SUBJECT: AR 15-6 Report of Investigation (Escalation of Force)

1. Purpose. The purpose of this memorandum is to provide the findings and recommendations regarding the escalation of force by A Section, 1st Platoon, A Troop, 8-10 CAV 112305MAR06 vic MB 3295 8119.

2. Summary of Incident. On 11MAR06, A/1/A/8-10 CAV was conducting a patrol with three vehicles (A12, A13, and A92) along (b)(2)High and then down into Muhalla 891 (EXHIBIT N). At approximately 2230, the 8-10 CAV TOC notified the Patrol Leader, SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) he needed to investigate a suspicious mound of dirt at grid (b)(2)High reported to 8-10 CAV by Cobra Mike (EXHIBIT B, N). A Red 2 (SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) patrol) arrived in the vicinity of (b)(2)High at approximately 2252 (EXHIBIT P). Once in the area, the patrol approached a "Y" leading to two dirt roads running north to south (EXHIBIT B, I, N). SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) followed by the A92 vehicle take the eastern road closest to the canal while SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) takes the western road, all traveling south (EXHIBIT I, N, L). Line of Sight was momentarily lost between SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) vehicle and the two other elements of the patrol (EXHIBIT I).

At 2305 SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) (AR 2) reported receiving small arms contact from the east vic (b)(2)High (b)(2)High directed in the area of his vehicle (EXHIBIT L, N, P). Small arms fire and about three personnel are seen on the edge of M895 running back east into buildings (EXHIBIT N).

SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) (TC), SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) (DRVR), SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) (GNR), and SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) (b)(3)(b)(6) (MEDIC) on A13 vehicle came to a road that turned back east and took it to link back up with the other members of the patrol when the crew observed a man approximately (2)Himeters away (EXHIBIT B, D, G, H). Upon seeing the A13 vehicle the individual ducked back behind the corner of a concrete wall (EXHIBIT B, D, G, H). The A13 vehicle proceeded slowly to the corner of the wall. Upon reaching the corner of the wall SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) shined the spot light on the individual whereby the individual began running back in the direction the vehicle had just gone and opposite the direction the vehicle was facing (EXHIBIT B, D, G, H). The gunner, SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) held the spot light on the individual and started yelling for him to "oggoff" or stop (EXHIBIT G, H) and "stop or we will shoot" in Arabic (EXHIBIT B). At this time, SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) and SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) saw the individual carrying something in his hand that appeared to be white or light in color, round, thin and about a foot long (EXHIBITS B, C, D, E, F, G). He appeared to be tucking it under his arm as if trying to hide it (EXHIBIT H). SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) and SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) dismounted the HMMWV and began yelling for the individual to "stop" and "stop or we will shoot" several times (EXHIBITS B, D, G, H). The individual continued to run at a full sprint (EXHIBIT B). At this time SGT (b)(4) fired approximately (2)H demonstration/warning shot off the ground and at the wall next to the individual (EXHIBIT B, H). SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) fired a couple of demonstration shots at the wall (EXHIBIT D). SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) fired (b)(2)High rounds before realizing it was too dangerous and continued to hold the spot light on the individual (EXHIBIT G). The individual continued to run, he was approximately (2)Himeters away from the A13 crew and approximately (2)Himeters from rounding a corner in the wall (EXHIBIT B, D, L). At this time, SGT (b)(2)High gave the order to take the individual down (EXHIBIT B, H). SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) and SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) fired approximately (2)H disabling shots each at the individual at which time he went down and did not move (EXHIBIT B, C, D, E, H). At (2)High SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) (AR2) reported to the 8-10 CAV TOC that they "saw a man running away with what appeared to be a mortar tube in his hand, he threw something at the patrol, they fired warning shots, he threw something else at them, they fired on him and he went down" (EXHIBIT P). This was reported by SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) who was relaying to Squadron TOC from SGT (b)(3)(b)(6). However, SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) clarified this report saying he didn't recall saying the individual had thrown something at the vehicle, but was trying to say the individual running by the vehicle had something in his hand and might have dropped it. He was also in the middle of reporting the small arms fire directed toward his vehicle and the two reports probable got mixed together (EXHIBIT Q).

SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) also stated that there was a lot of trash in the area so it was impossible to determine what the individual might have been carrying. However, they did not find anything that posed a threat to them after searching the area (EXHIBIT Q). SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) stated that he did not know what it was or what happened to it (EXHIBIT B). SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) stated (b)(3)(b)(6) h they found nothing. SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) then ordered the crew to (b)(2)High. As the crew was (b)(2)High, SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) noticed the primer on the bottom of what he thought was a mortar round located where the individual had been standing before he had begun running (EXHIBIT H). SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) confirmed the artillery round when the individual had been standing and ordered his crew to move forward (EXHIBIT B, H, M, P). SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) called in a report to SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) informing him of the details. A cordon was established using (b)(2)High (EXHIBIT B, M, J).

(b)(3)(b)(6) CSM (b)(3)(b)(6) and the PSD arrived at the location at (b)(2)High and confirmed that the suspected object was not a live UXO (EXHIBIT I). SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) stated that it looked like an artillery round (EXHIBIT G) and SPC (b)(3)(b)(6) stated SGT (b)(3)(b)(6) found what appeared to be an artillery shell casing (EXHIBIT D). SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) along with Red 3 (b)(3)(b)(6) confirmed the object to be dunnage, an old artillery round (EXHIBIT P). The body was examined and confirmed dead from a bullet wound that struck the back of the head and exited the upper right forehead (EXHIBIT H, I, J). SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) stated he walked the ground where the rounds were located and found nothing suspicious (EXHIBIT J).

SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) along with the Interpreter (b)(6) spoke with local nationals at the site. One local national identified the body saying his name (b)(6). The local national said the individual (b)(6) acting suspicious, even though he was told to stay inside. The local national speaking with SSG (b)(3)(b)(6) said his uncle lived in the house in front of the body. The uncle called on a cell phone and told them he overheard the Americans warning the individual to "stop or we shoot" at least three times and then the shooting. The uncle also told the (b)(6) that awhile ago the individual found an explosive device, took it home, somehow it detonated and accidentally killed two of his brothers (EXHIBIT K, J).

At (b)(2)High IP arrive on the scene to recover the body of the Local National (EXHIBIT M).

On 12MAR06, SSG Reed along with a B Section patrol went back to the site and contacted the individual's brother. The brother reaffirmed (b)(6) of his deceased brother. He was given a 4th ID Contact Card (EXHIBIT I).

3. Findings of the Investigation. The actions of the local national combined with recent IED/AIF activity in the vicinity of GRID (b)(2) High led SGT (b)(3), b(6) SPC (b)(3), b(6) and SPC (b)(3), b(6) to believe the local national was exhibiting hostile intent with the potential for committing a hostile act (EXHIBIT C, D, F, M, O). SGT (b)(3), b(6) perceived the local national actions as hostile given that he was at the grid coordinate of a possible IED, the local national was out after curfew and was trying to evade coalition forces. SGT (b)(3), b(6) believed the local national was in a "hot area, after curfew, to plant or observe coalition (b)(3), b(6) (nel) for the intent of hurting or killing troops, directly or indirectly" (EXHIBIT C). SPC (b)(3), b(6) stated that the "person appeared to be evading us from what appeared to be as placing an IED or being the trigger man for the possible IED we were call" (EXHIBIT E). SPC (b)(3), b(6) also stated the individual "could easily take cover and proceed to do any kind of engagement towards us" (EXHIBIT D).

Based on the perceived hostile intent of the individual, SGT (b)(3), b(6) and his crew used proper EOP. (b)(3), b(6) (b)(3), b(6) (b)(3), b(6) (b)(2)High

1. CPT [redacted (b)(3)(b)(6)] HHT/8-10 CAV is hereby appointed an investigating officer pursuant to AR 15-6 to conduct an informal investigation into a EOF fatality of a local national which occurred on 11 MAR 06 involving SGT [redacted (b)(3)(b)(6)].
