October 7, 2009

The United States Army announces the loss of Specialist Stephan L. Mace, 21, of Virginia, who died on October 3, 2009, in Kamdesh, Afghanistan, in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. According to initial reports, Specialist Mace died of injuries sustained when his contingency outpost received small arms, rocket-propelled grenade, and indirect fire.

Specialist Mace was assigned to B Troop, 3rd Squadron, 61st Cavalry Regiment, 4th Infantry Division, Fort Carson, Colorado.

Specialist Mace's family resides in Charles Town, West Virginia (mother) and Winchester, Virginia (father). The Army extends heartfelt sympathy and condolences to his family and friends who have suffered this loss and is committed to providing full support for their needs.
