir,

On 26-08-2005 (b)(6) (a (b)(6) and resident of Logar Province), who was leaving his shop for his home by his motorcycle had an accident with Coalition Forces' vehicle as a result of which (b)(6) was seriously injured while another passenger (who was accompanying (b)(6) on the same motorcycle) lost his live. After this accident, (b)(6) lost his consciousness and he is still in the same condition.

The Collation Forces took him to Bagram Airbase Hospital by helicopter and then transferred him to Ali Abad Hospital after some simple treatment dressing. Since there was no enough facilities for his treatment in the hospital, he was admitted in Blossom, a private clinic and he is still in coma.

According to the doctors, this accident has affected his nervous system and his treatment is possible to be done abroad that needs a lot of money, however, (b)(6) is only the one who supports a nine-member family. The only source of his financial support is his shop and it is about a month that he is in coma and even hasn't said a word.

(b)(6)'s health and his family's current situation need serious attention and his family requests for below points to be done,

- o As his family cannot afford his treatment expenses, the Collation Forces should pay for his treatment either in the country or outside country.
- o The damages that the Collation Forces caused should be compensated to (b)(6)
- o ~~Apologize from the family~~ and pay attention to them till he gets well.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Foreign Claim Investigation, Claim # A1D-05-387 (b)(6)

1. Identifying Information.

a. Claimant: The claimant is a local national, (b)(6) (hereinafter "the claimant"), living in Kabul, Afghanistan.

b. Amount: The claimant filed a claim for \$100,000.00USD on 16 Sep 05.

c. The claimant states on 27 August 2005, his brother and (b)(6) were riding a motorcycle that was struck by a U.S Government vehicle. (b)(6) died as a result of that accident and (b)(6)'s brother was seriously injured.

d. Investigation Completed: 31 January 2006.

2. Jurisdiction. This claim is presented for consideration under the Foreign Claims Act, 10 U.S.C. §2734. The claimant filed his claim in a timely manner in the form of an SF 95. The claimant is a foreign national and the brother of the injured party. The claimant is a proper claimant under the Foreign Claims Act IAW DA PAM 27-162, para. 10-2.

3. Statement of Facts.

a. On 27 August 2005, at approx 1530L, SPC (b)(3), (b)(6) was driving an UAH B-33 in a convoy. His recollection is that the motorcycle approached the B-33 from the rear and got caught between the B-33 and the parked construction vehicle. His vehicle was the last of 5 in this convoy. There were 5 occupants in the vehicle and they were traveling at approx. 30 mph. The road he was traveling on was currently under construction. There was a parked construction vehicle on the right hand side of the road and SPC (b)(3), (b)(6) moved slightly into the left hand lane to pass the parked vehicle. Based on other statements, it is believed that after the UAH B-33 passed the stopped construction vehicle, SPC (b)(3), (b)(6) veered back into the right hand lane and that is when the motorcycle and military vehicle collided.

b. On 15 October 2005, three local nationals, (b)(6) and (b)(6) were interviewed. They all stated that they were located behind the B-33 on bicycles as the accident happened. Each of the three stated that the motorcycle was in front of the UAH B-33. Then, just as the UAH B-33 passed the stopped construction vehicle, it made a right turn to get back into the right lane and struck the motorcycle. None of the witnesses actually saw the

collision, but they all witnessed the events leading up to and after the collision. They all basically stated the same set of facts.

c. MAJ (b)(3) (b)(6) stated that there was a stopped construction vehicle on the right side of the road and "a motorcycle with a driver and one passenger pulled out from behind the parked construction vehicle and stopped next to the construction vehicle's left side." He yelled to the driver to watch out, but he was unable to maneuver in time and it the motorcycle with the front right corner of the humvee. Thus, MAJ (b)(3) (b)(6) placed the motorcycle in front of the B-33.

d. Further, from photographs (Exhibit #11) of damage, there seems to be nominal damage to the right side of the vehicle and the mirror is not damaged at all. Just the front right portion of the hood and some scratches at the door at the top of the tire level. This would suggest that the impact came when the vehicle and motorcycle impacted if the motorcycle was in front of the UAH B-33.

e. The claimant submitted an SF 95 indicating damages of \$100,000 USD for the injuries sustained by his brother.

#### **4. Legal Analysis.**

a. Legal Rules. Under AR 27-20, para. 10-3, the incident that forms the basis for the claim must arise in a foreign country and be a result of either noncombat activities of the U.S. armed forces or the negligent or wrongful acts of civilian employees or military members. "Noncombat activity" is defined in the Glossary of AR 27-20, as "authorized activities essentially military in nature, having little parallel in civilian pursuits, which historically have been considered as furnishing the proper basis for payment of claims. Activities excluded are those incident to combat, whether in time of war or not, and use of military personnel and civilian employees in connection with civil disturbances."

b. Application of Rules. In this case, the claim arose in Afghanistan, a foreign country. The military vehicle driver engaged in negligent conduct by not proceeding in a safe manner, i.e., the driver's speed may have been excessive due to road conditions and did not ensure the right hand lane was clear prior to moving back into that lane.

#### **5. Damages.**

a. The claimant's brother was seriously injured as a result of the accident.

b. SF 95. The claimant filed an SF 95 on 6 September 2005. The SF 95 indicates damages in the amount of \$100,000 USD for the injuries of his brother. However, according to the valuation chart for death claims in Afghanistan \$6,000.00 USD is fair and reasonable for the death of a local national; therefore, \$3,000.00 is fair and reasonable for the injuries sustained to the claimant's brother.

6. **Proposed Settlement or Action.** This claim is payable under the Foreign Claims Act because the injuries of the claimant's brother occurred as a result of a U.S. military member's negligent conduct. This claim should be settled \$3,000.00 (151,020 Afghani).

LINE 8 - SUMMARY (Summary of incident) SPC(3) (b)(6) (SECFOR/203) was driving H33 on a CONOP from Camp Phoenix to Gardez. Shortly after passing through Pol e' Alam, we entered a construction zone. As H33 passed through the area, a motorcycle with two local nationals tried to squeeze between H33 and a parked jingle truck as the UAH passed. MAJ (b)(3) (b)(6) saw the individuals and tried to warn SPC(3) (b)(6) and SPC(3) (b)(6) tried to maneuver H33 clear. He was unsuccessful and the motorcycle and victims were pinned and dragged between the two vehicles until H33 was clear. SPC(3) (b)(6) immediately stopped the vehicle and MAJ (b)(3) (b)(6) passed the word to the CONOP CDR, MAJ (b)(3) (b)(6) (CLS) personnel responded to the scene and began to treat the individuals. Phoenix JOC was notified and MEDEVAC was requested. An 82nd Abn CONOP was also passing through the area and also stopped to render aid. 82nd Abn medic arrived on scene and took over primary care of the

I met today with the family members of the two accident victims that your Soldiers helped in Logar province at the end of August and distributed the personal property that I had picked up from your ALOC. A copy of the inventory we received from your people is attached.

The family members asked about there whereabouts of 3 items:

1. The motorcycle;
2. a cell phone;
3. a notebook (that contained names and figures of business accounts)

They agreed on everything else, including the cash. We paid the widow of the deceased a solatia payment fairly quickly. She submitted a claim today that may or may not be paid depending on the accident investigation as to fault. The other individual that was air evac'd to Bagram is now in an Afghan hospital and still in poor condition and probably won't recover. (b)(6) and we have been dealing with him about him filing a claim to pay for the hospital bills.
