THE SECOND ISSUE IS SHOOTING FLEEING SUSPECTS AND VEHICLES. WE DO NOT SHOOT CARS THAT TURN AROUND BEFORE GOING THRU A CHECKPOINT. WE DO NOT SHOOT UNARMED PERSONS WHO HAVE NOT COMMITTED A HOSTILE ACT AND ARE RUNNING AWAY FROM THE SCENE OF AN INCIDENT. IF A HOSTILE ACT OR HOSTILE INTENT DOES NOT EXIST, THEN SOLDIERS SHOULD NOT BE FIRING THEIR WEAPONS AT FLEEING PERSONS. THIS IS NOT THE FIRST TIME I HAVE DISCUSSED THIS. YOU NEED TO GET THE WORD DOWN TO YOUR SOLDIERS.

LAST ISSUE. MNC-I JUST CONDUCTED AN IG SURVEY REGARDING HOW WELL SOLDIERS UNDERSTAND THE ROE AND LAW OF WAR. NO BIG ISSUES, BUT THE INSPECTION DID FIND THAT REFRESHER TRAINING IS NOT OCCURRING IN THEATER WITH QUALIFIED TRAINERS. I DON'T THINK THIS IS A PROBLEM IN OUR FORMATIONS, BUT MAKE SURE YOUR JAGS ARE GETTING OUT AND CONDUCTING THE TRAINING. KEEP UP THE GREAT WORK AND STAY FOCUSED ON DISCIPLINE AND STANDARDS.
