(MN0004) Biaj DHQ: (TRA Level 4) PTT visited Bi'aj DHQ to check on operations and observed an Iraqi Police emergency drill. After the drill, PTT met with the Officers and policemen, separately and held debriefings. Suggestions were given and discussions held. PTT inspected the jail and checked on two prisoners. There were not any signs of abuse, but the jail was dirty. PTT took steps to see the jail was cleaned before leaving.

(MN0022) Al Rabeain District DHQ: (TRA Level UNK) PTT met with the Station Commander, COL [redacted], who stated he participated in overnight patrols which were without incident. COL [redacted] stated the investigation of the two IP that were killed on September 30, 2007, was ongoing. COL [redacted] stated that the station has received tips from citizens, which were being investigated. PTT checked the detention area and arms room which appeared to be in order. PTT advised COL [redacted] we will be conducting joint patrols with the IP on one of the next visits. PTT also advised COL [redacted] to work on setting up the meeting with all the station commanders assigned to the district headquarters. COL [redacted] stated a new station commander for Al Yarmook had not been appointed, since the death of MAJ [redacted]. PTT advised COL [redacted] to continue the foot patrols and mounted patrols in the neighborhoods to help foster the public's trust.

(MN0056) Ninewah Provincial Headquarters: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with BG [redacted], OIC TOC, and discussed the significant events occurring in Ninewah Province during the past 24 hours. BG [redacted] advised that IA EOD conducted a controlled blast of an IED in the Al Eslah neighborhood. An Al Nasir DHQ patrol conducted a controlled blast of an IED in the Bab Shamas neighborhood. CF located and killed two AIF and captured one AIF, who had been in the process of implanting IEDs in the Jesser Al Sabonya neighborhood. AIF kidnapped two local national males in the Soq Al Naby neighborhood. An IED was detonated against CF in the Sayden Al Qusore neighborhood. AIF using small arms fire attacked a 2nd ERB TCP in the Hay Alwahda neighborhood and wounded one IP. AIF killed a LT in the IA in the Hay Aljazaer neighborhood. An IED detonated against CF in the Sayden Al Qahera neighborhood. Mortar rounds impacted and detonated in the Wadey Hajar neighborhood wounding a local national civilian. AIF using small arms fire attacked an Abi Tamaam DHQ patrol wounding one IP and killing one IP. Four mortar rounds impacted and detonated within the campus of the MPSA. A 2nd ERB patrol was attacked by AIF using small arms fire. An IED detonated against an Al Baji DHQ patrol wounding one IP. AIF shot and killed an IP LT from Al Kazrag in the 17 Tamooz neighborhood. AIF using small arms fire attacked a 3rd ERB patrol in the Al Tabana neighborhood. AIF shot and killed two IP in the Babjeded neighborhood. Three mortar rounds impacted and detonated in the Hay Al Shohada neighborhood. An IED detonated in the Al Rasheyda market wounding several local nationals. Tall Afar DHQ discovered a weapons cache consisting of IEDs, RPGs, one bomb vest, BKC ammunition, a 60mm mortar round, anti-aircraft ammunition and four pounds of a high explosive.

PTT attended a briefing for LTG [redacted], Director of Operations for the JCS, and briefed him regarding the status of Ninewah IP. PTT spoke with BG [redacted], Logistics Officer, who provided the current ammunition and weapons count. PTT spoke with MAJ [redacted], NPHQ Jail and conducted a daily inspection. Yesterday Major [redacted] expressed a need to move some of the jail population over to the Transportation Jail in order to alleviate the overcrowding problems at the NPHQ Jail. PTT then spoke with COL [redacted], Jail Director

and today PTT noted that sixteen detainees have now been transferred to the Transportation Jail. PTT noted that due to the severe overcrowding at the NPHQ Jail, there is a problem with detainees having sufficient space for sleeping, and there are not enough restroom facilities to maintain sanitary conditions.

The PTT also visited the Major Terrorist Unit (MTU) detention cell and observed that they have 23 adult male detainees along with 13 juveniles. No signs of prisoner abuse were observed. PTT spoke with COL [redacted], Director Transportation Jail, who related that he currently houses 613 detainees at his facility. He also related that he has 37 sentenced prisoners, who need transportation to the Badoush prison.

PTT, PRT and members of INL (US State Department) met with BG [redacted] Training Officer. The subject of the meeting was the training of investigators and the status of the Mosul crime lab. PTT noted that BG [redacted] Crime Lab Director complained of only receiving 200 liters of diesel per month for the generators at the lab. He related that he would be able to conduct more exams if his fuel supply was increased to 400 liters per month for the generators. He agreed to provide PTT with monthly statistics on examinations conducted at the lab.

MPSA Class 25 continues with 236 students from Tall Afar and 53 from Mosul. MPSA reports 322 students in class 25. PTT uses the number of students, who have reported to NPHQ for transportation to MPSA to begin classes at that facility. MPSA has been found on occasion to show more students than there are students. It has been explained to PTT that MPSA will graduate IP on paper, who have not attended. MPSA as favors to area commanders. The Police Station Training Officer Course continues.

(MN0066) Sinjar DHQ: (TRA Level 4) PTT traveled to Sinjar DHQ and met with the station XO, LTC [redacted]. He advised PTT that the station received a list from IA on 03 Oct. 2007. The list was of 113 families living in Sinjar. The IA was seeking assistance in getting the 113 family's to leave Sinjar, because they supposedly only moved to Sinjar in the last two years. All families listed were Arab. Many of the family's on the list included members of IA and IP. Upon further investigation, PTT learned that the order originated from the PDK. PTT forwarded the information through the chain of command. While at Sinjar DHQ, PTT inspected the station armory. The armory was acceptable. Once PTT concluded visit PTT went to COB Nimur.

(MN0099) Major Crimes Unit/Major Terrorist Unit: (TRA Level 2) PTT and a CF SJA attorney met with COL [redacted] Commander of MTU. COL [redacted] confirmed that with the assistance of the PTT and the liaison with the IJ, that his investigators have been able to complete more pending investigations and present them to the IJ for adjudication. COL [redacted] advised PTT that important cases are presented to the IJ within 24 hours.

(MN0140) Tal Afar CP1 LPS: (TRA Level 2) PTT mission was to visit LTC [redacted] at Checkpoint Company LPS and gather ACF intelligence, deliver clipboards for the nine checkpoints, conduct training, and carry out a joint patrol with IP to the station's checkpoints to assess productivity. PTT met with LTC who said that there were no significant reports of ACF activity. PTT delivered nine clipboards for the checkpoints as requested by LTC. He was further requested to mark each clipboard with the name of the checkpoint to insure that the clipboards remain at their designated locations. PTT trained LT [redacted] and LTC [redacted] in entering relevant data and maintaining records. PTT departed the station with four IP, including LTC, utilizing one IP truck, and traveling to checkpoints to conduct assessment productivity. PTT returned to FOB Sykes without incident.

(MN0215) Al Gadeda LPS: (TRA Level UNK) PTT met with the Station Commander, CPT [redacted], who stated no serious incidents have occurred since the last visit his station on October 2, 2007. CPT [redacted] stated he requested another 30 IP since he only received 20 new IP after requesting 40 new IP. CPT [redacted] stated he has again requested PKC ammunition to properly protect the checkpoints and for the station force protection. CPT [redacted] was advised to keep submitting requests and the PTT will check on the status of the requests. CPT [redacted] was advised PTT is continuing to work on a weekly Station Commanders meeting to be held at the Al Rabeain HQ with COL [redacted] about the needs of the station and to be updated on what's occurring in the district. PTT advised CPT [redacted] to appoint a training officer for the station, to assist him with training and training records of the IP. CPT [redacted] advised PTT he is conducting the training and he does not have an IPO to conduct training or be the training officer. PTT strongly advised CPT [redacted] the importance of having a training officer especially since he has received new IP and continues to request new IP. PTT will continue to follow up with CPT [redacted] about appointing a training officer. PTT advised CPT [redacted] that PTT is working on conducting firearms training with the IP in the next month. PTT will continue to work on the logistical issues of obtaining ammunition and scheduling the date and time at the firing range.

(MN0222) Rabiyah DHQ: (TRA Level UNK) PTT departed COP Heider to conduct a station visit at Tal Uwaynat while en route to FOB Sykes. PTT experienced mechanical problems with a vehicle and needed QRF to respond from FOB Sykes. PTT was unable to conduct the station visit due to the need to have the vehicle towed to FOB Sykes. PTT responded to a VBIED scene with the QRF force while traveling to FOB Sykes from the disabled vehicle. The VBIED was a small vehicle and did not cause a crater in the roadway at the market in Tal Afar. The VBIED caused 4 deaths and wounded 30 civilians.

(MN0914) Tal Afar Traffic Circle LPS: (TRA Level 2) PTT traveled to Tal Afar Traffic Circle LPS without incident. PTT conducted a use of force class. PTT then inspected the jail and prisoners. One prisoner was segregated from the others because of being a suspected terrorist. PTT transported the arms room officer to another LPS so that he could observe a properly kept arms room.

(MN0928) Abi Tamaam DHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with assistant district station commander, as well as CPT [redacted]. PTT was told that one IP identified as [redacted] was killed and LT [redacted] was injured. Both were engaged in a fire fight with terrorists this date. On 03 October 2007, two subjects were arrested for planting IED's in the Ninewah woods neighborhood. \$7000.00 American dollars were seized from the subjects and placed in evidence at Abi Tamaam by CPT [redacted]. Both claimed they were part of the Al Mustafa terrorist group. The subjects were identified as [redacted], and [redacted]. Both subjects told CPT [redacted] that the IED'S were being planted to target coalition forces or IA and not the IP. CPT [redacted] is investigating the incident. No evidence was collected from the scene due to all parts of the IED being destroyed during the explosion. Three men were arrested this date for attempting to kidnap a child in the Al Shorta neighborhood. The subjects live in the Al Kadas neighborhood. The three men were on a golf cart in the neighborhood. One Turkish 8 and 1/2 mm handgun was found on one of the men. The weapon was collected as evidence and placed in evidence at the Abi Tamaam station. The subjects were identified as [redacted], [redacted], and [redacted]. Photos of the three arrested are included with this report. Also detained this date was a male identified as [redacted]. The male lives in the Al Kaira neighborhood and was found at Ladies Loop with a mask and failed to identify himself. CPT [redacted] also requested that a report be sent into NPHQ requesting that three additional stations be opened and manned in the Abi Tamaam District to gain control of the Sadaam, and three other neighborhoods that are causing a lot of crime in the

district. CPT [redacted] also stated that The Al Zahor Station should be reopened and additional IP be supplied for all stations.

(TT0004) Aruba Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 1) PTT met with the station chief and shift commanders. PTT learned Kurdish Security Forces are interfering with police patrols and circumventing their authority. On several occasions, it has been reported Asiesh Security Forces have forced their way into and out of fuel points without paying. They also use intimidation on IP if they attempt to challenge their actions. PTT has found evidence BG [redacted] is not supporting the police in other areas when it comes to tracking the Asiesh Security Force's misconduct. PTT is recommending that two NCOs be sent to the next available Station Training Academy

(TT0005) Kirkuk Provincial HQ: (TRA Level UNK) PTT met with BG [redacted] on FOB Warrior. He stated that, since the last meeting, there have been no significant incidents. He has been getting complaints from station commanders because of the inability to spend money. Simple things for the stations are unavailable due to the freeze on spending. Another concern of BG [redacted] is that much of the budget is left. BG [redacted] will be gone for 30 days and will only be back for a short time before he leaves again. This will leave very little time to buy much needed items such as generators for the Police Academy and uniforms before the end of the budget year. If they are not purchased with available funds, BG [redacted] is afraid the next budget will be cut and there will not be sufficient funds for these purchases and the needs of the next fiscal year. Also, during the meeting, BG [redacted] received a call from MOI giving verbal approval for the class of 1700 recruits to start training. He will have them notified immediately, and training should begin within the next ten days.

(TT0008/TT0276) Dibbis District Police HQ/JCC: (TRA Level UNK) PTT traveled to the Dibbis police station and met with the Chief, COL [redacted]. The station had completed the transfer of four IP to other stations and the transfer of four IP into Dibbis. Within the past thirty days, the station has received additional weapons and ammunition. Further, the STO recently returned from a training class at the academy with an electronic search wand and a mirror to search the undercarriage of vehicles. These will be incorporated into the station's training schedule. PTT and IP conducted a foot patrol in the downtown commercial area and made contact with many of the local merchants.

(TT0009) Domies Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 1) PTT met with the Station Chief and Shift Commander. PTT observed guard mount and roll call. The Shift Commander admonished several officers for being late. PTT is preparing to purchase four video cameras on the local economy to enhance station security. The cost of the cameras should not exceed one thousand dollars. The Station Chief also asked for a window to be installed in the North West guard shack to provide better temperature control. PTT was informed by investigations that no other contraband was located at the house, which was searched on 10-01-07, and the PTT is making arrangements to reward those individuals coming forward with similar information.

(TT0022) Meghdad Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT visited Meghdad Station as part of TCP checks. The Officer in charge was informed of a number of IP who took it upon themselves to relocate a TCP without first requesting permission.

(TT0024) Qarah Anir Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with the shift commander, collected PSMR information and checked the detention facility. PTT conducted a block of instruction with nine officers on Standards and Ethics.

(TT0030) Saragaran Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with the Station Chief, COL [redacted], who recounted efforts to arrange a raid to serve several arrest warrants on insurgents who resided in nearby villages. The warrants were issued from information station personnel have been able to obtain recently, both from community members and interviews with detainees. Additional information indicates there may be several weapons caches as well. The chief mentioned many of the same problems expressed before by other station chiefs relating to vehicle repairs and lack of sufficient fuel for effective patrol. Saragaran Station is also responsible for a large land area, and there seems to be a bottleneck at the Meghdad facility with little consideration given to the difficulties of the outlying stations. STO, LT [redacted] returned from the academy after attending a class on search techniques with an electronic sweep wand and an undercarriage mirror. Training in the use of these tools will begin shortly. LT [redacted] received a notice from the academy on the start date for a basic class, and was able to get two IP into the class, who needed to attend. Unfortunately, the ordnance which is buried behind the station has not been removed by EOD.

Irbil [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(NO FFID) Camp Irbil: (TRA Level UNK) PTT traveled outside the city limits of Irbil to secure a location for Hazardous Devices Training. This is to provide a safe and secure training environment for the specialists to retain and maintain skill level. PTT traveled approximately (withheld) outside the city of Irbil to a range used for PSD training and Iraqi UXO demolition. This location was found to have ample cover and remote features for maximum privacy during guarded / classified training ops. This is only one of several steps in the mentoring and training stages of the IPA program that are slated to improve EOD response and render safe tactics. The training team will also attempt to secure tools and "Training Aids" from area vendors and contractors to assist in the training with the area Specialists.

(NO FFID) Irbil Traffic PHQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT reviewed information regarding the efforts made over the last week regarding the three traffic sectors of the Traffic Control plan that were toured.

(NO FFID) Koya Oil Police General Directorate: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with LTC [redacted] at Oil Police General Directorate. PTT discussed the T3 course that was postponed until after Ramadan and the possible dates to consider for the course. PTT also met with LTC [redacted] of the Sulaymaniyah Oil Police General Directorate, LTC [redacted] supervising officer, and discussed the T3 course further. PTT discussed the recent contracts with foreign companies by Kurdistan government and the possible expansion of the Oil Police role. LTC [redacted] explained that one of the refineries would be located near Khabat and that the Oil Police have not yet been given expanded roles or assigned new personnel or stations, but LTC [redacted] and LTC [redacted] expected some changes in the near future. LTC [redacted] assured PTT that PTT would be kept up to date if station changes were made and thanked PTT for the assistance and training PTT offers.

(MI0275) Irbil Provincial JCC: (TRA Level 3) PTT discussed the situation with the radio equipment with the command staff at the PJCC. PJCC advised that the equipment had been delivered to Irbil by a privately contracted company courtesy of the KRG. PTT was advised that an inventory of the equipment was going to take place and would most likely continue into the middle of the coming week. PJCC and communication center staff will notify PTT of any problems, and will meet to discuss distribution and installation plans. PTT once again advised both agencies that the KRG would also be responsible for the installation and costs incurred for any missing pieces. PTT advised that as much information as possible would be gathered about the system, the programming and the installation

process, and passed along to them once the inventory was complete. PTT also advised that a plan for the distribution and placement of the base stations and antennas should become a priority after the inventory.

(MI0606) Irbil National Crime Lab: (TRA Level 3) PTT traveled to the Irbil National Crime Lab for day five of a ten day Forensic Photographers Course. A total of eight Crime Lab personnel attended the course today. The primary subject for today's class was flash photography techniques and their use and relationship in the field of forensics. The curriculum included numerous topics including the use of time exposures, front and rear synch, fill flash and bounce flash. PTT also presented blocks of instruction on the use of direct flash techniques to reduce "red eye" and shadows in identification photographs. PTT conducted a review of the past five days of forensic photography theory and discussed the practical aspect of the course which will start on (date withheld). PTT attended a review with MG [redacted], Irbil National Crime Lab Commander, concerning the previous week of the course. MG [redacted] expressed to PTT that he was pleased with the course and desired to expand it for other officers in the Irbil area. PTT agreed to participate and present the desired courses as requested.

Sulaymaniyah

The Team leader met with PB [redacted] intell officer and noted that the threat level remains the same. IPA remains on lock down. The threat level is expected increase as the end of Ramadan approaches and for the weeks following Ramadan.

Dahuk

(NO FFID) Dahuk PJCC: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with COL [redacted] the Deputy Director. Another PTT member was introduced to COL [redacted] and was given a tour of the facility. The COL advised there were no new activities to report. The COL also provided information of the recent meeting between all security forces in the province which was held this week. PTT plans to attend the next meeting which is usually held (date withheld).

(MD0006) Malta LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT responded to [redacted] LPS to mentor LT [redacted] with his last day of class on Community Policing. Four IP graduated from the class.

(MD0099) Major Crimes Unit: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with MAJ [redacted] to discuss the morning's incoming cases.

Ramadi (MND-W)

(RA0002) IP Headquarters PHQ: (TRA level 3) Provincial Police Transition Team (P-PTT) members met with the Deputy Provincial Chief of Police to discuss continuing problems with the Ministry of the Interior (MOI). The group is making a detailed list of the problems that will be presented to MOI in the near future. P-PTT transferred 1170 AK-47's to the Provincial Logistics Officer. P-PTT provided training for Iraqi Police Training Officers on the AK 47 rifle. The training consisted of assembly, disassembly and tactical use of the weapon. After the initial training, each student had to teach the course to the other students. The students will assist with supervision of the scheduled live-fire training.

Senior Iraqi Border Police Officers met with the Deputy Provincial Chief of Police and P-PTT. This was primarily a social meeting; P-PTT has no relationship with the Border Police.

(RA0005) Amariyah Patrol Police: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) trained 50 Provincial Security Forces personal. The training covered basic policing skills. Classroom training was followed by practical application exercises.

(RA0033) Ashreen Station: (TRA level 4) The PTT mentored IP's regarding diligence and professionalism. This was, in part due, to activities that the PTT has observed over the last week.

(RA0048) West Ramadi District Headquarters: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) provided day 4 of the IP Female Course. The training covered a live fire familiarization of the Glock pistol and AK-47 at the range.

(RA0052) IHP-6: (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) escorted 12 IHP vehicles to West Ramadi in an attempt to obtain fuel. The vehicles have been unable to travel back to their home stations due to fuel problems. The vehicles were unable to fuel as no fuel was available. The PTT continued to the Ramadi Government Center to contact Provincial Leadership in reference to the fuel issue. The PTT is working to resolve the issue.

International Police Advisers (IPA) from FOB Korean Village met with the IHP-6 PTT Leader at FOB Korean Village to coordinate classes for the Iraqi Police Officers of IHP-6. Additional meetings were scheduled to discuss these matters.

(RA0070) Civil Camp Police Station (Habbaniyah): (TRA level:3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) provided training for 20 Iraqi Police (IP) on crime scene investigation, and report writing. Two IP Training Officers were present during the course of instruction. The PTT met with the Station Chief to discuss fuel shortages.

(RA0071) Coolie Camp Police Station (Habbaniyah): (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) provided training for 21 Iraqi Police (IP) on crime scene investigation and report writing. The IP were attentive and participated in discussion. Four IP Training Officers were present during the training for train-the-trainer skill building. The PTT reviewed the station patrol logs.

(RA0072) Rutbah District Police HQ: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) inspected the detention facility and checked the welfare of detainees; no issues were noted. PTT members met to discuss a new Iraqi Police training schedule.

(RA0080) Al Qaim (Husaybah) District HQ: (TRA level 2) Delayed reporting due to limited communications.

03 October 2007 A The Police Transition Team (PTT) attended the weekly Station Chiefs meeting. The PTT introduced new PTT members to the District and Station Chiefs. After the meeting, the PTT traveled to Al Qaim LPS to award the Station Chief with the first Al Qaim District Station of the Month Award. The PTT traveled to various stations and checkpoints in the area to familiarize new members. The PTT traveled to Camp Al Qaim to pick up payroll for the Al Qaim District. The PTT distributed the payroll to the District Finance Officer.

04 October 2007 Military members of the Police Transition Team (PTT) conducted a station visit to introduce new military members. No seats were available for International Police Advisers (IPA). IPA met at Camp Al Qaim to discuss the results of a recent inventory and logistical issues to be addressed during upcoming visit.

(RA0081) Hit Dist HQ: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team (PTT) convoyed to Ramadi in order to pick up pay. The Provincial Police Transition Team (P-PTT) informed the

Hit District PTT that the Hit District Headquarters had not turned in the proper paper work to pick up pay. P-PTT stated the Hit District Headquarters was instructed, last week, that all paper work needed to be turned in or they could not pick up pay. This information was not passed on to the Hit PTT until they arrived at Ramadi to pick up the pay. The PTT returned to the Hit District Headquarters to speak with the District Chief and Administration Officer. PTT told the District Chief that this was not acceptable and the Administration Section should have completed the task in a timely manner and informed to Police Transition Team prior to departure.

(RA0084) Baghdad Local Police Station: (TRA level 4) The Police Transition Team (PTT) was informed by the Iraqi Police (IP) of a possible Improvised Explosive Device (IED) on the road to the west of Camp Lueken. The PTT arrived and observed disturbed earth about a foot from the road. The PTT and IP provided cordon security of the area until the Explosive Ordinance Disposal (EOD) arrived. EOD found no explosive device in the area. PTT members met to discuss developments in the area.

(RA0086) Anah District Police HQ: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) and Iraqi Police (IP) command staff are developing a master roster of IP for the purpose of more accurate tracking and placement of IP. The PTT mentored IP command staff on the proper procedure for preparing a shift schedule.

(RA0089) Barwanah Local Police Station: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) met with area Coalition Forces Commanders to discuss ongoing plans and brief them on the daily operations of the PTT.

(RA0102) Husaybah LPS: (TRA Level 2) The Police Transition Team (PTT) attended the weekly District Chief's meeting at the Al Qaim District Headquarters. PTT members met with Iraqi Police Officers to discuss inventory and budget issues at the station.

(RA0103) Sadah Local Police Station: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) attended the weekly District Chief's meeting at the Al Qaim District Headquarters. PTT members met with Iraqi Police Officers to discuss inventory and budget issues at the station.

(RA0104) Al Furat (Zawaya) Local Police Station: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team traveled to the former District Headquarters building and completed literacy tests for the Provincial Security Forces.

(RA0106) Tal Aswad Local Police Station: (TRA level 2) The Police Transition Team traveled to the former District Headquarters building and completed literacy tests for the Provincial Security Forces.

Training also covered Building Entry, Checkpoint Searches and Handcuffing Techniques. 10 National Police Officers were also trained. The Team delivered 80 liters of fuel for patrol vehicles. Spare parts for one of the JSS's generators were also delivered.

(BC0049) Al Rashad Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) Training was conducted covering person searches. Information was given to the IP about dealing with suspected suicide bombers and uncooperative suspects. Further training was conducted covering building searches.

(BC0051) Al Rasheed Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The Team continued Pay Day monitoring and gathered information for the badge process. All check points were inspected and found to be properly manned. The team inspected the D-cell, checking on the detainees to ensure all were receiving food and water. The team conducted a mounted patrol to the schools in the area to deliver supplies to the children, but discovered the school will not be open for one week since the school had no supplies. Training was conducted with 9 IP. The students were very attentive and did well on the practical exercise. Electrical problems are a major issue as the station only had power for 1 hour during this visit.

(BC0052) Al Rashidia Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team met with Capt. [redacted] the duty officer for the day. The station's vehicles were inspected and the team discovered the station only has 4 operational vehicles. There were 7 IP absent today and 21 AWOL, making it difficult for the station to provide the support to the community that it needs. A class was conducted covering combat first aid by team members.

(BC0061) Al Seilkh (Railway) Local Police Station: (TRA Level UNK) The team met with Capt. [redacted] and the station training officer, Lt. [redacted]. The team observed Capt. [redacted] was actively utilizing the progressive discipline system taught on an earlier station visit. The team updated the station's computers with the new MOI request forms and added more Arabic Power Points for classroom instruction. The training officer requested assistance with a class on evidence collection and processing. He was unfamiliar with some of the information outlined in the course. The team instructed him on the subject matter and then assisted him with conducting training for 5 IP. Lt. [redacted] is now requesting assistance with a firearms course.

(BC0063) Al Saliyah District Police HQ: (TRA Level 2) The Station Commander, Col. [redacted], advised the team the district could use more officers since Al-Juaifer, Al Seilkh Railway and Karadah Mariam are short of personnel. The team addressed a denied request from Al-Juaifer for fuel and repair of broken air conditioners. Col. [redacted] advised no request had been received. He contact with LTC. [redacted] and resolved the issue.

(BC0069) Al Thawra Local Police Station (Baghdad): (TRA Level 1) The team delivered 10 gallons of fuel for the IP patrol vehicles and 10 gallons of fuel for the generator. An inspection of the detention facility revealed no obvious problems. Medication was given to a detainee with pneumonia and he will be monitored closely. LT [redacted] reported he received a death threat on his mobile phone in the form of a text message. The message instructed him to "call his family to say goodbye. Death will come to visit you shortly." The incident is under investigation.

(BC0070) Al Thawra District Police HQ: (TRA Level 2) The team met with LT COL [redacted] who provided a detailed list of needed station and personnel equipment for all stations under his command. He also requested the team's assistance in obtaining needed general office supplies for daily activities.

(BC0073) Al Yarmouk Patrol Police Station (West): (TRA Level 2) The team conducted a joint patrol of the area to familiarize the new military squad with the area. 9 checkpoints were visited with no incidents reported.

(BC0079) Bab al Muadam Patrol Station: (TRA Level 2) The team conducted a joint patrol with 10 IP with no significant incidents.

(BC0080) Bab Al Sheikh District Police HQ: (TRA Level 2) The team met with GEN [redacted] who advised there were no significant incidents since the last visit. GEN [redacted] escorted the team to the armory for an inspection. The armory was in excellent condition. GEN [redacted] requested his IP receive time on the firing range to improve their marksmanship. The team conducted training covering the Custodial Searches of Persons.

(BC0086) Baghdad Main Provincial Police HQ: (TRA Level NA) The team traveled to CMF to meet with Major General [redacted] for an inspection. The General made the decision to go to CMF after the team's inspection on 10-03-07. Accompanying the Major General were his deputies, Brigadier General [redacted], Brigadier General [redacted] and Col. [redacted]. Also present were representatives from the CMF maintenance facility and the CMF Logistic support unit. He came to validate complaints from the team regarding the excessive amount of equipment on hand and a large amount of equipment being exposed to the elements by being stacked outside. The team accompanied him while he viewed every storage room at the facility. The General was critical of the supply rooms and the lack of organization. He ordered the commanders and the section heads to organize their supplies so they can be efficiently stored and distributed. He gave the Logistics Section two days to complete this project. He relieved one of the Logistics commander's of duty. He explained more would be removed if his order was not followed.

When the General entered the ammunition storage room he became furious. He ordered all ammunition, with the exception of a basic supply, be immediately distributed to all IP stations in Baghdad. He commanded Colonel [redacted] to make sure each IP has a basic load and the rest stored at the stations. He ordered every AK-47 and 9MM cleaning kit to be distributed immediately, as well as the rest of the "surplus" equipment.

A female approached the Major General and appeared to be very upset. The General spoke with the female and she told him her son was an IP at CMF and had been killed in action several months ago. Each month she comes to collect his pay and does not receive any. The Finance manager told the General he had been paying her. She showed the General the order to pay her and the documentation showing she had not been paid. He immediately signed an order to pay her, then relieved the Finance manager of command. He warned the other commanders they would meet the same fate if they did not follow his orders.

Major General [redacted] thanked the team for their support and advised if there were any other issues to bring them directly to him.

(BC0095) Jisr Diyala Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) On October 1st the team conducted a joint patrol with 8 IP and stopped 2 vehicles and 2 motorcycles. The driver of the second vehicle had information about insurgent activity in the area, including videos, documents, and photos. His name and information were taken by the military and later given

to Intelligence for follow up. The team conducted training covering vehicle and person searches prior to going out on the joint patrol.

On October 2nd the team met with Colonel [redacted] who reported he is having some problems obtaining the fuel he needs for his station. Colonel [redacted] asked for permission to purchase a tank to store approximately one month's supply of fuel at the station. The military unit is going to look into this. He said he needs more than 157 new IP to effectively run his station and was told authorization for additional IP would have to come from MOI. He also reported the arrest of one of his IP during the previous week by CF for insurgent activity. The team conducted a checkpoint with 8 IP. The patrol searched approximately 20 vehicles with no significant incidents. The team conducted training prior to going on the joint patrol covering vehicle and person searches.

On October 3rd the team conducted training covering Glock maintenance.

(BC0097) Latifiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 4) Training on the AK-47 was conducted in preparation for the upcoming range day.

(BC0100) Mada'in Patrol Police Station (East): (TRA Level 2) The team met with LtCol [redacted] who advised an IP patrol was struck with an IED in Salmon-Pak. The IED resulted in 1 IP KIA and 2 WIA.

(BC0112) New Baghdad Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team attended a meeting with the local sheikhs to discuss security issues and why IP sit in their trucks on the side of the road and do not patrol. Col. [redacted], the liaison for Rusafa HQ, said this way of policing has been ordered by the MOI. The team told him a lot of crime in the area would decrease if the IP got out of their vehicles and performed Community Policing and Patrol Work. Col. [redacted], Col. [redacted], and everyone at the meeting agreed, but must be approved by MOI. The team discussed trying to start a school resource program. The council liked this idea and said it would be another way of deterring some of the crime located near or inside the schools.

(BC0119) Al Rusafa Patrol Station (East): (TRA Level 2) The team escorted 2 IP vehicles and 10 IP for firearms training at FOB Shield range. The IP performed above average at the range in weapons handling, marksmanship, range safety and attentiveness.

(BC0120) Rusafa Police Directorate HQ: (TRA Level 1) The team met with the station commander to discuss enhancements of the station's force protection. New T-walls are scheduled for delivery by the end of next week. The team met with the Logistics OIC and inspected ongoing construction work on a new arms storage room.

(BC0125) Yousifiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 4) The team addressed the issue of IP leaving their post until properly relieved. The team discovered no IP at their posts on this visit. FOB Echo: The VISTA program graduated its 4th Basic SWAT class with eighteen IPs. All IPs received a uniform and equipment. Along with the uniform and equipment, they also received a certificate of completion. Again, the Ukrainians assisted the IPAs with Force Protection and training. The IPAs completed the Biometrics for this group. General [redacted] mentioned today that he has 1400 IPs from the Force Protection Service (FPS) to be trained in the Basic SWAT Course and the training should start right away. The first class will begin on (date withheld) with 30 IPs.

Babil

FOB Kalsu: FOB Kalsu continues to experience an internet outage and is not able to submit or make reports available at time of submission.

(BB0002) Al Balda District Police HQ: PTT met with station commander Lieutenant Colonel [redacted]. PTT verified the positioning of the T-walls that were received last week. Present at the station were representatives from the Information Department. The Information Department is working with Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] on the badging process in the Al Hillah area. The representatives asked PTT if they could provide 31 computers for use on this project. They were advised that these assets would need to come from the Provincial level. The team also discussed upcoming joint patrols and check point assessments.

(BB0032) Babil Provincial Police HQ: (TRA Level 1) PTT discussed the contract issues, specifically electrical, involved in the reconstruction of Camp Charlie. Colonel [redacted] Head of the Engineering Dept., was called in. He said the main contractor was the Sigma Company, and he understood the electrical problems had been solved. Information was presented to the contrary and it was decided a visit to Camp Charlie was warranted. At this point, General [redacted] informed PTT he had been made aware of a document from GOI transferring Camp Charlie, which houses Babil SWAT, Babil ERU and CF Special Forces, to the Babil University. This document was apparently signed by PM [redacted]. Both Captain [redacted] and General [redacted] are extremely concerned about the flagrant back-door manner in which this was done and will take whatever steps are necessary to halt the transfer.

The second involved the transfer of land in north Babil for the future site of ERU. General [redacted] had just spoken with the Mayor of Ishkandariyah who was going to look into the matter. General [redacted] mentioned a local neighborhood leader had been assassinated in his home yesterday evening. Three people were arrested and jailed. Shortly afterwards, General [redacted] received a phone call from the Babil Provincial Governor requesting these three be released, apparently because they belonged to the same political / religious party as the Governor. General [redacted] promptly turned the prisoners over to the CF. At this point, General [redacted] got a phone call informing him the Mayor of Ishkandariyah, to whom he had just talked to, had been killed by an IED on his way to investigate the land transfer previously mentioned. In addition, four others were killed along with several injured. General [redacted] was visibly shaken and the conference came to an end.

PTT also met with Colonel [redacted], the Provincial Logistics Officer. Colonel [redacted] provides supplies and ammunition for all Districts within the Babil Province. Salaam also provides ammunition for training at the Al Hillah Academy, Camp Charlie ERU and Kalsu training sites. [redacted] advised the team that he had been getting his ammunition supply from Coalition Forces. Recently he has been trying to get the ammunition from MOI but has had

problems getting the ammunition he needs. He has submitted numerous memorandums stating what he needs and these requests are continuously being denied. [redacted] gave the name, Major General [redacted] as the Officer who has denied the requests. PTT advised [redacted] to maintain records of memorandums submitted to MOI for requests. He was also advised to maintain records of denied requests, the reason the request was denied and the name of the individual denying the request. He was also asked to provide copies of these to the PTT on the next visit.

Wasit [redacted]

FOB Delta: IPAs not on mission attended and supported CLS training conducted by military, with twenty-one local IP's from Al Kut.

(BW0015) Al Kut Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) PTT members met with Commander Lieutenant Colonel [redacted]. PTT completed Bio-Metrics on Commander and most Officers. PTT also started BIO-Metrics on IPs. The Commander advised that they had 1456 cases in the year 2006, with 159 of those still active. In 2007, up until the present day, they have had 1222 cases, with 347 of those cases still active. Currently, there are ten Investigators which are all Officers. He has completed a written request for two more investigators. Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] advised that written requests are not needed for winter gear, uniforms or clothes. [redacted] said PHQ will supply without request, except that in the past they have not received all needed winter gear. Lieutenant Colonel advised that the winter clothes are made of cheap materials.

(BW0045) Wasit Maintenance Facility: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with the new Commander, Colonel [redacted], and the Assistant Commander, Major [redacted]. Colonel [redacted] was the PHQ Logistics Commander for Wasit Province, but was transferred as the commander of the Vehicle Patrol Station. He was busy being briefed by Major [redacted] on all operations of the station. PTT addressed training issues previously discussed with the former commander. PTT then conducted a joint patrol with IP's.

(BW0612) Wasit EOD Unit: (No TRA Level) PTT and met with Captain [redacted] EOD supervisor. The only issue that he had was need for a better internet data base in order to better organize his work. His journals are well organized, and PTT agrees that being able to put his entry on some sort of data base would well benefit his mission..

(BW0630) Wasit River Patrol: (TRA Level 3) PTT members met with Commander Lieutenant Colonel [redacted]. PTT discussed in detail the previous information received from various shift commanders and compared the two. PTT members found that there were many discrepancies or misinformation passed to PTT via other officers. Future reports will be updated with this new and correct information. PTT discussed Force Protection and boat dock needs. The Commander and staff have been under the assumption that the Coalition Forces were to supply most needs.

(No FFID#) Wasit 1st SRT: (No TRA Level) PTT met with the Deputy Chief, Major [redacted]. The team discussed the ongoing training of Building Searches with [redacted]. PTT conducted on the spot training with two of the IPs regarding personal searches.

(No FFID#) Al Killodi LPS: (No TRA Level) PTT members met with Finance Investigator Captain [redacted] from PHQ, who was working a case at the Killodi Station. PTT also met with several Investigators at the station. Captain [redacted] advised that he was in the final stages of an investigation involving 1000 tons of illegal tea smuggled in from Iran. This tea was evidently hazardous because of toxins from the growing area. 17 arrests had been made and one

Vehicle Check Point Training class was conducted by the DTC and PIC members at Camp Mittica. Twenty four Dhi Qar IPS Officers arrived for the training. Training centered upon handcuffing, Person & Vehicle Searches. Participation from the Iraqi IPS was still lethargic. PIC members attempted to mentor the IPS a second time on the need to participate and learn from training. PIC members followed up with an email to the Dhi Qar PJCC Commander to seek assistance in motivating the new class. There has been no reply from the PJCC Commander. Team members then attended the daily Targeting Meeting in Camp Terendak. PIC members also attended an SSR meeting with Australian Military officials who passed on intelligence information and daily operations to the team. Further, a team meeting was held to discuss upcoming training for the Al Muthanna Senior IPS Officers. PIC members were advised to start planning for goals and objectives for the next Australian Battle Group. PIC members then met with the Romanian and Australian Military counterparts to discuss upcoming training for the Al Muthanna Province.

Baghdad River Patrol

(b)(6), (b)(3)

(BC0147) River Police Training Center: (TRA Level 2) IPA's noted the station's force protection was in place and properly equipped. Station housekeeping was conducted and the entire area was policed. There was no power at the station upon arrival. The power came on at 1000 hours, went off again at 1030 hours, and came back on at 1130 hours. IPAs spoke with Lt. [redacted] about the IP's wearing proper uniform while at the station. The Navy conducted a class on boat maintenance and keeping a log for all maintenance. Some of the IP's were working in the armory. IPAs introduced a weekly schedule for the force protection and the boat crew, which was translated into Arabic and presented to Lt. [redacted]. A roster was completed concerning IP force protection, boat crews, and mechanics that are stationed at River Patrol. There is a total of 70 IP's, with 37 still in need of IZ badges.

(TD0024) Diyala Provincial Police HQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT-P traveled to IPS HQ and met with MG [redacted], Diyala PDoP, to discuss several administrative and operational issues.

(TD0002) Al Abarra Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) PTT-D met with LT [redacted] and discussed attacks that occurred on Hadd and Miksir check points. These checkpoints fall under the control of the Al Abarra station. PTT-D conducted training on pre-patrol operations and preparation with seven IP and one officer. A joint dismounted patrol was conducted after the training.

(TD0109) Al Hawaidir Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT-D traveled to Al Hawaidir IP station and spoke with LT [redacted]. PTT-D conducted a joint foot patrol with several IP.

(TD0046) Zaganiya Local Police Station: (TRA Non Active Station) PTT-D met with SGM [redacted] the NCO in charge for night shift. The majority of the meeting was used to determine how many IP were on duty at the station and at the check points during the evening hours. Ali had no knowledge of how many IP were manning their check points or providing force protection during the evening shifts. Training on accountability and personnel management was given to Ali.

(TA0002) Abe Dalaf LPS (TRA Level 4) PTT visited Abe Dalaf to gain information on the old Police station. PTT concluded that the building is not acceptable for any occupants. The station was attacked several months ago by insurgents and the building was destroyed by a VBIED. Photographs were taken of the station for administrative purposes. Since the attack on the Abe Dalaf station, the LPS have been co-located with the Ad Dawr LPS in Ad Dawr. Upon talking to several local citizens in the area, PTT discovered that the Abe Dalaf IP do not conduct patrols in this area. According to some of these citizens, the IP have not been in the area since the VBIED attack. This issue will be brought to the attention of the District Chief. PTT conducted a meet and greet with numerous adults and children of the local area.

(TA0037) Al Owja LPS: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with LT [redacted] who informed PTT that the station's last running vehicle had broken down during the day leaving the IP to use personal vehicles to patrol the village. When asked whether or not these civilian vehicle patrols officers wore their uniforms, the LT stated that sometimes the officers wore civilian clothing as well. PTT advised of the dangers involved with a car full of armed personnel in plain-clothes attire. PTT then reviewed station reaction to attack procedures and observed the IP take their fighting positions for station defense.

(TA0049) Ar Rubaydhah LPS (TRA Level 3): The purpose of this visit was for the new CF Members of PTT to see where the Al-Alam substations were and to meet the staff. CPT. [redacted] advised that this station covers a 30 kilometer square area and serves approx. 12000 residents. The station has 2 vehicles and is the most northern station in the Al-Alam District. PTT advised this station that they are attempting to get a team that will visit this station on a regular basis.

(TA0080) Salah Al Din PHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with MG [redacted] of the Salah Ad Din Training Division. He advised that Samarra had not sent in a request for 400 men to be hired or vetted. They had sent in a list of 150 names of which anyone who was not from Samarra was deleted from the list. He said the reason was that many men will apply through Samarra, but when it comes to being assigned there after they are sent to the Academy they refuse to work there. This is why they cut anyone not from there. Only 36 persons were submitted to TIPS for vetting. The committee has approved all 36. He does not know when they will be sent to the Academy.

PTT met with MAJ [redacted] of the Communications Department. He was provided with telephone testing equipment which was donated from the states. He is having trouble programming the Barrett radios. He was advised [redacted] needs portable radio batteries and he asked that [redacted] contact him to see if he has the type they need and he will help them.

PTT met with COL [redacted] of the ERU unit. Most of his men were out on an operation. He requested more c-wire, Hesco's and sandbags for force protection of PHQ. PTT advised they would try to help him with this issue. The additional building space for the unit is progressing well and should be completed in about a month.

(TA 0601) Tikrit Main LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT spoke with LTC [redacted] and inspected the arms room and detention facility. PTT interviewed an inmate that provided information on the sniper that shot and wounded a CF soldier at the Cotacia LPS.

(TA0602) Al Samra LPS (TRA Level 3): PTT traveled to the Samra station and spoke with LTC [redacted]. The purpose of this visit was for the new CF Members of PTT to see where the Al-Alam substations were and to meet the staff.

(TA None) Zamere LPS (TRA Level 3): PTT traveled to the Zamere station and spoke with Station Chief, LTC [redacted]. The purpose of this visit was for the new CF Members of PTT to see where the Al-Alam substations were and to meet the staff. This station was established within the last 6 months at the request of the local village residents. This station has only one small building with three small rooms. This station's force protection consists of a dirt berm surrounding the station and a few dirt mounds in the drive way of the station. This station covers a 5 kilometer area that lies in between Rubaydhah and Samra. This station has 2 vehicles and serves approx. 2500 residents.

(TA0029) Al Messirah LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with Station Commander LTC [redacted]. PTT discussed force protection issues with the LTC. The LTC advised that a class on patrol movements and tactics was planned for (date withheld).

(TA0034) Al Musafi ESU: (TRA Level 3) PTT conducted range training for the Musafi ESU unit on the FOB. Instruction was on SWAT team movements and combat operations.

(TA0050) As Sanyiah DHQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT gave a block of instruction on patrol movements and tactics. PTT also monitored a foot patrol by on duty personnel.

(TA0074) Al Makahul LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with the Station Chief and delivered supplies to the station. PTT discussed force protection issues with the Station Commander, including equipment accountability.

(TA0077) HWY North LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT delivered supplies to the station and conducted a class on firearms safety and accountability. PTT inspected the patrol vehicles issued to the station and found them to be in good condition.

(TA0006) Ad Dujayl ERU: (TRA Level 3) PTT continued the process of verifying ERU personnel by photograph and listing of names by shift. PTT visited the AD Dujayl District JCC and met with COL [redacted] to discuss a series of issues including the need for better logistics, needed improvements to the physical plant and streamlined procedures in the operations center. PTT performed an assessment for improved force protection measures and will arrange to have a CF engineer come to the facility to conduct one as well.

(TA0042) Al Salam LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT reviewed budgetary information to assist in determining the total expense and balance for the monthly budget we are also attempting to reconcile the number of IP working against the number paid.

(TA 0103) Yethrib LPS: (TRA Level 4) PTT met with MAJ [redacted] and discussed the exceptionally large number of transfers between the DHQ and the LPS.

(TA0048) AMERILI DPS: (TRA Level 4) PTT convoyed to Amerili DPS and met with the station XO, MAJ [redacted], and his staff. The station's emergency plans were discussed and modifications were recommended by PTT. There were 156 IP on duty with 67 of them in training today. When asked what the subject matter of the day had been, it was reported that the IP were being taught drill formations and marching. PTT advised that there needs to be more emphasis and priority on basic police training as opposed to drilling and marching procedures. They advised they were following the curriculum that Tikrit had issued them. Admin Officer, LT [redacted], complained that they have no ammunition or targets to train the IP. He was directed to write up the issue and submit it to Tikrit.
