(BC0001) Abu Ghraib District Police HQ: (TRA Level 4) The team met with LT [redacted] from the Abu Ghraib LPS concerning training issues for the new IP. The team visited the detention cell and found no irregularities.

(BC0002) Abu Ghraib Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team met with 2LT [redacted], one of the station training officers and discussed training. The LT expressed to the team he is eager to work on training projects, especially for the new IP coming from the Camp India graduating class.

(BC0010) Al Bayaa Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team inspected the detention cell with no irregularities found. A meeting was conducted with Maj. [redacted] who said the LPS has a shortage of officers. The station has been approved for 20 officers but only have 6. He said the generator for the station is not running and there has been no electricity for 4 days. A contractor is scheduled to visit the station for an estimate for repairs. A request for the funds will be submitted. The team asked Maj. [redacted] to provide a copy of the request when completed.

(BC0017) Al Hurrya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team asked Capt. [redacted] for information about obtaining more IP for the station. He said the Commander should soon find out whether or not they would be receiving any more IP. The team will follow up on this matter.

(BC0018) Al Jazaaer Local Police Station: (TRA Level 1) The team conducted a joint mounted patrol with 5 IP. During the patrol, a foot patrol was performed in one of the neighboring residential areas with no significant incidents.

(BC0038) Al Khansa Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) On October 1st the team conducted training for the Force Protection IP covering person searches using the Wand Metal Detector. The IP were also shown the proper way to provide cover while the other guard conducts person searches.

On October 2nd an inspection of the force protection at the front guard post was conducted. The IP were provided with training covering person searches using the Wand Metal Detector. Training was also conducted covering room clearing and weapon maintenance for Glock.

On October 3rd, the team conducted training for the QRF on room clearing and weapons maintenance for the Glock 19.

On October 4th, the team conducted training for 5 IP covering maintaining crowd control. At approximately 0815hrs, an IED was detonated approximately 30-50 meters south of the front gate to the station. Members of the QRF responded to the area along with additional IP. There were no civilian or military injuries.

(BC0042) Al Meshahadah Local Police Station: (TRA Level NA) The team conducted an arms room inventory with no issues found. The team was alerted that a LN had been struck by an IED and was wounded. The LN was brought to the front gate where CF could treat his

wounds. The team conducted training covering basic marksmanship with Lt. [redacted] conducting the class. The team also received a tip regarding a weapons cache in a town north of the station. The team conducted a joint patrol by responding to the area and conducting a search. No cache was found. The team then responded to an area near Rt. Tampa where the unit has previously taken fire and had been struck by IEDs and rockets. The IP and team conducted a foot patrol through the area and located 2 rockets, one IRL and command wire. The IP assisted in scene security until EOD responded and destroyed the items in place.

(BC0052) Al Rashidia Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team met with Major [redacted] and turned over 1 detainee from CFS at Camp Taji. Prior to placing him, an inspection of the detention cell was conducted by the team. Several safety violations were found and corrected. Team members conducted training for the IP covering the proper way to secure a detention area.

(BC0073) Al Yarmouk Patrol Police Station (West): (TRA Level 2) The acting Deputy Commander asked for assistance with a patrol to help confirm an incident at check-point K-16. Initial reports indicated a shooting incident between the IP and the IA. Upon arrival, the team was informed 11 IP in a van from the Al Dora District, dressed in civilian clothes, attempted to pass through the check-point. 4 of the IP in the van were seriously injured and 3 had minor injuries. It appeared the IP were trying to deliver the injured to the hospital. When the IP were refused entry by the IA, they flashed their badges and weapons. The IA fired a burst of rounds into the air. The IA confiscated 6 AK's, 4 BKC's and 4 Glocks from the IP. The IP made it to the hospital and 1 was arrested by the IA. The team spoke with the IA commander and Col [redacted] at the scene and provided mediation to calm the situation.

(BC0079) Bab al Muadam Patrol Station: (TRA Level 2) The team conducted training for 2 IPO and 10 IP covering pre-patrol briefings. The team conducted a joint mounted patrol, 1 dismounted patrol and 1 hasty checkpoint. During the checkpoint, the team conducted training covering Vehicle Searches.

(BC0081) Bab al Sheikh Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team conducted a mounted patrol and a foot patrol with the IP focusing on Community Policing. The team conducted an inventory of the station's armory with satisfactory results.

(BC0089) Belat al Shuhadaa Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team learned several IP and officers are being given transfers to other stations and they are not being replaced. It is reported they can pay to receive the transfers they want. The team also learned the Station Commander has requested a transfer to the MOI and has been approved. The team noted the AWOL rate is very high. The IP said this is due to the area being unsafe. The station currently has no power due to lack of fuel. It was noted the station shows 32 vehicles on their records, but only 5 are accounted for. The team will continue to work on these issues.

(BC0097) Latifiya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 4) The team conducted training covering the AK-47, including reloading drills, immediate action and remedial action drills with good participation by IP.

(BC0098) Mada'in District Police HQ: (TRA Level 3) On October 1st the team made contact with General [redacted] and discussed the possibility of having a SRO program so local citizens will not be afraid to enroll their children into the local schools.

On October 2nd the team met with General [redacted] administrative staff to ensure the proper AWOL information had been forwarded to their office by Major Razaq. The General said there would soon be a recruitment drive for the district.

On October 3rd the team met with General [redacted] in reference to the lack of man power for force protection. He was told the issue has been addressed several times with Major [redacted] and has been told several different reasons for the lack of man power.

(BC0099) Al Mada'in Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) On October 1st the detention facility was inspected with no irregularities found. The team conducted training for covering the proper paper work needed for transferring detainees from the IP to the NP.

On October 4th the team met with Major [redacted] and discussed the need to get his man power issue under control. The team informed him they observed the pay day process and the pay roster. The number of employees did not match the number of people available for the 2 shifts. Major [redacted] said he would be transferred soon to another department and was unsure who would be taking his position.

(BC0102) Mahmoudya Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team finished pay operations and facilitated the cleaning of the Detention cell.

(BC0112) New Baghdad Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) The team conducted training for 4 IP covering Person Searches, Vehicle Searches, Weapons Safety and Officer Safety. A joint patrol was conducted with 4 IP through nearby neighborhoods. The mounted patrol conducted vehicle stops and searches with nothing significant to report.

(BC0119) Al Rusafa Patrol Station (East): (TRA Level 2) BGEN [redacted] of MOI Internal Affairs arrived to investigate the recent detainment of 3 IP patrols from Al Rusafa PPS by the National Police. He also advised JSS personnel (U.S. Military) are verbally abusing his IP, which is causing some animosity.

(BC0120) Rusafa Police Directorate HQ: (TRA Level 1) The team delivered 137 IP uniform shirts, one 25 meter by 25 meter sun screen, 2 monitors and two computers.

(BC0122) Sheikh Saad Local Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The team met with Capt. [redacted] and reported there were no IP at the check-point set up at the gate to the village. The team checked the area and found 2 patrol vehicles roaming the streets inside the village. This is a major security violation discussed several times in the past. Actions were taken by Capt. [redacted] to correct the problem. The team conducted a joint patrol, setting up check-points at Antesar with the IP and again found no IP at the village gate. Both vehicles were located in different parts of town. The IP badges were confiscated and the team returned to the station to meet with Capt. [redacted] who was directed to inform Lt. Col. [redacted] of these incidents.

(BC0625) Mahmoudiyah Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 3) The IP Training Officer conducted training covering the material covered on the previous visit. The team then conducted a joint patrol.

FOB Echo: The IPAs will receive 34 IPAs for the Basic SWAT course and 15 IPAs for the next Combat Life Support class. The Ukrainians will assist the IPA's in the preparation and scheduling of the new group. This makes the 5th group of SWAT to be trained since the VISTA program started.

FOB Kalsu: FOB Kalsu continues to have internet issues and is not able to send reports at this time.

FOB REO: The team conducted an inspection of the Regional Training Center's Firing Range. The team checked on the progress of the ongoing renovation and inspected the front entrance to the Training Center. The Center will have a new class scheduled to arrive on the (date withheld). The team was restricted in the visit time due to the convoy being tasked with prisoner escort duty.

Wasit [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(3)

(BW0034) Wasit Checkpoint Headquarters: (TRA Level 2) PTT team met with Colonel [redacted] and Lieutenant Colonel [redacted]. This was the first visit to this site. Colonel [redacted] showed the team the location of the five checkpoints he is currently operating. The team advised that each checkpoint would be visited and inspected. Also discussed was the Colonel's intention of relocating two of his checkpoints to areas that would be more effective in managing traffic flow. Colonel [redacted] said he was more than willing to work with the team and would implement whatever suggestions that were offered. He said four of his checkpoints were supervised by Lieutenant Colonels and the other was supervised by a Major. He advised that he would have each checkpoint supervisor meet with the team to discuss whatever issues they might have. The Team also conducted a security and force protection inspection of the station.

(BW0054) Wasit Provincial Headquarters: (TRA Level 2) The team met with General [redacted] and his aide, Captain [redacted]. The team inspected the facility, checking the Communication's Center, the Operations Center and the Armory. General [redacted] then sat in with the team while Captain [redacted] gave a power-point presentation showing the different areas of Al Kut and how they are divided into areas of responsibility. After viewing the presentation, the team expressed concern over (specific deficiencies withheld). The team told General [redacted] that they had already talked with Colonel [redacted] regarding the two checkpoints in question and that he was willing to work with the team on the matter. As for security on the river, General [redacted] said their River Patrol Unit was currently being evaluated to see if it could become a viable resource.

(No FFID#) Wasit 1st SRT: (No TRA Level) The team met with Major [redacted] who stated there have not been any incidents since the last visit. He also said the day and night patrols were taxing on his men during Ramadan, so they will only be running night patrols.

Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna (PIC) [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(3)

PIC members attended a SSR meeting with Australian Military officials who passed on intelligence information and daily operations to the team. A meeting was then held to discuss upcoming training for the Al Muthanna Senior IPS Officers at Camp Mittica. Six months of training for the Al Muthanna and Dhi Qar IPS was discussed in length. PIC members will meet with Provincial PDoPs and PJCC Commander's to seek approval for implementation of the plan.

Team members and the Australian Military met with the Dhi Qar.PJCC Commander in a key leadership engagement meeting to discuss training, operations and vehicle check points in Camp Terendak. The PIC Team and the Australian DTC members conducted training in weapon handling and range qualification for the Dhi Qar IPS at Camp Mittica. Training will continue for the next three days. PIC members have trained two classes and the last class will be trained this week.

Baghdad River Patrol

(BC0147) River Police Training Center: (TRA Level 2) The IP from the Armory conducted a class on familiarization of the PKC; force protection personnel attended the class. The class was mentored by IPAs. IPAs conducted a class on Lockdown drills with force protection and the boat crew. Mercury Contractor was called in to check electrical issues. IPAs completed boat station markings.

River Patrol: IPAs received supplies for the River Station. The equipment was inventoried and consisted of two laptop computers, six desk top computers, six flat screen monitors, two printer scanner, two battery backup surge protector units, two routers and four APC units. These items will be turned over to the River Station and to the Head Quarters across the river.

(TD0032) Kanan Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT-D spoke with CPT [redacted] and conducted weapons training with 5 IP.

(TD0046) Zaganiya Local Police Station: (TRA Non Active Station) PTT-D conducted a night time visit to the station. Minutes after arrival, the checkpoint outside the station came under fire. The fire fight lasted approximately 15 minutes and no injuries were reported. PTT-D spoke with SGM [redacted] to discuss the importance of ensuring the IP are ready in the event another attack. PTT-D also interviewed a recent detainee who had information on many of the terrorists working in the area. In total, 12 names were recorded as well as other information. PTT-D will continue to monitor this and continue to investigate.

(TD0052) Baqubah Twin Bridges Checkpoint HQ: (TRA Non Active Station) PTT-D conducted a station visit to Twin Bridges IP station and met with CPT [redacted]. The CPT stated that he had 28 IP on duty with 19 IP at the two check points. Training was conducted using 9 IP on Station Force Protection Drills. CPT [redacted] and the IP knew their position's at the station and pointed out what they thought were weak points with there current force protection. PTT-D provided 100 sand bags. The station needs more concertina wire, sand bags and Hescos to add to their force protection.

(TD0104) Diyala Provincial QRF (Neshda): (TRA Level 3) PTT-D met with LTC [redacted] who reported two new check points with 30 IP assigned from the Twin Bridges station. He also stated that those 30 IP will be reassigned to QRF. LTC [redacted] stated he would have the total number of IP assigned to QRF on the next station visit. No training was conducted due to the holiday Ramadan.

(TD0109) Al Hawaidir Local Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT-D met with LT [redacted] and gathered numbers for the PSMR.

(TD0110) Diyala ERF 2: (TRA Level 3) PTT-D met with COL [redacted] and conducted a station assessment which included observing force protection. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(No FFID#) Al Durah Local Police Station: (TRA Non Active Station) PTT-D conducted a night time visit to the station and spoke with LTC [redacted]. PTT-D attempted to gather PSMR numbers. However, the information was in a locked cabinet and the LTC was unable to unlock the door. He advised he would have the needed information on the next visit. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(TD0018) Balad Ruz District Police HQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT-D traveled to Balad Ruz DHQ to assess the recent force protection change in Bazania. PTT noted that checkpoints had been decommissioned. PTT-D ordered that the checkpoints be replaced and no changes were to be made in the future without higher approval. PTT-D then gathered a patrol of ten IP and proceeded to Bazania to conduct a foot patrol. The IP were instructed on the importance of community policing and building rapport with the citizens.

Scorpion Academy: PTT trained 35 IP on weapons maintenance and checkpoint set-up and operations.

Salah Al Din [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(TA0079) Check Point HQ (TRA Level 2) PTT met with LTC [redacted] who stated that this station is still having problems receiving basic logistical support. PTT advised of the request procedure and encouraged the IP to follow the system that is in place by making all requests in writing and providing a copy for PTT. PTT conducted an arms room inspection and inventory. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(TA0100) Tikrit Emergency Patrol: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with LTC [redacted]. He stated that he had 23 IP working today and 12 of the IP were notified by GEN [redacted] this morning to report to Owja for raids that were being conducted. LTC [redacted] also stated that he has 20 IP in the TIPS Academy that should graduate soon. PTT provided advise on logistical supply requests. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(TA0033) Mujamma LPS: (TRA Level 4) PTT delivered several rolls of C-wire, 20 4x4 HESCO barriers and 250 sandbags. PTT then met with LTC [redacted] and discussed several areas including the visual representation of the IP. PTT advised him to implement a Patrol schedule and get the IP out into the community. The Team also discussed logistical issues including the lack of supplied fuel. The Team received the completed BIOs and inspected the detention facility. The PTT medic noted no medical problems

FOB Summerall: All PTT missions were by CF on this date.

(TA0006) Ad Dujayl District JCC: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with MAJ [redacted] regarding accountability of all ERF personnel. He was advised that, effective immediately, a photograph and positive identification is now required in order for all ERF officers to be paid. MAJ [redacted] understands the need for such measures and will cooperate. Once there is an official roster in place and all "ghost" personnel are removed, measures to ensure daily attendance will be implemented. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(TA0042) Al Salam LPS: (TRA Level 3) PTT conducted training with the station IP on check point coordination and control. The IP leadership has also taken a strong position to support the developing skill sets by direct participation and giving direction to their IP.

(TA0056) Balad District HQ: (TRA Level 3) PTT met with COL [redacted] and COL [redacted]. An inspection of the jail was made and it was noted that 31 detainees were in good health and were clean. Twenty of the detainees need to go to the court in Tikrit.

(TA0605) Tuz IP Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with COL [redacted] who relayed that he had received more negative propaganda that was being disseminated to the public from detractors. The reasoning for the recent change of status of the Sulayman Bak and Amerili Police Stations to independent Departments was discussed. The general conclusion was that it was a political issue and decision. COL [redacted] also stated that 93 IP from his department are delegated to provide security at and for various government staff and facilities; such as the Courthouse, Water works, Electrical station and the Municipal council.

(NO FFID) 5th Emergency Response Battalion: (TRA Level UNK) PTT made it's initial visit as a complete unit comprised of both military and civilian components to the 5th Emergency Response Battalion. A short discussion ensued with the collection of the data needed to complete the Daily Status Report. A collection of Officers names and the positions that they hold was obtained by the PTT for future mentoring and advising within specific departments of the station.

(NO FFID) Emergency Response Unit: (TRA Level UNK) PTT met with LTC [redacted] to discuss the status of the ERU Emergency Response Unit and collected the data necessary to complete the Daily Status Report. PTT collected the names of Officers and the positions that they hold within the unit. These names will be utilized at later dates by the PTT for mentoring and advising in regards to specific departments and their operation.

(MN0004) Baij DHQ: (TRA Level 4) PTT traveled to Bi'aj to meet with LTC [redacted] and proceeded to Al Qananiyah to observe an emergency drill. PTT observed the site protection emergency drill along with the district executive officer and the station commander. PTT conducted an after action review and conducted additional training with the IP concerning weapon safety.

(MN0027) Al Tahadi: (TRA Level UNK) PTT met with CPT [redacted] and gathered information to complete the PMSR. PTT also conducted a joint dismounted patrol in the AO.

(MN0036) Al Dawasa LPS: (TRA Level 2) PTT spoke with MAJ [redacted] who advised that the check points this station mans have been attacked about ten times in the last month. PTT also met with training officer LT [redacted] regarding implementation of training on a regular basis and keeping records of who attends and course content.

(MN0066) Sinjar DHQ: (TRA Level 4) PTT t met with the XO, LTC [redacted] to see if any new intelligence was available. PTT then traveled to Bulaj LPS and conducted training on weapon safety. IP were instructed to continue practicing what they learned in this class.

(MN0076) Tal Afar DHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT traveled to DHQ to attend a meeting with BG [redacted] and other CF elements. The additional CF elements were in Tal Afar in order to conduct an assessment of the security of the city as well as the current status of ISF. After the meeting, PTT met with MAJ [redacted] of Al Kisik LPS. The focus of this meeting was to push the IP to take more responsibility for their own training at Al Kisik. MAJ [redacted] stated that LTC [redacted] was the station's training officer. PTT advised MAJ [redacted] that

LTC [redacted] had not yet been to a training officers program and PTT feels that by attending this course, LTC [redacted] will be much better versed on how to conduct training and how to properly track the training of the IP. MAJ [redacted] agreed that this would be very beneficial for the station and PTT then advised him that a spot would be left open for LTC [redacted] at the upcoming training seminar in Sinjar. MAJ [redacted] advised that LTC [redacted] would not attend the Sinjar training because he thought that traveling to Sinjar was too dangerous. BG [redacted] told MAJ [redacted] that LTC [redacted] would have to make the decision to either show strength as a leader and improve himself, or step down from his position. The new IP need positive role models and a LTC that refuses to leave his AO is not a positive role model. As a possible compromise, BG [redacted] has stated that he would look into housing in the Sinjar area for LTC [redacted] for the week that he would be in training.

(MN0136) Al Ahrar LPS: (TRA Level 2) PTT traveled to Al-Ahrar LPS to obtain information for the PMSR. LTC [redacted] reported that his IP found a water heater that was turned into an IED. The IP later found the device to be a fake IED. LTC [redacted] stated that the terrorists have been using fake IED's to distract the IP from the real ones. While at the station, PTT inventoried the arms room and inspected the jail. The arms room was in order and everything was accounted for. The jail currently has three male inmates in custody. All three of them are being held on theft related charges. The jail was clean and the facilities were in good working order. The inmates said they received three meals a day and they are treated well by the IP.

(MN0220) Al Karama DHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT arrived at SE-4 to conduct an assessment of the detention facility. Shortly after arrival, PTT was called from the station to QRF for another MP unit. While enroute, PTT struck an IED and returned to the FOB.

(MN0222) Rabiya DHQ: (TRA Level 2) PTT spoke to LT [redacted] who confirmed a rocket attack in a village at approximately 1700 hours. Five rockets were fired into the village causing damage but no injuries. The LT stated that there are no intelligence reports of upcoming attacks.

PTT traveled to Al Salaam and conducted a one-hour joint dismounted patrol. There were no curfew violations and no suspicious activity observed during the patrol. LTC [redacted] stated that the IP have no intelligence of upcoming attacks.

(MN0233) 2nd Emergency Response Battalion: (TRA Level UNK) PTT met with LTC [redacted] the Battalion Commander. LTC [redacted] was briefed by PTT of the upcoming training program at ERB 5 beginning (date withheld). LTC [redacted] advised PTT he had selected ten IP to attend this training. In addition, PTT requested LTC [redacted] provide PTT with a list of names, rank and position of all his IPO. LTC [redacted] advised PTT he would prepare the list and have it available for the next station visit. While PTT was collecting the Daily Status Report information from LTC [redacted], one of his IP Check Points came under Small Arms Fire (SAF) from AIF. PTT responded to the area with IP from ERB 2 and conducted a Mounted Patrol of the area searching for the AIF. After a 30 minute Patrol with negative results, PTT returned to FOB Marez. There were no casualties or injuries reported from the attack at the Check Point.

(MN0924) Al Jamouri Hospital LPS: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with the Station Commander and advised him that trainind would be conducted with handouts in English and Arabic that range from administrative and investigative duties to defensive tactics and building and car checks. PTT also advised the Station Commander that range training would also be provided. The Station Commander informed PTT that he would provided as many IP as possible, but also advised of the shortage of IP. The Station Commander informed PTT he needs two towers for Force Protection, with one tower at the main gate and one in the rear

of the hospital. The Station Commander also needs a front loader or shovels to fill the HESCO barriers to add to the Force Protection around the station since the station is attacked on a regular basis. The Station Commander stated the IP now provide personnel to secure the main gate. The Station Commander advised the IP do not conducted mounted patrols, unless they are joint with the IA, due to the personnel shortage. The Station Commander stated the Force Protection around the hospital is his main focus, which is why the towers and HESCO barriers are his top priority. PTT advised the Station Commander that the team will follow through with NPHQ to check on the status of a high loader for the HESCO's and with erecting two towers for the hospital.

(NO FFID) Daquq JCC: (TRA Level 1) PTT observed the daily operations of the communications center. The communications office was well staffed and everyone seemed very knowledgeable in their job. PTT filled out the PSMR for the station.

(TT0005) Kirkuk Provincial HQ: (TRA Level UNK) PTT gave a station orientation to new military personnel. PTT met with LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he is in the process of making a distribution plan for helmets, medical bags and binoculars. PTT met with the finance officer and asked about the generator purchase for the academy. PTT was advised that BG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) issued a written order directing the finance officer and LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) to discuss the issue and determine if a new generator is needed. PTT was advised that the discussion needs to include BG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and no such meeting can take place since BG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) is on vacation.

PTT met with BG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated that he has the written authorization to begin training of the new class of 1700 Police Recruits. The authorization includes the authorized names and a copy was given to PTT. The training is scheduled to begin the first day after the Bayram Holiday. After training the entire class of 1700 will be assigned to the ESU. The next class of 1300 will be assigned to the stations. For the next class, there are approximately 500 Arab names approved. The rest will have a standard hiring process at the Police Academy. Another security check will be conducted at the Academy to ensure that all has been done to make the premises as secure as possible.

Prior to his departure, BG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) left written instructions to have a list of needed purchases and as many bids as possible by contractor. BG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated that this list is ready and will be presented to GEN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) upon his return. BG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) is still fearful that there will not be enough time before the end of the fiscal year to purchase everything that is necessary for the province.

(TT0024) Qarah Anir Patrol Police Station: (TRA Level 2) PTT met with the shift commander and collected information needed for the PMSR. PTT then conducted a training class on setting up perimeters, entering and searching building.

International Police Advisers (IPA) located at FOB Korean Village participated, with IHP-6 PTT members, in an IHP-6 mounted patrol. IPA observed the IHP-6 morning roll call and duty assignment formation. The joint mounted patrol departed FOB Korean Village stopping at two different service station sites. IHP were observed as they interacted with Iraqi business owners at both service stations. During the engagement at both service stations, IHP-6 demonstrated excellent perimeter security set-up for the patrol by not allowing any vehicles inside the joint patrol's area of operation. Also, IHP-6 utilized their community policing skills and interacted very well with the Iraqi citizens. Afterwards, the patrol departed the businesses and patrolled the roadways of Mobile Highway looking for any suspicious vehicles or individuals. IPA observed IHP-6 displaying proper road safety and maintaining proper vehicle intervals during the convoy operation. The joint mounted patrol stopped at a designated location on Mobile Highway and IHP-6 conducted vehicle checkpoint operation. The main purpose of the vehicle checkpoint operation was for IHP-6 to check all vehicles for illegal weapons or contraband. The PTT observed IHP-6 as they conducted the vehicle checkpoint operations and checked the identity of all drivers. IHP-6 demonstrated excellent vehicle checkpoint setup and security. IHP-6 handled the checkpoint and controlled all highway traffic in a very professional manner. The joint mounted patrol departed the location and returned to FOB Korean Village.

IPA and the PTT discussed ideas for the upcoming Advance Iraqi Police (IP) Training Center. IPA informed the PTT that the IHP-6 officers, who successfully complete the training, should be assigned as training instructors for the future attendees. IPA stressed this appointment will begin the "Train-the-Trainer" concept for the Iraqi police and allow IPA to monitor the IHP-6 instructors in the classroom setting. The joint mounted patrol departed the location and returned to FOB Korean Village.

(RA0054) Al Taashi: (TRA level 4) No station visit was conducted. Military members of the Police Transition Team (PTT) were tasked with operations not related to the PTT mission.

(RA0072) Rutbah District Police HQ: (TRA level 3) The Police Transitional Team (PTT) participated in an Iraqi Police (IP) security patrol. (RA0083) Hadithah District HQ: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) distributed helmets and flak vests to the Iraqi Police (IP) and Provincial Security Forces (PSF). The scheduled visit to Haqlaniyah was canceled due to adverse weather conditions.

An IP Officer returned to Haditha District Headquarters with an improvised explosive device (IED) in the bed of his truck. He found the device near the Bani Dahir Local Police Station. The Officer parked in a safe area outside the station and walked in through the pedestrian entrance. The area was cordoned off and called Explosive Ordinance Disposal responded to dispose of the ordinance. The PTT took this opportunity to give an impromptu class to several IP and PSF on the proper safety precautions, containment, and notification procedures in the event they locate another IED in the future.

(RA0088) Haqlaniyah (K3): (TRA level 4) A scheduled visit was canceled due to adverse weather conditions. The Police Transition Team distributed equipment at Haditha District Headquarters.

(RA0089) Barwanah Local Police Station: (TRA level 3) The Police Transition Team (PTT) participated in an Iraqi Police (IP) mounted patrol to West Sakron Station. The PTT and Barwanah Police met with Iraqi Army and the Military Transition Team (MTT). While on patrol, the PTT corrected any mistakes being made by the IP. IP handed out water and interacted with community members.
