(BC0003) Airport Police Local Police Station: (TRA Level NA) The BIAP IPAs conducted a class for the BIAP station. The class general topic remains "First Aid". The individual class outline was First Aid #4 which includes Victim Movement. There were a total of 8 IP students in attendance for this class.

(BC0022) Al Kadhimaya Patrol Police Station (West): (TRA Level 2) The team conducted an on the spot weapons safety class with IP that had been identified as being deficient in the subject. The team spent a majority of their time entering personnel into the HIDE system.

(BC0025) Al Karada Patrol Police Station (East): (TRA Level 1) The team continued the HIDE system entries. Training on combat grip and sighting was conducted with 27 IP on a one-to-one basis. Approximately 10% of the Station's staff remains to be processed.

(BC0028) Al Karkh Police Directorate HQ: (TRA Level 2) The PT Team visited three different stations. The first was Jamea station the team observed the new recruits take there PT test. The second station was Mansour HQ where a CF General held a meeting with Col (b)(6), the station commander. The third station the team visited was Karkh Directorate, the team spoke to BG (b)(6) about two of the new recruits who were killed on the 26th at their homes for being IP.

(BC0041) Al Mesbah Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT distributed the temporary badges made for the IP. These IPs were required to have his retina scanned and be fingerprinted. The process is 90% complete. Fuel issues were addressed and the Team conducted a joint patrol.

(BC0042) Al Meshahadah Local Police Station: (TRA Level NA) The team arrived and found the station IP prepared for a patrol to Baghdad to complete administrative work at HQ. Three trucks and 18 IP went. The team was given the daily station report by Lt. Col. (b)(6). The Col. reports that the station will be conducting more independent patrols in the coming weeks due to school starting. The Col. gave the updated station numbers and vehicle inventory by V.I.N. The station's completed renovation began to deteriorate with the rest rooms backing up, an AC unit is inoperable, several light switches are inoperable and the light fixtures are falling down.

The team conducted training on Station Defense after the IP returned from patrol. The Lt. performed well with minor assistance. Two IEDs were detonated while the team was on station. Both were south of the station. A third IED was detonated while the team was waiting in a cordon on the way back to Camp Taji. No injuries were reported in any of the incidents.

(BC0051) Al Rasheed Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The Team continued training on weapons safety and handling in preparation for a range day. The team continued to request an IP to act as the Station Training Officer and the Commander has agreed to provide one of the newly assigned Warrant Officers to this duty.

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(BC0052) Al Rashidia Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team met with Col. [redacted] who provided the team with the daily report. Col. [redacted] advised that they now have a total of 169 IP as they have received two new ones from other stations. There were no absent today and 9 on vacation. Col. [redacted] advised that he had 11 IP on force protection that appeared observant to their surroundings as we arrived. The team was advised about a hole in the roadway that was suspected of being used to plant an IED. Col. [redacted] contacted the JSS and an IA squad was investigating. While on station, the JSS contacted the station and advised that the roadway was clear for normal traffic. No fuel had been delivered to the station today. The team began to mount a joint patrol but discovered an IA squad with an inoperable vehicle. The team assisted with towing and repairs.

(BC0064) Al Taji Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) 09/24/07 The team spoke with Col. [redacted]. The station is not getting any fuel from MOI and they are still having issues maintaining patrols because of lack of fuel.

09/25/07 The Team conducted a joint patrol to assess check points. While on patrol, the team responded to an IED strike. The IP continued their patrol while the team set up a cordon. Later in the evening, the team conducted a second joint patrol where the team conducted a patrol in one of the local villages.

09/26/07 The IP were at their posts and were properly equipped. The PTT met with Col. [redacted] to discuss basic station operations. The only significant issue is the lack of fuel for the patrol vehicles. Training was conducted by Lt. [redacted] on getting the IP involved with Community Policing. The class was attended by 10 IP. A joint Patrol was organized which included 2 IP vehicles and 11 IP. One of the IP vehicles ran out of fuel early in the patrol. A Local National traveled to a gas station and obtained fuel for the IP patrol vehicle. A foot patrol was conducted in a nearby village and the IP interacted positively with small shop owners, adults and children.

09/27/07 The team conducted a 3 hour "Presence Patrol".

(BC0065) Al Taji Patrol Police Station (West): (TRA Level 2)

09/24/07 The team visited Al Taji IHP and spoke with the Sgt Major at the station regarding supply issues.

09/25/07 The team spoke with Col. [redacted] who provided a copy of a request he had submitted for uniforms, vests and ammo. The team is awaiting translation of the list. Col. [redacted] stated he only has two vehicles that are not in need of repairs. He also said he has five vehicles that just need new batteries and they will be useable. The station is remains undermanned.

09/26/07 The IP were at their posts and were properly equipped. The PTT met with Col. [redacted] to discuss basic station operations. The only significant issue is the lack of fuel for their patrol vehicles and the difficulty he has had trying to obtain fuel. It was suggested that Col. [redacted] work through his IP chain of command to try and rectify this problem. the allotted training time.

09/27/07 The team conducted a 3 hour "Presence Patrol" before returning to Camp Taji.

(BC0097) Latifiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 4) An antenna for the base station that was placed on the roof is believed to have been intentionally knocked down. Repairs will be attempted as time permits. A Joint foot patrol was conducted in an adjoining neighborhood. A class held for 4 IP in weapon retention.

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(BC0101) Mahmoudya District Police HQ: (TRA Level 3) The team met Col. [redacted] to continue discussions regarding new MOI request forms. The Team explained the form and how it would be used to request maintenance supplies and equipment.

(BC0102) Mahmoudya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The Team noted the ECP guards were not armed and were not checking cars they admitted to the parking lot. The Team took corrective action by providing training to the IP in the matter.

(BC0112) New Baghdad Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team was asked by the commander of the 2/69 JSS, located at the New Baghdad LPS, to attend a meeting with Col. [redacted], New Baghdad City Manager and 10 Sheiks representing the local tribes. There were 5 high ranking women from the New Baghdad Area that were present as well, and Col. [redacted] of the IA. This meeting was conducted to discuss security issues in the region and starting a neighborhood watch program. The Team had input into policing, neighborhood watch programs and security issues. This meeting will take place regularly address these issues as well as issues involving local development of construction including roads, electricity, sewer system and schools.

(BC0113) New Baghdad Patrol Police Station (East): (TRA Level 2) The Team arrived on station to find training in progress with Commissioner Muhammad [redacted] and 18 IP. The IPA assisted Commissioner [redacted] with training on Checkpoint operations, personal and vehicle searches and reaction to contact. Topics covered were officer safety at checkpoints, concealment locations in vehicles and on persons, and cover and concealment when in contact with AIF. At approximately 0900 hours, a patrol was targeted with an IED in the area of the Muthana LPS that resulted in damage to a vehicle and 1 LN killed. Shortly after that, a suicide bomber detonated a device in Mahalla 702 that resulted in at least 1 LN killed. The team also spoke with Col. [redacted] about dismantled joint patrols in the area of Restaurant Road due to recent IED and VBIED threats. Colonel [redacted] has proposed that street side parking to Restaurant Road be closed. The team developed a plan to distribute fliers advising the merchants and customers of the no parking areas.

(BC0117) Risalah Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The Station Commander advised that the IP recruits who graduated Tuesday were killed the same day by Al Qaeda in the Risalah area.

(BC0120) Rusafa Police Directorate HQ: (TRA Level 1) The Military PTT Team Leader and one of the IPAs traveled with a squad from the MP Co. to escort the Station Commander and two other IP officers to the IZ to work on their IZ Badge applications. The rest of the team continued the process of issuing IP badges.

(BC0122) Sheikh Saad Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) IPA team member reported for assignment as required; however, the team had already departed. There had been a time change for the mission and communications of this time change to the IPA Team Leader failed to occur.

(BC0125) Yousifiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 4) Training on First aid and pressure points was given. A foot patrol was conducted to escort CAG members into the village. While on patrol, IPAs used interpreter to mentor IP on walking patrol procedures and importance of maintaining 360 awareness. Good community relations with locals were noted while CAG was conducting meetings. CAG was then escorted back to the FOB. There was a joint vehicle patrol this afternoon in Village of Mullahfiyat. No incidents were reported on either patrol.

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(BC0401) Baghdad Taji IHP Station: (TRA Level 2) The team entered IP personnel into the HIIDE system. The team also established a training room for future classes that will accommodate 10 to 20 IP.

(BC0625) Mahmoudiyah Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The Team reported the Station Training Officer was conducting a review of this weeks classes. The team has been receiving misleading staffing numbers and requested the duty officer explain. Although they keep 398 on the books, only 333 are working.

(TD0031) Jedidah Al Shaat Local Police Station: The PTT arrived at the Jedidah Al Shaat LPS for a meeting between the station commander and the PTT CF team leader. Due to the PTT having only one LA, the amount of information obtained by and for PTT was extremely limited. The time restraints were due to a separate meeting which was scheduled to take place at the JSS east. The PTT was able to assess the station force protection. During this assessment the PTT observed all the IP assigned to the TCP and roof areas alert and attentive to their surroundings.

Babylon (MND-CS/S) [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

Al Qadisiyah [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

FOB Echo: The VISTA training program resumed with 18 IPs for the Basic SWAT course: IP priorities due to Ramadan celebrations prohibited having a Combat Life Support class, but Biometrics testing continued. CF visited the class and were encouraged by what they saw. IPAs also attended the PSTA meeting with the Provincial Governor, the Provincial Council Chief, MOI and others that insist that future assessments will depend partly on the FOB training.

Babil [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

FOB Kalsu: PTT conducted training on FOB Kalsu for 147 Iraqi Police Officers that will make up the north Babil Emergency Response Unit.

(No FFID) Tunis Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with Major [redacted] to discuss an outline of what needs to be included in Major [redacted] personnel utilization plan that PTT previously requested he submit in regards to his request for 30 additional IPs. Major [redacted] informed PTT that he had assigned Lieutenant [redacted] as the Station's Training Officer. Major [redacted] said he would express to Lieutenant [redacted] what he desired in a training regimen and then have Lieutenant [redacted] coordinate with the PTT on accomplishing these objectives.

(BB0043) Babil Iskandariyah IHP Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT arrived at the IHP Station and made contact with Capt. [redacted]. The primary focus of the PTT visit this date was updating Captain [redacted] on the status of an IHP IP that was detained and incarcerated as a suspected wanted person by Iraqi authorities at FOB Kalsu. Subsequent to his detainment, conflicting information concerning the IPs identity and that of the wanted person arose. It appears the IP and the suspect are two different individuals. The military component of the PTT arranged to attend a meeting between Captain [redacted] and the FOB Kalsu Commander in an attempt to resolve this issue.

PTT made contact with on duty Shift Commander Captain [redacted]. PTT conducted a hands-on inventory of the Station's ammunition supplies as follow up on replenishment requests and photographed the physical condition of a sampling of the Station's body armor, also as

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follow up on a supply request. PTT also obtained biographical information and training background information concerning several of the Station's officers.

(BB0032) Babil Provincial Police HQ: PTT met with Captain [redacted] who stated that the jail's capacity was 150 and the population was currently 238 male prisoners. This number included 23 female prisoners and 4 children.

Captain [redacted] stated that he had one terrorist that had been accused of killing 300 civilians (specific information regarding identifiers, residency and other items have been deleted from this report). Captain [redacted] stated that he was a leader of one of the Al-Qaida Cells. Captain [redacted] stated that they had arrested another terrorist that had been accused of making IED's, (specific information regarding identifiers, residency and other items have been deleted from this report)admitted to killing nine IPs means unknown to me at this time.

Wasit [redacted]

FOB DELTA: IPAs conducted academy training with the military PTT on Combat Life Saving. This is the fourth class out of four scheduled this week for CLS training by military personnel.

(BW0034) Wasit Checkpoint Headquarters: (TRA Level 2) PTT obtained biography information on the station commander. PTT then traveled to Messan Checkpoint as well as Badrah Checkpoint #1 and provided each with C-wire.

(BW0601) Wasit Police Patrol HQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with the Commander, Colonel [redacted]. After obtaining the needed information, Colonel [redacted] told the IPA that he is happy with the Combat Life Support/First Aid training that his IP's have been receiving from the in service training center. Colonel [redacted] also mentioned that the IP's have been bringing their combat life support bags to work with them as they should. PTT then conveyed to three of the checkpoints that Vehicle Patrol is responsible for and met with the supervisors of each checkpoint and the IP's. PTT observed the IP's search vehicles and at each checkpoint, although they conducted a thorough search, they were not aware of personal safety. PTT then mentored the IP's regarding search techniques.

Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna (PIC) [redacted]

PIC members attended a SSR meeting with Australian Military officials who passed on intelligence information and daily operations to the team. A meeting with Colonel [redacted], the Dhi Qar Provincial Financial Officer, was conducted in Camp Terendak. Discussion revolved around budgetary issues. PIC members assisted the Al Muthanna Logistics Officer in Camp Terendak by issuing office supplies, weapon lockers and refrigerators. PIC members held a meeting with the Babylon Chief of Operations concerning the team's needs and concerns. A meeting with the Australian MITT Team was also conducted to discuss scheduling activities.

Baghdad River Patrol [redacted]

(BC0147) River Police Training Center: (TRA Level 2) The IPA team was present for shift change and formation. The IPs passed on information from one shift to the next. Several students were not able to attend class because of checkpoints in Baghdad blocking their travel. Combat Engineers attended to the site with the erection of the tent for temporary housing of academy students. The tents supplied by the Army were missing parts and entire sections. Mercury construction also visited the station today to begin replacement of the torn sniper screens.

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Tikrit (MND-CW) [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(3)

Diyala [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(3)

(TD0016) Mufrek Local Police Station: (TRA Non Active Station) PTT-D traveled to Mujamma LPS (Mufrek Substation) to conduct training. PTT met with LT [redacted] and SGT [redacted]. 6 IED's were found by IP and turned over to EOD for disposition. 2 IP were wounded in action fighting insurgent forces this week. The station continues to have problems obtaining much needed ammunition and uniforms. There is no fuel for patrol vehicles. PTT conducted training in building entry and search.

PTT-D traveled to Khatoon LPS (Mufrek Substation) and met with CPT [redacted] and LT [redacted]. CPT [redacted] advises that he has 60 IP on duty. The station is having difficulties obtaining much needed supplies from HQ. Training in human rights and ethics was conducted.

(TD0002) Al Abarra Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) PTT-D met with MAJ [redacted] and discussed weekly station goals that were made at the station's staff meeting. Improvements were suggested on force protection for the station and additional sand bags and Hesco walls were delivered.

(No FFID#) Al Durah Local Police Station: (TRA Non Active Station) PTT-D met with LTC [redacted] and discussed force protection improvements for the station. PTT-D then met with several members of the community during a joint foot patrol. The purpose of the joint foot patrol was to help build community policing skills and relations.

Salah Al Din [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(3)

(TA0079) Check PT HQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT conducted a visit to Zero check point and spoke with LT [redacted]. PTT conducted training for 5 IP on vehicle searches with emphasis on officer safety. PTT observed the progress being made on the new station being built beside the current station. The new station is approximately 40% complete.

PTT then traveled to the Wynott check point and spoke with LT [redacted] who advised that this check point is not effective due to the fact that traffic can bypass this location if they desire. PTT observed operations and will recommend changes at a later date.

(TA0080) Salah Al Din PHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with r in the Finance Department, he was asked about the ten percent that was being kept out of monies allocated to districts such as Ad Dujayl for fuel. He was informed that districts felt he was keeping the funds for his personal use. He provided paperwork to show that the ten percent was for fuel and not for him. The fuel monies starting in the month of July were a loan from the Governors accounts, because the IP fuel funds had ran out for the entire Province. The ten percent was interest being taken out of the funding ahead of time on this loan by the Governors accounts.

MAJ [redacted] was asked about funding for the FPS. He said only the FPS that have been providing security for MOI facilities are going to be paid by his accounts. He has not been told if they are going to purchase equipment and other things for this group of men. He is not sure when they will take over all the FPS in the Province.

MAJ [redacted] stated that all SWAT team members had been paid for this month. There was enough money obtained to meet all salaries for this month including hazard pay, martyr and food. He did show a list of money that had been withheld for food payments to people who are on leave, off for injuries, illness and martyr. He said some people say he keeps this

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money to, but this is retained in future salaries. He also provided a list of monies returned from some districts for salaries which had not been used.

SWAT: Pay was issued with around 2/3rds of the force being present. Several names were on the pay roster that the Team was not familiar with. MAJ [redacted] advised that this is a common system error and will be fixed by next month. The Team also noted three persons, who quit during training, show up to receive pay. They were refused as they had not been on duty for the past two and a half months. Their pay will be returned to provincial HQ.

(TA0034) Al Musafi ESU: (TRA Level 3) PTT delivered a new computer to the station and gave a block of instruction on report writing and record keeping. Instruction was also given on computer skills.

(TA0050) As Saniyah DHQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT conducted a block of training on crime scene management to 20 IP.

(TA 0084) Samarra DHQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT assisted while the pay officers handed out the pay to the IP from Samarra HQ, Motor Pool and several other stations. PTT spoke with COL [redacted] about the Samarra jail and who was in charge of it. COL [redacted] stated that the IP have nothing to do with the jail and it is under the control of GEN [redacted]. They do, however, help guard the perimeter at the request of the NP.

PTT found all the old paperwork from the courthouse outside in a pile, PTT asked the contractor stated the Mayor told them to do this so they could fix up the rooms where the papers had been. PTT will plan a meeting with the Mayor about this issue.

(TA0006) Dujayl LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT visited Dujayl LPS to verify personnel and equipment issues for the PSMR.

(TA0028) Muhatta LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with COL [redacted] who reported that there are a total of 27 IP assigned to the station. However, there were only four officers on-duty. COL [redacted] says it is an ongoing challenge to encourage the officers to attend work. This is partly because of the bad relations between the IP and the IA. He said many of the IP fear making the commute to and from work. In an attempt to resolve this all issue, CF is trying to organize a meeting between the IA and IP. The goal is to create a more productive relationship. COL [redacted] was instructed to not issue funds on payday without PTT supervision in an attempt to account for the IP. Despite the tremendous need for personnel and supplies, PTT observed a high level of professionalism and organization.

(TA0071) Hatamiya: (TRA Level 4) LTC [redacted] informed PTT that they were finished distributing the pay and there were no problems. PTT stamped all weapons on station.

(TA 0103) Yethrib: (TRA Level 4) PTT met with Chief [redacted] and LTC [redacted]. PTT discussed their progress on setting up a station level force protection plan. PTT also discussed personnel problems throughout the station concerning shift regulations and the number of personnel on station. PTT observed and helped with pay day for the station and Yethrib District. PTT stamped all IP weapons on station and entered new personnel into the HIDE system.

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Mosul (MND-N)

Ninewah

(NO FFID) FOB Q-West: PTT attended the graduation ceremony for the thirteen IP that had attended the two week course of instruction on advanced topics. No other station visits were conducted due to combined military operations in the AO.

(NO FFID) 5th Emergency Response Battalion: (TRA Level UNK) ERB/ERU PTT traveled to the 5th Emergency Response Battalion (ERB) to conduct training. The training consisted of check point procedures using IP vehicles and at check point stations. Familiarization training was given for the PKC weapon. The students were shown how to disassemble and clean the weapon. It was also shown how to clear the weapon if a malfunction happened.

(MN0004) Baij DHQ: (TRA Level 4) PTT observed a Joint Iraqi Security force operation. Iraqi Army and Iraqi Police conducted a Cordon and Knock operation in Baij.

(MN0027) Al Tahadi: (TRA Level UNK) PTT spoke to LT [redacted] LT [redacted] said there was no new activity, in the AO. LT [redacted] said AIF & ACF activity will increase from October 3rd to October 12th. LT [redacted] said there is a special day during Ramadan, but no-one knows the exact day. Lt [redacted] said the AIF & ACF will try things during this time period, in an attempt to hit on the special day. LT [redacted] said the LPS opened a new checkpoint (AK2). LT [redacted] said IP found an IED inside the house the IP are occupying for checkpoint AK2. LT [redacted] said EOD came to the house and took the IED. PTT conducted a joint mounted patrol to checkpoint AK2 before returning to FOB Sykes.

(MN0056) Ninewah Provincial Headquarters: (TRA Level 2) PTT spoke with PDOP MG [redacted] and discussed a recent personnel issue at Ninewah SWAT. He agreed to the reinstatement of CPT [redacted] as a member of the SWAT team. PTT also discussed the need for him to make a decision regards a convoy to Baghdad to retrieve numerous logistics items awaiting issue to Ninewah IP. It was noted that some of the items were an additional EOD truck; 500,000 rounds of AK ammunition; ballistic vests; Motorola software and extra batteries for the Motorola 360 radios currently in use by Ninewah IP.

PTT discussed the repositioning of IP "sniper/overwatch" static positions in the city. It was noted these positions were utilized at night and by repositioning some of them, at sites where IEDs are planted on a regular basis, then the AIF threat could be reduced or eliminated in those areas.

PTT spoke with NPHQ TOC BG Kareem and discussed the significant events occurring in Ninewah Province during the past 24 hours. BG [redacted] advised that AIF attacked an Al Nasir DHQ checkpoint in the Al Jazear neighborhood with small arms fire. In the Al-Borsa neighborhood an IED detonated against an Al Hadba DHQ patrol and wounded two IP, who required hospitalization. In the Soaq-al-Maa'sh neighborhood AIF shot and killed a pedestrian. An SVBIED detonated at a building under construction in the Al Bath neighborhood resulting in destruction of the building, four deaths and 48 minor to serious injuries of local nationals. AIF engaged 3rd ERB IP near their headquarters with small arms fire and attempted to strike it with a dump-truck SVBIED. The IP thwarted the attempt and recovered and disarmed the SVBIED. An IED was detonated against a 1st ERB patrol in the Al Magrab neighborhood wounding one IP, who required hospitalization. An anti-tank mine IED was discovered and disarmed by IP EOD in the Al Bared neighborhood. An SVBIED was detonated in Baaj against a tribal sheikh's residence resulting in eight deaths and nine minor to serious injuries of local nationals. In the Al Gogahalee neighborhood a VBIED

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detonated resulting in one death and two injuries to local nationals. In the Al Shirgat neighborhood a VBIED detonated resulting in two local nationals being seriously injured.

PTT spoke with LTC [redacted] Boat Unit Commander, who related that he has two operational patrol boats and needed an additional boat repaired. The PDOP was consulted and authorized dispensation of funds to affect the repairs to the engine so that the boat could be returned to a serviceable condition. LTC [redacted] related that he also needed flotation equipment life preservers, "wet suits" for his divers, and body bags for utilization when a dead person is discovered floating in the river. PTT informed LTC [redacted] that his requests would be taken under advisement for future action.

PTT spoke with Logistics officer BG [redacted] and received the current ammunition and weapons count in addition to discussion several supply and logistical issues. SGT [redacted] advised that the jail has eight air conditioners but that only two are currently operational. He remarked that a repair request has been sent to the Logistics officer and that the repair request has been authorized.

PTT then spoke with BG [redacted] Finance officer, who related that he was familiar with the repair request for the air conditioners. He explained that there is a budget shortage for equipment repairs, but that it is being addressed via MOI and that he expects funds to be available for the repairs by this time next week.

At MPSA, Class 24, consisting of 151 students from the Mosul area, graduated. Class 25, comprised of 236 students from Tall Afar and 53 from Mosul continues in the training cycle. MPSA reports 322 students are enrolled in Class 25. (For clarification purposes) PTT uses the number of students (who have reported to NPHQ, as they have been ordered to do, and are then transported to the academy) to reflect the correct number of students assigned to each class. MPSA has been found on occasion to show more students attending each class than there are actual attendees. It has been explained to PTT that MPSA will graduate IP, who have not attended MPSA as favors to area commanders. During a review of Class 24, PTT found eleven IP, who were assigned to the Provincial Governor's security team, but were working and not attending training. The current Police Station Training Officer Course comprised of 21 officers from the Mosul area is in session.

(MN0066) Sinjar DHQ: (TRA Level 3) Sinjar DHQ PTT escorted other CF to Bulaj LPS so they could obtain an assessment of village resources. While there PTT conducted a foot patrol the village with IP.

(MN0076) Tal Afar DHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT visited NDJH ERU which is the site of the Iraqi Police In-service training program. A total of 59 IP and 20 FPS were in attendance. Training is progressing well and the IP training officers are becoming more comfortable with their teaching skills with each class. The station commander LTC [redacted] stated that he is moving the station to a different location in Tal Afar and effective tomorrow, the current site will be used for training purposes only. PTT also visited DHQ and spoke with BG [redacted]. BR [redacted] produced four rockets which were found by and IP patrol in the Al Sarai area of the city. EOD was contacted and will respond to dispose of the ordnance. BG [redacted] stated that security remains very good within the city limits of Tal Afar and CF and IA are continuing to pressure IAF outside of the city limits. LTC [redacted] of investigations was given a packet containing all cases currently needing attention from MTU. Although LTC [redacted] has been given these cases in the past, PTT wanted to ensure that there was no confusion and continue to push Tal Afar investigations in the right direction.

(MN0099) MTU/MCU: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with COL [redacted], commander of MTU. COL advised the PTT that with help of them overseeing investigation reports that more are

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being process by the courts on a timely matter. PTT has been advising MTU on preparing cases for the criminal justice system that will go before Investigative Judges.

(MN0907) Al Sarai LPS: (TRA Level 2) While there PTT held a class to train the trainer on building entry techniques. PTT then conducted a joint foot patrol.

(MN0962) Al Salaam LPS: (TRA Level 2) PTT mission was to conduct a night dismounted patrol with IP from Al Salaam, gather ACF intelligence, obtain PSMR information and complete Detention form. PTT met with LTC [redacted] who stated the LPS will not be relocating as previously planned; it will remain at the same location. Total IP is 159 with five IP officers. Nine radios were sent to DHQ for repairs, and Checkpoint #19, a new checkpoint, will be completed in October. PTT requested to LTC to produce two memorandums that identify the public affairs officer and the Internal affairs officer. He designated himself as the public affairs officer, and designated LT [redacted] as the internal affairs officer. These memorandums will be completed by the next visit, as stated by LTC [redacted]. PTT departed LPS with two IP trucks and ten IP and carried out a dismounted patrol.

At Tamim [redacted]

(TT0024) Qarah Anir Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with the station chief and shift commander. PTT made arrangements to assist the Iraqi Army in delivering food to nearby mosques and provided security. The IA delivered a shipment of food in conjunction with the Ramadan religious observance.

(TT0026) Rahemawa Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with shift commander LTC [redacted]. He had two detainees who were arrested for DUI and being out after curfew. PTT took this time to train the IP Officer and five IP on field sobriety testing.

Irbil [redacted]

(MI0001) Department of Civil Defense: (TRA Level 3) PTT traveled to the Department of Civil Defense to meet Hazardous Devices Personnel and discuss future needs and concerns. PTT met with SGT [redacted] the designated hazardous devices technician. SGT [redacted] presented the equipment that was shipped from Baghdad, still in its original crate. After opening the crate, PTT found some of the items in question, that were said to be missing, were actually never unpacked. (On a prior visit PTT were advised by department personnel that the Civil Defense was missing some important test equipment from the Baghdad shipment. According to the original packing list, there are still a few items unaccounted for. The items are a Metal Detector (hand held), hook and line kit, digital Kodak Camera, and Photographic PPS600 scales. PTT found some of the same concerns over obtaining a Response Vehicle, along with a Disruptor (water cannon). PTT discussed a permanent place to house and store equipment, to keep it ready for deployment. There were also questions about available Specialists on hand. As of this date, there is only one Bomb Technician assigned to this location. At least four are needed for an effective callout. At this time, the Civil Defense Location is "Response Ineffective". This status can be changed quickly and effectively if the resources can be placed into motion. PTT will be working closely with Civil Defense to bring them up to speed on the correctable points of interest.

(MI0042) Kasnazan Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 3) PTT traveled to Kasnazan Patrol Police Station and met with LT [redacted]. Kasnazan Patrol Police Station has received a base radio and handheld Motorola radios. LT Harish and the IP assigned to operate the radio were using the base radio to speak with another station while PTT visited. PTT

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discussed the station location and LT [redacted] informed PTT that the station might move to the building of the mayor's office, and take on new duties dealing with the human rights of women. PTT visited the temporary detention facility and also learned the station is co-located with the Kasnazan Assayish Station. LT [redacted] stated that things are going well at the station and looks forward to further visits from PTT.

(MI0079) Irbil Traffic Police Academy: (TRA Level 3) PTT visited the Irbil Traffic Police Academy today to meet with the newly assigned academy commander, BG [redacted]. PTT advised that they had proposals regarding future training programs that the last academy commander had expressed interest in, and advised PTT would return to speak with the BG later. It was noted that the force protection detail on the facility was rigorously enforcing access to the facility.

(MI0606) Irbil National Crime Lab: (TRA Level 3) PTT traveled to the Irbil National Crime Lab for a scheduled meeting. PTT made contact with LT [redacted] and LT [redacted], who are assigned to the Chemical and Ballistics sections. LT [redacted] confirmed that the Basic Crime Scene Photographers Course had been approved and that three Officers and three Commissioners are scheduled to attend. LT [redacted] also confirmed that the Nikon camera systems had been charged and is ready for the class. It was also confirmed that the memory cards that had been supplied earlier by PTT had been installed. PTT discussed the course outline with LT [redacted] and LT [redacted], which was met with positive feedback. Due to the Ramadan holiday and the nature of the work load at the Crime lab, the course will be conducted over a ten day period for two hours each day. This will allow the Crime Lab Technicians to attend the course and perform their assigned duties. The times and length of the course were agreed upon by MG [redacted] and PTT in order to provide the maximum amount of training time within the duty day. PTT will provide all training materials and will complete a daily class attendance roster. PTT and MG [redacted] will also present certificates upon successful completion of the course.

Sulaymaniyah

(NO FFID) Sulaymaniyah PJCC: (No TRA Level) PTT met with BG [redacted] and discussed PJCC operation. PTT also obtained more information for the PJCC workbook from MAJ [redacted]. MAJ [redacted] also advised PTT that they had received information regarding nine VBIED's that were allegedly in Sulaymaniyah at this time. PTT passed this information onto Team Leader at Camp Tow.

(TS0005) Sulaymaniyah Emergency Police: (TRA Level 2) PTT conducted an overview of the topics which were given to the SWAT TEAM; this includes the mind set of Criminal, Terrorist and Emotionally Disturbed persons. Basic Combat first aid, was also instructed.

(TS0020) Bazyan LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT arrived at Bazyan Local Police Station to conduct classes on investigations. The period of instruction covered Latent and Patent prints.

(TS0610) Barda Qaraman LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT traveled to Barda Qaraman LPS and conducted the final day of training for the Community Policing program. PTT presented the training officer from Barda Qaraman LPS with a compact disc. The compact disc contains the Community Policing Course curriculum and any pictures that were taken during the course.

(TS0610) Barda Qaraman LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT traveled to Barda Qaraman and conducted the new DR with the Station Commander, LTC [redacted]. PTT observed the

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detention areas and no persons were in these areas. The cells were clean and very neat. PTT also conducted class on "Dead Body Evidence" for the Station.

(MD0002) Dahuk Provincial HQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with the PDOP in reference to the computers Dahuk Province is supposed to receive soon. The computers were coming from CPATT to be issued directly to the IP in Dahuk. However, the KMOI in Irbil has picked up Dahuk's property without notifying Dahuk. PTT met with a representative with the KMOI in Irbil to ask why this occurred without notifying anyone. PTT informed the MG of the status of the computers and what the team is planning to rectify this situation.

(MD0007) Mangish LPS: (TRA level 3) PTT, along with the Provincial IP training team, traveled to the Mangish LPS station and met with the station commander. PTT continued with its fourth and final day of training in defensive tactics as part of the force protection plan. PTT instructed nine IP on strikes, weapon retention, weapon takeaways and baton. PTT was also able to identify an IP in the class that will make a good instructor for the district HQ. PTT plans on working on the train the trainer program with this IP.

(MD0009) Sarhildan LPS: (TRA Level 3) The class on Community Policing was concluded at Sarhildan LPS. LT (b)(6) the instructor, reviewed the principles and benefits of the program along with methods of accomplishing these goals. H

(MD0099) Major Crimes Unit: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with both CPT (b)(7)(c) and LT (b)(6), updating them the information involving the suspect in the Tal Afar case. PTT stated all the information on the suspect had been sent to a Mosul Provincial MCU Investigator. Advising once PTT heard back from them, he would pass along any intelligence obtained. CPT (b)(6) then briefed PTT on the in coming cases from the night before.

(RA0002) IP Headquarters PHQ: (TRA level 3) P-PTT checked all guard posts around the Government Center complex. There has been a continuing problem with the IP guards being asleep. The program recently imposed includes the night supervisor calling each post via radio every thirty minutes and the individual posts calling each other every fifteen minutes. Night checks by the P-PTT will continue.

P-PTT attended a Provincial Council meeting in which the Provincial Chief of Police (PCOP) had to report the current status of police within the province. Council members asked questions to the PCOP for five hours. The questions were pertaining to staffing levels and budgetary concerns. P-PTT also met with the Training Section Leader. The group reorganized the individual training files with new documents.

(RA0009) PSF-3 (Tway): (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team provided training for 6 Iraqi Police officers. The training consisted of a mock crime scene. Participants were tasked with gathering information from the scene and writing reports pertaining to the investigation. A Training Officer, fired a few days ago, is now back on duty.

(RA0010) Tameem: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team assisted with pay operations. Several of the Iraqi Police Pay Officers were trained on new methods of accountability for pay.

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Korean Village to begin repairs to a wooden structure which will be utilized to training IP. PTT members then met to coordinate future training for the Iraqi Highway Patrol (IHP) 6 Station.

(RA0080) Al Qaim (Husaybah) District HQ: (TRA level 2) No station visit was conducted. Military members of the Police Transition Team were tasked to hand over fuel tanker trucks to Iraqi Police at Camp Al Qaim.

(RA0081) Hit Dist HQ: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team (PTT) traveled to the Kubaysah Station to deliver items to the Station Chief.

(RA0083) Hadithah District HQ: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) assisted with pay operations. Ten Iraqi Police began their first day of a five day advanced police tactics course at Haditha Dam.

(RA0084) Baghdadi Local Police Station: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team traveled to Baghdadi District Headquarters for pay operations.

(RA0088) Haqlaniyah (K3): (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team was tasked with pay operations at the Haditha District Headquarters.

(RA0090) Haqlaniyah: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team was tasked with pay operations at the Haditha District Headquarters.

(RA0091) Al Ubaydi LPS: (TRA Level 2) Delayed reporting due to limited communications. 26 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) carried out a scheduled visit to Al Qaim District Headquarters to attend the weekly Station Chiefs meeting. The PTT was also tasked to escort Iraqi Police (IP) Officers to the Al Qaim Bank to pick up the monthly IP pay. The bank refused to honor the check because it did not contain a signature of one of the Al Qaim Police officials. It only had the signature of three Provincial personnel. The PTT is working to resolve this issue.

27 September 2007 No station visit was conducted. Military members of the Police Transition Team were tasked with administrative duties at Camp Al Qaim.

(RA0093) Rumana Local Police Station: (TRA level 2) Delayed reporting due to limited communications.

26 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) carried out a scheduled visit to Al Qaim District Headquarters to attend the weekly Station Chiefs meeting. The PTT was also tasked to escort Iraqi Police (IP) Officers to the Al Qaim Bank to pick up the monthly IP pay. The bank refused to honor the check because it did not contain a signature of one of the Al Qaim Police officials. It only had the signature of three Provincial personnel. The PTT is working to resolve this issue.

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(RA0096) Dulab Local Police Station: (TRA level 4) Delayed reporting from an extended visit.

26 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) traveled to Camp Leuken for military logistical issues. Upon returning to Dulab, a site assessment was conducted for the new Dulab Station. Construction continues on the new station. The PTT received information the station will now have a second level. This will push back the estimated completion date.

The PTT met with the Dulab Station Chief to discuss their new patrol schedule. The Chief stated that Iraqi Police (IP) liked the new patrol schedules. IP mentioned be approached by many citizens just to talk.

27 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) traveled to Combat Out Post (COP) Zukaykah to speak with members of the Provincial Security Force (PSF). The visit was to assess the level of support received from the Baghdadi District Headquarters. PSF members stated they are receiving limited support with logistical issues such as fuel and ammunition. PSF members stated they are not being paid but will continue to work to make their community safe. The PTT intends to obtain hiring orders for Zukaykah PSF to become Iraqi Police (IP). It is unknown when this will occur.

(RA0098) Muhammadi Local Police Station: (TRA level 3) Delayed reporting due to limited communications.

26 September 2007 No station visit was conducted. The Police Transition Team was tasked with administrative duties. PTT members met to discuss training schedules and upcoming operations.

27 September 2007 No station visit was conducted. The Police Transition Team was tasked with administrative duties. PTT members met to discuss training schedules and upcoming operations.

(RA0100) T-1 LPS: (TRA Level 3) Military members of the Police Transition Team were tasked to hand over fuel tanker trucks to Iraqi Police (IP) at Camp Al Qaim.

(RA0133) Habbaniyah District HQ: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team provided instruction for the Iraqi Police Development Course at Camp Habbaniyah. Twenty-five Iraqi Police (IP) from Husayba Watch, a sub-station of Khaladiyah, received training on pre-patrol operations, patrol operations, check point procedures. The group carried out practical application exercises in preparation for the final examination. This station does not conduct patrol and is tasked with static security in various locations.

(RA0134) Khaladiyah Police Station (Habbaniyah): (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) assisted with payroll operations. The PTT inspected the detention facility and checked the welfare of detainees; no issues were noted. The PTT reviewed patrol logs and discussed security issues with the Station Chief.

(RA0252) Fallujah JCC: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team provided training for 30 Iraqi Police on crime scene investigation.

(RA0901) West Ramadi: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) inspected the detention facility and checked the welfare of detainees; no issues were noted. The PTT met with the Station Chief to request a list of training that he thought the station needed. He requested crime scene investigation and weapons training. He also stated that his Iraqi Police (IP) were looking more professional as well as searching vehicles and persons better than in the past due to PTT training. The PTT provided training for IP on the Glock pistol.

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(RA0927) Al Faraj: (TRA level 3) PTT member met to discuss upcoming training and station operations.

(RA0930) Samoud: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) assisted with pay operations. The PTT inspected the detention facility and checked the welfare of detainees. Recommendations concerning officer safety were relayed to station leadership following the inspections. The issue of the fuel being stored in the detention room was again brought up by the PTT. When the station receives lumber, which they have requested, they plan to build a room in which to store fuel.

Hammurabi Training Center (Al Asad): International Police Advisors contacted military counterparts at Camp Ripper. The next course, Basic Criminal Investigation, was discussed. The interpreter will look over PowerPoint slides that to determine how long it will take to translate them. The group also reviewed content for the course. An additional meeting is scheduled.

Iraqi Police Professional Leadership Development Course (IPPLDC): The cadre met a Police Transition Team Leader about moving the course date for the Patrol Development Course due to scheduled personnel rotations. The PTT leader also asked the cadre to generate a class for the junior Iraq Police Leadership. The cadre began work on a Leadership Course geared to help lieutenants and Sergeants become better supervisors. The cadre also had correspondence with the Al Hammurabi Training Center cadre in reference to their upcoming Investigations Course.

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
