(BC0003) Airport Police Local Police Station: (TRA Level NA) Two BIAP IPAs were assigned to the terminal area to assist the IP in maintaining order in the terminal area. The IPAs observed and mentored the BIAP IP while performing their assigned duty.

(BC0006) Al Adhamiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The PTT team met with MAJ (b)(6) and collected the daily station report statistics. The PTT team continued handing out new Baghdad identification badges to IP. The team also made a detention inspection and conducted a station management training session with MAJ (b)(6).

(BC0007) Al Adhamiya Patrol Police Station (East): (TRA Level 2) The team spoke with COL (b)(6) who stated that everything was going well. The Colonel asked for phone numbers for the tip lines. The Colonel stated that a suspect from Tal Afar had planted an IED but the device was disposed of by military personnel. The team left the station to conduct a patrol to locate IP checkpoints.

(BC0021) Al Kadhimaya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team conducted training on weapon cleaning and safety. The class covered topics such as muzzle discipline and the proper method of carrying a rifle. The IP were also taught several methods of securing their weapons when not in use.

(BC0026) Al Karamah Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The PTT team observed the MAJ (b)(6) handling of local police matters and community relations. During this session the PTT team spoke with the family of (b)(6) an IP from the station, who was detained a month ago and has not been released. The IP's spouse and MAJ (b)(6) are coordinating his release through the PTT team and Coalition Forces. Another issue was about death compensation, which has not been paid to the family of a SGT MAJ killed August 1st. During the family's query into this issue, conflicting answers were given by MOI personnel. This matter will be forwarded to Iraqi Internal Affairs.

(BC0030) Al Karkh Highway Traffic Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team collected information regarding 15 checkpoints that are currently assigned within the station's AOR. The team's primary mission was entering station personnel into the HIIDE system. The station's generator is not working and is in need of repair.

(BC0039) Al Mamum Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team met with the Station Commander to discuss the development of the station's force protection plan. The Commander will make instituting an SOP for force protection a priority and requested the team's continued support. The team met with construction contractors who provided estimates for repairing the station's perimeter lighting.

(BC0042) Al Meshadah Local Police Station: (TRA Level NA) The team issued a new computer to the JSS, but found this computer to be faulty. The team met with Col. (b)(6) and Lt. Col. (b)(6) about speaking to MOI in reference to class 34 and 35 be transferred to Tarimiyah instead of Baghdad as a resolution for these classes being investigated for AWOL. The team recommended that Meshadiah LPS pick up fuel for both stations and give Tarimiyah their share to save an extra trip to Baghdad. The team recorded all Glock pistols that were at the station on this visit including serial numbers and MOI badges. The

team sat in on the daily briefing and documented the staffing numbers for IPS. The team gave Lt. [redacted] the class outline for Hostage Survival and Lt. [redacted] gave a class to the IP after he reviewed the content.

(BC0049) Al Rashad Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team conducted training for 4 IP on weapon retention and disarming techniques. A joint patrol was conducted in the Mahalla 730 area. IP inform the individuals who were selling illegal gas on the roadside that next time they would be arrested and their gas confiscated.

(BC0051) Al Rasheed Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) Station Commander requested the Team accompany him to express to Gen [redacted] the need for additional Officers to effectively manage the station. The Commander was very displeased with the condition of the station when he is not there and feels he is getting no support from his subordinate officers. The Station has 5 officers assigned to a station authorized over 30. Remaining time at the station was spent reinforcing one guard tower to improve force security by installing bullet proof glass and additional sand bags.

(BC0052) Al Rashidia Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team spoke with CPT [redacted] and advised there are still 21 AWOL. 2 Officers are currently in Baghdad training at the police academy. Cpt. [redacted] advised that he had 9 IP on force protection. The team observed the IP force protection detail to be on alert and aware of their surroundings. The team coordinated with Cpt. [redacted] to conduct an accurate account of IP on pay day. During the accounting of the arms room the team was advised that 391 AK rounds and 220 AKC rounds had been fired last night when returning fire at a sniper that shot at the station at about midnight. CPT [redacted] did not know how many rounds the sniper shot or where the rounds hit. CPT [redacted] thought the sniper was firing from a position north of the station. CPT [redacted] advised he had not reported the sniper incident to the JSS because he did not know that he was supposed to contact the CF in this type of incident. The station has been receiving fuel from the CF and Baghdad, but the team discovered a discrepancy in the fuel. The station has 3 Motorola radios that are all operational. The team conducted a joint patrol with the IP which stopped at two checkpoints and conducted vehicle searches.

(BC0059) Al Sha'ab Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team met with MAJ [redacted] who reported no significant events on this date. The PTT team took eighty IP pictures for the new Baghdad identification badges.

(BC0062) Al Suleikh Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team met with COL [redacted] who reported an IED hit the IA convoy and one IA died. The PTT team conducted a joint mounted patrol, with three IP included in the area check.

(BC0081) Bab al Sheikh Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The PTT team talked with COL [redacted] about the threat of IEDs placed in his area of responsibility. An IED was found just at the edge of COL [redacted] area today, and the commander is concerned about the insurgents moving their activities to his area. Also discussed was the attempted kidnapping and shooting of Commissioner [redacted] on September 25th. The Commissioner lost his weapon to the kidnapers. The PTT team offered solutions to better protect his officers and their community. COL [redacted] has already put in place some of the measures. The PTT team went on a mounted patrol with one IP vehicle and four IP.

(BC0088) Baghdad Provincial Traffic Police HQ: (TRA Level 3) The Team met with Brig. General [redacted] in Logistics and discussed an order that was sent from the MOI for the repair of broken AK-47s. It was determined to have the weapons transported to CMF at a future date via joint patrol.

The team talked to Brig. General [redacted] who advised he has tried many times to get spare parts for the new motorcycles from the MOI without success. The Brig. General was asked to research if there were any motorcycle shops in the Baghdad area and that the Traffic HQ could get parts for the broken motorcycles. The Brig. General was also asked about funds in the current budget to repair the motorcycle. It was explained to the Brig. General that the repairs that needed to be completed on the motorcycles were not under warranty and was have to have a line item charge to get the funds for the repairs. The team was also advised that two warrant officers would be leaving on Friday to go to Japan for a 2 week motorcycle course.

The team met with Lt. Colonel [redacted] of the Public Relations Office at Traffic HQ who advised his one year old daughter is having problems with her "legs not working." The team advised him that we would see if there were any agencies that might be able to help him and his daughter. Upon return to base, the team spoke with military counterparts who advised there is the Iraqi Assistance Group, who helps with children that have a major medical problem. The team was advised the party needed to go to ECP 2, with 2 forms of I.D. and they are put on a list in the order of arrival to the gate for help. This information will be relayed to Lt. Colonel [redacted] upon our return to Traffic HQ.

(BC0090) Boob Al Sham Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The PTT met with 2nd Lt [redacted] and received the station stats for today's shift. There have been no incidents since the team's last visit. Col. [redacted] was in Baghdad working on station badges. A combined joint patrol was conducted using 1 IP vehicle manned by 4 IP and 1 IA vehicle manned by 5 IA. The patrol lasted for 1hr and was cut short by vehicle problems with a coalition vehicle. After reporting the progress of the patrol to 2nd Lt. [redacted], the team returned to base.

(BC0097) Latifiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 4) Tthe Station Commander he stated he placed one of his IP in jail as a suspected JAM member the previous evening. He also informed advised 3 IP were detained by IA for coming from check point in a taxi. IA commander released IP later saying it looked suspicious for IP in uniform to be in a taxi as some stolen IP uniforms are used by insurgents. IA commander said he will assist IP 'brother' with fuel situation. A joint meeting of IA and IP commanders as well as local mayor to discuss the town's future is being set up on a each week. Base station install completed.

(BC0102) Mahmoudya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team met with Maj. [redacted] and discussed the October training schedule. The detention cell was clean and orderly, but very crowded. A joint patrol was conducted to check neighborhoods and conducted a hasty check point.

(BC0103) Major Crimes Unit HQ: (TRA Level 2) The team met with the Logistics Officer and discussed supplies and computers. The team then visited the detention facility and assessed the facility and inmates. The team also visited with the Commanding General of the Station. The General stated there are 12 investigators at CID 1. The General had concerns about the new construction for his station and when the construction will start. The General also advised the Investigative Judges change so often that the judges are not familiar with the cases that are under investigation. Some cases that need action are being held up by the judges. The team proposed a possible solution by arranging a meeting between the Judges and Investigators.

While at CID 1, the PTT assigned to CID 1 arrived for their daily visit. The CID 1 team distributed ID cards to the IP. These cards were made by the military for the specific purpose of identifying IP assigned to the AO. They were not official MOI IP badges.

(BC0104) Major Crimes Unit (West): (TRA Level NA) The team conducted a brief

inspection of the station and entered 90 detainees into the HIIDES system.

(BC0105) Major Crimes Unit (East): (TRA Level 3) PTT team continued issuing the new Baghdad identification badges to the IP and conducted an inmate status check. Ninety inmates were inside a cell designed for fifty inmates and nineteen had just been transferred from other facilities. None have been in custody for longer than one month at this facility.

(BC0112) New Baghdad Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) Training was conducted for 1 Officer and 2 commissioners. Training consisted of Interview and Interrogation, Surveillance Techniques and Investigative Techniques.

(BC0119) Al Rusafa Patrol Station (East): (TRA Level 2) The PTT team met with CAPT [redacted], CAPT [redacted] advised MAJ [redacted] was asleep and was refusing to speak with the PTT team. CAPT [redacted] was quick to dismiss the PTT team, directing them to another room to handle the issuing of the new Baghdad identification badges. The lack of cooperation from the station's command staff is becoming worse on each visit, with the exception of CAPT [redacted]. CAPT [redacted] has been the only source of assistance at the station. The PTT team was unable to properly assess the station do to the current relationship. PTT team did bring the printer paper as requested.

(BC0120) Rusafa Police Directorate HQ: (TRA Level 1) PTT continued to issue IP badges with 19 issued today. This brings the total to 362 thus far. A squad from the CF counterpart traveled to the station this morning with the Company Commander to meet with the Station Commander and make arrangements for a trip to the IZ to complete the paperwork for IZ badges for him and two officers. PTT also visited the rest of the station offices collecting emergency phone numbers and contact information for the CF counterpart. Funding has been approved for the purchase of 14 T-walls to enhance our station force protection.

(BC0125) Yousifiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 4) The Military counterpart flew into Yousifiyah FOB, conducted a patrol and visited the JSS.

(BC0625) Mahmoudiyah Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team completed Combat Lifesaving.

(BC0628) Rusafa Directorate Checkpoint Police HQ: (TRA Level UNK) The PT Team spoke with Col [redacted] about making sure the station facilities were going to be ready for the Commanders meeting on the (date withheld). The team also observed a meeting being held in the vehicle maintenance office, with several of the vehicle mechanics from the LP stations.

(TD0041) Mohammed Sokran Local Police Station: The Team met with the Station Commander to discuss recent issues at the station. The Station Commander purchased four new Motorola batteries for the Stations radios. The Commander advised that he was manning a new checkpoint and was going assess the activity before he decided the number of IP he would assign to the checkpoint. An inquiry about warrants for the area was made by KBS District Headquarters. The Station Commander advised he was directed to gather intelligence on the warrants and to turn the rest of over to Capt [redacted] at District. The Team advised the Commander that they would attempt to include the Stations IP in the raid in order to give the Station experience in this matter.

Day eight of the mini academy training was conducted jointly with the Station Training Officer and the Team. The Station Training Officer and the IPA taught the Crime Scene Investigation class together taking experience from both officers and incorporating it into the class. A class on Vehicle Maintenance was also given.

FOB Echo: The VISTA program resumed training activities with 18 IPs for the Basic SWAT course and the six IPs for the CLS class. The Ukrainians assisted with Force Protection and training. IPAs continue with the Biometrics everyday. IPAs will meet with General [redacted] the Diwaniyah Police Chief, Colonel [redacted] the Chief of training, Colonel [redacted] the assistant training Chief, Captain [redacted] the Commander of training and Colonel [redacted] CSF on Saturday 9/29/07. The meeting will take place at the VISTA training site in the CLS room.

Babil [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

FOB Kalsu: PTT conducted training on FOB Kalsu for 147 Iraqi Police Officers that will make up the north Babil ERU (Emergency Response Unit). Class review with the military and preparations for next class were discussed.

FOB REO: PTT conducted a movement to the ERU compound at Camp Charlie in order to conduct a course review. Upon completion, PTT returned to FOB REO without incident.

(NP9904) Iraqi Camp Charlie National Police Compound: (TRA Level 3) PTT traveled to Camp Charlie, ERU Compound to obtain an evaluation of course material that had been presented over the last 12 weeks. The Cadre and students were asked of their opinions of each category of training. The students were satisfied with the largest portion of the training but did have suggestions on improvements. They requested that more time be spent on raid techniques and building searches. They were happy with the training they received on vehicle stops, vehicle searches and crime scene. The main cause of the unhappiness was the 210,000 dinar they must pay a month. Overall the Cadre and students were satisfied with the training.

Wasit [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

FOB DELTA: IPAs conducted academy training with the PTT on Combat Live Saving. This is the third class, out of four, scheduled this week for CLS training by military personnel.

(BW0034) Wasit Checkpoint Headquarters: (TRA Level 2) Mission was cancelled due to PTT being tasked to a non-PTT mission.

(No FFID#) Al Killodi LPS: (No TRA Level) PTT Members met with Commander Lieutenant Colonel [redacted]. PTT completed Bio-Metrics on IP's and completed personnel bios on Officers and Department heads. PTT Medic examined numerous IPs about their medical problems. One IP was to be referred for upgraded medical exam by qualified doctor. There was a Combat Photographer on the mission with the PTT. The photographer completed a photo shoot for PTT members handing out children's t-shirts and stuffed animals to the IPs.

(No FFID#) Wasit 1st SRT: (No TRA Level) PTT met with Major [redacted] and Captain [redacted] Raad, Commander of 2nd Co, 1st SRT. Major [redacted] said that they have increased their patrol operations to both day and night, and that along with it being Ramadan, has quieted things down. He also said different family tribes within Al Kut are supportive of the City Government and City Council and this has also helped keep the peace.

PTT trained 25 IPs on movement with weapons, team movement, building entry, room searches and clearing stairwells. PTT also gave Major [redacted] ten gallons of fuel for their generator.

Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna (PIC)

PIC members attended a SSR meeting with Australian Military officials who passed on intelligence information and daily operations to the team. The regular Targeting meeting that was attended by PIC members was cancelled in Camp Terendak. PIC members reviewed lesson plans for Vehicle Check Point Training with the Dhi Qar IPS Provincial Instructors. Team members prepared a meeting with the Dhi Qar IPS Financial Officer in Camp Terendak. PIC members contacted SPU unit regarding information EOD information.

Baghdad River Patrol

(BC0147) River Police Training Center: (TRA Level 2) The IPA team observed shift change formation and briefing. The IPAs and US Navy personnel coached the student instructors on teaching docking drills to unskilled students. The IPs conducted the pre-brief and set up how the boats would be used. The IPs taught four unskilled students how to drive and dock the boats. During the training, problems with three boat motors. The IPs conducted a debriefing and had the mechanics come into the debriefing to discuss the possible causes of the problems with the motors. The IPA team also took IPs to the Convention Center for biometrics for their IZ Badges.

Tikrit (MND-CW)

Diyala

(TD0024) Diyala Provincial Police HQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT-P traveled to Zaganiya LPS with the Provincial Director of Police (PDoP), GEN [redacted] GEN [redacted] spoke with the staff of the Zaganiya LPS, Baqubah District HQ and the Al Abarrah LPS about administrative, logistical, ethical and security issues. The material GEN [redacted] discussed was well received by the staff.

(TD0103) Diyala ERF 1: (TRA Level 3) PTT-D spoke with BG [redacted] about recent problems that occurred at the hospital during the suicide bombing at the Mosque. PTT-D offered suggestions on keeping better crowd control inside and outside of the hospital, as well as vehicle traffic control. [redacted] advised he would schedule a meeting with LTC [redacted] from New Baqubah and medical staff so they can develop a critical incident plan. Both of these stations share responsibility for the security of the hospital.

(TD0607) New Baqubah Local Police Station: (TRA Level 4) PTT-D conducted a night mission to the station and met with LTC [redacted]. Issues discussed included security of the hospital during the recent critical incident. PTT-D offered suggestions on better ways to safe guard the perimeter of the hospital. PTT observed training conducted by the TO. The topic of the class was community oriented policing.

(TD0003) Al Hurryaih Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT-D traveled to Balad Ruz and made a night visit at Al Hurryaih LPS. PTT-D was advised that an IP was shot and killed at 1000 hours while at a check point in the Bazania area south of Balad Ruz. PTT led 15 IP on a joint foot and mounted patrol of the Bazania area of Balad Ruz. The check point that was attacked was also visited.

Salah Al Din

(TA0013) Al Alam District HQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with COL [redacted] and advised him that this would be the last visit for this CF unit and that all future visits would be with the new unit.

(TA0029) Al Messirah: (TRA Level 3) There were 9 IP on duty today, PTT gave a class in station security

(TA0034) Al Musafi: (TRA Level 3) There were 8 IP on duty including COL [redacted] the Station Commander. PTT conducted a block of instruction on accountability and weapon retention.

(TA0050) As Sanyiah DHQ: (TRA Level 3) There were 51 IP on duty. PTT, along with the Sanyiah Training Officer SGT [redacted], gave a block of instruction on reaction to an ambush and tactical patrol movements.

(TA 0084) Samarra DHQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with COL [redacted] and discussed the new IP that are supposed to be coming to Samarra from Tikrit. The COL stated that the new number is 70 IP. None of them will be trained since the current class in the Tikrit academy is for NP. COL [redacted] believes that Tikrit is setting up Samarra to fail. PTT told Col [redacted] to schedule an in person meeting with MG [redacted] and the personnel officer in Tikrit so that he can try to rectify the problem.

While PTT was talking with Col [redacted] the IP came in and said insurgents had placed an IED outside of BP5. It was supposed to be 100 meters south of the checkpoint, (grid 95508470 LC). It was determined that the item was possibly an IED. PTT responded and assessed the area and found a white feed bag with what appeared to be a 155 mm round in it. EOD was contacted they determined it was a suspicious package and destroyed it in place. The IP and NP worked well together.

(TA 0019) Hay al Askari Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 3) There were five IHP and five IP at the joint station. PTT conducted training on perimeter security and weapons handling. IP LT Ibrahim stated that he needs more ballistic vests as well as ammunition for his men. The LT was advised to request the items through his chain of command.

(TA 0103) Yethrib LPS: (TRA Level 4)

(9/25/2007) PTT arrived at Checkpoint Tango 38 and spoke with CPT [redacted]. While there, the check point received small arms fire coming from the north. Air weapons support and QRF responded to assist. No known injuries occurred to PTT, CF, IP or civilians. PTT was unable to reach Yethrib station due to time limits.

(9/26/2007) PTT arrived at the Yethrib station and spoke to CPT [redacted]. CPT [redacted] informed PTT that no citizens were killed in last night's fire fight. PTT performed a force protection class with the IP on station. PTT reviewed all personnel on station and entered missing IP into the HIDE system.

(TA0135) South AD Duluyiah Patrol Station: (TRA Level 4) PTT met with the South Station second-in-command, LTC [redacted]. PTT discussed logistical issues that concern the station, especially a shortage of ammunition. It was discovered that south station has a computer room consisting of two computers. We were advised that the computers are strictly used for communications via the Internet only, and no data is stored on them. A future suggestion will be to utilize these computers for district-wide personnel file and record keeping, to include case reports.

(No FFID) Sulyman Bak DPS: (TRA Level 3) Upon meeting with PTT, COL [redacted] began explaining a kidnapping case which was initially reported to his station on the morning of 09-25-07 by the alleged kidnapping victim's 10 year old son. 10 IP's were dispatched to help in the search for the victim. This station had 128 IP's scheduled on duty to man check points and to conduct 2 area patrols during the day and 2 area patrols for the night.

Mosul (MND-N) [redacted]

Ninewah [redacted]

(NO FFID) 5th Emergency Response Battalion: (TRA Level UNK) PTT conducted live fire training on the AK 47 rifle. Drills included weapon presentation, muzzle discipline and accuracy. Students were taught the correct way to shoot and move and multiple target engagements. PTT was informed that other members of the 5th ERB received a 50,000 Dinar bonus that the instructors did not receive. Upon investigation the reason for this was cited as the 50,000 was given to certain members of the ERB who have shown outstanding courage and motivation while on patrol. Another issue that PTT is working on is concerning an IP from the 5th-ERB who was sent to the Instructor School at Key West. The IP's name is [redacted]. LTC [redacted] Battalion Commander of the 5th ERB is alleged to have dropped the IP from the roll and reported him absent while he was in training. PTT will investigate this matter further.

(NO FFID) FOB Q-West: PTT conducted training for thirteen IP at the Advanced Training Center located on FOB Q-West. The training consisted of weapons maintenance and a Glock live fire range. No other station visits were conducted due to combined military operations in the AO.

(MN0056) Ninewah Provincial Headquarters: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with BG [redacted], NPHQ TOC, and discussed the significant events occurring in Ninewah Province during the past 24 hours. BG [redacted] advised that an IED was discovered and disarmed by IP in the Al Najar neighborhood. AIF attacked an Al Rabeain DHQ checkpoint with small arms fire in the Al Nijar neighborhood. AIF killed a pedestrian in the Al Muthan neighborhood. AIF attacked an Al Karama DHQ patrol near the Adan intersection and killed a pedestrian walking near the engagement. An AIF sniper engaged a 1stERB checkpoint in the Al Shefa neighborhood. An IED detonated against a combined IA/Coalition Forces patrol in the Al Yabesaat neighborhood. Two mortar rounds impacted and detonated near a 3rdERB checkpoint in the Katheeb Alban neighborhood. Three mortar rounds impacted and detonated near a 2ndERB checkpoint in the Palestine neighborhood. Three mortar rounds impacted and detonated near the Kurdish Party Headquarters in the Al Sinaa neighborhood. A homicide bomber detonated himself in the Al Mujmough fuel station at an Al Thakkafa LPS checkpoint, wounding one IP and killing ten civilians.

PTT checked the Sipper computer in the TOC and the IT technician, temporarily assigned to the PTT, reconnected it to the Sipper line; allowing secure communication with the Ninewah PJCC and MOI in Baghdad.

PTT spoke with BG [redacted], Logistics Officer, and discussed the current lack of BKC ammunition. He advised that he had visited Baghdad MOI this past weekend and discussed the deficit of BKC ammunition with the MOI Logistics officer. BG [redacted] related that the meeting was less than satisfactory as MOI did not issue any BKC ammunition to Ninewah Province. BG [redacted] provided the current weapons/ammunition count for NPHQ: 1,892,000

rounds of AK ammunition; 1,076,000 rounds of 9mm ammunition; 2,000 rounds of BKC ammunition; ten RPG7 launchers; 30 AK47 rifles; 496 Glock semi-automatic pistols; four BKC machineguns and five RBK rifles.

PTT met with LTC [redacted] NPHQ Training Division and four officers, who have graduated from the PSTO course. The meeting's topic of discussion was the failure of the graduates to begin conducting any type of training since their graduation from the PSTO class. They informed the PTT that their chiefs do not support any training nor do they have a designated training officer. PTT also discovered there are only six officers of the assigned 28, who are certified instructors at MPSA. PTT began addressing the problem immediately.

In MPSA Class 24 there are 151 students from the Mosul area. MPSA Class 25 continues with 236 students from Tall Afar and 53 from Mosul. The new Police Station Training Officer Course (PSTO) began on this date. The class has 21 officers from the Mosul area. It should be noted that the numbers reflected are the actual number of personnel, who reported to NPHQ for transportation to MPSA. PTT has discovered several instances wherein BG [redacted] has added students to the roster of class attendees as a favor for peers and superiors within the IPS. It was noted that these additional students don't actually attend the academy, but are "ghost students" as their supervisors don't want to lose them from a duty status to attend the actual classes. This in turn causes a "false count" when the academy is queried telephonically for a student count by personnel not assigned to the NPHQ PTT. The "ghost student" issue will be addressed with MG [redacted] PDOP.

PTT revisited the issue of recruitment with COL [redacted] Personnel Division and updated the IP recruitment statistics for September 2007, and then inspected the newly constructed detention area at the MTU.

(MN0066) Sinjar DHQ: (TRA Level 3) Sinjar DHQ PTT escorted other CF to Bulaj LPS to obtain an assessment of village resources. While there, PTT conducted a foot patrol in the village with IP.

(MN0131) Bughah LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT mission this date was to report to Bughah LPS and gather any ACF intelligence. MAJ [redacted] reports that possible ACF activity continues at the mountain top near the village of Haluml in his AOR. MAJ [redacted] witnessed about 10 trucks trafficking in the area a few days ago and is asking that PTT conduct a joint operation and conduct a search. Some of the local people have been previously approached and threatened by suspects to stay away from the mountain. This information was previously reported to PTT by MAJ [redacted]. The water well project has been completed and is operating. PTT requested that MAJ [redacted] produce a memorandum showing that he is the public affairs designee and he promised that it would be completed by the next LPS visit. PTT completed a monthly jail inspection. There are no prisoners. PTT departed Bughah AO and traveled to Avgani LPS to continue with another mission objective.

(MN0222) Rabiyah DHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT photographed the detainees and entered them into the tracking system. PTT inquired about one detainee that has been in the jail for an extended period of time. The IP informed PTT that the detainee has been in the jail for three years and has not been to trial. PTT conducted training on Crime Scene Management with two IP officers and one IP patrolman. The instruction was provided by PTT.

(MN0907) Al Saria LPS: (TRA Level UNK) PTT held a class to train the trainer on building entry techniques. PTT then conducted a joint foot patrol.

The station did a fair job of executing the requests of PTT on dealing with an attack of their station. PTT discussed the good points and the bad points of the drill with COL [redacted].

(NO FFID) FOB Irbil: (TRA Level UNK) PTT traveled to Dukan to meet with Sulaymaniyah PTT for logistical personnel support after a logistics meeting at FOB Irbil.

(NO FFID) FOB Irbil: (TRA Level UNK) Irbil PTT and Dahuk PTT continued with the coordination of personnel for the delivery of a large amount of computers and equipment for the Dahuk Province. PTT and representatives of the KMOI finalized the details of delivery and distribution to the personnel from Dahuk once the final load of equipment has been delivered.

PTT was informed that the Nikon Forensic Photographers Course due to start (date withheld) has been approved and that the Officers will be present for the course. PTT relayed to the Crime Scene Unit to make sure that all assigned Nikon D2x cameras were made available for the class. A classroom is being prepared and PTT will furnish all training aids and class handouts. PTT was made aware that the material provided on a previous visit concerning crime scene protocol had been well received and will be reviewed for future use.

The PTT then met with the Station Chief to discuss the new patrol schedule that is being implemented to have Iraqi Police in the community on a more permanent basis.

(RA0102) Husaybah LPS: (TRA Level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) met with the Station Chief staff.
