(c) Brief Description: Hound 26 reports EOF with civilian casualties vicinity grid (b)(2) High

(b)(2)High at 29 1558 SEP 06 while conducting SOI engagement with IP Station #

nd 26 reports white four door sedan traveling at a high rate of speed from west  
to east on Market Street toward them while securing IP station # 2 during SOI

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engagement. They used EOF procedures consisting of Hand and Arm signals, presentation of weapon, and firing a warning shot in front of the vehicle. The white sedan showed no signs of slowing down. When the vehicle was at approximately 50M the convoy engaged with 25 rounds of 5.56 from M4, 55 rounds of 7.62 from M240 and 35 rounds of .50 Cal. 4 x LN were wounded and initially were transported to Hawijah Hospital then taken to Kirkuk for treatment. Treatment by US Forces was offered but denied by the family members. CPT (b)(6) (IP Chief) immediately dispatched IP to the scene to secure the area. Hound 36 and T were pushed to Riyadh to disseminate IO Message to Iraqi Local Nationals.

(a) Date of Incident: 30 September 2006

(b) Unit: B CO 1-505<sup>th</sup> IN

(c) Brief Description: At 301145SEP06 1/B/1-505<sup>th</sup> PIR Combat Out reported an EOF in the Salah Ad Din province west of Bayji, vic grid [redacted] 1/B/1-505<sup>th</sup> was securing Engineers from A/878 that were reinforcing checkpoint into the COP. Bravo 17 reported that a white Toyota truck approached at a high rate of speed (Est. 50 MPH) along East- [redacted] Road. The vehicle sped through both the concertina wire and cones placed approx. [redacted] from 1/B/1-505<sup>th</sup> PIR CP. CP attempted to flag vehicle down prior to the vehicle driving through the cones and wire in front of the COPs location. Vehicle increased speed [redacted] and both IA and CF engaged with AK-47.M3 and M240. Vehicle veered off the road [redacted] from COP location and down into a gully where it caught fire. Small explosions [redacted] reported from the truck as it burned. IA from the COP moved the truck to attempt to assess and put out fire. 3 LN reportedly from Tikrit were confirmed dead.





(a) Date of Incident: 10 July 2006

(b) Unit: 1-68 CAB (B CO, 2-9 CAV), 3HBCT

(c) Brief Description: Unit responded to IED detonation; during questioning of local IZ in the area, a teenage boy started running and was shot to disable, but was killed. The BOLT received a claim for his death, checked the SIGACT, and realized the death had

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not been reported. It appears the boy was not AIF, so the BDE CDR initiated a 15-6 to determine the facts as to what happened and to determine why the shooting was not reported in the SIGACT (it was reported in the storyboard). 15-6 investigation underwent revisions since last week and is again pending legal review.

(a) Date of Incident: 17 September 2006

(b) Unit: A Co., 2-3 IN

(c) Brief Description: TF 2 [redacted] t 2/1/54 Ps conducted an EOF in the Ninewa Province, Mosul at [redacted] on RTE [redacted] of the intersection of RTE Infinity. 2/1/549 MP C [redacted] north o [redacted] when a LN vehicle approached quickly to the rear of the trail vehicle gunner observed a vehicle with only a driver rapidly approaching at [redacted] distance, so he executed hand and arm signals, but the vehicle failed to reduce speed or stop. At [redacted] distance, the gunner placed 10-15 rounds of 7.62mm from a M240 into the hood of the vehicle and through the windshield. The squad continued moving forward to the next available turnaround point, but the civilian vehicle stopped. The vehicle actually contained 1 x LN male, 1 x LN woman, and 1 x LN child. The female and child were located in the backseat, so were not readily visible to the gunner. The male immediately exited the vehicle, and took the child to a local hospital in another civilian vehicle that had stopped at the scene. When the MP squad arrived back on scene, only the LN female was present. They searched the vehicle with no results. The male returned to the scene 20 minutes later and reported the LN child had been pronounced dead at the Abu Nasir Hospital. There was 1 x LN child killed and damage to a civilian vehicle as the result of this incident.
