(TA0079) Check Point HQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT conducted a visit at the Check Point HQ and spoke with LTC [redacted]. PTT reviewed procedures for checking and approving the paper work for semi's hauling fuel and oil. PTT advised LTC [redacted] about the incident(s) involving the IP at North check point telling the fuel truck drivers that they required 10k dinar to process there paper work.

(TA0029) Al Messirah LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT spoke to LT [redacted] Shift Commander, about ongoing issues at the station. Classes were given on suicide bombings and crime scene investigation. PTT and the IP also conducted a joint mounted patrol of Messirah and the area surrounding MSR Tampa.

(TA0050) As Saniyah DHQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT conducted a class on detainee security and first aid. After class, PTT and IP conducted a joint foot patrol.

(TA0064) Bayji DHQ: (TRA Level 3)

21Sep07: PTT was briefed by the outgoing team. PTT monitored an In-Service class conducted by MAJ [redacted], the class was on personal search procedures and was attended by 13 IP. A practical exercise was conducted with each of the attending IP displaying the requisite skills for this training class. PTT later assisted the IP in processing 12 detainees. All the detainees, including 1 former IP LT, were in custody on warrants issued by COL [redacted].

22Sep07: The Training Officer, MAJ [redacted], conducted a class on patrol procedures to 13 IP on duty this morning. Night training was also conducted by CPT [redacted] on the subject of patrol procedures and readiness.

23Sep07: MAJ [redacted] conducted a class on station force protection to 11 IP. There was night training conducted by IP [redacted] on force protection and assignment responsibility. PTT taught a class in police ethics and respect of officers and CF.

24Sep07: MAJ [redacted] gave a class on conducting mounted and dismounted patrols and IP officer respect. Night training was conducted by CPT [redacted] who covered IP weapon accountability and conduct accountability.

25Sep07: MAJ [redacted] conducted a class on patrol readiness and personal safety, which was attended by 14 IP. There was night training conducted by LT [redacted]. The block of instruction was on station force protection and defense measures. There was a patrol response drill conducted in conjunction with the class.

26SEP07: In an IP operation, former IP MAJ [redacted] was detained. An RPK and several IP items were recovered. MAJ [redacted] conducted a block of instruction on IP rank and

respect along with patrol readiness that was attended by 22 IP. Night training consisted of a practical exercise of patrol response and readiness.

27Sep07: MAJ [redacted] conducted a class on police survival. The night training class covered use of force. PTT also gave a block of instruction on community oriented policing and personal conduct. Classes were attended by 15 IP.

(TA0084) Samarra DHQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT observed payroll and learned that the payroll officers have paid 156 IP. Pay distribution should be completed in three to four days.

PTT made a night visit at the River Checkpoint and learned that the IP had come under fire from across the river. The IP had no AK ammo and no PKC ammo after the incident. PTT was able to provide 120 rounds of AK ammo until they were re supplied.

(TA0076) North AD Duluyiah Patrol Station: (TRA Level 4) PTT met with the North Station's Chief, MAJ [redacted], and witnessed payday operations. PTT documented approximately 60 IP being paid. PTT will create a spreadsheet to further track IP pay activities in the future. PTT members also continued IP identification activities including fingerprints, retinal scans and photographs.

(TA060) Tuz District IP Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with COL [redacted] who relayed that his station had commenced with the 50 day IP training program emanating from Tikrit. There were a total of 115 in attendance; 87 of these were IP and the remaining balance was comprised of FPS and Firefighting personnel. The curriculum includes weapons training, discipline, patrol, site and ambush protection, cordon and building searches and raids, persons and vehicle searching and first aid techniques.

A detailed payroll report for this past month, showing all payments and deductions for and from his staff was requested from the COL. The COL stated that he would present that report in the near future. Additionally, he said that all of his 502 active IP had been paid for the month, and that there were a total of 22 absences that occurred in the same period of time.

PTT met with CPT [redacted], Tuz Supply Officer. The CPT stated that they were in great need of equipment, and had not received designated supplies. CPT [redacted] said that 270 of their IP do not have firearms. Additionally, most of the IP had to purchase their own duty belts and make-shift uniforms consisting of non-standard blue long sleeved shirts, non-standard black trousers and black shoes. When asked if CPT [redacted] had sent out any letters of inquiry as to the status of the issuance of their allotted equipment, he said that he had received a letter of denial. He was requested to make copies of the denial letter for PTT.

(MN0004) Baij DHQ: (TRA Level 4) PTT observed an Iraqi Security Forces operation "Cordon and Knock" search for people on a watch list. PTT also visited Al Gazira LPS. The chief was not there, as has been the case for all of the Team's visits. The executive officer was also not present. There were only three IP present at the station, without access to a vehicle. PTT also visited Al Qananiyah LPS and collected station information and provided training on shift briefings to eight IP and one officer.

(MN0020) Hassangoi LPS: (TRA Level 2) PTT spoke to LT [redacted] and SGT [redacted] who reported no significant incidents and that the electricity has been off in Tal Afar since 0800hrs. PTT conducted a joint dismounted patrol in the AQ.

(MN0066) Sinjar DHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with COL [redacted] PTT instructed a class to IP on dismounted foot patrol and weapons handling. PTT conducted a joint foot patrol with IP.

(MN0142) Qadisiyah LPS: (TRA Level 2) The PTT mission this date to execute a night visit to Qadisiyah LPS in order to obtain ACF information, obtain information for the Detention report and to carry out a joint dismounted patrol with IP. PTT met with training officer CPT [redacted] and provided wanted posters. The jail facility was checked for violations and was found suitable for holding prisoners. The prisoners were checked and all appeared in good health. PTT carried out a joint dismounted operation with six IP and one truck. During the joint dismounted patrol, a subject was detained and transferred to the LPS for questioning.

(MN0222) Rabiyah DHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT inspected IPs at the checkpoints and the station chief with flyers and pamphlets. PTT then traveled to Al Salaam and provided the station chief with flyers and pamphlets.

(TT0003) Arafa Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 1) PTT observed the operations conducted by IP, obtained PSMR information and followed up on a VBIED investigation. The investigators have tracked the vehicle used in the VBIED back to a car dealership in Hawijah. The vehicle was a black Hyundai with Kirkuk plates 18433. A follow up investigation in Hawijah is being done by investigators there.

(TT0005) Kirkuk Provincial HQ: (TRA Level UNK) PTT met with MG [redacted] and discussed the Academy issues. MG [redacted] stated that he does not have written authorization for the 1700 trainees, but has verbal approval. The land for the Police Academy will not be transferred from MOD to MOI, and a search for an alternative site is being conducted. There is a good chance the land can be acquired in Schwann. The time frame for acquiring the land and moving the academy is approximately two years.

MG [redacted] discussed the problems concerning COL [redacted]. COL [redacted] has not attended Police Chief's meetings in approximately three months. He also continues to be uncooperative with CF, and refuses to handle internal issues under his command such as cross leveling ammunition and supplies between his stations. MG [redacted] will contact COL [redacted] to address these issues.

MG [redacted] was informed of corruption in the MCU where it is alleged that some officers are releasing detainees in exchange for money and sex. MG [redacted] stated that he is aware of the situation, and will take action once he receives the necessary documentation. PTT will gather available documentation from the MP CO and provide the information to MG [redacted].

PTT met with COL [redacted] at the Police Academy. COL [redacted] stated that the electrical repairs are approximately 70% completed, and the water pump was installed. The generator still has not been purchased, and COL [redacted] will follow up with the Provincial XO during MG [redacted] vacation absence.

(TT0023) Azadi Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 1) PTT met with the station training officer and reviewed training matters. PTT met with investigators and inspected the

detention cell. A detainee was also questioned by the military for intelligence information. The detainee admitted to being involved in a murder as well as setting IEDs in a local market. The investigators had already turned the case over to a judge for review.

(RA0002) IP Headquarters PHQ: (TRA level 3) The Provincial Police Transition Team (P-PTT) issued Iraqi Police (IP) badges. P-PTT provided night vision optics training to 12 IP assigned to the Security Section of Provincial Headquarters. Interpreters have received the new training folders to be translated into Arabic. P-PTT logistics personnel returned from Baghdad today with several trucks of IP supplies.

(RA0007) Al Qaim Local Police Station: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team (PTT) instructed 14 Iraqi Police (IP) and 1 IP Officer on Glock handgun maintenance. The PTT also conducted an inspection of IP handcuffs and found 2 pair that were unserviceable. They were taken to the armory and replaced. The PTT assisted the armory personnel with filling out the proper supply requisition form in order to obtain supplies from Al Qaim District Headquarters. The IP turned the request into the District Headquarters and was instructed to take the request back because there were no supplies at District Headquarters. The PTT follow up on the request.

(RA0010) Tameem: (TRA level 3) No station visit was conducted. Military members of the Police Transition Team (PTT) were assigned to operations not related to the PTT mission. PTT members met to discuss training and upcoming visits.

(RA0025) Al-Huryia: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) met with the Station Chief to discuss issues involving the station. New military members of the PTT were introduced and familiarized with the station operations.

(RA0027) Al Hawz: No station visit was conducted. Military members of the Police Transition Team (PTT) were assigned to operations not related to the PTT mission.

(RA0032) Karmah Station: (TRA level 3) Delayed reporting from an extended visit. 20 September 2007 The Police Transition Team provided training for 10 Iraqi Police on community oriented policing and proper radio procedures; no issues were noted.

21 September 2007 The Police Transition Team provided training for 10 Iraqi Police on domestic violence. The Iraqi Police are transporting detainees to the local magistrate for court appearances.

22 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) met with the Station Chief to discuss current operations. No Iraqi Police were available for training due to mission requirements.

23 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) met with the Station Chief to discuss current operations. No Iraqi Police (IP) were available for training due to mission requirements. The PTT spoke with the Station Chief about selecting an IP to become the Training Officer. IP went to Camp Fallujah to pick up an IP truck that was there for repairs. They were refused entry into Camp Fallujah by Coalition Forces. The truck was not picked up.

24 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) mentored Iraqi Police (IP) in community oriented policing while on their foot patrol. Corrective guidance was provided as necessary.

27 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) inspected the detention facility and checked the welfare of detainees; no issues were noted. Karmah Station received a new vehicle today. The vehicle was issued to the station from Fallujah District Headquarters. The Karmah Police Station has an issue with inadequately installed electrical wires throughout the station; the issue is being addressed by the PTT.

The PTT met with the Acting Station Chief to discuss the issuance of identification cards to the citizens of Karmah. During the conversation, the PTT explained to the Station Chief that the identification cards were being developed in Fallujah and that the issuance of the cards would cost the citizens of Karmah nothing. The PTT monitored IP pay operations.

28 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) observed the Iraqi Police (IP) conduct a morning formation. During the formation, the Station Chief addressed the IP and inspected for proper uniforms and equipment.

The PTT mentored an IP Officer on the importance of proper Detention Facility procedures. The IP Officer was taught how to correctly address the reasons for detainment and the necessity for proper documentation. The PTT provided training for 2 IP on firearms accountability. The course covered the proper paperwork for the issuance of firearms and other armory supplies.

29 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) inspected the detention facility and checked the welfare of detainees; no issues were noted. The PTT provided guidance to Iraqi Police on the proper channels to obtain vehicle maintenance. There are several vehicles that will be routed to the District Headquarters for maintenance.

The Karmah Police Station remains out of communication with the Joint Communications Center. The PTT learned of available base station units at Fallujah District Headquarters and will be sending a request for 2 high frequency radio base stations.

(RA0048) West Ramadi District Headquarters: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) presented a class to the Ramadi Iraqi Police (IP) Senior Officers on the national discipline code. The class was given at the Ramadi Municipal Coordination Center (RMCC).

(RA0052) IHP-6: (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) carried out a full weapons inventory for all IHP-6 and nearby stations. Meetings took place to discuss private contracting for water and fuel delivery. The PTT traveled to Ramadi to pick up new equipment for IHP-6.

(RA0060) Saqlawiyah Station: (TRA level 3) Delayed reporting from an extended visit. 24 September 2007 The scheduled training for this date was canceled by the Station Chief. He stated that he needed to take available Iraqi Police (IP) to Fallujah District Headquarters for their pay.

Police Transition Team (PTT) traveled Camp Fallujah to carry out administrative duties then to Fallujah District Headquarters in an attempt to receive pay for the IP. PTT was unable to receive the IP pay and will attempt again at a later date.

25 September 2007 The Police Transition Team (PTT) traveled to Azergiyah, a sub-station of Saqlawiyah. The Iraqi Police Training Officer conducted a training class for 14 Iraqi Police (IP) from the Azergiyah Station. The training covered patrol procedures and personnel searches. Two detainees were booked into the detention facility during the visit, bringing the total to five. All five detainees were later transferred to Fallujah District Headquarters.

The Police Transition Team (PTT) traveled to Fallujah District Headquarters and obtained the payroll for Saqlawiyah Station. PTT then traveled to Azergiyah Iraqi Police Station and had dinner with the Station Chief and his IP. The Station Chief expressed concerns about receiving equipment for his IP. The PTT assisted the Chief to complete the required paperwork and submit it through the appropriate channels.

26 September 2007 The Azergiyah Training Officer conducted training for 16 Azergiyah Iraqi Police (IP) at the Saqlawiyah Station. The training covered identifying suicide bombers and personnel searches.

PTT has been having problems with the Saqlawiyah Station Chief. He has not been requiring his men to attend training classes and he refuses to utilize the new report forms in place at the Saqlawiyah Station. Saqlawiyah IP have been paid and it was discovered that 2 IP were fined 60,000 Dinar each by the Saqlawiyah Station Chief. PTT recovered the money and paid the IP who were initially fined. Saqlawiyah IP are stating the Station Chief is being transferred back to Fallujah District Headquarters and Saqlawiyah Station will be gaining a new Chief.

(RA0070) Civil Camp Police Station (Habbaniyah): (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team provided training for Iraqi Police (IP) on police administration and proper detention documentation. Daily officer logs are being completed and turned into the Habbaniyah District Headquarters. The station is having difficulties getting support to perform maintenance on their vehicles. IP have been donating money from their pay to maintain the vehicles. The Station Chief has stated he is not getting any support from Ministry of Interior or Provincial.

(RA0071) Coolie Camp Police Station (Habbaniyah): (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) conducted training for 5 Iraqi Police (IP) on proper record keeping and equipment issuance in the arms room. The Station Chief said that his station is not receiving fuel due to Provincial not releasing funds. There were 2 patrols being carried out while the PTT was at the station. One patrol was conducting shift change operations at a check point while the second patrol was operating in the neighborhoods.

(RA0072) Rutbah District Police HQ: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) assisted with payroll operations. The PTT inspected the detention facility and checked the welfare of detainees; no issues were noted.

The PTT convoyed to Forward Operation Base (FOB) Korean Village for scheduled meetings and logistical support. PTT members provided a class in ethics to 3 IHP-6 officers at FOB Korean Village.

(RA0080) Al Qaim (Husaybah) District HQ: (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) met with the Logistics Officer and informed him of a scheduled full District inventory. The inventory will include weapons, ammunition, uniforms, and all issued equipment. The District Logistics Officer submitted a district ammunition expenditure report and assisted with development of a district ammunition supply requisition report for the next 3 months. The PTT also met with the officer in charge of the budget to confirm that he had made corrections to the 2008 District budget by removing the cost for fuel. The corrected budget will be delivered the Provincial Command Staff by the District Chief during an upcoming meeting.

(RA0081) Hit Dist HQ: (TRA level 4) AThe Police Transition Team (PTT) met with the District Chief and assigned Supply Officers. The PTT escorted the Supply Officers to Ramadi in order to pick up equipment.

(RA0083) Hadithah District HQ: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Teams (PTT) participated in an Iraqi Police (IP) patrol through the southern sector of the Haditha District. The PTT provided corrective guidance as necessary through out the patrol; no adverse issues were noted.

The Haditha District has an ongoing issue with radio base stations and portable radios. Each station lacks enough radios to keep constant communication with the IP who are out on patrol. Once they begin patrolling independently of Coalition Forces (CF), it will be critical to maintain constant communication with the IP patrols. This is a major safety factor. A CF communications assessment team is due to arrive at the Haditha District Headquarters to discuss this issue. Issues that will be discussed include the establishment of a centralized communication (dispatch) room that will include a base station and accurate maps of the city. This communication center will allow the IP to know the exact whereabouts of each IP patrol at all times. Another topic that needs to be discussed will be the possible placement of repeaters throughout the city. The intent of this communication assessment is to have successful communications throughout the entire Haditha District, to include Haqlaniyah, Bani Dahir, K-3 and South Dam Village.

(RA0084) Baghdadi Local Police Station: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team was tasked with pay operations at Dulab Station.

(RA0086) Anah District Police HQ: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) met with the Iraqi Police (IP) Shift Leaders in reference to station disciplinary issues. They felt that their disciplinary actions on IP for minor infractions were not being followed up by higher command staff. The Anah Chief only counsels the personnel and the District Chief will not use pay deduction as a form of discipline. PTT members advised that the Chief had the final word on discipline, but discipline had to be consistent for every IP. The PTT plans to meet with the Station and District Chiefs to review and offer assistance with the establishment of a written policy and disciplinary procedures.

(RA0088) Haqlaniyah (K3): (TRA level 4) No station visit was conducted. The Police Transition Team was tasked with operations at the Haditha District Headquarters.

(RA0090) Haqlaniyah: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team was tasked with operations at the Haditha District Headquarters.

(RA0091) Al Ubaydi LPS: (TRA Level 2) The Police Transition Team mentored the Station Chief and Lead Investigative Officer on how to set up and track case files using the newly installed computer.

(RA0093) Rumana Local Police Station: (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team delivered 45 Hesco barriers to improve the new station's force protection. A visit was also conducted at BP Saipan, which is under direct supervision from Rumana LPS. A new generator was installed to improve the living conditions of the assigned Iraqi Police.

(RA0095) Baghdadi DHQ: (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) traveled to Dulab in order to assist with pay operations. After finishing pay operations, the PTT travel to Hit to attend a scheduled meeting.

(RA0100) T-1 LPS: (TRA Level 3) No station visit was conducted. The military members of the Police Transition Team were tasked with administrative duties at Camp Al Qaim.

(RA0104) Al Furat (Zawaya) Local Police Station: (TRA level 3) A station visit was conducted. The Police Transition Team (PTT) inspected emergency equipment at the station. The Station Chief advised the PTT of additional logistical support requests. The PTT instructed the Station Chief on the proper method to request supplies through his chain of command.

(RA0106) Tal Aswad Local Police Station: (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) was tasked to distribute drinking water to the citizens of Tal Aswad. The PTT delivered 12 pallets of water.

(RA0133) Habbaniyah District HQ: (TRA level 4) The focus of this station visit was to ensure that all Iraqi Police (IP) Training Officers understood what was required of them. Questions regarding training and the future "Train the Trainer" Course were answered. The Police Transition Team (PTT) met with the Assistant Station Chief in regards to the training schedule.

The station computer used to maintain cases, IP information, and finance documents is having problems. The PTT is attempting to obtain anti-virus software for the computer. Fuel for the station has not been received. Orders are still waiting to be sent from Provincial, allowing not only this station but other stations in the Habbaniyah District to receive the allotted fuel.

Report forms were discussed with the Investigation Officer to ensure that his section understands the need for completing the documents correctly. Training on the Daily Logs was also conducted with the Assistant Station Chief.

(RA0134) Khaladiyah Police Station (Habbaniyah): (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) escorted Coalition Forces to the Habbaniyah Courthouse in order to observe operations taking place at the courthouse. Due to Ramadan, nobody was present. The PTT continued to Khaladiyah Station. The PTT inspected the detention facility and checked the welfare of detainees; no issues were noted.

(RA0252) Fallujah JCC: (TRA level 4) A station visit was conducted. The Police Transition Team (PTT) provided training for 9 Iraqi Police Officers in crime scene investigations.

(RA0807) Fallujah Local Police: (TRA level 3) This station is co-located with the Fallujah District Headquarters. The International Police Advisor is conducting in-service training for the Fallujah District.

(BC0006) Al Adhamiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team conducted 1 joint foot patrol handing out flyers to eligible men for recruitment. The team is attempting to build the IP's confidence while patrolling the Abuhanifa Mosque neighborhood operated by [redacted]. The [redacted] appears to be unsupportive of the MNF and their mission. The station has several maintenance issues involving vehicles and radio repairs. The MOI is taking up to 18 months to repair a single vehicle. No one appears to know who is responsible for radio repairs. The team will follow up on these problems next visit and will suggest creating a maintenance supervisor position.

(BC0013) Al Dorah Traffic Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The station's logistics personnel requested additional office supplies. The team will provide assistance acquiring the items. The team was notified Warrant Officer Hani was injured by a VBIED in the Al Baya'a District.

(BC0026) Al Karamah Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team met with MAJ [redacted] and had his administrative staff start compiling uniform measurements for their IP. MOI has uniform allotments available for all the IP at this station. The team met with CAPT [redacted] of the Naturalization office. He asked about a station food stipend and requested filing cabinets. The team is currently working on both of these requests. The team conducted training for 8 IP covering Casualty Carries.

(BC0028) Al Karkh Police Directorate HQ: (TRA Level 2) The Team traveled to Karkh Directorate to speak to CPT [redacted] The team also spoke with the Colonel in logistics regarding the 45 recruits with prior military experience.

(BC0042) Al Meshahadah Local Police Station: (TRA Level NA) A meeting was held between Tawfek, CF Landowners and the Team regarding hiring new IP, insurgent activity in the area and establishing police stations and security forces to the west. Also discussed was the issue of taking the existing AWOL IP off the books in the Tarimiyah District, and rehiring those who want to come back to work. He said he would like to see the authorized IP for both stations raised to 250. A tour of the station was conducted to inspect the substandard renovations.

The IP conducted patrols and security details on MSR Tampa during the station visit. The IP were providing security for the electric company while they made repairs. The team noted the IP were properly positioned covering the repairman.

(BC0047) Al Quds Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team met with MAJ [redacted] who reported an IED detonation and another IED located. The IED was brought to the station to wait for Iraqi EOD for disposal. The team was advised a recruitment drive scheduled to start on Monday was canceled by MOI and district headquarters. They said they did not approve the process and the police candidates have not paid the \$500 applicant's fee to become an IP. The team conducted 1 joint mounted patrol with 4 IP and checked an IED site.

(BC0051) Al Rasheed Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team observed all checkpoints on the way to the station and found 2 of the 4 manned. The Station Commander was informed and took corrective measures. The team conducted training covering Ethics. This class was requested by the Commander. CF Communication Techs made repairs to the station's base radio system, which should be operational when electricity is available.

(BC0062) Al Suleikh Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team was advised of a drive by shooting at the fish market. The Team conducted a joint mounted patrol with 4 IP to the incident site and mentored the IP on Crime Scene Investigation. The Team conducted training for 14 IP.

The team was told about a suspicious subject named [redacted] who IP arrested a week ago. The team used the opportunity and conducted training covering Interviewing Techniques with the subject. The station commander assigned COMM [redacted] and LT [redacted] as the station's training officers. LT COL [redacted] would like the training officers to conduct training covering Weapons Safety, Muzzle Control, Officer Survival Tactics and De-escalation in a High Stress Environment.

FOB DELTA: IPAs not on mission attended weekly unit meeting and prepared for upcoming CLS class conducted with military counterparts.

(BW0600) Wasit Internal Affairs Department: (TRA Level 2) PTT arrived to learn this station had been relocated to Provincial Headquarters. The Team traveled to the new location and met with Lieutenant Colonel [redacted]. A biography on the Colonel was completed.

(BW0601) Wasit Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with Commander Colonel [redacted] and the Assistant Commander, [redacted] to discuss training issues and form a joint patrol. IPA discussed the upcoming in service training with Colonel [redacted]. Colonel [redacted] and the IPA will meet with the in service training commander Major [redacted] to insure that Vehicle Patrol's IPs attend the two week course. Colonel [redacted] will pick IPs under his command that will be competent enough to be able to train his other IP's. PTT then patrolled with two IPs in coalition force vehicles. These IP's were able to give information on each neighborhood patrolled and pointed out areas suspected of militia inhabitants.

Discussion further dealt with informant handling, investigative methods, courts, raids/searches, militia investigations, evidence/evidence handling, high intensity crime areas and their investigation.
