(BC0003) Airport Police Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 9 IPs and 3 Officers covering the Basic Glock Pistol. Classes were held at the Terminal and French Village Sub-Station. NCO Ali (FTO) attended the instruction at French Village Sub-Station and was provided training material for future reference. The Team met Global Security officials and the IP Command Staff to discuss security issues. The IP Command Staff was reminded to use the Chain of Command when requesting equipment and supplies. The Team observed the morning briefing and found IPs receiving their daily assignments and continues to monitor IPs daily activities at the Terminal and French Village Sub-Station.

(BC0010) Al Bayaa Local Police Station: The Team met Major [redacted] (b)(7)(c) who is replacing Colonel [redacted] (b)(7)(c) as Station Commander. Major [redacted] (b)(7)(c) advised he would like to see more effective patrols in the AOR and will evaluate conditions for change. The Team met IP [redacted] (b)(7)(c) who stated the generator has not had any type preventative maintenance which will likely cause malfunction or damage in the future. The Station was heavily damaged from a previous VBIED attack and reconstruction efforts are scheduled to begin by mid-July 2007.

(BC0018) Al Jazaaer Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 8 IPs and 1 Officer covering Building Entry and Search Procedures. The Team conducted 2 Joint Patrols and 4 Foot Patrols with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 5 detainees incarcerated with no problems reported. The Team met Lieutenant [redacted] (b)(6) (Station Commander) and discussed Station operations.

(BC0037) Al Kahdra Local Police Station: The Team met Warrant Officer [redacted] (STO) and discussed the MOI Training Plan. The Team learned of his intentions to use training folders for tracking all data associated with training for Station personnel. Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) advised MOI is not supplying diesel fuel for Station operations. Information revealed attendants at the Al Kadamia Fuel Point repeatedly advise no fuel is available. Additional information indicated Colonel [redacted] is purchasing fuel (with his money) for Station operations. The Team met Major [redacted] (Shift Commander) who advised "I am not in charge" and was reluctant to discuss anything.

(BC0041) Al Mesbah Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 5 IPs covering Foot Patrols (Day/Night) and Suspect Field Interview Techniques. Students participated in practical exercises to demonstrate proficiency in the techniques learned. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 38 detainees incarcerated in very hot conditions.

The Teams Military medic provided medication for detainees complaining of medical problems. The Station reported 6 AWOLs and the MOI AWOL Policy is posted inside the Station.

(BC0046) Al Quanat Local Police Station: The Team conducted Training for 10 IPs and 1 Officer covering Officer Safety, Detention Cell/Prisoner Search and Traffic Stops. Students participated in real-time exercises searching the Detention area and prisoners. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 41 detainees incarcerated. Iraqi Police Officers being detained (in a separate cell) were checked and found without drinking water. 1 IP detainee was in need of medication for an apparent kidney stone ailment. The Station

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Commander (Colonel [redacted]) was notified and appeared unconcerned about the issues. Lieutenant [redacted] assisted the Team with providing drinking water as well as making arrangements for a trip to a pharmacy for medication. One air conditioner was operating in the jail and others were in need of repair. The Military counterpart is attempting to locate a more suitable electric water pump for the Station to increase water pressure.

(BC0069) Al Thawra Local Police Station: The Team met Lieutenant [redacted] (Shift Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet during the past 24 hours. The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol and Foot Patrol with IPs and no incidents were experienced. The Station has been without fuel for 2 days due to the imposed curfew. Lieutenant [redacted] stated local mosque sermons advised people not to support or cooperate with the Militia.

(BC0074) Al Yarmouk Traffic Police Station: The Team conducted a Joint Patrol with General [redacted] and inspected IPs working at Yarmouk traffic circles. The Team visited Checkpoints in the AOR and no incidents were experienced. Captain [redacted] continues working with [redacted] (Karkh South Traffic) and Warrant Officer [redacted] (Dorah Traffic) to develop a Traffic Training plans. Information revealed a Draft Plan is scheduled for completion by July 10th and review by Brigadier General [redacted] (Station Commander).

(BC0081) Bab Al Sheikh Local Police Station: The Team briefed Captain [redacted] covering Community Policing issues. The Team also conducted 1 Joint Patrol and Foot Patrol with IPs and no incidents were experienced. Captain [redacted] advised the AOR had been quiet during the past 24 hours.

(BC0085) Baghdad Provincial Patrol Police HQ: The Team met Colonel [redacted] who advised the Tiger Team Class had been delayed for 2 months due to recruit training scheduled at Baghdad Academy. After discussing the negative impact of the decision, Colonel [redacted] reversed his decision and agreed to have the Tiger Team Class ready for training in 1 week. The Team met Lieutenant [redacted] and Instructor [redacted] and discussed Firearms Training. Instructor [redacted] advised Hesco barriers had been rearranged but required filling with sand. The Teams' suggestion of using IPs for the task was met with resistance and it remains unclear how the task will be completed. The Team met Brigadier General [redacted] (OIC Vehicle Maintenance) who advised he was seeking MOI approval for selling junked IP vehicles for scrap. Details indicated the process involved red-tape and may take approximately 2 months for resolution. The Team continues monitoring work in-progress for the new Training Building. Information revealed the structure is under contract to be attached to the municipal power-grid.

(BC0103) Criminal Investigation Directorate HQ: The Team met the Assistant Station Commander who advised of overcrowding in the Detention Facility. He advised the Iraqi Army routinely delivers prisoners for incarceration with little or no evidence of crimes committed. Further information revealed the Iraqi Army has a reputation for beating confessions out of prisoners. Details revealed 14 different gangs confessed to 1 bombing incident in the area. Additional information indicated the Iraqi Army does not turn-in evidence associated with crimes when delivering suspects for incarceration. The Team inspected the Evidence Room and found evidence/weapons have not been moved to the 12 new evidence lockers. Evidence officers requested an additional refrigerator for storing drug evidence as the section stores evidence for the entire country of Iraq.

The Team conducted an unannounced shake-down inspection of the Detention Facility and found 385 detainees incarcerated. Special emphasis was placed on officer safety as IPs assisted with a systematic search of the Detention area. Several contraband items (including a knife) were confiscated and turned over to the Detention Staff as evidence.

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(BC0119) Al Rusafa Patrol Station: The Team visited 12 Checkpoints and conducted Training for 40 IPs covering Checkpoint Operations and Vehicle Search Procedures. Real-time training was conducted at the Checkpoints and observations indicated the IPs require situational awareness training. The Team inspected the Detention Facility and found 5 detainees incarcerated with 3 being IP officers. Details revealed the 3 IPs were jailed for killing a vehicle driver after firing warning shots. Additional information indicated the IPs had been ordered released by MOI. The Team met Colonel [redacted] (Station Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet during the past 24 hours.

(BC0120) Rusafa Directorate Police HQ: Training was conducted for 140 IPs covering ERU Weapons and Vehicle/Basic Equipment Familiarization. The Team met General [redacted] (Station Commander) and discussed fuel station hours of operation in the AOR. Time constraints were being considered in an attempt to stop citizens from violating the imposed curfew to purchase fuel. General [redacted] was advised that the Ethics Class was cancelled due to a MPRI instructor encountering transportation problems. The Team met Major [redacted] (Internal Affairs) and discussed a Force Protection Plan for the Station. The Team met Colonel [redacted] (ERF Commander) and advised him the Weapons/Shooting exercise was cancelled due to the curfew. He expressed concern over being unable to provide messing for 140 recruits restricted to the Station due to the curfew. He advised the Station's cook was unable to travel and the kitchen was closed. Brigadier General [redacted] (Headquarters Station Commander) has been provided with a copy of the MOI Field Training Manual for review. He advised that MOI has not provided him with any information or guidance in reference the Training Plan.

(BC0628) Baghdad Checkpoint District Headquarters: The Team conducted Training for 5 IPs covering Checkpoint Operations. The Team met Captain [redacted] (Shift Commander) who advised the AOR had been quiet due to the holy day and curfew. The Station has not received fuel for the past 3 days.

MND-CS/S

Al Qadisiyah

There were no missions scheduled today for Camp Echo; however, IPLOs attended a combat life saver Train the Trainer course conducted by the military. This course was in preparation to allow the Team to assist in training 42 IPs from the province to become combat life saver instructors.

Wasit Province

There were no missions scheduled for Camp Delta.

Babil Province

(BB0032) Babil Provincial Police HQ: The PTT Team from FOB Reo attended the weekly Babil Provincial Chiefs' meeting conducted by Lt. General [redacted]. During the meeting, the General ordered the IPs in the province to present them selves in a professional manner and to have no association with the militia. He stated that violation of this order would result in immediate termination.

Lt. Colonel [redacted], Chief of Al Aqhida HQ, stated he has 17 mosques in his district and because of the recent mosque bombings he does not have enough IPs to provide security for them. The General advised the LTC to meet with the tribal leaders and

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ask their assistance in mosque security. The General told his Command Staff not to ask for any more television or satellite dishes as Iraqi Police are to work and not watch television. The Gen also advised all the IPs that were hired by coalition forces to complete new paperwork to be sent to the MOI along with a medical examination. The proper paperwork has never been completed.

Following the meeting, the team met with the General to get final approval on a proposed reconstruction of an abandoned building at the Al Hillah Academy to be used as a regional crime lab. This facility will only be used temporarily until the new regional crime lab is constructed. A new lab is scheduled for construction in the future; however, the land has not yet been purchased. This reconstruction project is based on a funding request that is being submitted to the U.S. State Department.

Dhi Qar / Al Muthanna Over Watch (PIC)

PTT members attended the daily operational briefing in Camp Terendak and the daily SSR/MITT/CPATT meeting with Major (b)(6). PTT members met with members of MITT team to coordinate planning and training efforts for both provinces. In addition, PTT members briefly discussed with CIMIC members to the possibility of engaging in community outreach programs the IPS can become involved in.

PTT members continue the task of inquiring about the MOI Badging process and will evaluate procedures for future implementation within each province. It is PTT's goal to have a good understanding of the process from initiation to conclusion.

(TA0080) Salah Al Din Provincial Police HQ: PTT met with COL (b)(6) (Community Crimes, Jail), who stated that he had requested a survey for new buildings which are to be located on FOB Danger. PTT is aware of a land title issue concerning FOB Danger that could affect this request.

PTT met with COL (b)(6) (Motor Pool), who informed the Team that he had spoken with GEN (b)(6) and was told the distribution list for the new 17 IP vehicles was acceptable. Ten of the vehicles will be held for the new Emergency Battalion that GEN (b)(6) wishes to initiate. PTT also received a list which is supposed to identify where each vehicle within the province is located by station. PTT will use this inventory list in an attempt to increase accountability of vehicles.

(TA0013) Al Alam District Police HQ: The Al-Alam District Headquarters has made vast improvements to their force protection by utilizing the materials provided by PTT. The station has moved the HESCO walls out further from the station and has built up the exterior dirt wall around the parking area.

PTT advised COL (b)(6) of the IP's absence at the old IHP check point on ASR Clemson when the Team came through the Abu-Ajeel area. COL (b)(6) stated that he did order the Abu-Ajeel station to take over this check point, but this station's staff continues to offer



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excuses as to why they can't abide by that order. COL [redacted] stated within the next week he will have a meeting with MG [redacted] about who will take responsibility for this check point and get rid of some of the Abu-Ajeel IP due to their unwillingness to work.

PTT [redacted] discussed the Air Weapons shooting incident that occurred the night before. COL [redacted] advised that he has told all his personnel that they can not do any type of work that requires digging near the roadway, without prior approval from the PJCC. COL [redacted] advised PTT that the personnel were not planting an IED during this incident and that they were just putting in a water main when the Air Weapons team engaged them. PTT also conducted force protection training while at the station.

PTT also visited the Al-Alam Emergency Company Compound on the way out from the District Headquarters and assessed their force protection. PTT discovered that the force protection at this station is extremely lacking. PTT advised the station staff that they would present a Force Protection Plan to COL [redacted] and funnel force protection material to this station through the District Headquarters.

(TA0100) Tikrit Patrol Police Station: PTT conducted training for 22 IP, along with 13 from Tikrit 911 and 9 from the Emergency Company on Station Security. Also discussed was how to improve force protection and person / vehicle searches. A classroom is being set up at FOB Danger and PTT will require a generator, chairs and a projector for slide shows and training exercises.

(TA0084) Samarra District Police HQ: PTT assisted NP MAJ [redacted] in sending information by email to Baghdad Operations.

PTT learned that one of the IP that had transferred to FOB Olson for special training with CF was killed on a mission today. The IP worked in the Emergency Battalion in Samarra and was chosen to go on this special group when a sniper shot and killed him in the area of the Al Razik Mosque. The IP were not able to locate a suspect.

Camp Anaconda: PTT conducted a brief in regards to a mission for the Ad Dujayl District IP Headquarters. The BATS system was discussed and the amount of time that it will take to process each IP. CFs will utilize the BATS system and the IPLOs will conduct the station evaluation. Detention (lock-up) issues were also discussed as to speed up the holding process.

(MN0961) Al Shur Local Police Station: The PTT did not conduct a station visit due to a military no roll.

(NoFFID#) Al Haria Local Police Station: This Station has not been visited before by IPLos and has existed for approximately two years. It is well maintained and organized. The station has also been suffering from the lack of fresh water for approximately one week. The building is in need of repairs to the latrines, but otherwise in good condition. The station has maps the IPs made of the village area and house numbers, and listed under the house numbers are the family names of the residents. The station appears to be keeping very good records of its daily operations and personnel records.

The PTT met with Shift Commander, MAJ [redacted] who has nine years of prior law enforcement experience during the Saddam era. He appears to be very capable of performing his duties.

(MN0960) Limissa Local Police Station: This station has been without fresh water supply for approx 1 week. The station has three vehicles but only two are operable. Hesco barriers and T walls have been verbally requested by the director of the station. T-Walls can be obtained from the old Jamissa IP Station with the assistance of CF and a crane.

(NoFFID#) NDJH Helpful Company: PTT traveled to NJDH Helpful Company LPS without incident and spoke to the LT, as the LTC was gone for the day. PTT informed the LT about the concern for uniformity within all LPS in Tal Afar. PTT informed the LT that DHQ PTT wanted to see regular inspections of all IP at every station. PTT mentored on how to conduct regular inspections.

At Tamim

(TT0099) Kirkut (Tamim) Major Crimes Unit (CID): PTT spoke to COL [redacted] and LTC [redacted] and were advised that MG [redacted] conducted an unannounced inspection of the MCU. The MG was checking various stations to verify that they were operationally ready during the alert that MG [redacted] instituted on June 14th. LTC [redacted] was on duty during the late night inspection along with four other Investigators. All of the check points were manned and ready. LTC [redacted] felt that they had done well and that BG [redacted] was pleased with them.

PTT discussed with COL [redacted] the two upcoming training sessions that the PRT members have made available to both the MCU and Criminal Evidence Unit. COL [redacted] has reluctantly committed ten of the sixteen members to the one day Management/Leadership Conference.

The second training will take place in Baghdad starting on July 14th. This will be a door to door three week course that will focus on Leadership. COL [redacted] will commit five officers for the three week session.

(TT0006) Tamim National Crime Lab: PTT met with COL [redacted] at the Criminal Evidence Unit this afternoon and learned that the Juvenile Jail will be relocating to Headquarters over the next couple of weeks. This will allow CEU to take over their space and set up operations while the current building receives the much needed repairs and additional rooms. COL [redacted] advised that he will have a total of twelve rooms in the building once the work is completed.

(b)(7)(c)

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COL [redacted] (b)(7)(c) has committed seven of his officers to attend the leadership training to be conducted at FOB Warrior and if more are available at the time of the conference, he will make adjustments to send them as well. COL [redacted] (b)(7)(c) will also be taking advantage of the three week Leadership training in Baghdad and send three of his officers.

(TT0003) Arafa Patrol Police Station: PTT conveyed to Arafa police station and were met by the station commander LTC [redacted] (b)(7)(c). PTT trained on patrol procedures concentrating on responding to calls with an active shooter. The class covered using the patrol vehicle for cover and shooting from inside of the vehicle. PTT also spoke about taking a suspect into custody from a position of cover. The IP were very receptive to this type of training, interacting with the practical portion of the class and asking good questions. The remodeling projects on the jail have been completed; PTT and COL [redacted] (b)(6),(d) are pleased with the work.

The training sergeant is still in the process of training the 24 new IP. SGT [redacted] (b)(6),(d) is training on first aid, basic marksmanship and detainee procedures.

(TT0004) Aruba Patrol Police Station: No PTT mission due to ongoing military operation.

(NoFFID#) Daquq JCC: PTT delivered Hesco barriers to Daquq JCC for use in the force protection of the compound. The station commander was on assignment with CFs.

(TT0031) Shwan Local Police Station: PTT worked on validation in the administration office by reviewing personnel records, PJCC memo records and IP attendance records. All records appeared in good order. PTT discussed with BG [redacted] (b)(6),(d) the estimate on the improvements to the station.

(TT0032) Taza Karhmatu Patrol Police Station: No PTT mission, due to ongoing military operation.

Irbil

Dennis Shoemaker

(M0001) Irbil Provincial Police HQ: PTT visited the PDOP office and spoke with LT [redacted] (b)(7)(c) in the absence of the PDOP. LT [redacted] (b)(7)(c) and another employee displayed an envelope with a G passport belonging to a friend. The G passport is required for international travel. Most Iraqis only have an S passport, if any at all. The envelope also contained \$14,000.00 in cash to be sent to Baghdad for Visas for the same man. According to employees, the man paid someone they call a Smuggler to take application documents to Baghdad to the passport office and thereby getting the passport issued in one week. The passport cost is about \$50.00. Reportedly people in the passport office are taking payoff money from the Smuggler to process the passports quicker than usual which is between three and six months. If one does not pay the \$1000.00, his paperwork will be held up for three to six months. The Visa money is also given to the smuggler who takes it to various Embassies in Baghdad where he pays exorbitant fees to people there to issue the Visas. The \$14,000.00 reportedly will buy Visas for all countries except the United Kingdom and the United States.

(NoFFID#) Zaravani Police HQ: PTT delivered 50 vests to MG [redacted] (b)(7)(c) with the Zaravani Police. MG [redacted] (b)(7)(c) expressed his gratitude for the vests and the helmets provided in the last month and said all were badly needed and will be used.

(NoFFID#) Irbil Training Center: PTT met at the Irbil Training Center to discuss the Presentations for the upcoming Summit 2007. PTT prepared the appropriate digital productions and fine-tuned the Power Point Presentations. In addition, PTT addressed logistical issues in preparation for the Summit.



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Sulaymaniyah

(TS0010) Sulaymaniyah Traffic Police HQ: PTT met with officers at the PHQ for traffic. The scheduled training for the day was cancelled due to the class room being used for a promotion course. 52 traffic police were training to take the promotion test. PTT attempted to do a station inventory, but MAJ [redacted] advised he did not think it would be necessary because he would not receive any equipment anyway. After advising him the purpose of the inventory he advised he would get the information for the next visit.

(TS0024) Cham Chamal District Police HQ: The PTT traveled to Chamchamal DHQ and conducted day four of a two week community policing training program.

PTT also continued the lesson on Crime Scene Evidence Collection and discussed foot print and blood collection. The class was involved in the discussion as well as practical exercises. All students took good notes and gained valuable information on the procedures of crime scene investigation

(TS0275) Sulaymaniyah PJCC: PTT met with BG [redacted] and MAJ [redacted] and discussed PJCC operations over the weekend. [redacted] stated that there were no major disturbances over the past weekend. PTT then gathered biographical information on [redacted] and [redacted].

Dahuk

(MD0001) Golan Local Police Station: PTT met with Station commander, MAJ [redacted] and learned that approximately sixty percent of Akre city's problems occur within the Golan LPS areas of responsibility. About seventy five percent of these crimes are committed by family members from Mosul who has moved into the area. Nearly one thousand families from Mosul have moved into the Akre area because of other family members already living there. The station commander added that these people are used to the dangers of Mosul and not having to deal with police. Some of the increase in crime is being noticed in areas of robberies, sexual assaults, fighting, and fraud. The MAJ is trying to prevent the problems by tagging potential problems when they move into the area. He does this by getting the people over the neighborhoods to inform Golan station when new people move in and have the new people come to the station so the police can get information about them. Golan LPS also utilizes 24 hour patrols and sets up random check points. They seemed interested in adding some possible joint patrols to learn new ideas and techniques to combat their increasing crime rate.

There is no jail at Golan LPS. When needed, they use the Akre Holding Cells Station, which is located next door. The duty officer for the shift on payday is responsible for retrieving and distributing the KP pay. MAJ [redacted] advised Golan LPS was having no payroll issues.

The city of Akre has had a problem with electric power. The MAJ advised the station receives very few hours of power daily and has no generator. He also expressed a need for a copier and a printer. While discussing logistic issues, PTT learned that the station only has twenty ballistic vests with plates and five Kevlar for 43 people.

PTT discussed training issues with the MAJ after learning the types of crimes the station was dealing with. He seemed very interested in an interview technique class for his officers and defensive tactics along with handcuffing and control tactics for his KP. Upon further discussion, PTT learned that one of the officers at Golan LPS had been through a six month EOD school. PTT had an opportunity to speak to this officer who seemed optimistic about being able to share his knowledge with other KP

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(MD0622) Akre Local Police Station: PTT met with MAJ [redacted] and discussed the daily activities of his station. He advised PTT that his men were on 24 hour patrol working different shifts. They also do check points in different locations throughout the city. The MAJ also advised PTT that he had created a twelve man, plainclothes unit (MCU Team) that worked the night shift to try and catch people in the trouble areas of the city.

The MAJ advised PTT that he has requested land for a new station for over a year. His 70 man department is working out of an apartment that is on the second floor and is very small. PTT asked the MAJ what has happened with the request and he stated that they have been ignored. PTT asked the MAJ to produce the written request to be worked on by the PHQ team. He stated that he would have all of them copied and ready next week for pick up. He also advised that he needed more men, more vehicles and a larger budget. PTT asked him to write up a budget plan and request for what he needed and PTT would work with him. No promises were made. The MAJ advised PTT that he was short pistols, body armor, helmets and radios.

PTT discussed the train the trainer course with the MAJ and he was very receptive to the idea stating that it would help his department and the district.

(MD0623) Akre Holding Cells Station: PTT met with LT [redacted] at the Akre Holding Cell Station who related that they hold, on average, 40 prisoners a day. He also advised PTT that his men make three trips a week to Dahuk with prisoners to be seen by the Judge. All other activities during the day are spent taking care of the prisoners they have.

The holding cell at this station has a maximum capacity of 80 people per the commander of the station. The facility seemed to be in good condition and all that were detained seemed to be taken care of. The commander advised PTT that they were getting ready to add another story to the station.

LT [redacted] advised PTT that his transport van used to take the prisoners to Dahuk was very run down and could stop running at any time. He was advised by PTT that he should request another through PHQ. He also advised PTT that his 100,000 dinar per month allotment was not enough to supply gas and food that he needed each month. When asked how much he needed his reply was 1,000,000 per month. This seems a little extreme to the PTT assigned to the station. He also advised PTT that his station needed a computer, printer, copier, new TV and a satellite.

The LT stated that they had a power cable that cost 900,000 that was too small to work for them and have not paid for it yet. He asked the PTT if they would get him a better cable and pay for both so they could have power. PTT advised the LT that he needed to contact PHQ concerning his logistical issues.

(MD0647) Zahko Local Police Station: This is a large station servicing a densely populated area. The station is responsible for an ERB unit, the District Jail and the Court Protection unit. The station utilizes foot and vehicle patrols with emphasis on foot patrols. Every patrol is required to set up a temporary vehicle checkpoint during their patrol. The station maintains both computerized and hard copy records. This station receives an estimated average of twenty new cases each day and has only two investigators to deal with them. The station is short staffed and the station commander outlined a reasonable and effective plan for utilizing the additional personnel he has requested. The station is very organized and well maintained. The officer on duty conducts daily morning briefings.

The station maintains the District Jail with two rooms. The larger room is used for adult males while the smaller is used for juvenile males. The team inspected both rooms and



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spoke briefly with the prisoners housed there. All prisoners seemed in good health and no complaints were voiced concerning their treatment. The larger adult room has two air conditioners, one of which is out of service. The station commander was genuinely concerned about this and complained that he lacked the money to repair the unit. The temperature was not too excessive but having the unit repaired as quickly as possible would improve the conditions. The only concern the PTT found regarding the jail is that the commander advised an average population is 60 to 70 with an estimated maximum capacity of 100. In the PTT's opinion, 60 appears to be a more reasonable maximum number unless the juvenile prisoners are housed elsewhere to give more room for the adult prisoners. The jail is very well maintained and clean.

The station budget is insufficient for the size of this station and especially considering adequate jail conditions need to be maintained. The station is unable to come up with \$150.00 to repair an air-conditioning unit. The commander reports an all too common problem of new hires being forced to go three to four months before they begin receiving their salaries from the KMOI. The commander has submitted a request for an additional 150 men but has had no response as of yet from the KMOI.

Only the officers of this station carry a full three magazine complement of pistol ammunition; the rest of the men only have one magazine each. The PTT will check on this matter as it is known there is sufficient 9mm ammunition in stock at PHQ and other stations in the Province are being issued three magazines of ammunition each. The station is being issued 60 liters of fuel per week for each vehicle and this is insufficient for their needs. The PTT will check with the DHQ later in the week to determine why these stations are not receiving the 600 liter per month allotment that others are. The station needs to have its base station radio programmed and needs to obtain vehicle radios. Due to the large volume of paperwork the station has to do regarding the jail and court duties it has, a high capacity copier is needed as is another computer and the entire station has only one computer.

Currently, the only training being received by station personnel is PT, mind set and community relations. The station commander expressed a strong desire to have one or two of his men trained as trainers so that they might conduct other more advanced skills training on their own. The station commander would also very much like to have specialized prisoner and jail related training for his men assigned that function.

(MD0651) Rizgari Local Police Station: The PTT met with the station commander to obtain SINV data and discuss the general situation of the station. The station is trying to stretch its insufficient fuel allotment by operating a night time checkpoint rather than trying to run night time patrols. The commander is worried regarding poor cooperation/coordination with Turkey which borders his area. He states that it is very difficult to work even something as simple as a drowning in the river separating the two because of this. The biggest issue facing the station is traffic. The commander feels that the local traffic police are trying but lack the support they need to effectively enforce traffic law. It was pointed out to the commander that other stations are working in conjunction with or even separate from the Traffic Police to try and bring the number of traffic accidents under control, but the station commander feels this is the responsibility of the Traffic Police and not his station. The station is keeping both hard copy and computerized records for their area.

The station has no jail and transports any prisoners either to PHQ or the Zahko LPS. No problems were observed or brought to the team's attention regarding payroll or finance. The PTT did discuss the low monthly budget provided for the stations in the area and went over the concept of record keeping in order justifying any request for an increased budget.

On a positive note, the radio reception within the station AO was described as very good, with communication ability extending all the way to Dahuk PHQ.

Currently the only training being received by station personnel is PT. The station commander expressed a strong desire to have one or two of his men trained as trainers so that they might conduct other more advanced skills training on their own. This station still has ten men who need academy training.

June 17th: The Police Transition Team continued the process of paying the Iraq Police assigned to Provincial Security Unit (PSU). The Iraqi officers performed very well and were motivated during the process.

Police Transition Team and Iraqi Police conducted a joint convoy operation to Camp Fallujah for refueling.

(RA0016) Ferris Station: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team (PTT) assigned to non-PTT duties.

(RA0032) Karmah Station: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team (PTT) assigned to non-PTT duties.



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(RA0060) Saqlawiyah Patrol Police Station: The Iraqi Police are conducting patrol, checkpoints and working with the military providing force protection for the station. The three newly promoted Staff Sergeants continue to be motivated and progressing well.

(RA0080) Al Qaim District Police HQ: PTT met with the District Chief and his logistics officer on Camp Al Qaim and were shown the proper forms and procedures for requesting logistical support from the Ministry of Interior. The District Chief was explained the importance of the procedures and how it works in conjunction with their budget.

(RA0093) Rumana Local Police Station: The Police Transition Team trained 2 officers and 8 Iraq Police in the area of firearms safety. The training consisted of the proper handling and use of both the Glock and AK-47 rifle.

(RA0092) Karabilah Local Police Station: The Police Transition Team met with the Station Chief and discussed the lack of support they were providing their sub-station. Other areas discussed included supplies, new station construction and future man power for the station. PTT conducted training on vehicle security and maintenance and inspected the detention facility and found no prisoners. The Police Transition Team also visited the sub-station and discussed staffing issues and the possibility of a recruit drive.

(RA0010) Ta'meem Local Police Station: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team (PTT) assigned to non-PTT duties.

(RA0020) Ramadi East Local Police Station: The Police Transition Team Station met with the Station Chief and has implemented daily cleaning of the station and equipment. The Iraq Police and PTT have worked very well together in training and mission planning.

(RA0025) Al Huria Local Police Station: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team assigned to non-PTT duties.

(RA0029) Jazeera Local Police Station: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team (PTT) assigned to non-PTT duties.

(RA0030) Ramadi South Local Police Station: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team assigned to non-PTT duties.

(RA0048) Ramadi District Police HQ: No station visit at this time due to the Police Transition Team (PTT) assigned to non-PTT duties.

June 15th: There was no training conducted as the Police Transition Team was assigned to non-PTT duties.

(RA0083) Hadithah District Police HQ: The Police Transition Team conducted training to 30 Iraq Police and 2 Officers on vehicle searches, weapons handling, and officer tactics. The PTT checked on the detainees currently held in the station holding cell and found no new detainees. The detainees did not show any signs of physical abuse. The detention facility is always staffed and clean and are checked regularly and fed twice a day.

(RA0081) Hit District Police HQ: The Police Transition Team trained a total of 9 Iraq Police in a Train the Trainer class conducted at Camp Hit. The classes were a recap of previously instructed material and vehicle searches.

(RA0002) Al Anbar Provincial Police HQ: The Police Transition Team Chief and Deputy Chief were transported to the Sophia District of Ramadi and attended a conference hosted by [redacted] of the Abu Fahad Tribe.

(RA0052) Al Anbar IHP Station 6: The Police Transition Team began fuel operations with a total of 34 Iraq Police vehicles receiving fuel from the fuel farm on Camp Ramadi. In addition, PTT observed and monitored a firearms class for new Iraq Highway Patrol members.
