**(BC0003) Airport Police Local Police Station:** The Team conducted Training at the French Village Sub-Station for 8 IPs covering Basic Glock Pistol. NCO Ali (FTO) attended the class and was provided training material. The Team received information the STO has been reassigned to MOI. The Team met Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed the firearms training schedule. The Team met Captain [Redacted] (Logistics OIC) and reinforced the need for continued use of the Chain of Command to request office supplies. The Team continues monitoring IP's daily performance at the BIAP Terminal and French Village Sub-Station.

**(BC0018) Al Jazaaer Local Police Station:** The Team conducted Training for 8 IPs and 1 Officer covering Democratic Policing. Students were attentive to the material presented and actively participated in classroom discussions. The Team conducted 2 Joint Patrols with 4 IPs and no incidents were experienced.

**(BC0021) Al Kadhimaya Local Police Station:** The Team conducted Training for 11 IPs and 1 Officer covering VBIED Stops/Suspect Extraction and Mirror Search Techniques for Explosives. The MOI Training Plan is being implemented at the Station. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 56 detainees incarcerated with no problems reported.

**(BC0036) Karrada Traffic Police Station:** The Team met Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed Station operations. The Military counterpart advised that TIFF funding would be available for Station improvements. The Station has not received fuel for the past 10 days. Colonel [Redacted] advised training is not required at Karrada Traffic Station and MOI provides training as required at the Station. The Station Commander has been briefed on the MOI Training Plan.

**(BC0038) Al Khansa Local Police Station:** The Team met Major [Redacted] (Station Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet the past 24 hours. The Team conducted Training for 6 IPs and 2 Officers covering Prisoner Management, Handcuffing Techniques and Community Relations. Captain [Redacted] assisted and provided valuable input concerning the topics instructed. Special emphasis was placed on officer safety and students were attentive to the material presented. The FTO selection process should be finalized within the coming week.

**(BC0041) Al Mesbah Local Police Station:** The Team conducted Training for 5 IPs covering Crime Scene Response and Security Procedures. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 35 detainees incarcerated. Air-conditioning and fans are not available due to the Station being without power. The Military counterpart is attempting to correct the issue by providing a portable generator for Station operations. The Team met Lieutenant [Redacted] (STO) who stated that MOI failed to provide the Station with a Field Training Manual. He was requested to secure all training certificates for filing in compliance with the MOI Training Plan.

**(BC0042) Meshahadah Local Police Station:** The Team observed Training conducted by Lieutenant [Redacted] for 9 IPs covering Prisoner Custody Procedures. At 1255 hours 3 mortar rounds impacted inside the Station compound. The rounds struck 6 fuel bladders containing

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approximately 1,200 gallons of fuel each which resulted in a large fire. The fire collapsed an inner wall and destroyed 2 skids of MRE's and drinking water. In addition, several portable toilets were destroyed due to the extreme heat for the fire. No injuries were sustained from the attack and the fire eventually burned out. This was the second incident involving mortars destroying fuel bladders at the Station.

**(BC0043) Al Muthana Local Police Station:** The Team conducted Training for 3 IPs covering Patrol Procedures and Reaction to Ambush. Students were attentive to the material presented and actively participated in classroom discussions. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 36 detainees incarcerated with no problems reported. The Team met Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] (Station Deputy Commander) who advised the Rusafa Corrections Facility continues their refusal to admit prisoners.

**(BC0049) Al Rashad Local Police Station:** The Team conducted Training for 8 IPs and 1 Officer covering Handcuffing Techniques, Pain Compliance Techniques, Patrol Procedures and Officer Mindset. Students were attentive to material presented and actively participated in classroom discussions. The lack of fuel continues to have a negative impact on Station operations. CF is supplying diesel fuel for generator operations at the Station. Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) advised the previously reported AWOL issue has been resolved and the offending IPs were returned to duty.

IPs detained a suspect on June 9th for a kidnapping in the AOR. Information revealed the suspect was wanted for questioning by Military Authorities concerning an earlier EFP attack on Coalition Forces. Additional information revealed the suspect fired on IPs and assaulted Lieutenant [redacted] (Rashad LPS) during the arrest process. The suspect was transported to FOB Rustamiyah for questioning and further processing.

**(BC0069) Al Thawra Local Police Station:** The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet during the past 24 hours. He advised no information has been received from MOI concerning the Training Plan. The Team conducted 2 Joint Patrols and 1 Foot Patrol with 5 IPs and no incidents were experienced. The IP infected with Typhoid is taking medication and continues working at the Detention Facility.

**(BC0094) Hy Al Amil Patrol Police Station:** The Team met Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised an IP patrol was attacked on June 9th. The patrol was responding to a report of dead bodies and was accompanied by an element of the National Police. As officers approached the location (local neighborhood), the NP unit stopped and refused to enter the area. IPs proceeded into the area with 2 vehicles and were attacked by an IED injuring 5 IPs and damaging the 2 vehicles. IPs were attacked by SAF after the explosion and radioed for assistance from the JSS. Information revealed the JSS and nearby NP unit failed to respond to the call for assistance. Colonel [redacted] advised a back-up unit from the Station arrived at the scene and provided assistance. The Station requested additional ammunition through the Chain of Command several times without any response.

Information revealed the Station continues to be advised that diesel fuel is available for operations.

**(BC0101) Mahmoudiya District Police HQ:** The Team conducted Training for 43 IP recruits covering Checkpoint and Vehicle Search Procedures. Information revealed the recruits will be scheduled to attend the Baghdad Training Academy at a later date.

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**(BC0120) Rusafa Directorate Police HQ:** The Team observed Training for 140 IP recruits covering ERU Weapons and Basic Equipment/Vehicle Familiarization. The Team met Brigadier General [redacted] (Headquarters Station Commander) and discussed the planned ERU Training Exercise for 12 IPs. Members of the US State Department (18 personnel) visited the Station to conduct an assessment of operations. The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Movement/Training OIC) and discussed a training schedule for Rusafa. Brigadier General [redacted] was advised on the MOI Training Plan.

**(BC0121) Saba Al Boor Local Police Station:** The Team conducted Training for 15 IPs covering Checkpoint Operations and Interview Techniques. Students were attentive to material presented and participated in classroom discussions. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with IPs and set-up a Hasty Checkpoint with no incidents experienced. CF is supplying fuel for vehicle patrols and generator operations at the Station. The MOI Training Plan was discussed with Major Reaid (Station Commander).

**Babylon (MND-CS/S)** [redacted]

**Al Qadisiyah** [redacted]

Missions were canceled by the Babylon Region command staff.

**Wasit Province** [redacted]

**(BW0600) Wasit Internal Affairs Facility:** The PTT Team from FOB Delta met with Commander, Col [redacted], who advised that he only has three vehicles assigned to his unit which is a major concern for him because he has 49 IPs working in his section and not enough vehicles to affectively support the work of his unit. The team advised him the paperwork in reference to his building construction was forwarded to Baghdad for approval.

**(NoFFID#) Wasit SRT 1:** The team met with Commander, LTC [redacted] and was informed the station has 2,000 AK-47 rounds, 1,000 BKC rounds and 1,250 PKM rounds of ammunition which was insufficient for his mission. The commander stated he has two PKM's but they are inoperatedue to the firing pins being broken. The LTC stated he has requested more ammunition and weapon parts from Provincial Headquarters but has not received anything. He was advised to provide the team with a copy of the written request so the team can forward it.

After visiting with the LTC, the team along with IPs from the station conducted a joint vehicle and foot patrol in the Shuhiada quarter. During the joint patrol, the team along with the IPs contacted local residents to gather information concerning possible insurgent rocket launch locations in the area. During the joint patrol, the team was approached by Sheik [redacted] (local Sheik for the area) who invited them into his home. He said he welcomed them into his community and asked the IPs to increase their patrols in the area. He stated the IPs were already patrolling and they have had a positive impact. He told the team he was aware of the rocket attacks on Camp Delta but he could only give a general area of where he thought the launches originated from.

After completing the meeting with the Sheik, a joint patrol was conducted in the area he indicated but with negative results on obvious launch points.

**Babil Province** [redacted]



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**(BB0032) Babil Provoincial Police HQ:** The team from FOB REO met and conducted a briefing on a joint effort (sweep) involving the Iraqi Army, Iraqi Police, IP SWAT, Coalition Forces , Civil Affairs personnel, as well as both PTT and MTT teams. The objective of the sweep was for the IA and IP SWAT to search and confiscate unauthorized weapons. Throughout the exercise, the IP SWAT appeared to perform in a fairly professional and efficient manner. Initially, the IP were fairly proactive in both traffic and pedestrian control although occasionally they turned to the team for guidance. Early on, they demonstrated adequate ability to direct vehicle and pedestrian traffic; however, as the day wore on and the heat increased, the IPs were inclined to retreat into shade and forego active engagement of traffic control.

In summary, an apparent need for additional training in traffic management was identified. A plan addressing the appropriate course of action to rectify this deficiency will be discussed.

No missions were conducted by IPLOs assigned to FOB Kalsu; however, training was conducted at the FOB Kalsu Training Facility. Twenty-one IPs conducted tests and surveys. Today was the last day of the ten day training for the IPs who were given a graduation ceremony at that conclusion of the training.

**Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna (PIC)** (b)(3), (b)(6)

PTT & MITT scheduled to issue equipment to Dhi Qar IPS logistical Officer. A call was received that he was not able to make the scheduled issue time and a new date is to be coordinated in the near future.

PTT members also met with the Dhi Qar IPS Financial Officer regarding upcoming Financial Training being offered to the IPS.

**Tikrit (MND-CW)** (b)(8), (b)(6)

**Diyala** (b)(8), (b)(6)

No report on this date from Diyala Provincial assets which is due possibly to the Chlorine VBIED attack that occurred on June 3rd. Internet service is inoperable at this time.

**Salah Al Din** (b)(3), (b)(6)

**Camp Speicher:** PTT met with COL (b)(7)(c) of the Salah Ad Din TIP's Academy who advised that on June 9th, a class of 65 men started the TIPs Academy class.

PTT met with COL (b)(7)(c) of the Provincial Logistics Office who provided several lists of equipment that have been issued to a few of the District Headquarters. He stated that some of the districts may not be coming in to get equipment because they say travel to Tikrit is too dangerous.

When PTT arrived at the TIPs Academy, a loud explosion was heard. This explosion turned out to be a VBIED detonation at the Iraqi Highway Patrol Station. PTT was advised that there was considerable damage, with several killed and wounded IP at that location. Also while at the Academy, considerable gunfire was heard all over certain parts of the city and many shells could be heard hitting the walls of the Academy. It appears that all of this gunfire was from IP clearing the streets of citizens. At this time, the city has been placed under a curfew for an unknwn length of time.



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**(NoFFID#) Bayji District Police HQ:** PTT conducted classes on Crimes against Persons and Personal Searches. The morning class was administered by MAJ [redacted], one of the four training officers at the Bayji JSS. The new night training was conducted by the PTT members only.

There was also training conducted by MAJ [redacted], the chief FTO for Bayji JSS in torture and mistreatment by the police.

PTT conducted additional classes on June 6-10<sup>th</sup> on judiciary system-chain of command, reaction to an ambush-level one, weapon safety and sectors of fire and elements of a crime.

**(TA0084) Samarra District Police HQ:** PTT met with MAJ [redacted] GEN [redacted], and LTC [redacted] at the JCC. GEN [redacted] was complaining about LTC [redacted] who is now the Mayor of Samarra. His complaint was that the LTC is now diverting electricity from Samarra to Al-Qala. LTC [redacted] stated that Al-Aala had been out of power for the past week and that he will figure out something so that Samarra and Al-Qala will both have electricity. They also discussed the security of BP5, where LTC [redacted] body guards are going in and out with garbage bags so that they can clean up the area. GEN [redacted] was worried about security as his men are in charge of BP5. LTC [redacted] agreed to place two of his body guards at BP5 to do the searches of anyone coming in. LTC [redacted] also agreed to take full responsibility if anything was to happen due to his men missing an item that may hurt someone. LTC [redacted] also agreed to give CF a key to his office building in case the Team suspected any wrong doing or needed to get into the building to place soldiers on the roof for force protection.

There also was an issue concerning how many IP had been paid compared to what was reported.

**(TA0087) Thar Thar Local Police Station:** PTT met with Officer [redacted], who stated that there were 15 IP working at this time along with him. PTT checked in the arms room to see if any of the weapons that were there were the ones that were missing two days ago. PTT could only locate 7 RBKs and 1 BKC. When the armor was questioned where the rest of the weapons were, he stated that he had issued them out to other IP.

**FOB Bernstein:** Twenty-one new IP received instruction in Iraqi law at the FOB who were receptive to learning and asked many questions of the instructors.

**(TA0099) Tikrit District Police HQ:** PTT asked BG [redacted] if he had a chance to talk with MG [redacted] about switching some of the IP at the Oujia station with some of the Tikrit area IP to lessen the tribal and family influence within the Oujia station. BG [redacted] stated that he had spoken with GEN [redacted] and he thought it was a good idea, but had not had a chance to speak with MG [redacted] about it. PTT informed BG [redacted] about the recent sniper attack at the Qadassia station and how the IP were not willing to cooperate with the CF and respond to the attack. BG [redacted] stated that they did not include that information in the report, but he would address that issue with the station's chain of command. PTT inquired if there had been any major crimes reported in the Tikrit area and BG [redacted] stated that nothing major had happened. PTT receives this same answer every time it has asked this question since BG [redacted] was appointed as the new District Chief. PTT has received information from various briefings that several kidnappings and murders have recently been committed in the Tikrit area. BG [redacted] is either not aware of these crimes or is purposely not sharing the information with the Team.

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**TA0604 Al Faris District Police HQ:** PTT met with approximately 30 IP and CAPT [redacted] of the Ad Dujayl District HQ Station at FOB O'Ryan. The course study for day 2 of the 10 day training was checkpoint survival, vehicle stops, searches, and occupant pat down and searches.

**Mosul (MND-N)** [redacted]

**Ninewah** [redacted]

**(MN0056) Ninewah Provincial Headquarters:** PTT spoke with LT [redacted] NPHQ jail and was informed that the juvenile detainees had not been moved to the juvenile detention facility. LT [redacted] requested PTT assistant in speaking with MG [redacted], PDOP to obtain 300 new blankets for the detainees. He explained that the current blankets are dirty, have not been cleaned and are passed from detainee to detainee without being cleaned. He also discussed providing MG [redacted] with the option of allowing family members to provide blankets for the detainees.

LT [redacted] asked that PTT advise MG [redacted] to issue a written memorandum to the jail allowing one of the options in order to improve the sanitation situation within the jail. PTT noted that there appears to be no known or obvious attempt to mistreat the detainees. PTT noted the detainees are being fed and provided water. PTT was advised the daily detention account was 382 civilian adults, thirteen juveniles, fourteen IP and two IA.

PTT spoke with BG [redacted], Logistics officer, who agreed to provide an air conditioner for the evidence room at the MCU. He advised that NPHQ only had a total of 13,000 rounds of BKC ammunition in reserve. He related that he is ready to provide the 5<sup>th</sup> ERB with 200 AK-47 rifles once the unit is properly manned and ready to be formally activated.

PTT spoke with BG [redacted], Finance officer, who explained that he has received a new order from MOI reference the subsistence order which allows either a monetary payment for the IP or the provision of food to the DHQ and LPS to feed the on duty IP. BG [redacted] provided a copy of the new order to PTT for translation. BG [redacted] related that under the existing order, IP working inside Mosul were to be fed at the DHQ or LPS, with IP outside the city limits being provided money to purchase food. He added that MOI had given the PDOP authorization to make a determination on how funds or food was disseminated to the IP. PTT inquired whether or not he was aware of any funds being provided by CF to the PDOP for support of the PJCC in Mosul. He was unable to answer the inquiry.

PTT spoke with COL [redacted], Chief of Administration, who explained that there were in fact two MG assigned to NPHQ. He explained that MG [redacted] had been the Commander for the Traffic Police in 2003 and has not received a new assignment since that date, but is believed to be in the process of retiring. He also advised that the 5<sup>th</sup> ERB has not been assigned any personnel, but that the assignment process is now in progress. PTT was provided with a breakdown of assigned personnel within Ninewah Province, Tall Afar and to NPHQ. PTT was advised that currently there are 18,278 IP in Ninewah Province; 2,816 in Tall Afar and 2,547 assigned to NPHQ. It was explained to PTT that a total of 3,822 are paid on the NPHQ payroll but that 1,275 are assigned to other units outside the headquarters (IE: Trans Jail, Governor's security detail, mayor's office, PJCC, 4<sup>th</sup>ERB, Economic police, Archeology department).

PTT spoke with Mr. [redacted], Administrator of Courts in Mosul, who related that all trials are in fact conducted at the Al Qathera courthouse near NPHQ. He said there is an



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Investigation court on the north side of the city and a Marriage/divorce civil court with both located in the Al Faysalia neighborhood of the city.

PTT conducted an inspection of the MPSA facilities, which included the quality of life for the students and its training staff. The PTT observed several classes in progress for quality control. PTT spoke with a few students who praised both the instructors and the content of the classes. PTT met with BG [redacted] Director MPSA, who explained his pressing concerns for MPSA. He stated the MPSA needs to be placed on the National Electric Power Grid, as this would reduce their dependence on diesel fuel to power their generators. BG [redacted] related the cost for connection would be two hundred million Iraqi Dinar. BG [redacted] said this request for additional diesel fuel had been refused by NPHQ Logistics. PTT learned the new food provider has only been operating for the last three days and is not providing water for other than drinking. BG [redacted] advised that he will provide the PTT with the training schedule for the two present academy classes and the future training class.

PTT returned to NPHQ and spoke with BG [redacted] about the electric concerns for MPSA. BG [redacted] advised he would make an effort to obtain the funds needed to connect MPSA to the power grid. BG [redacted] related he would send out a directive to the different police districts and stations requesting the names of 150 IP in need of basic police training. He related that the target date for attendance in the BRC at MPSA for these IP would be June 25<sup>th</sup>. Currently at the MPSA, there are 162 students participating in class 21. There are 137 students from Tall Afar in class 22.

**(MN0099) Mosul (Ninewah) Major Crimes Unit (CID):** The PTT met with COL [redacted] and discussed the upcoming graduation. The PTT explained to COL [redacted] that only nine students will be graduating due to the lack of attendance by other students. COL [redacted] agreed and informed the PTT that the students who did not attend the training will be disciplined.

PTT and COL [redacted] discussed how evidence is disposed of after a case has been adjudicated. COL [redacted] advised that if a detainee is released, the Judge can order the evidence to be released back to the detainee or held. The detainees can petition the court to have the evidence returned. If the detainee is convicted then the evidence is then turned over to NPHQ Logistics. COL [redacted] advised if the evidence is a firearm then it will be issued to an IP station.

The PTT met with COL [redacted] of MCU and discussed the upcoming graduation. COL [redacted] was informed of the number of students that would graduate. The PTT provided COL [redacted] with a synopsis of the crime scene scenario that was conducted this past Thursday. PTT then discussed the issue of photo lineups with COL [redacted]. COL [redacted] informed the PTT that his unit does not take photographs of detainees and that process is currently being completed by the jail. The PTT inquired as to why MCU does not photograph the detainees at which time the Colonel advised that the cameras received from NPHQ Logistics are of low quality and the batteries were missing for some of the cameras. COL [redacted] informed the PTT that he attempted to obtain replacement batteries but he cannot find the appropriate sized battery in Mosul. The PTT informed COL [redacted] the team would attempt to rectify the situation. The PTT then continued to discuss the importance of photo lineups and their effectiveness when trying to identify a suspect in a crime.

The PTT also followed up on the standardized forms that COL [redacted] is attempting to create. The PTT went through an active case with COL [redacted] and discussed each form in detail. The PTT made several suggestions to COL [redacted] regarding the standardization of forms. COL [redacted] informed the PTT he was pleased with the discussion and will continue



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to work on the documents.

**(MN0221) Al Kadra Local Police Station:** PTT met with MAJ [redacted] (b)(7)(c) who stated that on July 9th, IP responded to a request for assistance from IP elements of Ninewah Provincial Head Quarters (NPHQ) that had come under mortar attack two kilometers west of the LPS. Upon arrival there, they came under small arms fire. The IP returned fire and repulsed the attack. An IP lieutenant from NPHQ was killed and three civilians were wounded and transported to the hospital by IP vehicle. No IP from the LPS were injured but a truck sustained moderate damage. It is unknown if any AIF were killed or injured.

The ammunition depleted in the aforementioned attack was documented with NPHQ for replacement purposes. It consisted of 400 PKC rounds and 700 AK-47 rounds.

A computer and printer were issued to the LPS this date. The LPS will purchase a generator and it was suggested that they obtain surge protectors.

**(MN0928) Abi Tamaam District Police HQ:** This station has manning strength of 150 IP, of which 70 reported for duty on this date. This station covers nine check points and conducts three mobile patrols daily. COL [redacted] (b)(7)(c) reported that he has sixteen vehicles of which only twelve are working. The station also has 96 handheld radios assigned, but only 64 are working, which leaves 32 in need of repair. COL [redacted] (b)(7)(c) was advised by PTT that there is a contact in Baghdad that will work on the radios and that this information will be forwarded to him by PTT.

**(MN0381) Al Zuhoor Local Police Station:** Station Commander, CPT [redacted] (b)(7)(c) advised that his station operates three, day patrols two hours each and one night patrol five hours long. The station also has one over watch position and two check points. CPT [redacted] (b)(7)(c) stated that he has 34 IP and three officers on duty. PTT discussed community oriented policing and gave a class on public relations to the officers.

CPT [redacted] (b)(7)(c) advised that he is awaiting equipment to assist in filling the Hesco barriers and sand bags received from the military. The PTT ordered several items to assist with report writing and filing through CF. According to CPT Luay, his men are interacting with the community in which they protect.

**(NoFFID#) Badoush Prison:** Extended Visit:

June 3rd: PTT met with COL [redacted] (b)(6) who stated he needed more AK-47 training for his IPs.

June 4<sup>th</sup>: PTT conducted a class with thirteen IP for two hours on the safety, cleaning, proper stance, and sight picture and range safety for the AK-47.

June 5<sup>th</sup>: Trained eleven IP in interview techniques, stance, combat stance and posture, and how to properly interview a subject with and without backup.

06/06/2007: Conducted a class with fourteen IP in a classroom and trained for two hours on the safety, cleaning, proper stance, and sight picture and range safety for the AK 47.

June 6<sup>th</sup>: Took fourteen IP to the range just outside of the prison and trained them on proper stance and firing techniques of the AK 47. This range lasted four hours and we were able to teach the IP how to shoot accurate and be aware of weapon safety at all times.



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June 7<sup>th</sup>: Trained fourteen IP on the proper way to clean the AK 47 to include breaking it down and a function check. During this time all of the weapons were cleaned from the range this week. This class lasted two hours.

June 9<sup>th</sup>: Spent six hours on the ECP at the front gate retraining the IP on the proper way to search a person and their bags. In addition, PTT trained the IP on how to identify metal objects hidden on the body using the metal detector and the hand wand.

**(MN0201) Ninewah SWAT Team:** PTT was briefed by the Special Forces Commanding Officer with regards to four target packages. PTT mentored the Ninewah SWAT Tactical Commander and nineteen operators in the areas of explosive breaches; specifically stack placement and appropriate distances. Due to the time sensitive nature of the targets, PTT assisted Ninewah SWAT command in organizing two simultaneous entries and response to additional on site targets, should they evolve. Once all assets were briefed, Ninewah SWAT, SF, and CF set the order of movement. Shortly there after three target locations were breached; two explosively, and one by mechanical entry. Two simultaneous entries occurred with Ninewah SWAT performing all room clearing, assisted by SF. In total, seven locations did evolve, requiring breach, explosively and mechanically. Fourteen male AIF were secured, searched, and taken into custody by Ninewah SWAT and SF. All were transported to the detention facility on FOB Diamondback.

**(NO FFID) 1<sup>st</sup> Emergency Response Battalion:** This station was not visited today due to military re-tasking.

**(NO FFID) 2<sup>nd</sup> Emergency Response Battalion:** This station was not visited today due to military re-tasking.

**(NO FFID) 3<sup>rd</sup> Emergency Response Battalion:** This station was not visited today due to military re-tasking.

**(NO FFID) 4<sup>th</sup> Emergency Response Battalion:** This station was not visited today due to military re-tasking.

**(NO FFID) Emergency Response Unit:** This station was not visited today due to military re-tasking.

**(MN0009) Al Hadba District Police HQ:** This station was not visited because the military portion of the PTT was assigned to another PTT and visited Al Gizlani LPS and Al Waqaas LPS.

**(MN0008) Al Gizlani Local Police Station:** PTT met with MAJ [redacted] (b)(7)(c) who advised that the station received nine new IP from NPHQ. He continued, stating that one IP quit and they did obtain his equipment, including his pistol. PTT spent most of the station visit to gather information for the IPFSR. MAJ [redacted] (b)(7)(c) was provided with training material concerning Immediate Action Drills and Pedestrian Stops.

**(MN0214) Al Waqaas Local Police Station:** PTT met with MAJ [redacted] (b)(7)(c) who advised that a patrol was hit by an IED on June 7<sup>th</sup> resulting with one IP sustaining hand wounds. There was some discussion about Force Protection issues. PTT measured for T-barriers to be placed in the street in front of the station. The military will advise the engineers.

In the last months, two IP have quit. There is also an active investigation on two IP that quit one month ago and another that quit four months ago who never turned in their weapons. MAJ [redacted] (b)(7)(c) advised that he has eight vehicles and one is not working. He was again advised to send it to be fixed. In addition, MAJ [redacted] (b)(7)(c) has not received any information on the status of obtaining electric power from the city.



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PTT (b)(6) provided training material on Immediate Action drills and pedestrian stops to MAJ (b)(6) to be given to the training officer.

**(MN0045) Al Kazrag Local Police Station:** PTT arrived and met with COL (b)(6) who stated that the station received AK-47 ammo on June 9th and they have sent in a request for PKC and 9mm ammo.

**(MN0036) Al Dawasa Local Police Station:** PTT was informed by the Station Commander that the station had received 1000 rounds of AK-47 and PKC ammo. PTT informed the station commander that a quick fix for the station is in the works for HESCO barriers, c-wire and dirt.

The PTT was informed by the Station Commander that 70,000 dinar was taken from each IP paycheck to pay for food, which consisted of three eggs, two cans of beef and chicken, three bags of beans, six packages of jelly, one bag of tea and cheese. This food is supposed to last each IP for the entire month. The remaining 30,000 dinar has not been paid to the IP, but will be added to the IP on next paycheck. The Station Commander was advised that NPHQ will be contacted.

**(MN0222) Rabiya District Police HQ:** PTT observed the Combat Life Support refresher training at the Rabiya Port of Entry for Iraqi Security Forces. PTT also observed a simulated IED attack response with the movement of pedestrians through the POE and assisted as needed.

**(MN0131) Al-Bughah Local Police Station:** PTT departed DHQ and traveled to LPS Bugha to follow up on assessment requests and to conduct Firearms training. PTT returned to FOB without incident.

**(MN0204) Al Tahadi Local Police Station:** PTT traveled to Al Tahadi LPS without incident and met with the LTC. PTT completed the IPSFR and Station Force Protection Assessment. PTT reminded the LTC that LPS equipment needs should be sent to DHQ, in writing and suggested the requests be made bi-monthly. PTT also suggested they make three copies; one copy for the LPS records, the second for DHQ and the third for PTT. The LTC gave PTT a copy of the latest DHQ request. PTT noticed some weapons being stored in separate locations within the LPS. PTT had the weapons moved to the arms room. PTT also noted some debris around the station and suggested the debris be removed for the health and safety of all. PTT informed the LTC that there will be an upcoming Crime Scene Investigations class in which the LTC said he had two IP he wanted to attend the course.

## At Tamim

**(TT0005) Kirkuk Provincial Police HQ:** PTT met with MG (b)(6) and sat in on his staff meeting in which the following issues were discussed:

- Land transfer issues for stations and the academy
- Pay for the families of IP killed in service
- The need for deadlines for investigations
- The new jail opening ceremony
- Yearly firearms training for IP
- Proper supervision for IP checkpoints and patrols.



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The meeting went well and MG [redacted] will address many of the above listed issues with MOI at his meeting in Baghdad. MG [redacted] did; however, demand that individual stations be held accountable for insuring their IP were working their assigned areas.

PTT met with COL [redacted] and was advised that MG [redacted] approved the request for ammunition to outfit the province for a year and the request for new uniforms. He was asked about Glocks for the new recruits who have just graduated the academy in which he stated that he has 428 Glocks at HQ that can be issued to stations requesting them. He also stated that not all of the stations have turned in their inventory list of weapons currently in their possession and that he will provide the Team with the inventory list once it is compiled.

**(TT0034) Kirkuk TIPS Academy:** PTT traveled to the TIPS Academy today and verified the vehicle identification numbers on each of the Academy vehicles.

**(TT0099) Kirkut (Tamim) Major Crimes Unit (CID):** PTT verified vehicle identification numbers on the MCU vehicles that were at the station. The MCU received two computers and one air conditioning unit along with metal cabinets for the Investigators office. PTT updated the PSMR information and worked with LTC Qaise on the IP work schedule.

**(TT0023) Azadi Patrol Police Station:** PTT conveyed to Azadi Police Station and met with Station Commander, COL [redacted]. PTT and the Chief discussed IP guarding of the schools during the forthcoming graduation ceremonies. PTT also conducted IPFSR questions.

**(TT0007) Daquq Patrol Police Station:** PTT went to Daquq Police Station and met with the Station Commander. The team mentored the commander and investigators on the poor performance of the Daquq Police Station while the bombing incident was taking place. The station commander advised the team he has had several high level meetings and feels the problem has been addressed.

**(TT0009) Domies Patrol Police Station:** PTT conveyed to the Domies IP station and attended the Validation Ceremony.

**(NoFFID#) ERU:** PTT met with the station commander and discussed equipment issues. The station commander requested a welder for the station, which he said would enable the station to perform its own installation of security equipment on patrol vehicles. The commander also said that even though ERU is supposed to receive 40 liters of fuel per day for each vehicle, ERU is only receiving five liters per day.

**(TT0606) Mareay Local Police Station:** PTT conveyed to Mareay police station and was met by MAJ [redacted], Station Commander. PTT was tasked with patrolling all 21 villages Mareay is responsible for, to acquire GPS positioning for mapping purposes.

**(TT0025) Qoria Patrol Police Station:** PTT conveyed to Qoria Police Station, met with CPT [redacted] and discussed possible terrorist activity observed by the CPT.

**(TT0030) Saragan Patrol Police Station:** PTT traveled to Sagan IP station and met with COL [redacted]. Discussions included contracting for force protection issues and supply procedures. Station training was observed which included drill, ceremony, and physical training.



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Irbil [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

**(MI0001) Irbil Provincial Police HQ:** PTT met with MG [redacted] for permission to use the Provincial HQ conference room for the Irbil Summit meeting on June 23rd. He stated that he would check if it will be in use that day and would get back to the PTT. PTT also asked PDOP if he could make an appearance at the meeting. He stated he will be off work that day but would try to make it to the meeting.

The PTT also met with Deputy Director BG [redacted] who stated the police have made arrests of several people who have confessed to having been involved in the bombings of the MOI and Asayish buildings in Irbil on May 9th and the bombing of the KDP HQ in Makhmur four days later. BG [redacted] stated the suspects will be shown on local television in the next few days. BG [redacted] further stated some of the suspects may be Kurdish and that the reason for the bombings is not clear yet but that it was not a rift between the PUK and KDP. He stated there is an excellent relationship between the two parties at this time. He has high hopes for the future in the Kurdish region and for the whole of Iraq. The recent news that some Islamic groups have sounded off against Al Qaeda gives BG [redacted] confidence that peace is coming in the future for Iraq.

**(NoFFID#) Irbil Training Center:** PTT met with IPT at Irbil Training Center and worked on the Koya Power Point Presentation and obtained materials for T3 Presentations. PTT worked with IPT on T3 (Train the Trainer) Power Point Presentatin for the upcoming summit. PTT discussed with IPT the SOP for Soran, Mergasor, and Choman areas where T3 courses have been taught and instructors graduated. PTT and IPT are working toward laying the groundwork for a standard to which the areas will all work their instructors and PTT will monitor the progress and periodically oversee lessons.

**(MI0905) Airport Security Station:** The PTT met with the Station Commander to discuss the on going security assessment that the PTT is conducting at Irbil International Airport (EIA). The PTT and the Station Commander also discussed the physical security of the airport and conducted a site survey of the perimeter. Recommendations for enhancing perimeter security and airport access points were noted. The Station Commander is concerned that the current security policy is not adequate to address the additional security issues involved after the additional airport terminals are placed into service later this year. The Station Commander additionally stated that the recommendations of the PTT are essential for EIA to receive the funding required to address these security issues. The assessment is continuing and will address all security issues related to EIA.

Sulaymaniyah [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(d)

**(TS0275) Sulaymaniyah Provincial JCC:** PTT met with BG [redacted] and MAJ [redacted] and discussed PJCC operation as well as equipment issues for the PJCC and the five other JCC's. [redacted] is planning to bring Penjwin and Halabja JCC online in the near future. As of now, they are in the process of hiring additional personnel for those areas and are waiting on equipment for Kalar, Charchamal, and Ranya JCC.

PTT spoke with MAJ [redacted] regarding the PJCC Workbook, Threat Assessment, and SOP's issues. [redacted] was able to provide some of the information for the workbook today and will get the rest later this week. He stated that there has never been a threat assessment done to his knowledge but that the PJCC would be willing to meet with MOI and Provincial HQ to come up with one. There is no SOP in written form and that is something that PTT has addressed in the past with Khoshest and will address with him again this week. [redacted] said



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that there is currently a plan for the MOI to move to Irbil, and when that happens, the PJCC is scheduled to be relocated at Provincial HQ. He did not have a time line for this move.

**(TS0010) Sulaymaniyah Traffic Police HQ:** The PTT met with officers from the Sulaymaniyah Traffic HQ. The first course of training was Force Continuum and Expandable Baton. Students were instructed on what the mind set should be when on duty. Officer Presence, Verbalization, and Restraining and Detaining to include a display of authority as a peace officer and such non-verbal means of communication as body language, demeanor, and manner of approaching. Verbalization involves the direction, and commands given to the subject. Restraining and detaining includes an officer laying hands on a subject with the intention of gaining control of the subject. Also included in this level would be the application of temporary restraining devices such as handcuffs and leg restraints. Compliance Techniques were discussed to include joint manipulations, pressure point applications, take-down type techniques and the use of intermediate weapons in control type configurations.

**(TS0024) Cham Chamal District Police HQ:** PTT arrived at Chamchamal DHQ and continued the lesson on Crime Scene Evidence Collection. The topic of the class was sketching crime scenes and probable cause. The class was involved in the discussion as well as practical exercises. All students took good notes and gained valuable information on the procedures of crime scene investigation.

**(TS0008) Sulaymaniyah Provincial Police HQ:** The team began the second week of the 30-day advanced accident investigations course at the Sulaymaniyah Police Academy. This course is being conducted at the request of MG [redacted], to insure his police investigators have an understanding of accident investigation, as they have the duty under Iraqi Law to present the case to the Investigative Judges in fatality cases.

A review of the course content for the past week was positive in that the majority of the investigators attending have a clear understand to date of the subject matter taught. This is in spite of their varying levels of education.

**(TS0010) Sulaymaniyah Traffic Police HQ:** PTT traveled to the Border Patrol Academy where the first day of Motorcycle training for the 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive class began. The Kurdistan Traffic Police Instructors that were selected took an active role in the training with PTT, playing more of a mentoring role:

**Dahuk** [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6)

**(MD0002) Dahuk Provincial Police HQ:** PTT traveled to Dahuk PHQ and met with the PDOP, MG [redacted]. The PTT informed the MG that CF was waiting to assist with the Macloob Mountain repeater installation but needed a date and time that the IP could be ready to go. MG [redacted] set a date, time, and location to meet. The PTT will forward that information on to CF. This is the last repeater scheduled to go up in the Dahuk Province. (b)(2), (b)(3), (b)(6)

The PTT also asked the MG about the status of the T-barriers that were ordered for Camp Zawita. The MG called the manufacturing plant while the PTT was present and advised that the barriers were ready for delivery. A delivery time was worked out and equipment will be on hand to place the barriers when they arrive.

**(MD0645) Derya Local Police Station:** This station is responsible for patrolling the lake and shore between Dahuk and Ninewah Provinces and enforce criminal as well as fishing laws. The station has four small boats and three small boat motors for lake patrol. The commander advises that he concentrates boat patrol during the night in order to try and



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identify any persons trying to cross from the Ninewah side over the lake to avoid checkpoints. The station has insufficient fuel to patrol as much as they feel they need to and only three boats are operable with one of those three usually down for some sort of repair or maintenance. They have a problem in that their boats and motors are so small they frequently are eluded by boats they attempt to check at night.

The commander would like to see Ninewah Province establish a boat patrol unit working that side of the lake so that they could coordinate their efforts to catch and identify suspicious craft. This unit is often fired on when they near the Ninewah side as well. As previously stated they try to concentrate their boat patrols during the night due to fuel constraints and patrol from the shore during the day when visibility is good and boats can be launched to investigate anything suspicious. In addition to these duties, the station provides back up assistance for the next nearest station when called upon.

The base station radio for this station is not operable and needs to be programmed and their vehicle needs to have a radio installed. The station has three hand held radios that operate very weakly or not at all from all but high ground in their area. This area is also very weak in cell phone service. The province still has one repeater that has not been put in place yet so it is unknown at this time if that might correct the communications problem.

The station consists of two very small containers and no built up docking for the patrol boats. Both a larger and better facility and a boat dock are needed as well as a larger patrol boat with an engine capable of giving them the chance to catch and inspect suspicious craft. A telephone line also needs to be run to this station to help with communications. Only the officers carry three magazines of pistol ammunition; the others only have fifteen rounds per pistol. The commander is going to start documenting logistics supply requests in order for the PTT to evaluate DHQ and PHQ responses.

Currently PT and drill are the only training being conducted at the station level but the commander would like to have a qualified trainer to do more training. In particular, the commander would like marine related training as that is their primary duty. Three of the men assigned to this station do not even know how to swim.

**Ramadi (MND-W)** [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6)

**Al Anbar** [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6)

**(RA0013) Fallujah District Police HQ:** PTT attended the bi-monthly team meeting with Regimental Combat Team 6. The topics of discussion for this station were that the pay procedures are in place and pay rosters are up to date. Provincial Support Unit Training is in progress and performing well and the Iraqi Police Recruit drive is complete.

**(RA0252) Fallujah District JCC:** The same PTT serves the Fallujah District Headquarters. The PTT attended the bi-monthly team meeting with Regimental Combat Team 6. The topics of discussion for this station were that the PTT continues to improve relationship with the Iraqi Police.

**(RA0005) Amariyah Police Station:** The Police Transition Team attended the bi-monthly team meeting with Regimental Combat Team 6. The topics of discussion for this station were the recruitment drive, force protection and pay for the Provincial Support Unit. The PTT has drafted a budget for 2007-2008.

**(RA0016) Ferris Patrol Police Station:** The PTT has drafted a budget for 2007-2008.



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**(RA0022) Al Anbar IHP Station 7:** The Police Transition Team attended the bi-monthly team meeting with Regimental Combat Team 6. The topics of discussion for this station were the initial assessments being conducted. The PTT has drafted a budget for 2007-2008.

**(RA0032) Karmah Patrol Police Station:** PTT attended the bi-monthly team meeting with Regimental Combat Team 6. The topics of discussion for this station were that the Iraqi Police want to be more independent and replacement parts are difficult to obtain.

**(RA0060) Saqlawiyah Patrol Police Station:** The Police Transition Team attended the bi-monthly team meeting with Regimental Combat Team 6. Topics of discussion for this station were that the Warrant Officer Program is in place and operating.

**(RA0101) Ramadi Central Local Police Station:** The Police Transition Team met with Station Chief and discussed multiple issues. The PTT also conducted a security survey. The majority of the Iraq Police were not properly attired in vests or helmets when observed at their posts. The Station Chief stated they did not have the equipment to issue to the IP in order for them to be properly attired.

**(RA0072) Rutbah District Police HQ:** The Police Transition Team met with the Station Chief and mentored him on the proper development of a command structure.

**(RA0010) Tamim Local Police Station:** No station visit was conducted. Military PTT members were assigned to non PTT related missions.

**(RA0025) Al-Huria Local Police Station:** No station visit was conducted. Military PTT members were assigned to non PTT related missions.

**(RA0029) Jazeera Local Police Station:** No station visit was conducted. Military PTT members were assigned to non PTT related missions.

**(RA0030) Ramadi South Local Police Station:** No station visit was conducted. Military PTT members were assigned to non PTT related missions.

**(RA0048) Ramadi District Police HQ:** No station visit was conducted. Military PTT members were assigned to non PTT related missions.

**(RA0095) Baghdadi District HQ:** The Police Transition Team (PTT) are continuing to construct a course outline for training at Camp Lueken.
