(BC0003) Airport Police Local Police Station: The Team conducted training for 6 IPs covering Basic Glock Pistol. NCO Yasser (FTO) attended the class and was provided additional training material for future reference. The Station requires another STO appointment as Lieutenant [Redacted] has been reassigned to MOI. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and Armory at French Village Sub-Station. The Team inspected the BIAP Detention Facility and found it without electricity. The Team met Captain [Redacted] (OIC Logistics) and discussed logistics issues. The Team continued working on the firearms Training schedule. The Team continues to monitor and assist IPs during their daily activities at the BIAP Terminal and French Village Sub-Station.

(BC0007) Al Adhamiya Patrol Police Station: The Team conducted Training for IP recruits covering AK-47 and ASP Baton Tactics. Students were attentive to the material presented and participated in practical exercises to demonstrate proficiency. The Team conducted a special class for Police Commissioners covering Police Ethics and Crimes against Property/Persons. The Team met Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) who was pleased with the training process for new recruits. The Station FTO was observed professional and diligent in his efforts to conduct training.

(BC0011) Al Dorah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 8 IPs covering Combat First Aid, Weapons Safety and Vehicle/Person Searches. Lieutenant Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) was advised that demolition of the old Police Station was scheduled to commence on or about July 2nd. The building sustained heavy damage from a previous VBIED attack and deemed unsafe.

(BC0012) Al Dorah Patrol Police Station: The Team met Lieutenant [Redacted] (STO) to discuss future training for IP recruits covering Human Rights and Community Policing. The Team met Lieutenant Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) who expressed frustration over a request for additional BKC ammunition. He advised the written requisition to Headquarters was returned indicating no ammunition was available. He further stated written requisitions are not worth the paper they are written on. The Team has determined that Colonel [Redacted] fails to supervise subordinate Officers holding leadership positions at the Station. The Team learned of several incidents where Colonel [Redacted] failed to pass-on important information to subordinate Officers. The Team instructed the Station Commander on the importance of maintaining proper information flow throughout the Chain of Command.

(BC0017) Al Hurrya Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 6 IPs covering Human Rights and Treatment of Prisoners. Students were attentive to material presented and participated in classroom discussions. The Team met Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) who advised the AOR was quiet during the past 24 hours.

(BC0041) Al Mesbah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 5 IPs covering Crime Scene Response/Security and Situational Awareness. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 39 detainees incarcerated. The jail condition was hot due to being without electricity for air-conditioning or fans. No Station Command Staff were present at the Station.

(BC0042) Meshadah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 8 IPs and 1 Officer covering Patrol Principles and Objectives. The Team met [redacted] (class instructor) and reviewed lesson plans used during the class. Force Protection was found adequate with officers manning assigned posts. The latrines remain out of service due to the sewage holding tank being full. The Station is out of fuel and no Joint Patrols were conducted.

(BC0043) Al Muthana Local Police Station: The Team met Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised the sniper problem in the AOR continues with an SA soldier KIA earlier in the morning of June 10th. Preliminary information indicated the sniper was operating (shooting people) from inside a vehicle. The Team made the suggestion for the Station Commander to begin plotting the attacks to formulate a pattern of the sniper. He was further advised the information could be used to set-up undercover stake-outs to apprehend sniper. The Station has 4 AWOLs which have been reported to MOI for disposition. Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] will not make any positive movement concerning the MOI Training Plan until receiving directions from MOI.

(BC0065) Al Taji Patrol Police Station: The Team met Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised IP recruits will complete their training in approximately 10 days. He indicated 108 of the 120 originally hired recruits remained in the class. Further details revealed 9 recruits were fired after criminal record checks indicated convictions for serious crimes. The Team suggested for background checks be conducted prior to hiring so as to avoid the possibility of breach in security procedures.

(BC0078) Al Zohour Patrol Police Station: The Team met 2nd Lieutenant [redacted], 1st Sergeant [redacted] and Sergeant [redacted] and discussed Police Survival lesson plans. The Team requested a list of supplies needed for the training. The Team met Major [redacted] (Station Deputy Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet during the past 24 hours.

(BC0082) Criminal Evidence Division: The Team met General [redacted] (Station Commander) who requested training for IPs covering Crime Scene Procedures. The Team met General [redacted] (Personnel Officer) and learned the Station is fully staffed. He advised approximately 15 IPs require identification badges after working at the Station for 8 months. The Team met Lieutenant Colonel [redacted] (Communications Officer) who advised 9 computers are out of service due to recent power surges at the Station. Generator fuel is being supplied by Coalition Forces.

(BC0088) Baghdad Provincial Traffic Police HQ: The Team met Major General [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised 360 IP Traffic recruits arrived at Traffic Headquarters. Further information revealed the remaining 140 recruits are expected to arrive within 2 weeks and all will require training. He advised 5 instructors are assigned to the task using the MOI Training Plan. The Team will monitor the process and provide assistance as needed. General [redacted] (Traffic Training Director) was contacted and advised to use the Chain of Command for requesting logistics items such as ammunition and range hearing protection.

(BC0090) Boob Al Sham Local Police Station: The Team met Colonel [redacted] and discussed Station operations. He advised a truck loaded with alcohol exploded June 10th while the driver was attempting to hot wire the vehicle. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol and Foot Patrol with IPs in the market area and no incidents were experienced. The Team provided officer safety training during the operation.

(BC0105) Criminal Investigation Directorate Unit 2: The Team conducted Training for Lieutenant [redacted] (FTO) covering Prisoner Control and Building Entry/Search Procedures. Lieutenant [redacted] voiced concern that IP showed little interest in training due to the subject matter not being related to Force Protection. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 259 detainees incarcerated in overcrowded and unsanitary conditions previously reported.

(BC0120) Rusafa Directorate Police HQ: Training was conducted for 140 IP recruits covering ERU Weapons and Vehicle/Radio/Basic Equipment Familiarization. The Team met Brigadier General [redacted] and discussed Ethics Training at the Station. The Team is finalizing plans for Range Training scheduled for June 14th. The MOI Training Plan has been discussed with the Station Commander.

Babylon (MND-CS/S) [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

Al Qadisiyah [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

Missions have been canceled by the Babylon Region command staff.

IPLos, along with the 984th MP Unit from Camp Echo have begun work on establishing a training center on the FOB with the goal of bringing IPs from the province to the FOB and provide them with a controlled training environment. The team has been given an area to begin setting up classrooms and has enlisted the help of the Polish General and KBR. The team has also started preparing lesson plans and conducts daily meetings to advance the development of the training center.

Wasit Province [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

No information received at the time of this report.

Babil Province [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(BB0002) Al Balda District Police HQ: The PTT Team from FOB Reo met with Lieutenant Colonel [redacted], Deputy Commander, who advised that money has been allocated to the Hey Babil LPS for construction at the station. The station is in much need of infrastructure such as water line upgrades, emergency generator installation and sewer installation. These are priorities and quality of welfare issues to the IPs. The team advised the LTC that they would work to try and solve some of his concerns. A future visit to Babil Provincial HQ will allow the team to meet with the IP Command Staff to attempt to get some of these projects started.

The team discussed their recent visit to Hey Babil LPS with the LTC and asked about all the wrecked vehicles that were on the premises. Hey Babil LPS is a very small station with limited space inside their perimeter and the vehicles are taking up an enormous amount of parking space. The LTC explained that the procedure for getting the vehicles removed was to contact a judge and obtain an order for removal. The team advised the LTC that they would go to the Al Hilla Courthouse and speak with a judge concerning this issue.

Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna (PIC) [redacted] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

PTT members attended the daily operational briefing in Camp Terendak and the daily SSR/MITT/CPATT meeting with Major [redacted].

PTT met with MiTT Desk Officer for Al Muthanna IPS and discussed CPATT support requirements from the Battle Group/Combat Team for planned Train the Trainer operations in the future.

PTT members also met with CPT [redacted] & CPL [redacted] OBG (W)3, regarding information received during the finance meeting.

Tikrit (MND-CW)

Diyala

No report on this date from Diyala Provincial assets which is due possibly to the Chlorine VBIED attack that occurred on June 3rd. Internet service is inoperable at this time.

Salah Al Din

(TA0080) Salah Al Din Provincial HQ: PTT met with COL [redacted] who stated that the IHP station in Abu Ajihl had sustained heavy damage, due to yesterday's VBIED attack. The personnel at that station have been moved to the Abu Ajeel local police station, until another building can be located. 12 IPs were killed in the attack and 36 injured. COL [redacted] advised that a water truck was used as the VBIED. A complete report will be given to PTT upon its completion.

PTT met with COL Shoker, who stated he received a memo from MOI four days ago, stating all the uniform budget must be returned to MOI. PTT advised COL [redacted] that the matter would be addressed.

(TA0013) Al Alam District Police HQ: PTT traveled to FOB Danger and issued Hesco Baskets and C-Wire for the Al-Alam District Headquarters. PTT also visited the Internal Affairs office and spoke with COL [redacted]. COL [redacted] was asked how many cases were currently being worked by his department in Tikrit and he stated that it was over 100, but most were terrorist cases and not actually Internal Affairs type cases. COL [redacted] also stated that he has been working closely with the Provincial MAJ at the IP stations. COL [redacted] stated that over 50 IP have been fined \$200.00 for committing ethics violations.

(TA0077) Salah Al Din North IHP Station: The station is basically destroyed and is now recovering from the insurgent attack from yesterday. Most of the sensitive items have been removed and brought to Tikrit Main for inspection, accountability and serviceability. Most of the files were still left out in the open. These files have a great deal of IP personal information and MAJ [redacted] was told to make sure these items were recovered. It is unknown at this time what is going to be done on this HQ station. The only thing that is for certain is that it will be housed in the Abu Ajeel LPS in the interim.

(TA0084) Samarra District Police HQ: PTT met with GEN [redacted] and MAJ [redacted]. GEN [redacted] briefed PTT on the arrival of approximately 600 NP in Samarra which should take place sometime this week. GEN [redacted] is looking for locations within the city to house the NP. As it looks now, the NP will move into the city and take over the operations of the IP which will give the PTT time to get the IP back into working order. PTT again asked MAJ [redacted], for the list of IP that were paid this last payday. MAJ [redacted] again used stalling tactics and said he would have them today. GEN [redacted] is still not back from his vacation and no one knows his location.

PTT wanted to know if MAJ [redacted] sent the list of 175 IP that had been fired to the Provincial HQ. Maj. [redacted] stated he would have to check with [redacted]. When IPLOs went to see [redacted] he was gone for the day. PTT stressed to [redacted] that until these 175 IP were taken off the books, MOI would not send any replacement IP.

PTT also asked MAJ [redacted] if he had any information from GEN [redacted] about receiving help to rebuild the Emergency Battalion HQ. He stated that he had not received any information regarding that subject. PTT advised that they would approach the rebuilding of this HQ through the PTT in Tikrit.

(TA0056) Balad District Police HQ: PTT traveled to the Balad District IP HQ where they utilized the BATS system to ID 15 more IP and entered them into the data base system.

(TA0604) Al Faris District Police HQ: IPLO went to FOB O'Ryan to meet with approximately 30 IP. CAPT [redacted] continued day 3 of the 10 day training course which was an overview consisting of days 1 and 2 (check point setup, shift changes, roll calls, stops and approaches, vehicle searches, and personal pat downs).

Mosul (MND-N) [redacted]

Ninewah [redacted]

(MN0056) Ninewah Provincial Headquarters: PTT did not travel to the Provincial Headquarters, but accompanied by BG [redacted] NPHQ Logistics officer did travel to two separate District Headquarters for logistics inspections.

PTT spoke with COL [redacted] Commander, Hamaam Al Ajil DHQ and discussed the logistics needs of the headquarters. He expressed a desire to upgrade the force protection posture of the headquarters and requested that CF provide 25 rolls of concertina wire, Hesco barriers, fifteen bundles of sandbags, and 100 engineer stakes. PTT advised COL [redacted] that the materials would be provided by CF and staged at the Logistics office, NPHQ awaiting pickup by COL [redacted] IP. PTT spoke with MAJ Ali and MAJ [redacted], District Investigations officers, who expressed a desire to have a computer with printer and a digital camera issued to their office, so that they could better document investigative activity. BG [redacted] agreed to issue the equipment to the investigators. PTT noted that the investigative office does maintain evidence in a locked evidence container. PTT noted that it was packaged separately and properly marked with additional documentation maintained in the case file. PTT was advised that neither investigator has attended the three week investigators course offered at the Baghdad Police Academy.

PTT spoke with BG [redacted] Commander, Qayarah DHQ and discussed logistics needs for the headquarters. PTT advised him that CF would not issue RPG launchers or RPG rounds to IP at DHQ or LPS. PTT advised if the IP seized these types of weapons from AIF that when the case was finally adjudicated the judge could order the launchers and rounds to be released to the arresting agency for inclusion in their armory and used for defensive purposes only. PTT was advised that BG [redacted] intends to 'standup' an additional 300IP with the permission of MOI and the PDOP, MG [redacted]. BG [redacted] related that he would set aside body armor, Kevlar helmets, several AK-47 rifles and one or two BKC machine guns for the new unit. BG [redacted] advised PTT that he embraces the community policing concept and on a regular basis meets with various members of the public and several sheiks in the community. PTT noted that CPT [redacted], District investigator, does maintain an evidence

locker with properly tagged evidence, but has not attended the three week investigators course offered at the Baghdad Police Academy.

PTT inspected the Police Academy aboard FOB Endurance (Q West) and noted that some of the air conditioners were not working, but that the class rooms were properly furnished and useable for classes. PTT noted that only two small classes were currently being taught at the facility. PTT further noted that life support was in place.

(MN0099) Mosul (Ninewah) Major Crimes Unit (CID): The PTT did not travel to MTU on this date, due to the military PTT being reassigned to travel to Q-West on a separate PTT mission.

(MN0220) Al Karama District Police HQ: There was no notable activity in the last twenty-four hours at the DHQ. The station visit was cut short when PTT was re-tasked to a Quick Reactionary Force (QRF) mission when another unit came under Rocket Propelled Grenade (RPG) and small arms fire in the western portion of the city.

Twenty new IP were hired, but not all of them have reported to work yet. This should bring their numbers to 140, which includes ten officers. The DHQ has 70 Glock 9mm pistols (all functional), 348 AK-47 rifles (all functional) and 42 PKC machine guns (all functional). Ammunition includes 2000 AK-47 rounds (7.62X39) and 8800 PKC rounds (7.62X54). There is no pistol (9mm) ammunition. The DHQ has one base radio, ten vehicle radios (five are functional) and 43 portable radios (all are functional). In addition, there are ten trucks, of which six are functional.

The DHQ training officer will schedule Mosul Public Service Training (MPSA) for new members of the DHQ and LPS that fall under their purview. Mandatory range training for all IP will be scheduled in the near future.

(MN0928) Abi Tamaam District Police HQ: PTT conducted a range safety course which was followed by live fire drills. The IP present were from different stations in the Abi Tamaam district and were trained on the AK-47 weapon system. The range will be completed with 9mm range training on another training visit to the station.

(NoFFID#) Al Rimmah Local Police Station: Training was conducted at Abi Tamaam DHQ where there were twenty IP from different stations in the Abi Tamaam district present for the training. A twenty minute range safety class was conducted prior to the live fire drills. Training was called early as the squad had to assist another squad that had taken fire. The range training will be re-scheduled in the near future.

(MN0209) Avgani Local Police Station: As PTT was traveling to Avgani LPS, they were informed the IA / IP had cordoned off The City of Avgani, due to an IP being injured the previous night by a remote detonated IED. PTT spoke with LTC [redacted], who said that a source had informed IA / IP of the possible suspects that planted the IED, were in the city. The IA / IP conducted a sweep of the city and had gathered roughly, 525 civilians (males). The IA / IP briefly interviewed each subject and seventeen were detained for further questioning. The seventeen detainees were transported to Tal Afar Jail.

PTT conducted hands on training class with ten IP in regards to professionalism and ethics. PTT then traveled to the FOB without incident.

(MN0009) Al Hadba District Police HQ: The PTT learned BG [redacted] had been assigned to the Al Hadba District Station. BG [redacted] stated he would be moving to another

area of the police department as soon as the Ninewah Provincial HQ found a place where he could use his engineering skills.

Additionally, there were 25 new IP recruits in formation in front of the station upon the arrival of the PTT. BG [redacted] stated that after some testing and training that the new IP would be assigned to various stations in the district.

PTT conducted a training session on IP Mission, Values, & Roles in which 6 IP attended.

(MN0070) Al Suweis Local Police Station: PTT was unable to conduct a station visit as the Military members were re-tasked for maintenance. PTT addressed administrative issues, logistical tasking, and mission planning.

(MN0918) Al Fasalia Local Police Station: PTT was unable to conduct a station visit as the Military members were re-tasked for maintenance. PTT addressed administrative issues, logistical tasking, and mission planning.

(MN0136) Al Ahrar Local Police Station: PTT was unable to conduct a station visit as the Military members were re-tasked for maintenance. PTT addressed administrative issues, logistical tasking, and mission planning.

(MN0068) Al Somer Local Police Station: PTT was unable to conduct a station visit as the Military members were re-tasked for maintenance. PTT addressed administrative issues, logistical tasking, and mission planning.

(MN0018) Al Nasir District Police HQ: PTT was unable to conduct a station visit as the Military members were re-tasked for maintenance. PTT addressed administrative issues, logistical tasking, and mission planning.

(MN0030) Bab Shamas Local Police Station: PTT was unable to conduct a station visit as the Military members were re-tasked for maintenance. PTT addressed administrative issues, logistical tasking, and mission planning.

(NO FFID) 1st Emergency Response Battalion: This station was not visited due to military re-tasking.

(NO FFID) 2nd Emergency Response Battalion: This station was not visited due to military re-tasking.

(TT0005) Tamim Provincial Police HQ: Information was obtained about 'orders of capture' issued by the 'High Integrity Commission' (HIC which is located in the Kirkuk Court House. The order of capture has been issued and the police are waiting for the Governor of Kirkuk to agree with the order. A time frame will be given to PTT on the Governor's decision tomorrow.

LTC [Redacted] will be traveling to Baghdad to pick up ten PKMs and 75,000 rounds of PKM ammunition.

(b)(7)(c)

(TT0002) Altun Kupri Patrol Police Station: PTT observed the Altun Kupri Station IP personnel conduct operations at the north and south checkpoints along with COL [Redacted]. The IP demonstrated the skills in searching vehicles according to the block of instruction previously given by PTT. PTT examined the jail cell and found that it was clean and orderly with one detainee present.

(b)(6)

(TT0003) Arafa Patrol Police Station: PTT paid the IRD workers for the past weeks' work. The jail is in the process of being remodeled with plumbing issues and painting going on now. The training SGT is still in the process of training the 24 new IP. SGT [Redacted] is training on first aid, basic marksmanship, and detainee procedures.

(b)(6), (b)(7)(c)

(TT0910) Aydallah Patrol Police Station: The PTT met with Station Commander [Redacted] and discussed renovations for the training room and stairs. The PTT visited the holding cell and checked on certain areas. There were 25 inmates with no medical issues. The PTT did an inventory on all of the assigned weapons and ammunitions count with the Arms Room Officer. The 1SGT conducted a shift change formation and had an inspection of necessary equipment for all the IP. The IP were given classes on weapon familiarization and firing positions.

(b)(7)(c)

(NoFFID#) Multaka Local Police Station: PPT traveled to the Multaka station and collected data for the IPSFR. PTT also checked the VIN numbers on the stations' assigned vehicles.

(TT0024) Qarah Anir Patrol Police Station: PTT conveyed to Qara Hinjer Police Station and made contact with LTC [Redacted]. The main topics of discussion were force protection issues at the front of the station facility. PTT conducted body searches and felony handcuffing techniques with eleven officers. PTT also reviewed muzzle discipline and trigger control. PTT conducted an overview of force protection and security issues with Hesco barriers on the north side. The jail is not functional at this time and in dire need of a complete refurbishing.

(TT0026) Rahemawa Patrol Police Station: PTT paid the local IRD workers for their work from last week. LTC [Redacted] is still having problems getting enough water for the detainees. The local fire department arrived while PTT was at the station and filled seven five gallon

water containers. PTT is working with the personnel staff to update the new IP personnel files, who were recently assigned to the station.

(TT0032) Taza Karhmatu Patrol Police Station: PTT conveyed to Taza Police Station and met with COL [redacted] to discuss the purchase of several items with remaining PTT funds. The team then met with the Logistics Officer to review the progress in implementing a new logistics file for each IP.

Irbil

The PTT met with the Kurdish minister of the Interior (KMOI) who encouraged the Airport Security initiative that the PTT is conducting at the Erbil International Airport (EIA). EIA is expected to service over five million passengers in the next year and is a very important part of the process of promoting international business in the region. The KMOI stated that the support of the PTT in this endeavor is vital.

The KMOI stated that the security of EIA is essential to promoting economic growth and commerce to the Kurdistan region and encouraged the PTT to continue to provide training and assistance to address any security concern that the EIA may encounter.

(NoFFID#) Irbil Training Center: IPLOs and IPT visited the Irbil Training Center to discuss the Presentations for the coming Summit 2007. PTT discussed changes to T3 and Outlying Areas Power Point Presentations and began designs of other presentations. PTT also designed the layout and theme for the the Summit 2007. PTT discussed logistical issues with Logistics Office and continued preparation for the Summit as the numbers in attendance have grown and the location of the summit may be moved to a larger location.

Sulaymaniyah

(TS0010) Sulaymaniyah Traffic Police HQ: PTT met with officers from the Sulaymaniyah Traffic HQ. The first course of training was Force Continuum and Expandable Baton.

The goal of the Expandable Baton training program is to prepare the students to safely apply an intermediate weapon to neutralize aggressive /physical behavior, subject control, containment, and threat neutralization techniques. Further, the training will focus on establishing an understanding of use of force, techniques to gain subject compliance and to safely control individuals. PTT then walked them through the basic body mechanics and stance, carrying the baton, drawing the baton, baton strikes, target areas to strike and opening / closing the baton.

(TS0024) Cham Chamal District Police HQ: PTT arrived at Cham Chamal DHQ and continued the lesson on Crime Scene Evidence Collection. The topic of the class was Processing Vehicle at Crime Scenes. This was a very important class and the students understood that this is typically a very common form of investigators duties. This class was covered very carefully and it was not complete until all students had a good working knowledge of this type of investigation.

(TS0008) Sulaymaniyah Provincial Police HQ: PTT met with investigators from the Sulaymaniyah PHQ and continued the second week of the 30-day advanced accident investigations course at the Sulaymaniyah Police Academy. This course is being conducted at the request of MG [redacted] to insure his police investigators have an understanding of accident investigation, as they have the duty under Iraqi Law to present the case to the Investigative Judges in fatality cases.

Today's class required the investigators to start conducting some calculations in order to determine relevant facts pertaining to accident investigation. Again, due to the varying levels of education of the students, it will continue to be necessary to adjust the course accordingly to insure the investigators have a good understanding and working knowledge in this field, and are able to adequately interpret the physical evidence present at accident scenes.

PTT also traveled to the Border Patrol Academy where the second day of Motorcycle training for the 3rd consecutive class began. The class is progressing well and definitely on schedule if not ahead for some. Though the riding course has been reduced in size, it appears not to be a problem with the students and their ability to concentrate on the many cone patterns.

(MD0621) Akre District Police HQ: PTT discussed the daily schedule of the KP at DHQ with MAJ [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6). Responsibilities and hours of each KP working at DHQ were also covered. The MAJ wants to add KP to his district, including his DHQ. PTT worked with the MAJ on how to construct a plan to approach Dahuk PHQ with the personnel request. The MAJ also discussed the idea of wanting to start a narcotics unit in the Akre District.

The city of Akre has had a problem with electric power as the area might receive only two hours of city power per day. Today, PTT supplied Akre DHQ with a thirteen horsepower generator, purchased using TTIF funds and signed for by MAJ [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6).

PTT discussed more training issues with MAJ [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6) and explained the program of training the trainer. PTT explained that by sending KP from his district to the training program, he could begin to build a training team for his district. The MAJ seemed very interested in this program and is willing to select people to participate.

While at DHQ, CPT [redacted] (b)(3), (b)(6), who is over the A Sa Ish, came to DHQ. PTT also discussed building an Emergency Response Team and an Emergency Response Plan for the district. He seemed very interested in getting himself and his men involved in this. PTT scheduled a follow-up visit with him to discuss what role his agency might play in such a plan.

The Station Chief addressed his concern for setting up a District court. He also stated that at the current time tribes and the city council are handling most of the minor issues.
