(BC0007) Al Adhamiya Patrol Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 65 IP recruits and 1 Officer covering High Risk Traffic Stops and Vehicle Search Procedures. Special emphasis was placed on officer safety during the class. Commissioner Fadel (STO) attended the class and was briefed concerning his duties.

(BC0008) Al Adhamiya Traffic Police Station: The Team conducted a 'Train the Trainer' class for Captain [redacted] (STO) covering Glock Pistol Training. Arabic lesson plans are being utilized in compliance with MOI Training Initiative. The Team met General [redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed Station operations.

(BC0011) Al Dorah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Combat First Aid Training for 11 IPs at the IA Compound. Command Sergeant [redacted] (Iraqi Army) participated in instructing the class and special emphasis was placed on controlling bleeding for victims.

(BC0017) Al Hurrya Local Police Station: The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised 7 murders had occurred in the northern section of Hurrayah during the past week. The Team suggested increased patrols in the area as an attempt to curb future violence. Colonel [redacted] is familiar with MOI Training Initiative CF-LPS-07-00023.

(BC0022) Al Kadhimaya Patrol Police Station: The Team met Major [redacted] who advised 6 VBIEDs were detonated in the AOR during the past 24 hours. Further information indicated 1 of the VBIEDs killed 2 individuals and no other details were available. The Team notified Major [redacted] to use the Chain of Command for requesting logistics items. He was reminded that a copy of all written requisitions should be provided to the Team for tracking purposes. Information revealed 3 Force Protection IPs were fined 5 days pay for failing to wear their protective gear while manning a perimeter Guard Tower.

(BC0041) Al Mesbah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 4 IPs covering Crime Scene Response and Scene Security. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with 4 IPs and located several rocket tubes near Baghdad University. A close inspection revealed the rockets apparently had run out of fuel prior to striking the school.

The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 35 detainees incarcerated with no problems reported. IPs complained about having to attend training class and participate in a Joint Patrol with the Team. The Station Commander was not available and Commissioner [redacted] made arrangements for the class and joint patrol operation. Information revealed the Station did not receive fuel on June 8th and IPs purchased vehicle fuel with their own money.

(BC0042) Meshahadah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 10 IPs covering Reaction to IEDs and Building Entry Techniques. Students were attentive to the material presented and participated in practical exercises to demonstrate their proficiency.

(BC0045) Al Nasir Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 10 IPs and 1 Officer covering Fire and Maneuver Techniques. Students participated in practical exercises to demonstrate counter-ambush and cover/movement techniques. The Team conducted 1

Joint Patrol with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Team met Captain [redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed Station operations. (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

(BC0046) Al Quana Local Police Station: The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) and requested his assistance to provide 8 IPs and 1 Officer to conduct cordon operations with CF on June 10th. He was concerned the request would 'cut-short' personnel already assigned to security duties at local schools. (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

(BC0075) Al Zaafaranyah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 6 IPs covering Police Ethics and Professionalism. Lieutenant [redacted] (STO) was provided with an electronic copy of the MOI Training Initiative. The Team will provide a hard copy of the Training Plan at earliest convenience. The Station had not received fuel by time of the Teams departure on June 8th. The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised a high ranking JAM member was killed on June 7th and was allegedly an IP at Mada'in Station. Preliminary information indicated he was killed by other JAM members who believed he would divulge JAM information to authorities if arrested. (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

(BC0078) Al Zohour Patrol Police Station: Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) has appointed 3 STOs and all were provided copies of lesson plans in compliance with MOI Training Initiative CF-LPS-07-00023. Training supplies and equipment were requested through the Chain of Command and the request remains unanswered. (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

(BC0079) Bab Al Muadam Patrol Station: The Team conducted Training for 5 IPs and 1 Officer covering Prisoner Management, Officer Safety and Communications. IPs received hands-on instruction during an unannounced shake-down of the Detention Facility. Special emphasis was placed on prisoner security during the operation. Contraband was located and IPs were discouraged from allowing prisoners to maintain cell-phones inside the jail. IPs were encouraged to make a written log of Detention Facility activities and forward (brief) pertinent information to relief officers. (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

(BC0081) Bab Al Sheikh Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 2 IPs covering Vehicle Search and Checkpoint Procedures. The Team conducted 2 Joint Patrols and 3 Foot Patrols with IPs in the community. Checkpoints were visited and officers set-up Hasty Checkpoints and practiced vehicle search techniques. Information revealed increased patrols within the AOR contributed to a decrease in violence. Additional details revealed during the previous week the AOR experienced 8 dead bodies being recovered and 2 car bombs were detonated. (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

(BC0089) Belat Al Shuhadaa Local Police Station: The Team met Major [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised Captain [redacted] (Station Investigator) was shot to death on June 7th. Details revealed Captain [redacted] was murdered inside his vehicle while on his way home from the Station. (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

The Team discussed Checkpoint operations and determined 1 Checkpoint is being operated with assistance from NP personnel and has not received fuel for the past 9 days. The Team observed that a written request for fuel was made to Karkh Headquarters. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol and found IPs failing to man a Checkpoint. Upon the Teams approach to the Checkpoint, IPs were observed at a location across the street from their assigned post. IPs traveling in the Teams convoy attempted to cover for the deficiency by stating the offending IPs were actually manning the Checkpoint. (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

(BC0090) Boob Al Sham Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 6 IPs covering Situational Awareness. Classroom discussion covered the importance of passing (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

on information to relief officers. Special emphasis was placed on monitoring the temperament of citizens in local neighborhoods. The Team met Colonel [redacted] who advised daily training is being conducted at the Station. (b)(6) (b)(7)(c)

(BC0093) Hy Al Amil Local Police Station: It does not appear the Command Staff has taken any steps to implement the MOI Field Training Officer Program. The Team inspected the Armory and found numerous dirty weapons. Information revealed the Station is without any weapon cleaning supplies. The Team will conduct Training covering Integrity and Agency Cooperation for the IPs due to the Teams findings.

(BC0094) Hy Al Amil Patrol Police Station: The Command Staff has not made any progress towards incorporating the MOI Field Training Officer Plan. Training will be conducted for IPs covering Integrity and Agency Cooperation. The Team inspected the Armory and found the OIC busy cleaning AK-47s with diesel fuel. Requests for cleaning supplies through the Chain of Command have been submitted and remain unanswered.

(BC0100) Mada'in Patrol Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 3 IPs covering Vehicle Stop Procedures. Students were attentive to the material presented and participated in practical exercises to demonstrate proficiency. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with IPs and set-up a Hasty Checkpoint with no incidents experienced. The Team met Major [redacted] (Deputy Station Commander) who advised the body of a former IP was discovered at a nearby traffic circle. No further details were available and the investigation is pending into the matter. Major [redacted] stated he does not talk to his IPs out of fear for himself or his family being killed for cooperating with CF. He refused to comment on the Teams' request about where patrol efforts should be focused in the AOR. In private, he advised that he did not want to give information because he did not know which IPs in the Station were affiliated with JAM.

(BC0105) Criminal Investigation Directorate Unit 2: The Team met General [redacted] (Station Commander) to discuss Station operations and conditions at the Detention Facility. The Facility is holding 258 prisoners in a cell designed for 30 people. The cell has 2 showers and 2 toilets available for the prisoners which exacerbate previously reported unsanitary living conditions. The jail has 80 beds to accommodate detainees and General [redacted] is aware of the prisoners existing medical problems (scabies, upper respiratory disease and digestive track disease). The Teams' military counterpart initiated a request for a new Detention Facility to be constructed using military funding.

(BC0107) Medical City Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 10 IPs and 1 Officer covering Prisoner Search/Handcuffing and Movement Techniques. The Team conducted 2 Joint Patrols and IPs arrested 5 insurgents at Mulhallah 118. The suspects were found in possession of 4 AK-47s with approximately 1,000 rounds of ammunition and hoods for concealing their identity. Information revealed the suspects were preparing to conduct a kidnapping operation and all were transported to FOB Rustymiah for processing.

The Team conducted Training for 5 IPs and 2 Officers covering Interrogation Interview Techniques. IPs arrested a suspected bomb maker terrorist on June 4th which provided for an ideal opportunity for training. IPs were instructed in commonly used techniques for questioning suspects. CF tested the suspect for evidence which were found positive for gunpowder and TNT residue. The prisoner was transferred to Adhamiya JSS for safe keeping.

(BC0113) New Baghdad Patrol Police Station: The Team met Major [redacted] (Deputy Station Commander) who advised sniper activity has increased in the AOR. Details (b)(6) (b)(7)(c)

revealed there have been 6 recent sniper shootings which resulted in 1 IP WIA. Major [redacted] advised he wanted to increase vehicle patrols in the sniper area but the lack of vehicle fuel is hindering the effort. The Station received 600 liters of vehicle fuel during the Teams visit.

(BC0117) Risalah Local Police Station: The Station is not receiving fuel and the generator is out of service. Major [redacted] (Station Commander) has a copy of the MOI Training Initiative. There are no STOs available in the District.

(BC0401) Baghdad Taji IHP Station: The Team observed Training for 108 recruits covering Police Ethics Part 2. The class was presented by Warrant Officer Saif Ali Kudum and Sergeant [redacted]. Classroom training will be conducted for a 4 week period at which time the IPs will be paired with more experienced officers to work the street.

The Station Detention Facility has been deactivated due to poor conditions and being used to detain IPs for policy violations. The Team met Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) to discuss Station operations. The relocation of Taji Station was discussed and the possibility of 3 existing buildings being used for the new location was under consideration.

No missions were conducted today by IPLO's assigned to FOB Delta. The IPLO's conducted maintenance on their vehicles and individual housing units. The IPLO's also held a meeting with the Ukrainian military that is transferring to FOB Echo.

Babil Province

(BB0032) Babil Provincial Police HQ: PTT met with Colonel [redacted] the officer in charge of equipment maintenance in the Babil Province. The equipment involves all IP vehicles, and all emergency generators. There are approximately 800 vehicles in Babil Province, and approximately 53 emergency generators. The Colonel's concern is that his maintenance garage only has three bays to work on vehicles and it is very crowded. To compound the situation, he said he only has eight mechanics and need to be trained in modern vehicle technology. The mechanics advise they need a diagnostic computer to determine vehicle malfunction. Currently, the mechanics play a guessing game in order to repair a vehicle. The Colonel further advises that he needs a total of forty mechanics to service the entire province's vehicles and generators.

There is a new construction project to start in the current calendar year to build a new vehicle maintenance facility (2.5 Billion Dinar). An inspection of the existing garage is being scheduled to evaluate current working conditions and facility condition.

(BB0047) Hey Babil Local Police Station: During the station visit at Hey Babil the team spoke with Captain [redacted] concerning his station which is very substandard in appearance and needs support in obtaining needed equipment. The biggest needs currently,

are new protective vests. They presently have approximately 61 vests, but on a cursory inspection, the team found many of the existing vests are becoming worn and frayed from extensive wear. The station also is in need of an emergency generator as the local electrical power is not dependable.

This station also houses a jail. The detainees are mostly IP's that have been incarcerated for missing work and crimes of murder. When the power is off, the detainees get very hot which becomes a health hazard. In addition, the detainees do have water to drink or bathe. This station has a broken water line and is the process of submitting the proper paperwork to Babil Main HQ to have the line repaired. Additionally, the station is in need of beds with mattresses for the IPs as they presently only have two; whereby, numerous IPs have to sleep on the floor with no mattresses.

(BB0500) Babil Police Academy (Al Hilla): PTT conducted a follow up regarding a prior request for help in obtaining materials necessary to build bunkers on the academy grounds. The Academy houses approximately 1300 students plus cadre when classes are in full attendance. At this time there are no structures on academy grounds that would provide any shelter from rocket or mortar attacks. The team is in the process of determining what materials are needed and where the shelters should be placed. The acquisitions of materials are being addressed, both on the military side as well as other possible avenues.

No missions were conducted by IPLOs assigned to FOB Kalsu; however, training was conducted at the FOB Kalsu Training Facility. Twenty-one IPs received an eight hour block of instruction on Iraqi Rule of Law and Public Relations. Classes were administered by an Iraqi Judge and Lawyer.

Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna (PIC)

PTT members attended the daily operational briefing in Camp Terendak this and the daily SSR/MIIT/CPATT meeting in MAJ [Redacted] office. PTT members attended the second iteration of the Weekly Formal Targeting Conference for OBG (W) three activities in Al Muthanna & Dhi Qar Provinces in the near future.

PTT & MIIT issued equipment to the Dhi Qar IPS Logistical Officer and coordinated future pickup dates for additional equipment still on hand at Camp Terendak.

PTT member attended OBG meeting regarding upcoming extended desert movement and Provincial visit to various locations. Senior IPS leadership did not arrive for planned briefing by PTT at Tallil. This briefing was to update the leadership on the training plan for the coming week as well as to explain the benefits that the training could produce.

(TA0013) Al Alam District Police HQ: PTT convoyed to the Al Alam District headquarters to conduct a survey of the station's force protection capabilities. Over all, the station's ability to withstand an attack is good, but with the placement of some Hesco barriers and C-wire it

could be improved even more. PTT met with COL [redacted] and advised him that they would be drawing up the planned improvements for his station and will present them to him on their next visit.

(TA0084) Samarra District Police HQ: PTT learned that 50 of the new IP were turned away at the Samarra Dam by IA who failed to call when the IP arrived at the Dam. The IP left and returned home. However 5 IP were able to make it into Samarra since an IP from Emergency Battalion knew them and brought them in. The new IP were taken to the Samarra Station and waited for MAJ [redacted] to show up and make sure they were the IP that COL [redacted] hired.

Later in the afternoon, IA called the LNO and stated that there were three more new IP at the Dam wanting to cross. MAJ [redacted] sent the Emergency Battalion IP back out to pick up the new officers. MAJ [redacted] then talked to all of them and told them they would be working at the Emergency Battalion where they were given uniforms, AK-47 rifles, and body armor. PTT is hopeful that the 50 IP, who were turned away, will show up again tomorrow for processing. PTT is still working on a computer program that will keep track of all the IP working in Samarra, along with a schedule for them.

(TA0050) As Saniyah Local Police Station: Upon PTT arrival at the station, PTT found only 5 IP on duty. The IP that were at the station included two acting LTs and an acting CAPT. PTT was therefore unable to conduct any training due to the lack of IP Officers being available to attend.

Camp Anaconda: PTT traveled to and arrived at the AD Dujayl JCC, where the PTT team requested to view all receipts for equipment that had been submitted for reimbursement. PTT found the inventory of the general equipment was complete and satisfactory. The FOB O'Ryan training team met with approximately 30 IP on the IA training compound and began day 1 of the 10 day survival training. The course study of the day was checkpoint survival/manning, securing the checkpoint at shift change, and roll call accountability.

Mosul (MND-N)

Ninewah

(MN0056) Ninewah Provincial Police Headquarters: PTT was unable to conduct a headquarters visit as the military members of the team stood down for non PTT related duties.

(MN0099) Major Crimes Unit/Major Terrorist Unit: The PTT did not travel to MTU due to the military members being reassigned to perform vehicle maintenance and mission planning.

(MN0002) Ninewah National Crime Lab: NPHQ and MCU PTT members attended a meeting with representatives of the Ninewah PRT and Brigade Provost Marshal. Discussed were the existing force protection shortfalls at the laboratory and the status of the emplacement of T walls, Jersey barriers and concertina wire as recommended in a recent study conducted by a CF engineer officer. The attendees also discussed the plausibility of moving the laboratory and equipment to the Blickenstaff complex adjacent to NPHQ for security reasons. The PRT discussed FBI experts in forensics science training the IP crime laboratory technicians. Attendees discussed that the lab is now capable of some handwriting analysis and limited firearms examinations.

(MN0923) Al Yarmook: This station was not visited due to a military "Battalion No Roll".

(MN0924) Al Jamouri Hospital LPS: This station was not visited due to a military "Battalion No Roll".

(MN0215) Mosul Al Gadeda LPS: This station was not visited due to a military "Battalion No Roll".

(MN0076) Tall Afar District Police HQ: PTT visited the Avgani LPS and met with OIC LT [redacted]. PTT discussed the fact that the police station is currently housed in a combination of CHUs and tents with no permanent structure. PTT stated that although this is certainly a less than ideal situation, there is much that can be done to improve the area in regards to security as well as the general aesthetics of the station area until a more suitable structure can be built. There seemed to be reluctance on the part of the IP to attempt to improve their current conditions. This also carried over to the professionalism and appearance of the IP at the station. Many were wearing shirts with no patches; none had station badges and most had in general, a much disheveled look. Although PTT sympathized with the many logistics issue that were brought up, PTT stressed that the IP would have to put forth an effort to maximize their current inventory of supplies and work with their station teams in order to improve themselves. PTT would assist the IP, but would expect a better effort on their part as well.

PTT also visited the Al Bughah LPS and met with CPT [redacted] who stated that due to the diligence of his IP, there is very little crime or terrorist activity in Al Bughah. The IP are housed in a relatively new IP station which receives local electricity. The citizens of the community appear to work well with the police. One concern of both stations was the lack of support from DHQ, in particular with providing current IP identification cards and station badges. The majority of the IP in both AO are carrying expired identification cards. Another major concern was the lack of vehicles. Avgani has four vehicles to cover a very large AO and Al Bughah has only one vehicle which is a 2001 Nissan. Many times this vehicle is called into service to assist Avgani which leaves Al Bughah without a patrol vehicle.

(MN0222) Rabiyah District Police HQ: PTT went to the Rabiyah Clinic to get death certificates for the IP killed in the line of duty. PTT is working through the bureaucracy to accomplish this and get family benefits in place. PTT received concerns about clinic security due to a new traffic pattern, created by the SVBIED on June 7th. PTT went to Rabiyah DHQ and documented the damage to their patrol vehicles and unmarked vehicles. Rabiyah DHQ personnel are working at making their building livable. PTT spoke to the on-duty Major. PTT passed on information about the IP in CF hospital care and asked them to help get death certificates for those killed. PTT advised IP not to acquire materials from the proposed IA compound (site of the second SVBIED). The MAJ advised PTT he thought the response and rescue operation went as well as could be expected. PTT advised work is being done to help with rebuilding and funding, but it will take time. He is redistributing resources in the meantime.

(NO FFD) NDJH Helpful Company: PTT traveled to NJDH - Helpful Company LPS without incident. NJDH - Helpful Company LPS LTC was not at the LPS. PTT met with the LT. and completed the IPFSR and Station Force Protection Assessment. PTT reminded the LT that LPS equipment needs should be sent to DHQ, in writing. PTT suggested the requests be made bi-monthly. PTT suggested they make three copies. One copy for the LPS records, the second for DHQ and the third for PTT. There was some small arms fire

while PTT was at the LPS. PTT attempted to ascertain the location and report it to command. *The LT stated five IP of NJDH – Helpful Company LPS IP were injured in the IED yesterday while in route to the Training Academy, in Mosul.*

(MN0016) Al Kisik Local Police Station: PTT traveled to Al Kisik and met with LTC [redacted] (b)(7)(c) who informed PTT all operations are going very well, and the working relations between the IP and the IA are strong at this point. PTT spoke with LTC about the IP uniforms and if they are meeting the minimum standards. LTC stated that all IP have the standard uniform but several IP are lacking the station badge. LTC stated he will work on acquiring more for his IP. LTC stressed that the station has not had running water for about two years. He said they have been working on digging a water well and have completed about eighty meters without hitting water. LTC said the digging has stopped because they have run out of money. He said it will cost about one million five hundred thousand dinars to complete the water well. As PTT spoke with LTC, the issue of supplies and needed items for the station was a topic for discussion. LTC stated the past three years that he has been in command at the station, they have not received one item of support from DHQ for supplies and needed items to conduct themselves in a normal situation. LTC said except for the one water machine that was issued from the last TIFF fund run, he or the IP go out and buy what they need. LTC said he sees that the stations that are supplied are those in Tall Afar.

PTT observed one IP vehicle sitting in front of the station without wheels and tires. PTT advised that this will be a good issue to bring up with DHQ Command Staff, to reach out and try to obtain a little more support for the out lying rural areas. PTT made contact with the one inmate that Al Kisik is housing who stated that he is being treated well in the station. The subject is only waiting for the paperwork to be completed for his transfer to Mosul to be sentenced. PTT looked at the facility that is called the jail. The only room in the facility has a dirt floor. This room could only be used for a short detainment. PTT questioned LTC concerning the living conditions for the prisoner. LTC said the prisoner usually sleeps where the IP sleep, on the roof, and eats three to four meals a day with the IP. After the station visit PTT conducted a patrol within the AO before returning to the FOB.
