(BC0003) Airport Police Local Police Station: The Team was stood-down 16 June 2007 to attend a Memorial Service for 2 fellow employees. The imposed curfew is scheduled to be lifted 17 June 2007 and the Team will continue the Training Program CF-LPS-07-00023.

(BC0018) Al Jazaaer Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 3 IPs and 1 Officer covering Officer Safety CF-LPS-07-00023. Students were attentive to the material presented and actively participated in classroom discussions. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with 3 IPs occupying 1 vehicle and no incidents were experienced. The Team inspected Force Protection and found IPs alert and properly equipped.

(BC0041) Al Mesbah Local Police Station: The Team met Colonel [Redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed Station operations. A local couple was escorted to the Station by an IP from Karadah PPS to make a complaint. Information revealed the couple had been forced from their home and their vehicles were stolen. IPs refused to assist the couple because the alleged crime occurred more than 24 hours ago outside the AOR. The Station Commander advised the case must go through the Chain of Command to Rasafa Headquarters for disposition. The Karadah IP left the Station with the couple indicating he would attempt to contact a judicial official about the matter. IPs delivered 1 decomposing body to the Station which was recovered near the Tigris River. Investigators determined the unidentified male victim had been shot in the head multiple times and the matter remains under investigation. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 38 detainees incarcerated. Information revealed IPs are paying for electricity to power 2 fans for cooling prisoners in the jail. The Military counterpart plans to have a military medic visit the prisoners for evaluating their health conditions. The Station did not receive fuel and IPs will not travel to Al Dora Station for generator fuel CF-IHP-07-00021. The MOI Training Plan was not discussed due to the language assistant being unavailable CF-LPS-07-00023.

(BC0042) Meshahadah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 10-IPs and 1 Officer covering Combat First Aid. Lieutenant [Redacted] (STO) assisted with presenting the class using a lesson plan CF-LPS-07-00023. Students were attentive to the material presented and participated in practical exercises to demonstrate their proficiency. The Station does not have a preventative maintenance program for servicing patrol vehicles. Lack of planning has resulted in only 7 of the 16 assigned vehicles being operational for patrol duties. Vehicle patrols are not being conducted due to MOIs failure to support the Fuel Policy CF-IHP-07-00021. The Coalition Force is considering supplying vehicle fuel so IPs can begin patrolling the AOR and assume a more visible presence in the community. No prisoners are being held in the Detention Facility due to same being used by the military's QRF unit for billeting. Coalition Forces are providing Force Protection 24 hours per day at the Station. Latrines remain inoperable due to the sewage holding tank being at capacity. Drivers responsible for sewage disposal refuse to travel by stating the roadways are too dangerous for travel.

(BC0045) Al Nasir Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 9 IPs and 1 Officer covering Police Survival and Building Search Techniques CF-LPS-07-00023. Students were attentive to the material presented and participated in practical exercises to demonstrate their proficiency. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol and 4 Joint Foot Patrols

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and no incidents were experienced. The Team met Captain [redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed Station operations.

(BC0051) Al Rasheed Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 6 IPs covering Foot Patrol Procedures and Community Policing CF-LPS-07-00023. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol and Foot Patrol in the AOR and visited Checkpoints. The Team set-up a Hasty Checkpoint with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 24 detainees incarcerated with no problems reported. The Arms Room was inventoried and the OIC was concerning use of a log-book for maintaining weapons accountability.

(BC0081) Bab Al Sheikh Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for IPs covering Community Policing CF-LPS-07-00023. Students actively participated in classroom discussions and appeared to grasp the Community Policing concept. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol and Foot Patrol with IPs. The Team met Lieutenant [redacted] at a Checkpoint and he accompanied the Team during a vehicle patrol and no incidents were experienced. The Team met Captain [redacted] (Shift Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet during the past 24 hours.

(BC0100) Mada'in Patrol Police Station: The Team met Major [redacted] (Station Commander) and found the Station undermanned possibly due to the religious holiday and imposed curfew. Major [redacted] requested assistance in obtaining release of a weapon (Glock pistol) seized from an IP by Coalition Forces. The Teams Military counterpart will investigate the matter in an attempt to have the weapon returned. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with IPs and visited Checkpoints with no incidents experienced. No Training was conducted due to the shortage of personnel CF-LPS-00023.

(BC0119) Al Rusafa Patrol Station: The Team arrived at the Station to find the Station Commander and Deputy Commander sleeping. Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) advised the scheduled training class was cancelled due to the imposed curfew and class was rescheduled for 17 June 2007 CF-LPS-07-00023. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Team inspected 13 Checkpoints in the AOR prior to RTB. During the operation, 1 of the Teams gunners fired several rounds into a suspicious civilian vehicle which had approached the convoy. No injuries were sustained and the Team RTB without any further incident.

(BC0122) Sheikh Saad Local Police Station: The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) to discuss Station operations. Information revealed Colonel [redacted] received a 'temporary order' from MOI directing IPs to guard the local mosque in an attempt to prevent violence in the community. At direction from the JSS, the Team assisted with the recovery of a Military vehicle which had been stuck by an IED on Route North Harley. The Team provided scene security for the recovery operation. The military wrecker was targeted by another IED (which missed) during the RTB trip and no injuries were sustained from the attack. There was no confirmed threat to the Team during the mission.

(BB0500) Babylon Police Academy (Al Hilla): The PTT Team from FOB Reo met with Commander, Colonel [Redacted] who advised that three instructors were removed from the academy during the past week; two were transferred to the Emergency Response Unit in North Babil and one instructor was disciplined for instigating a confrontation with IPs at a local traffic check point. This instructor was reassigned to a local police station and jailed for two days by order of General [Redacted]. One recruit was dismissed from the academy for being AWOL. Some of the recruits from the North Babil area are having difficulties getting to and from the academy due to the increased tension and bombings between Shiites and Sunnis. The recruits were trained on qualification with the 9mm and arrest techniques.

Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna Over Watch (PIC)

PTT members attended the daily operational briefing in Camp Terendak and the daily SSR/MITT/CPATT meeting with Major [Redacted]. PTT members met with members of MITT team to coordinate planning and training efforts for both provinces. In addition, PTT members briefly discussed with CIMIC members to the possibility of engaging in community outreach programs the IPS can become involved in.

PTT members assisted in the issuance of Glock pistols to the Al Muthanna PJCC commander. PTT members met with Lt. Col. [Redacted] of the Al Muthanna PCJJ and discussed the Security Plan Status, Issuance of logistical items and support for upcoming training to be held at Al Muthanna Academy.

PTT members continue the task of inquiring about the MOI Badge process and will evaluate procedures for future implementation within each province. It is PTTs goal to have a good understanding of the process from initiation to conclusion.

(TA0141) Salah Al Din ERU 3rd Battalion: PTT conducted an inspection of the barracks building currently undergoing renovation. The building is 95% renovated and the ERU IP is already using the barracks. The building is a secure, structurally sound, and adequate building for the intended purpose. There are 3 different bunkrooms for each of the 3 companies of IP. There is also a vehicle maintenance supply room located in the building, which is stocked with parts and tools.

(TA0099) Tikrit District Police HQ: PTT traveled to the Tikrit District HQ and conducted a force assessment inspection of TDHQ. It was decided that a guard tower should be built on the roof of the guard building at the front gate as it will provide better fields of fire for the protection of the front gate. PTT then conducted a class on station protection and recognition and response to VBIED attacks.



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(TA0050) As Saniyah Local Police Station: Upon arrival at the station, PTT found 10 IP on duty. Five of them were sent down to work at the Check Point located at the edge of the city and the other five were used to relieve them later in the day. No training was conducted due to inadequate numbers of IP at the station. PTT met with the ex-station chief who is in consultation with the command staff at Tikrit PHQ about being restored to that position.

(TA0084) Samarra District Police HQ: PTT met with GEN [redacted] and discussed his bodyguards attempting to obtain pistols from the armory. He was told due to the situation in Samarra and the large number of IP quitting or being fired, no pistols would be issued at this time. GEN [redacted] agreed and asked for some ammunition for his bodyguards since they were involved in a gun fight three days ago. The armory will issue the General ammunition for his men.

PTT asked GEN [redacted] why the team has not received the information on all of the IP that had been paid for May. GEN [redacted] stated that he would have this information by Monday. The team then discussed why PTT was not provided the complete list of fired IP which is needed for replacements. GEN [redacted] stated we would also have it tomorrow. It was stressed to him about how importance of this information.

PTT met with GEN [redacted] about the number of IP that are on-duty in Samarra. GEN [redacted] would not furnish this information to PTT on paper. Instead, he would only give a number verbally. PTT later met with him and requested that the numbers be reported twice daily on paper to PTT. GEN [redacted] changed his stance on this and agreed to this request without further hesitation.

PTT conducted a large meeting with CF, NP, IA, and IP Generals. The focus of the meeting was who was going to be in charge of the forces in Samarra, and what was going to be done. There was much discussion concerning the rebuilding of the Golden Mosque during this meeting. The General in charge of the IA told his men that if anything else happened to the mosque, "heads would roll." As a result of the meeting; the IA is in charge of all the security at the Mosque and of the protection of the dam. The NP will be in charge of Uvani and they have Special Forces here to handle any Intel that comes in. The NP will patrol the city and will be in charge of the security of the Green Zone for the time being.

At approximately 2000 hour, the IP LNO informed the PTT that all the IP assigned to BP4 had left. PTT responded to that location and found this information to be correct. All of the IP had left the checkpoint without telling anyone. The PTT MPs were also advised and responded to BP4 with reinforcements. CF took positions at BP4 until IP could get there, approximately 20 minutes later. Once the area was secure, PTT went to GEN [redacted] to find out where the IP that were manning this checkpoint had gone. GEN [redacted] stated that MAJ [redacted] had left and gone on vacation again, taking these 10 IP with him as his PSD. GEN [redacted] stated he would leave his PSD at BP4 for the next 3 days to cover the absence. PTT advised him that this situation was not good; since there were only 13 men in his PSD and that they would become fatigued and then also quit.

PTT then went and met with NP GEN [redacted] about this situation. GEN [redacted] advised that MAJ [redacted] had been ordered by GEN Adnon to not have anything to do with the IP anymore. This included taking vehicles, weapons, uniforms, or manpower for his use. GEN [redacted] called for GEN [redacted] to come to his location in the presence of PTT. GEN [redacted] stated that he would take care of the problem and, subsequently sent 10 NP to BP4 to enhance its security.

PTT, through its IP leader assessment requirement, has formed the opinion that GEN [redacted] needs to be replaced immediately. He is not a good leader and the IP do not respond to him.

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which appears to be out of a lack of respect. PTT inadvertently witnessed a small part of a discipline session in regards to him from GEN [redacted] which appears to indicate that the leadership in this new security situation in Samarra does not have confidence in him. With so many new players in this security arrangement from agencies such as the IA and the NP, there needs to be a sound and capable leader for the IP.

(MN0056) Ninewah Provincial Police HQ: PTT was unable to conduct a headquarters visit as the military members of the team stood down for non PTT duties.

(MN0099) Mosul (Ninewah) Major Crimes Unit (CID): PTT was unable to conduct a headquarters visit as the military members of the team stood down for non PTT duties.

(MN0002) Ninewah National Crime Laboratory: NPHQ and MCU PTT members attended a meeting with representatives of the Ninewah PRT and Brigade Provost Marshal. Attendees renewed the discussion of moving the laboratory to a section of government owned land near NPHQ. It was noted that the cost of upgrading force protection at the present site would cost more than moving the lab into modular units at a more secure site near NPHQ.

(MN0220) Al Karama District Police HQ: PTT met with LTC [redacted] who related that there was nothing new to report on this date and that most of his IP were on patrol. The station had no power turned on and the generator was out of fuel. The station is in need of a larger fuel tank to support the generator.

(MN0928) Abi Tamaam District Police HQ: PTT met with District Commander, COL [redacted] who advised that four checkpoint patrols and twelve mobile patrols were conducted on this date. COL [redacted] also received a new officer, Colonel [redacted] second in command at the station. A personnel file was completed on COL [redacted] along with a photo. PTT received a copy of the force protection plan for Abi Tamaam which will be discussed by the Team to determine its effectiveness.

LT [redacted] promotion and pay request through NPHQ was again discussed as he is still not receiving lieutenants' pay.

(MN0918) Al Fasalia Local Police Station: COL [redacted] stated seven IP quit their jobs at the first of this month leaving only 40 IP for the station. One of the seven was his detective, LT [redacted]. PTT conducted training with the two ECP guards after watching them make a tactical error on body searches.

(MN0068) Al Somer Local Police Station: PTT continues to observe the IP and officer staffing levels for this station are at a minimum. Almost double the current number of IP, are necessary for this station to conduct effective pro-active policing for their AO.

The local contractors conducting the work on the station have not returned as of this date. The station generator is still not functioning. PTT discussed training with MAJ [redacted] and advised him that PTT could again begin training as soon as the next visit. MAJ [redacted] was very interested and advised of a few topics that he would like his IP to have instruction on. PTT will attempt to shadow the training that is accruing at Al-Nasir DHQ.



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(MN0961) Al Shur Local Police Station: A computer has been installed in the station commander's office and equipment inventory is now being maintained. Use of this and other computers in the building has been hampered by the lack of electricity to this area of the city. A generator is used sparingly every day because of the shortage of fuel.

A written request for 5000 AK-47 rounds and 3000 PKC rounds of ammunition has yet to be granted and the chronic ammunition shortage continues. PTT will continue to track this request through NPHQ (Ninewah Provincial Headquarters).

(MN0233) 2nd Emergency Response Battalion: This station was not visited due to military re-tasking.

(NO FFID) 3rd Emergency Response Battalion: This station was not visited due to military re-tasking.

(NO FFID) 4th Emergency Response Battalion: This station was not visited due to military re-tasking.

(NO FFID) Emergency Response Unit: This station was not visited due to military re-tasking.

(MN0009) Al Hadba DHQ: This station was not visited due to the military standing down for a regularly scheduled maintenance day.

(MN0008) Al Gizlani LPS: This station was not visited due to the military standing down for a regularly scheduled maintenance day.

(MN0214) Al Waqaas LPS: This station was not visited due to the military standing down for a regularly scheduled maintenance day.

(MN0045) Al Kazrag LPS: This station was not visited due to the military standing down for a regularly scheduled maintenance day.

(MN0036) Al Dawasa LPS: This station was not visited due to the military standing down for a regularly scheduled maintenance day.

(MN0061) Qayarra Local Police Station: PTT went to the Qayarra DHQ and conducted a small class on personnel and vehicle searches to the IP of Qayarra LPS. There were six students involved in the training.

(MN0140) Al Saad Local Police Station: The PTT went to the Checkpoint Company's AO for the purpose of conducting a station visit. During the visit, the PTT met with the station commander and was able to verify the information in his commander's bio as well as get an updated photograph of him. The PTT spoke with the commander about the status of the checkpoints within his AO. The commander stated that he felt that the checkpoints would benefit if DHQ created a team that would go to each checkpoint in Tal Afar to check for the accountability of the IP assigned. The PTT suggested that he present that idea to his chain of command. The PTT further advised the commander to ensure that the supervisors at his station conduct routine inspections of the checkpoints to check for the accountability of the personnel assigned.

The PTT also observed that the IP had followed up on our suggestions of measures that would increase the level of force protection at the station. The PTT was advised that the



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station has made several supply requests to DHQ with no results. The PTT was also advised that there is a need for new radios and at the very least, new radio batteries. The PTT advised the IP to continue to send written requests to DHQ until they receive the supplies that they need.

(MN0027) Al Tahadi Local Police Station: PTT traveled to Al Tahadi LPS, without incident. PTT spoke to LTC [redacted] and inquired about the number of checkpoints in Al Tahadi LPS's AO. LTC [redacted] said he had twenty two checkpoints and that seventeen checkpoints stopped vehicles and pedestrians. PTT explained the need for all IP to wear the same uniforms and display their badges. PTT explained to the LTC the importance of having a uniform policy.

(TT0022) Meghdad Patrol Police Station: The team observed station shift change procedures conducted by 1SG Wasab and LT [redacted] and informed them of changes needed to improve the daily shift change and inspections. The team made contact with the station chief, who was informed about the situation and training was scheduled regarding shift change procedures. The team assessed the holding cell, finding seven inmates with no medical issues.

(NoFFID#) Multaka Local Police Station: PTT traveled to Multaka and collected data for the IPFSR and updated station data.

(TT0032) Taza Karhmatu Patrol Police Station: No IPLO movement, due to CF conducting a military operation.

(NoFFID#) Irbil Training Center: PTT from Dahuk met with IPT at Irbil Training Center for the second day of a three day T3 (Train the Trainer) class. Upon completion, Dahuk PTT will have four IPLOs who will be certified T3T instructors. This course is being provided to support an effort to train as many IPLOs to begin providing classes for IP in their respective regions. All participants have indicated they are picking up some important training points from this course.

Irbil PTT Team: PTT assisted the medical team with visits to three nurse training centers in Irbil. CF requested transportation for two doctors to arrange basic medical training for nursing students. The classes will begin in September 2007. PTT accompanied the team on the visits and later returned them to the ROK base. The training, which is Train-the-Trainer, is very basic and is aimed at lowering the mortality rate in the rural villages in the Kurdish region. PTT agreed to assist wherever time allows in the future.

(MI0905) Airport Security Station: The PTT conducted a survey of the proposed Main Airport Entrance Checkpoint. This checkpoint will allow access to the EIA Passenger Terminals and buildings and will also serve as back up for any security breach that occurs at the 100 Meter checkpoint and will prevent further access to the actual airport. The PTT recommended both physical fortification of the checkpoint as well changes in staffing and checkpoint operational procedures. The station commander concurred with the PTT and will institute the recommendations.

(RA0025) Al Huria Local Police Station: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team (PTT) assigned to non-PTT duties.

(RA0029) Jazeera: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team (PTT) assigned to non-PTT duties.

(RA0030) Ramadi South Local Police Station: The Field Facility Identification number (FFID) issue is being resolved by Brigade Iraq Security Force, the FFID number will remain the same. The Police Transition Team (PTT) conducted training on prisoner searches and cell searches.

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(RA0046) Qatana Local Police Station: Delayed reporting due to an extended visit.

June 11th: The Police Transition Team worked with 2 Iraqi Police Captains and 2 Iraqi Police on investigations. Both were assisted with the documentation and the interviewing process. After both cases were concluded, a decision was reached by the Iraqi Police that no arrest should be made. The PTT followed up in both incidents with the IP Captains and IP on both cases. The cases were handled in a professional manner by the IP. The PTT met with all IP and Officers to discuss their job assignments and areas of responsibility.

June 12th: The Police Transition Team interviewed different Iraqi Police Officers and Iraqi Police with the goal of giving job specific training on the areas the IP work everyday, and then follow up on overall training for Officers and IP. The PTT did a joint dismounted patrol. The mission was community oriented with soccer balls passed out and the needs of the community documented by the IP.

June 13th: The Police Transition Team mentored one Iraqi Police Captain with his investigation, including interviewing and documentation process. The Police Transition Team also conducted a joint dismounted patrol that was community oriented. The mission was to handout food items, while the PTT documented the concerns of the citizens. The PTT met with and interviewed Iraq Police concerning their job responsibilities. Individual training for specific job tasks is being formulated for the immediate future with overall training being implemented as well.

June 14th: The Police Transition Team interviewed different Iraqi Police Officers and Iraqi Police with the goal of giving specific training on the areas the IP work everyday, and then follow up on overall training for Officers and IP. The PTT did a joint dismounted patrol. The mission was community oriented with the concerns of the citizens and business owners in the district documented. The PTT assisted one Iraqi Captain with his investigation and documentation on a subject that was arrested. This arrest was the result of the investigation and follow up from the arrest made on the previous day. PTT attended the Chiefs' meeting at the West Ramadi Station. The Police Chiefs in the area discussed district concerns to rules governing the IP as well as the advancements they are making in their stations.

June 15th: The Police Transition Team interviewed different Iraqi Police Officers and Iraqi Police with the goal of giving job specific training on the areas the IP work everyday, and then follow up on overall training for Officers and IP. The PTT began the implementation of a formal roll call process. The PTT followed up with the Iraqi Police Captain on his investigations and documentation of the two arrests that were made this week. The PTT were training one Iraqi Police Interpreter who will translate and assist in the teaching of police ethics to all IP

(RA0048) Ramadi District Police HQ: The Police Transition Team did not visit the West Ramadi District Headquarters Joint Coordination Center. The PTT hosted the monthly Iraq Police Awards Ceremony at Camp Ramadi. There were numerous Iraq Security Force personnel from the various Ramadi Stations and their PTT counterparts attending the function. The top ranking officer of the Ramadi Iraq Police, Battalion, and Brigade Commanders were the guests of honor. Several IP from every battle group were given awards.

The station and the detention center were inspected. The PTT attended an officers meeting and observed an interview conducted by the Iraq Police Officer on one detainee. The new policy was followed as far as the subject being checked out of the detention center and checked by the PTT.

(RA0095) Dulab Local Police Station: There was no station visit conducted, as PTT was tasked with the training of Iraq Police at the Baghdadi Forward Operation Base. The PTT conducted training for 17 IP recruits on democratic policing, police ethics, human rights and community policing.

(RA0083) Hadithah District Police HQ: The PTT explained briefly to the Station Chief the mission goals and to improve the relationship between the neighborhood and the Iraq Police. The PTT had to cancel the scheduled class due to no interpreter available for class instruction. The PTT conducted a joint patrol in the town of Hadithah. The purpose of the foot patrol was to help the IP to improve in the areas for patrolling techniques and to work on their interactions with the general public. Several houses and business were visited where the PTT monitored and evaluated the IP working on their public relation skills with the citizens of Hadithah.

PTT screened 16 individuals who were previous Iraq Police. Hadithah Police Officers collected their information and will request hiring orders from the Ministry of Interior. The PTT met with PTT from Haqlaniyah Station concerning facilities and equipment needs to make the station functional. The discussions included the transition of IPLOs into the PTT in the near future. The PTT checked on the detainees currently held in the station holding cell and found no signs of physical abuse. The detention facility is always staffed and clean. All detainees are checked regularly and are fed twice a day and given water when needed.

(RA0097) Kubaisa Local Police Station: The Police Transition Team conducted pay operations and conducted training of 6 separate classes on police ethics. The PTT trained a total of 91 Iraq Police and 11 Officers. The PTT prepared materials for train the trainer classes to be conducted at Camp Hit
