(BC0002) Abu Ghraib Local Police Station: The Team conducted Primary Marksmanship Training for 5 IPs at Mutharia IA Range. Students participated in 'live fire' exercises covering the AK-47 and Glock pistol. Weapons safety was stressed on the range officers were closely monitored. Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) has been provided with a copy of the Field Training Manual. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(BC0003) Airport Police Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 4 IPs covering Patrol Procedures. Lieutenant Saif (STO) attended the class and students were attentive to the material presented. The Team met Global Security officials and exchanged security information concerning BIAP operations. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 8 detainees incarcerated with no problems reported. The Team met the morning Guard Mount and observed all IPs in uniform and ready for duty. The Team continues to monitor IPs performance during their daily activities at the Terminal and French Village Sub-Station. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(BC0013) Al Dorah Traffic Police Station: The Team met Lieutenant [Redacted] (Shift Supervisor) and discussed Station operations. The Team conducted follow-up interviews with 2 IPs concerning the murder of Colonel [Redacted] 2 days ago. Both IPs changed their stories again concerning the circumstances surrounding the incident which remains under investigation. The Team met Warrant Officer [Redacted] and observed that he continues work on developing a training plan. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(BC0021) Al Kadhimaya Local Police Station: The Team met Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) who advised there was no IPs available for Training due to all being on assignments. Colonel [Redacted] is familiar with the MOI Training Initiative and is being implemented at the Station. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(BC0030) Al Karkh Highway Traffic Police Station: The Team visited the Station and observed it fully functional as an independent Traffic Police Station. IPs are rarely available for training due to being assigned on traffic posts. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(BC0037) Al Kahira Local Police Station: The Team conducted a Station Defense Drill with Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) and all available personnel. The Station Commander and personnel failed the exercise. Discrepancies were pointed out (after the drill) to the Station Commander and the Team will follow-up on the issue. The Team was notified that Captain [Redacted] was murdered in an ambush near the Station just prior to the Teams arrival. Details revealed he had just departed the Station and was murdered en route to Al Kadhimiya Station for a training class. Shortly after the attack, the Colonel [Redacted] received a text message from Captain [Redacted] cell phone advising "We know the secret". The Team assisted IPs with escorting Captain [Redacted] body to Yarmouk Hospital. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(BC0038) Al Khansa Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 2 IPs covering Pre-Patrol Preparation and Equipment Readiness. The class was initiated due to several previous observations of officers failing to wear protective gear on post and not being properly armed. The Team met Major [Redacted] (Station Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet since May 24th. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(BC0045) Al Nasir Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 15 IPs and 2 Officers covering Vehicle Search Techniques. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with IPs and observed officers initiating good vehicle searches with no incidents experienced. The Team met Captain [redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed Station operations.

(BC0049) Al Rashad Local Police Station: The Station has not received vehicle fuel for the past 10 days. IPs are purchasing fuel with their own money to complete vehicle work assignments.

(BC0059) Al Sha'ab Local Police Station: The Team observed the Station appears very efficient and only lacks MOI logistical support. The Team observed the daily station visits appear to be more of a burden than providing aid as intended. The Station is experiencing a fuel shortage which is dictating the style of policing being practiced.

During several station visits the team instructed IPs on Defensive Tactics, Weapons Retention and Prisoner Custody Searches.

(BC0069) Al Thawra Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 2 Officers and 1 IP covering Community Policing. Various areas of criminal activity and Militia presence were discussed including ideas to combat the problems. Special emphasis was placed on police involvement in the community as being a major factor for winning citizen support. Students participated in classroom discussions and agreed with the philosophy covered. The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet during the past 24 hours. He advised 1st Lieutenant [redacted] (Station Investigator) was assigned TDY to NP by MOI for assisting with investigations. The Team met with 1st Lieutenant [redacted] and 1st Lieutenant [redacted] and posed questions concerning Militia influence in the AOR (specifically Al Thawra Station). It was obvious the officers were uncomfortable with the subject and didn't care to make any definitive statements.

(BC0098) Mada'in District Police HQ: The Team conducted Training for 2 IPs covering Community Policing and Search Procedures. Students were attentive to the material presented and participated in practical exercises to demonstrated techniques learned. The Team met General [redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed the MOI Training Initiative. Training supplies were ordered for the Program but none have been received. The General advised that the Station was attacked 4 days ago by RPGs and SAF. The Station was attacked during the visit (evening hours) with 2 mortar rounds detonating outside the compound and SAF being heard in the general area. The Team observed 3 Guard Towers firing at suspects while fleeing the area and no injuries were sustained from the attack. The Station received fuel on May 17th which was considerably less (120 liters) than the 210 liters authorized.

(BC0099) Mada'in Local Police Station: The Team met Major [redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed the MOI Training Initiative. He stated that none of the training supplies previously requested have been received. The Station received fuel on May 17th and the amount (120 liters) was considerably less than the authorized amount of 210 liters. The Station received indirect fire during the night followed by SAF. The Team observed officers repelling the attack and no injuries were sustained from the incident.

(BC0103) Criminal Investigation Directorate HQ: The Team met the Chief of Investigations to process paperwork for a detainee who is scheduled to accompany the Team on a trip to Moisal. The Team met the Fleet Management Officer and clarified a list of repair parts needed for CID fleet vehicles. The Team met the Commissioner for the Headquarters Evidence Section and discussed evidence intake procedures.

(BC0106) Criminal Investigation Directorate Unit 3: The Team met Commissioner [redacted] (Personnel Officer and STO) who advised the Station has 60 recruits that have not received Academy Training. Details indicated a letter was forwarded through the Chain of Command requesting the recruits be admitted to the Academy. The Team inspected the Armory and learned 8 AK-47s were sent to the CID Armory for repair. The Station is experiencing problems in obtaining fuel from the Fuel Point. Details revealed officers have been turned away on 3 different occasions while attempting to obtain fuel. Further information revealed the Fuel Point OIC notified officers they would not be given fuel if they complained to Police Authorities in Baghdad.

(BC0112) New Baghdad Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 4 IPs covering Checkpoint Operations. The Team conducted 4 Joint Patrol with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised 1 dead body was recovered in the AOR. Force Protection was found in order with IPs alert on post and wearing protective gear. The Team met Lieutenant [redacted] and discussed the MOI Field Training Manual.

(BC0113) New Baghdad Patrol Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 4 IPs and 1 Officer covering Officer Safety and Vehicle Search Procedures. The Team demonstrated the techniques and observed IPs performing searches during real-time operations at a Hasty Checkpoint. The Team conducted 2 Joint Patrols and 1 Foot Patrol with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed the arrival of 48 new recruits. He advised 62 recruits were approved by MOI and only 48 have reported for duty. Lieutenant [redacted] has been assigned to train the recruits with drill and ceremony exercises. Colonel [redacted] asked for assistance in obtaining information about Captain [redacted] who was arrested by CF on May 22nd. The Teams' Military counterpart agreed to address the matter and give some reply at a later date. The Team briefly discussed the MOI Training Initiative with Colonel [redacted] and found his immediate focus was directed at training the new 48 recruits.

(BC0119) Rusafa Patrol Police Station: The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who requested assistance with training 40 new IP recruits. The Team will confer with their Military counterpart concerning the matter and attempt to assemble a plan involving the STO for training the recruits.

(BB0500) Al Hillah Regional Police Academy: The PTT team from Fob Reo again surveyed the proposed location for the crime lab which is considered to have sufficient space and accommodations to serve as a temporary lab. The electricity will have to be completely reworked and a small section of roof over the ladder-well needs to be replaced. The remainder of the work, except for the installation of security doors, is cosmetic and can be accomplished rather cheaply. A contractor has reportedly begun work to relieve the

above ground backflow of sewage in the westerly corner of the compound, near the back entrance. However, no work was observed on this visit. A check of the guard towers found all the guards alert.

(BB0038) Tunis Local Police Station: The PTT team from Fob Kalsu met with Tunis station commander MAJ [redacted] who advised that he was going to be transferred to Haswa in the near future and CPT [redacted] would be taking his place. The team discussed training issues with the Major. Refresher training at FOB Kalsu was discussed and he wanted to get as many of his IPs to this training as possible. Following the meeting, a joint patrol was conducted to the Nasar Faslo primary school. The patrol stopped at the school and remained on site for approximately one hour, conducting a joint community policing mission. During this time the team along with the Major met with school officials and handed out school supplies to the students. The patrol was conducted with one IP vehicle with six IP's.

Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna (PIC) [redacted]

PTT members met with MAJ [redacted] to plan position specific training for Dhi Qar financial officers. PTT members prepared lesson plans and outline for one week training in June for financial officers. PTT members assisted MTT members in the distribution of MTOE equipment for Dhi Qar province.

(TD0104) Diyala Provincial QRF (Neshda): PTT visited the QRF station and made contact with COL [redacted] who advised that there have been no attacks on the station in the last 24 hours and all IP were present and accounted for. PTT discussed equipment issues regarding ammunition and weapons. Additional issues of station force protection and station construction were made.

(TD0103) Diyala ERF 1 Facility: PTT spoke with BG [redacted] concerning the raid on May 24th. The Team expressed some concern in how the IP conducted themselves and the fact they were observed taking several items during the raid. Some of these included a goat, AK-47, and several cell phones. The Chief advised he had already spoken to the IP and had the items returned to their owner after the raid. In total they had detained 35 people from the raid, released 16 and sent 19 to IPS HQ to be held. The Chief also has formulated his Force Protection Plan and presented it to the PTT members.

(TD0002) Al Abarra Local Police Station: PTT traveled to Al Abarra LPS and met with COL [redacted]. There were twelve IP on duty. One prisoner was in-custody, arrested by the I.A. for gang related activity in Al Sadah the day before. COL [redacted] advised that he has received some equipment previously ordered. COL [redacted] advised that he was having problems obtaining fuel for his vehicles. PTT advised him that they would assist him next time and escort him to the fuel station and guide him through the procedure for obtaining fuel.

(TD0035) Khalis District Police HQ: PTT traveled to Khalis DHQ and talked with COL [redacted] who stated COL [redacted] was arrested on a warrant from MOI for allegation of theft. COL [redacted] stated he is having problems with the PHQ hiring IP without any input from the local levels. COL [redacted] stated he gave the PHQ 10 names of IP he would like to have hired but no response from PHQ. PHQ sent Khalis DHQ 58 IP and COL [redacted] does not know any of these IP. He was also told he would receive 10 more IP. COL [redacted] stated

that his supervisor GEN [redacted] is giving him orders to hire new Officers without going through the proper channels.

Salah Al Din [redacted]

(TA0080) Salah Al Din Provincial Police HQ: PTT met with COL [redacted] of the Salah Ad Din Provincial Operations Office and inquired concerning the additional IP's and checkpoints that were observed in the city. He stated that the IP were trying to present a stronger presence to help people feel safer in the city and to help create a more positive image of the police with the citizens.

MAJ [redacted] of the Communications Department was asked to provide an updated distribution list of communications equipment in the Province and what was being held in reserve of which he will provide next week.

LT [redacted] of the Provincial Vehicles Department was advised of 17 vehicles which arrived on the COB and most have some damage. He was asked to provide a distribution list of these and if possible take into account many small stations that may only have one or two working vehicles. Also, arrangements were made for the pick up of the vehicles. He did state that the department now only has the one larger working bus, but it has some damage from an explosion. The two smaller buses have been destroyed in attacks.

COL [redacted] of the Provincial Logistics arrived and discussion of the Provincial meeting was conducted. He feels that the meeting will be well attended and much good will come from advising Logistics Officers of procedures for ordering and how things will work with MOI. COL [redacted] advised the pick up of force protection supplies is still on for tomorrow. He was asked to provide a list of equipment he needs to bring the total Province up to its quota for supplies for all the men and then to send this to MOI requesting these items.

(TA0013) Al Alam District Police HQ: PTT traveled to Al-Alam District Headquarters and met with COL [redacted]. PTT inquired if any Iraqi Law training had been conducted at the Samra and Rubidyah stations and was told that the District investigators had not been able to get out there and conduct training due to on-going investigations. COL [redacted] advised the Team that the Abu-Jeel station had been moved again. The station has been moved to the Governor's Building approximately 200 meters west of the IHP station on Route Clemson. The COL advised that 2 days ago he had the Al-Alam IP perform a flash checkpoint on route Dover going towards Al-Dwar and this checkpoint was attacked with motor fire. He stated that there were no casualties during this attack

PTT asked if the District had recently received any ammunition from Provincial Headquarters and COL [redacted] stated no and that his District requested ammunition last month in writing and the Provincial Headquarters returned a written refusal. COL [redacted] gave the Team a copy of the request and refusal.

COL [redacted] requested that PTT move the training currently conducted on FOB Danger to the District Headquarters and requested that the training cover subjects of searching persons and vehicles, as well as cover, concealment and movement under fire.

Camp Speicher: Training was conducted for 11 IP at FOB Danger on Pre-Patrol Operations and Basics of Democratic Policing. In the Pre-Patrol Operations portion, the IP learned basic station operations, how to conduct a roll call, how to conduct inspections (weapons and uniforms) and how to inspect the vehicles that will be used that day. In the

Democratic Policing portion, they learned the Role of the Police, the Mission Statement, Rule of Law, Human Rights and the Use of Force.

At the beginning of the class, PTT explained to the training officer that he would be teaching the classes from now on, and the team would observe and step in when needed.

(TA0084) Samarra District Police HQ: PTT met with BG [redacted] MAJ [redacted] GEN [redacted] and other members of the NP, IA and IP. This meeting was called by GEN [redacted] to discuss the arrival of the Samarra Brigade which is to happen sometime this week. GEN [redacted] stated that all the units will be under his control which will also include the FPS that are protecting the SDI plant and other locations in Samarra. GEN [redacted] stated nothing will happen in Samarra without his knowledge and approval. All parties seem to agree with this plan.

GEN [redacted] also stated that he will personally check the IP and NP in Samarra to get an accurate count of them sometime this week. GEN [redacted] also informed all parties that if something happened in their AO he would hold them responsible for it and he would want answers on how it happened and why.

(TA0064) Bayji District Police HQ: PTT observed as the MAJ in charge of training conducted a class on patrol procedures. Following the class, several IP were allowed to stay and talk with the Team about being an IP. The same general questions came up such as how can they make more money and when do they get more IPs.

(TA0277) Tuz District JCC: PTT started a vehicle maintenance program and working with the station mechanic. In addition, a hiring process is being put together for the Tuz area as well. Training classes for class #4 began today in which the students received training in the areas of Check Points and Vehicle Searches. The students remained attentive throughout the classroom portion.

(NoFFID#) Balad District Police HQ: PTT issued 7 digital cameras to the station where COL [redacted] signed a receipt for the items. Brief training was given for the use of the cameras and a brief was given in reference to the gathering of visual evidence that the cameras would produce. The cameras are scheduled to be placed at each of the Balad IP stations. IPLOs and the PTT also entered approximately 15 IP into the (BATS) Biometrics Automated tracking system.

IPLO went to FOB O'Ryan and met with 30 IPs on the IA training compound and conducted day 2 of a 5 day survival check point training using a mock check point and tower on the IA compound.

(MN0928) Abi Tamaam District Police HQ: PTT met with COL [redacted] Executive Officer, who advised that seven stationary check points and six mobile patrols were conducted today. COL [redacted] advised the transition from the Al Rashidyah station to the Abi Tamaam station has been a success. PTT began an inventory of all vehicles at Abi Tamaam. At this time the Abi Tamaam records do not coincide with PTT records. PTT will continue to investigate the vehicle situation until it is resolved.

(NoFID#) 2nd Emergency Response Battalion: PTT met with Commander, COL [redacted] regarding an IP and CF joint foot patrol in the Al Wahad neighborhood. PTT briefed Col [redacted] on the mission and he agreed to contribute four IP vehicles and 20 IP for the joint mission.

PTT briefed COL [redacted] on the mission and where the IP vehicles were going to be placed in the outer cordon. PTT also briefed on foot patrol procedures. PTT observed an IP officer brief the IP on their individual responsibilities, while on the IP and CF joint patrol. Once the PTT arrived in the neighborhood, the joint patrol was initiated with the IP. The PTT and IP spoke with several residents in the neighborhood.

(MN0048) Makmoor District Police HQ: PTT met with District Commander, BG [redacted] who was in the process of reorganizing some of the station IP into three platoons in order to accompany CFs on joint patrols and raids. He also briefed the Intelligence officers about acquiring adequate intelligence and information. He has allowed them two weeks to start producing or they would be replaced. He advised PTT they tend to operate under the former regime guidance and only develop information about the IA and IP. PTT offered to provide training on report writing.

PTT also discussed the up-coming Police Conference and the agenda for the meeting. JCC has co-located with the DHQ and was encouraged to track incidents and produce trend analysis of events.

PTT was advised DHQ received 25 AK47 on May 25th. He also advised that he needs an additional 72 AK47s, 40 sets of body armor, 60 trauma plates and magazine pouches for 130 IP for joint patrols with CF. He advised PTT that the requests for this needed equipment has been forwarded to NPHQ.

(MN0025) Al Shura Local Police Station: PTT met with the Executive Officer, LTC [redacted] who advised there have been no recent attacks. He also advised PTT the LPS has a written defense plan which they practice twice daily. PTT also gathered PSMR information.

The LPS has been receiving ten liters of gasoline for each vehicle every week. The Station Commander has requested an additional fuel allotment, but this has been denied by COL [redacted] the DHQ Commander at Hammam Alil. PTT observed the LPS currently have one computer which operates poorly and the copier is inoperative.

(MN0076) Tall Afar District Police HQ: PTT assisted in the transport of personnel and equipment to FOB Hieder.

(MN0907) Saria Local Police Station: The PTT, Station Commander, and IP traveled to several checkpoints in the local area to check the manning levels, alertness, and hours the IP were searching vehicles and their occupants. PTT also completed a monthly jail inspection report and observed the jail currently holds thirteen detainees. The jail staff advised the PTT they are in need of a new refrigerator for the detainee's food.

(MN0016) Al Kisik Local Police Station: PTT conducted a station visit and introduced the new PTT members to command staff member, MAJ. [redacted]. The PTT also inspected the jail and observed four detainees. PTT was advised all the detainees had seen the investigation judge and are scheduled for release on May 28th. The detainees were observed to in good health and each advised they have been receiving food and had not been abused. MAJ [redacted] advised the LPS station was running low on ammunition

and needed more. He also advised several requests had been sent to DHQ, but had been denied. PTT advised him to send another request and save a copy for the PTT for follow up.

(MN0209) Avgani Local Police Station: PTT met with a member of the command staff, who advised the LPS was operating effectively, but was in need of AK47 ammunition. PTT reminded him of the proper procedures for obtaining equipment.

(NoFFID#) Al Bughah Local Police Station: PTT met with CPT [redacted] command staff member, who advised PTT the LPS is operating effectively. PTT introduced new PTT members from the military company assigned to the LPS. PTT observed the LPS is not actually located in a building, but conducts its operations from CHU's.

The Station Commander requested assistance with obtaining ammunition and was again advised by PTT that all supply requests must be made to DHQ.

At Tamim

(TT0005) Tamin Provincial Police HQ: PTT observed the graduation of 896 Iraqi Police from the academy.

(TT0034) Kirkuk TIPS Academy: PTT assisted with the security for the IP graduation and during the afternoon, continued with security for a visiting VIP.

(TT0004) Aruba Patrol IP LPS: PTT met with Constable Rhizar, Station Field Training, who was observed conducting guard mount and training consisting of marching, firearms handling, and ethics. COL [redacted] gave a talk on respect and truthfulness to several IP officers. Constable Rhizar requested the PTT provide him with more training material. He also requested weapons retention training and related that he needed additional holsters and magazine pouches for the IP.

(TT0614) Dibbis Local Police Station: PTT met with LTC [redacted] Deputy Station Commander, and discussed future training at the DHQ. LTC [redacted] advised he was very pleased with the training provided to the Investigations unit and would like training to continue. PTT also discussed records on training, attendance, and discipline. During the next visit, these records will be examined in detail and suggestions will be provided for any corrective activity deemed necessary.

(TT0009) Domies Patrol IP Station: PTT contacted the on duty IP and discussed and reviewed investigations initiated over the weekend.

(TT0022) Meghdad Patrol IP Station: PTT met with the detention officer to inspect the jail and review IP operating procedures. PTT noted the cell was clean and orderly, but needed some type of added ventilation or air conditioners. PTT spoke with the five detainees and observed them to be healthy and well cared for. PTT noted all detention procedures are being followed and the records are current and accurate. The PTT conducted training for four IP on how to conduct room searches and how to conduct an effective police patrol. A joint vehicle patrol with IP was conducted in the local area. The IP was observed by PTT searching one suspicious vehicle.

(TT0032) Taza Karhmatu Patrol IP Station: PTT worked on logistics issues, assisted with computer and file systems, and mentored the logistics officer on the use of computerized record keeping.

(TT0001) Abassi LPS: PTT spoke with MAJ [redacted] command staff member, and reviewed the construction progress on the station. The on-site contractor indicated the work may be finished in about one month.

PTT spoke at length with IP about their motivation for being an IP and their future prospects for promotion. PTT provided training on checkpoint security and procedures and search technique.

PTT observed checkpoint procedures and conducted a joint patrol with the local IP throughout the town of Abassi. PTT noted the IP are showing signs of improvement in check point operations.

(TT0010) Huwajaha District Police HQ: PTT visited the JCC and made contact with LT [redacted] shift commander and checked progress made on the class room construction. PTT noted the training area is almost complete except for electrical wiring installation. PTT checked the station SOP and IP personnel logs. The JCC command expressed a desire to implement a three shift rotation after additional officers and money become available.

PTT also visited the JCC and set up security. PTT performed check point assessments at the traffic circle and made on the spot corrections. PTT noted manning shortages and that body armor was not being utilized by all personal on duty. PTT conducted station assessments and police mentoring along with station performance recommendations.

Irbil: [redacted]

(MI0001) Irbil Provincial Police HQ: PTT met with MG [redacted], the PDOP to arrange security for the visit of LTG James Dubik MNSTC-I to the Irbil Police College. MG [redacted] agreed to provide members from Irbil SWAT as escort and LZ security.

PTT also met with BG [redacted] Irbil Police Chief, who thanked PTT for all the work of the PTT and pledged his support for the future. BG [redacted] recently moved from the Asayish Police to become the Irbil Police Chief. He advised he had worked with the Asayish for many years and experienced a good working relationship with the PTT.

PTT served as the welcoming contingent for LTG Dubik and his support team at the Irbil Police College at 1600hrs. PTT was asked for support by the ROK LNO. MG [redacted] the College Director, welcomed LTG Dubik along with MG [redacted] and PTT. The college cadets performed a marching drill on the college parade grounds along with the college band.

Sulaymaniyah **Gary Kuhn**

(TS0008) Sulaymaniyah Provincial Police HQ: PTT met with BG [redacted] concerning supply and training issues.

(NoFFID#) Asaish Check Point: PTT met with Asaish check point officers at the Kirkuk check point. Training continued with check point officers on searching vehicles and officer awareness. The PTT observed each check point has four shifts, so training must be taught four times to include all officers. PTT also worked with K-9 officers searching vehicles.

(TS0010) Sulaymaniyah Traffic Police HQ: PTT met with BG [redacted] and discussed the interaction and involvement between Traffic Police and IP at the station in serious and fatal motor vehicle accidents. BG [redacted] advised Traffic Police respond initially to the accident

scene. Once on scene, they conduct the initial investigation, interview the drivers and witnesses, examine the physical evidence, and complete a scene sketch. These reports are forwarded to the IP, where the traffic police report is attached to the IP report then sent to the investigative judge.

PTT proposed all investigators should be trained to properly and uniformly conduct these investigations. PTT advised all officers involved should go through the same training course provided by the PTT. The command staff was in agreement.

PTT traveled to the Border Patrol Academy where the first day of motor cycle training took place. PTT noted that of the ten students, the average motor cycle experience was eight years.

(TS0601) Saraa Local Police Station: PTT met with commander of the LPS concerning community oriented police training. PTT conducted training for eight officers on the concept of community policing and ethics. The PTT advised they would return on the May 28th and present the IP who attended the course with certificates of completion.

(TS0024) Chamchamal District Police HQ: PTT met with Station Commander, COL [redacted], concerning the new Investigations training class, which will begin on May 28th. COL [redacted] also escorted the PTT to the classroom area across the street from the DHQ and stated that he would provide any materials needed for the training. COL [redacted] was concerned about the IPs not having received training of any kind prior to his assignment at the station. He advised PTT that he had 700 IP under his command and only 200 of these IP were Academy trained. COL [redacted] requested SWAT training, medical training, officer survival, community policing and jail management training. He advised 25 IP Investigators would be attending the training. After this class, he requested the PTT train the remaining 25 Investigators on the same material. COL [redacted] advised he had 30 IP who were in need of SWAT training. He also advised 80 IP were in need of officer survival training. It was clear that COL [redacted] needed training and welcomed the help from PTT Instructors.

Dahuk

(MD0002) Dahuk Provincial Police HQ: PTT met with the MG [redacted] LTC [redacted] and representatives from CF in Mosul. PTT discussed the distribution of some equipment purchased with TTIF funds and the status of equipment, which is still located at the Mosul warehouse. MG [redacted] advised he had had trouble coordinating an IA escort and proper transportation to retrieve the items, but he would arrange to have the pick up made in the next few days.

PTT also discussed the need for uniforms in the province, since the Kurdish police do not wear the same blue uniform as the IP located in the South. PTT suggested the PDOP decide on a standard uniform, locate a local vender that could supply them, get prices, and provide the PTT with a copy which will be forwarded up the chain for consideration.

PTT also discussed the installation of the last radio repeater needed to complete the system in Dahuk. A suitable location was agreed on at Macloob Mountain and CF agreed to assist the IP with setting up the system. PTT will coordinate the installation in the very near future. The installation of the repeater should give all stations in the province the ability to communicate with each other and will allow communications between Dahuk, Irbil and Mosul, if necessary.

(MD0635) Shekhan District Police HQ: PTT contacted Mr. [redacted] Chief Engineer of ECCI at the Shekhan building site for the new Police HQ. Mr. [redacted] advised PTT the building under construction will be approximately 1300 sq meters of usable space and will be a two story construction. He advised they are including a four cell jail, which can easily accommodate 40 prisoners. The structure will have a wall surrounding the building, complete with four gun towers and two security gates. The building should be completed within four months. PTT noted the DHQ has been without a permanent facility for eight months.

(MD0632) Qadish Local Police Station: PTT visited the LPS and conducted a station assessment. PTT spoke to LT [redacted] about changes which had been made in the local area after the recent attacks in the Kurdish region. He advised the LPS was conducting additional patrols each day and was also conducting an additional 24 hour checkpoint. The LT also advised the IP were conducting additional foot patrols and posting guards in local areas.

PTT noted the jail is used as a holding cell, but is seldom used. PTT was advised by LT [redacted] that the station was in need of a computer due to constant repairs and also a copier. PTT will provide the station with a copier from the equipment purchased earlier today with TTIF funds.

Ramadi (MND-W) [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(3)

Al Anbar [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(3)

(RA0048) Ramadi District Police HQ: PTT conducted an Officer Survival class for the Iraqi Police (IP). The class covered the force continuum in order to affect an arrest. The course covered wrist locks, striking, and take downs to lead to handcuffing techniques. The class also covered the escalation and de-escalation of a given situation. The IP were instructed in the 'Confidence Factor' using real life scenarios to demonstrate IP abilities. The IP were given the opportunity to compete in bouts with their peers in a controlled and supervised environment with the IP wearing full protective gear.

(RA0069) Habbaniyah District Police HQ: PTT convoyed to the District Headquarters to conduct a detainee inspection, collection of detainee information in BATS, and to gather information for Range Cards and Sectors of Fire for future extended station visits.

The new detention room at district was very hot and had no ventilation. The IP were trying to install a fan system to assist with this problem. PTT will inspect their progress tomorrow. At this time, the District is housing 20 detainees. Due to the IP still in the move-in process, the detainees' records were not on scene. The Detention Officer advised he will have them moved by tomorrow.

DHQ Command Staff also reported they have no gas to run the generators at the station and the little they have will only keep it running for a few more hours.

(RA0070) Civil Camp Local Police Station: PTT conducted a dismounted patrol in the Civil Camp area. The PTT mission was to facilitate community involvement and IP interaction.

(RA0134) Khaladiyah Local Police Station: PTT conducted a station visit in reference to several issues including detainees and IP accountability. The Station Chief informed the PTT that the Iraqi Army (IA) from Jazeera turned over 24 detainees for suspected terrorist

activity to the IP on May 26th. None of the current 28 detainees showed signs of being abused.

(RA0089) Barwanah Local Police Station: PTT completed recruiting packets on 28 IP recruits and processed them through BATS for an upcoming academy.
