(BC0003) Airport Police Local Police Station: The Team conducted training for 1 IP covering Basic Glock Pistol. This training covered the introduction with Glock nomenclature and firearms safety. An audit of the French Village armory was completed on this visit. Instructions were given on how to properly maintain the arms room and supplies. The Team also visited the detention area with no problems identified. The Team continues to work on obtaining a Base Radio System to allow communication between the airport and French Village sub-station. Team members met with Global Security staff and were informed security measures have been increased due to the large volume of passenger traffic.

(BC0010) Al Bayaa Local Police Station: The Team conducted training for 1 officer and 6 IPs on search techniques and officer safety. The Team met with Maj. [Redacted] who cited a shortage of officers Lieutenant and above with only 11 assigned to the station. He has placed a request for more officers. Maj. [Redacted] told the team the area was very active and indicated a school in the area was attacked. He said the IPs were advised to stay out of the area while the IA conduct operations there. He also advised there had been a multiple VBIED attack at an area fuel station. It resulted in 2 LNs KIA. Also an IP General officer and 1 body guard were killed in a shooting. This incident is under investigation.

(BC0011) Al Dorah Local Police Station: Force Protection is in the process of being upgraded. T-walls are being placed and 2 new guard towers have been installed. The Team met with Col. [Redacted] and he indicated the station needs 3,000 liters of fuel per day to operate. They now receive only 1,500 liters per day.

(BC0015) Al Ghazalia Patrol Police Station: The Team met with Maj. [Redacted] and he stated the station needed 7 Motorola radios.

(BC0016) Habibya Local Police Station: The Team conducted training for 12 IPs covering Person Searches, Room Clearance, Handcuff Techniques, Self Defense Hand to Hand Combat and Vehicle Stops. The station commander indicated he is placing the new MOI training plan into action (CF-LPS-07-00023).

(BC0021) Al Kadhimaya Local Police Station: The Team conducted training for 2 IPs covering Weapons Safety.

(BC0041) Al Mesbah Local Police Station: The team did not conduct training, but did conduct one foot patrol with no incidents reported. The detention center was visited and the heat was found to be extreme. There was no power to run the ceiling fans. The station obtained fuel for their vehicles (CF-IHP-07-00021) but the IPs refuse to travel to Al Dora to obtain diesel fuel for their generator. The station has the MOI AWOL policy (CF-LPS-07-00001) posted but continues to have an AWOL problem. There were 5 AWOL IPs on this visit.

(BC0045) Al Nasir Local Police Station: The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol with no incidents occurring. The joint patrol lasted 5 hours and 30 minutes.

(BC0073) Al Yarmouk Patrol Police Station: The Team met with Col. [Redacted] and were informed of a possible IED construction factory near FOB Falcon. Little information could be

verified. The commander told the Team a request made for training ammunition had been denied. On 18 June 2007 The Team discussed the MOI Training Plan (CF-LPS-07-00023). The new recruits are in their 3rd and 4th week of training.

(BC0075) Al Zaafaranyah Local Police Station: The Team conducted training for 5 IPs covering Building Clearance and Weapon Awareness. Training involved a brief lecture and focused on practical exercises. Fuel has not been received at the station for 3 days. The fuel situation appears to be getting worse (CF-IHP-07-00021). Paperwork has been submitted requesting a new generator for the station.

(BC0081) Bab Al Sheikh Local Police Station: The Team conducted 1 Joint Foot Patrol in which IPs focused on Community Policing and making contacts with civilians in the community. Positive feedback from civilians was received.

(BC0088) Baghdad Provincial Traffic Police HQ: 375 Traffic IPs began training last week and 104 additional IPs began training this week. The Team observed the IP Traffic Training Team conduct the training of the new IPs. Construction on the new Traffic Institute began last week. Two buildings will be built. One will be used for training and the other will be used for administration and housing for trainees.

(BC0089) Belat Al Shuhadaa Local Police Station: The Team conducted 1 Joint Patrol. The patrol was instigated in response to gunfire nearby. The Team responded to a nearby checkpoint where sniper fire had been received. They then conducted a cordon and search for the next 90 minutes. The sniper was not found.

(BC0119) Al Rusafa Patrol Station: The Team conducted training for 8 IPs and 1 officer covering Crime Scene Management. The class was presented by the station training officer, Lt. [redacted].

(BC0120) Rusafa Directorate Police HQ: The Team conducted training of 140 IPs covering ERU weapons, radio and basic equipment and vehicle familiarization for new recruits. The MOI Training Plan (CF-LPS-07-00023) was discussed and BG [redacted] said he has not received information or guidance on it from the MOI. A copy of the plan was printed and given to him for review. The generator fuel allotment for Rusafa Directorate has not been received.

(BB0032) Babil Provincial Police HQ: The PTT Team noted the courtyard was two to three inches deep in water. The team met with Colonel [redacted], Detention Administrator, and learned a water heater had broken just after midnight. A request for service has been issued and repairs are expected to be complete some time today. The Col. also mentioned they were experiencing a sewer drainage problem. The sewer line was not broken, but was too small in diameter to adequately service the detention area. That issue is also being addressed although it is unknown when repairs will be completed. The team also met with Colonel [redacted] of the Engineering Department and discussed the water and electrical supply issues at the Hey Babil Local Police Station. He stated the department was waiting for a

written request from Hey Babil LPS. Apparently, the chief of Hey Babil had mailed the request instead of having it hand-delivered. Mail takes an extraordinarily long time to be delivered. However; the Col. Stated that since the team had taken such an interest in the welfare of Hey Babil LPS, he was going forward with the necessary repairs. He was sending an engineer to estimate the materials and cost to replace the current plastic line with a better, metal line. The Col. has also requested three generators from General [redacted] to be held in reserve, which could be taken to a station experiencing a power supply problem. He was appreciative the team cared enough to continue to check on this matter. He did ask the team to bring this entire matter to the attention of General [redacted] at the next meeting.

(BB0012) Al Hillah SWAT Facility: The team met with General [redacted], commander, and discussed the progress of the new facility being built. The team asked if the facility could be ready to house at least 600 IP's in the near future for training purposes. The Gen stated, when complete the facility would be able to house 600 plus IP's. The team learned there were issues being resolved with the sewage, as the sewage treatment facility that was planned fell through and the facility was now accepting bids for a large septic tank to be built to handle the waste products from all buildings. The team met with a representative from VIAP Quality Control, who was on premises to find out when the estimated completion date was. He stated the facility was slated for completion in mid July, but he felt that was too optimistic. It should be noted that if only one septic tank is built, it would have to be very large to handle the waste from 600 personnel on a daily basis. The team requested to look inside some of the buildings. There were six buildings that appeared to be near completion and a seventh that was a shell. The team viewed building number six and was shown some of the rooms and shower/bathroom areas. There were several large places on the outside of the building where the fresh stucco was peeling or had already fallen off. In one case the window ledge on the top floor had fallen onto the window ledge of the floor below and lay in a rubble pile on the window ledge. The Quality Control person did not appear to notice any of the areas mentioned. The team appeared to be guided away from the other buildings and did not have a chance to look inside.

(BB0002) Al Balda District Police HQ: The team met with Lt. Colonel [redacted], commander, and spoke with him about the recent raids that his IP's took part in. The team learned, over the past four raids, the IP's confiscated the following: 72 AK-47s, 89 AK-47 magazines, 2,060, rounds of 7.62 ammo and 50 rounds of PKC ammo.

(BB0043) Babil Iskandariyah IHP Station: The PTT Team met with Captain [redacted], the duty commander, and learned, 200 rounds of PKC ammunition had been issued to each checkpoint, 90 rounds of AK-47 ammunition per man issued at checkpoints north of the IHP Station and 60 rounds per man issued at the checkpoints south of the station. He estimated that there were approximately 2,800 rounds of PKC ammunition on hand at the station. The team learned restrictions to civilian traffic on MSR Tampa have been lightened, but curfew is still in effect from 2300-0600 to civilian traffic from checkpoint 20 to checkpoint 16. The Capt. stated, several IP's have been AWOL due to recent curfews and road closures in the area.

(BW0047) Wasit Police Academy: The PTT Team conducted advanced academy type training with 35 IP's and one officer from the province. Topics taught to the IP's included Defensive tactics, community relations, vehicle searches, check point operations, combat first aid and tactical movements. Training will continue throughout the week.

PTT members attended the daily operational briefing in Camp Terendak this morning. PTT members attended the daily SSR/MIIT/CPATT meeting with CF and MIIT team to coordinate planning and training efforts for both provinces and to solidify a plan for distribution of items to the Dhi Qar province. This event will be on going for the next several months.

(TA0080) Salah Al Din Provincial HQ: PTT met with COL (b)(7)(c) (Finance). COL (b)(7)(c) invited GEN (b)(7)(c), the Chief of Samarra, to attend the meeting. During the meeting, PTT discussed several irregularities within the Samarra payroll distribution with the two IP leaders. Numerous problems, including the continued payment of ghost IP in Samarra, were discussed, along with several explanations and possible solutions that will be enacted. The solutions can be used in other IP station payroll situations, Salah Ad Din Province wide. PTT met at COB Speicher by MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(c) of the Provincial Logistics Office. PTT distributed supplies to the IP at this meeting.

(TA0099) Tikrit District HQ: PTT-D traveled to the Tikrit District HQ for a station visit. BG (b)(7)(c) was present at the station and assisted PTT-D with their visit. BG (b)(7)(c) advised PTT-D that the transfers of IP between the Tikrit stations and the Oujia station have begun. This is being done to minimize the effects of tribal and family influence within the Oujia station. BG (b)(7)(c) stated that he had spoken to the Station Chief of the Qadassia station about responding to attacks at the station and assisting the PTT Teams in their efforts. PTT-D also discussed further issues of improving Force Protection at the station with the General.

(TA0033) Al Munshaa Local Police Station: PTT met with COL (b)(7)(c) and eleven of his station chiefs at the Al Munshaa Station. The meeting was halted abruptly, due to an attack on the PTTs convoy. PTTs returned to COB Speicher with no injuries to any of the team members. IPLO completed SIR detailing the attack.

(TA0050) As Saniyah Police Station: PTT traveled to the As Saniya Station and found an insufficient number of IPs available to conduct training. All IPs were either on patrol or on guard duty.

(TA0064) Bayji District HQ: On June 12, 2007, PTT observed IP MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(c) conducted a class on Accessories to Crime with six IP in attendance. PTT also assisted the IP with a kidnapping investigation. The suspect was later transported to FOB Summerall by CF. PTT then conducted a class on weapon retention to the evening shift that was attended by 18 IP.

On June 13, 2007, PTT observed IP MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(c) conduct a class on Criminal Liability and Exemptions, with four IP in attendance. MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(c) performed well during the class. He was organized and furnished useful information to the IP. PTT prepared TIFF requests for more office supplies to conduct the classes.

On June 14, 2007, PTT observed IP MAJ [redacted] instruct a class on apprehension with four IP in attendance. The class was well presented with participation by the students. PTT suggested to MAJ [redacted] that he create tests for his classes to measure the IP's information retention. PTT also inspected the detention cells and everything appeared to be in good order with no signs of abuse.

On June 16, 2007, PTT observed MAJ [redacted] conduct a class to four IP on Property Crimes. He issued a test to the IP after the class. The test consisted of only two questions. Only one IP passed the test. PTT discussed the outcome with MAJ [redacted]. He became upset and brought up the fact that training was being conducted at FOB Semmerall and Tikrit by other IP instructors. He felt that PTT did not trust him and would not let him teach in those locations. PTT explained, due to the different situations, instruction would have to be administered at the stations also. PTT conducted a first aid class with fifteen IP in attendance.

On June 17, 2007, PTT observed MAJ [redacted] conduct a class on Police Station Security. MAJ [redacted] did not perform well during this lesson. The instruction was not pertinent to the subject of the class.

On June 18, 2007, PTT arrived at the training office for the class and was advised that MAJ [redacted] would not be at work this morning and he did not pass on any information about the classes.

(TA0084) Samarra District HQ: PTTD conducted an inspection of BP4 and found the NP guarding the checkpoint with no IP at the location. The LT from the NP, that was in charge of the 20 NP at the checkpoint, asked if he could get cots for his men to sleep on, since they were sleeping on the floor. PTTD went back to JCC and checked with the MPs. PTTD was able to obtain 10 cots for them to use and they were delivered to the NP. PTTD returned to DHQ met with MAJ [redacted]. He advised that he was the new Chief in Samarra. MAJ [redacted] advised that he had just returned from MG [redacted] office and had a note saying that GEN [redacted] was to return to Tikrit and MAJ [redacted] was to take over his duties as Chief. MAJ [redacted] stated that GEN [redacted] was to leave all the IP equipment here in Samarra. MAJ [redacted] advised that he did not know if GEN [redacted] would agree with him becoming the new IP Chief of Samarra. GEN [redacted] wanted MAJ [redacted] to work for him at the NP. MAJ [redacted] asked the PTT if the Team would address the issue with GEN [redacted] in an effort to influence the GEN to agree with the change.

MAJ [redacted] advised, that in his meeting today with MG [redacted], it was learned that there are 233 IP ready to come to Samarra. They are presently at the TIPS Academy. PTT asked if they had gone to the academy yet and MAJ [redacted] said "no". As a result, the 233 new IP for Samarra will be untrained.

At approximately 1900 hours a VBIED hit the new NP station on 20th Street. The VBIED was detonated in the street and did not cause a great deal of damage to the building. The initial casualty count is; three NP WIA and one NP KIA. CF had information about a possible attack and therefore, CF was on scene when the attack occurred.

MAJ [redacted] later returned to the JCC and stated that his promotion to Chief of Samarra had been cancelled, and that GEN [redacted] remained as Chief. MAJ [redacted] stated he was quitting the IP and would be leaving. MAJ [redacted] advised GEN [redacted] is making up lies about him to keep his position. MAJ [redacted] also told PTT that GEN [redacted] is lying about the number of IP on duty, not only to PTT, but also to GEN [redacted] and GEN [redacted] to make himself look better.

(TA006) Ad Dujayl DJCC and (TA0810) Salah Al Din IHP Hayel Askari Station: PTT went to FOB Paliwoda and later proceeded to FOB O'Ryan for a meeting with additional military staff. PTT then proceeded to the AD Dujayl water treatment plant for a brief inspection. PTT then patrolled to the AD Dujayl JCC, where PTT met with LTC [redacted]. LTC [redacted] discussed his concerns regarding the NP being hostile to the IP when they attempt to pass through checkpoint #51. PTT advised him to make sure that IP were properly showing their ID when entering and passing through the checkpoint. LTC [redacted] was issued equipment such as vests, helmets, night vision, and stationary to assist with his operations. PTT then patrolled to the Hayel Askari IHP to inspect the station structure, which was satisfactory.

(MN0056) Ninewah Provincial Headquarters: PTT met with MG [redacted], PDOP and discussed the scheduled graduation ceremony for the recently completed advanced investigative officer's course. PTT discussed a planned personal security course to be presented to members of his command staff at NPHQ. PTT spoke with BG [redacted], TOC OIC and received a briefing on the significant events that occurred within the past 24 hours in Ninewah Province. He related that small arms fire was directed at three separate IP checkpoints in the Al Uruba and Al Nijar neighborhoods. Al Thakkafa LPS IP discovered an IED in the Al Baladial neighborhood. The residence of COL [redacted], Commander of 4th ERB was destroyed with explosives employed by AIF. Al Somer LPS was the victim of small arms fire directed against it by AIF. At the Mosul TV station three mortar rounds impacted and detonated with no injuries to employees or pedestrians in the area. In the Al Makaway neighborhood Al Hadba DHQ IP discovered and disarmed an IED.

PTT spoke with BG [redacted], Logistics Officer, and discussed the newly authorized IP manning level within Ninewah Province. He explained that he had been planning to provide supplies and equipment for up to 21,000 IP within the Province. He added that as the newly authorized manning level does not exceed that number he has planned adequately. PTT discussed the ammunition count discrepancy discovered at the Al Karama DHQ during a recent Provincial PTT/NPHQ Logistics officer inspection. BG [redacted] explained that this week he had spoken with and admonished the DHQ Logistics officer to have all his records up-to-date within the next two weeks. He added that if the officer fails to comply then he will face jail. BG [redacted] continued that if the discrepancy was not satisfactorily explained that BG [redacted] Chief Auditor NPHQ would be assigned to conduct an audit of the existing records. BG [redacted] discussed the need for MOI to provide three prisoner transport vans to NPHQ, so that they could be used to transport detainees from the Transient Jail (TransJail) for court appearances or to the Badoush prison for incarceration.

PTT spoke with LT [redacted], NPHQ Jail and noted the jail population to be comprised of 405 adult civilian detainees, 21 IP, and four IA. PTT assisted a member of the CF BATS team in reaching an agreement with the jail administration. It was agreed that all detainees would be taken to the BATS office to be processed on their date of arrest versus the current agreement wherein they appear in the BATS office after having been seen by an investigative judge. This new agreement will speed up the release process for the jail staff as MTU/MCU won't have to wait for detainees to then pass through the BATS process before they authorize the individual detainee's release. PTT did not note any signs of prisoner abuse among any of the detainees.

PTT spoke with LTC [redacted], NPHQ Chief of Communications, who explained that he currently has 250 Motorola model GP360 radios that are not mission capable. He related that he believed they had been individually subjected to ERI interference at various times while the IP were on patrol or standing traffic control points. PTT examined the radios and noted most displayed the caption "code plug error" in the LCD display area. PTT received one of the radios from LTC [redacted] so that it could be taken to a Motorola representative on the nearby FOB for examination.

PTT met in the office of BG [redacted], Chief of Finance and spoke with representatives of the Legal, Finance and Personnel departments. PTT discussed suspected "ghost employees" believed to be listed on the personnel and finance rosters within the various Ninewah DHQ and LPS. PTT was informed that the NPHQ Internal Affairs office now has IA investigators at all DHQ and LPS. PTT was advised that a portion of their duties included the examination of all personnel and payroll rosters in an effort to eliminate any "ghost employees". PTT requested a copy of the SOP manual for the NPHQ personnel/finance departments.

PTT met with BG [redacted], Training officer, who explained that Class 23 has been scheduled at MPSA, but that he doesn't currently have the exact count for the number of IP assigned to the class. BG [redacted] related that Tall Afar DHQ would be forwarding a list of all IP from that district, which is in need of attending the Basic Recruit Training Class. BG [redacted] explained that once the list is submitted that literacy testing can be scheduled. He provided PTT with the name of the Tall Afar DHQ training officer. He provided PTT with a list of names of the officers, who will attend the next PSTO class at FOB Endurance (Q West). PTT examined the NPHQ training class rooms and noted they have been painted; the broken window panes have been replaced; an air conditioner has been installed; and desks have been located.

(MN0099) Major Crimes Unit/Major Terrorist Unit: PTT met with COL [redacted] with MTU and discussed the possibility of SWAT executing arrest warrants for wanted persons from MTU. COL [redacted] stated that NPHQ was starting a 5th ERB and this ERB was going to be in charge of executing all arrest warrants for MTU. PTT discussed who was going to train this new unit on the tactics needed to conduct these operations. COL [redacted] stated that he spoke to CF about this and he was told that two (2) Officers from SWAT were going to instruct the new ERB. COL [redacted] also gave the PTT a new list of evidence received at MTU as well as number of detainees. This list is being translated and will be passed to CF.

PTT met with COL [redacted] at MCU. COL [redacted] was mentored and advised regarding the interview techniques to be used with detainees that have been in jail for an extended amount of time. COL [redacted] further stated to PTT there was a problem with detainees that were detained by MTU speaking to other detainees while at NPHQ Jail and waiting to speak with the judge. At present, MCU does not have a holding facility for newly detained individuals. COL [redacted] stated that this hinders his investigations due to detainees speaking with other detainees and "learning" what to say to the Investigators as well as the Investigative Judges. COL [redacted] asked PTT if there was any way they could have a holding facility built at MCU. This information will be passed to NPHQ. PTT also met with COL [redacted] of NPHQ Intelligence. COL [redacted] was mentored and advised about the keeping of records and informant information. COL [redacted] is preparing a report regarding new intelligence and this will be passed to CF.

(MN0201) Ninewah SWAT: This station was not visited and no missions were conducted today due to the military having maintenance issues.

(MN0232) 1st Emergency Response Battalion: PTT traveled to Fortitude and met with LTC [redacted] of the 1st ERB regarding a joint mission with IA, IP, and CF. LTC [redacted] had brought 4 IP and fourteen IP Trucks to support the mission. The CF then provided an outer cordon of the Al Shams neighborhood while the IP and IA conducted a search of the Al Shams neighborhood for a weapons cache. During the search, IP detained two male individuals who were later transported to the 1st ERB for questioning.

(MN0233) 2nd Emergency Response Battalion: This station was not visited today due to military re-tasking.

3rd Emergency Response Battalion: This station was not visited today due to military re-tasking.

4th Emergency Response Battalion: PTT traveled to the 4th Emergency Response Battalion (ERB) and contacted LTC [redacted] regarding a joint raid. PTT requested LTC [redacted] provide four IP Trucks and fifteen IP for the joint raid. LTC [redacted] stated he could provide the requested number of trucks and IP. PTT then briefed LTC [redacted] on the joint raid in the Palestine neighborhood. The IP were briefed by the IP LT who led them on the raid. The IP were responsible for assisting with the inner cordon and two IP and the IP LT assisted with interviews inside the residence. Once the mission was complete PTT escorted the IP back to the 4th ERB. PTT discussed with LTC [redacted] the need for him to complete a request with BG [redacted] regarding the new IP uniforms formerly requested. PTT also asked LTC [redacted] to conduct an inventory of his communications equipment including serial numbers, makes, and types to be provided to PTT on the next visit. LTC [redacted] stated he would have the inventory completed.

Emergency Response Unit: This station was not visited today due to military re-tasking.

(MN0009) Al Hadba DHQ: PTT met with the District Commander, BG [redacted]. BG [redacted] provided the items of information as detailed in this report. He indicated there had been two recent attacks in his district on 17Jun2007 and on 18Jun2007 in which IP patrols within the Borsa neighborhood received small arms fire. There were no casualties or arrests in either incident. BG [redacted] felt that AIF activity within the Borsa District was increasing at a significant rate.

BG [redacted] informed the PTT that his head investigator, MAJ [redacted], had been transferred to the Al Nasir LPS. No explanation was given for MAJ [redacted] transfer. Major [redacted] has been replaced by LTC [redacted] however, he was not present at the police station, this date. It should be noted that the PTT spoke with MAJ [redacted] telephonically, this date, and learned that as a result of his transfer he would be resigning from the IP. In addition, he felt that his removal from the Al Hadba DHQ was based on tribal motives, in the fact that he is not a member of the Al Jabouri Tribe. During the discussions, BG [redacted] requested assistance from the PTT with regard to an IA captain who was in possession of forged documents saying that he was in fact a LTC. BG [redacted] provided this individual's name and requested PTT assistance in proving that these documents were forged. This individual was connected to a raid that was conducted on a sugar factory. Efforts will be made by the PTT to follow up on BG [redacted] request.

The PTT requested permission from BG [redacted] to conduct joint patrols with his personnel in an effort to promote community policing within the IP of Mosul. General [redacted] indicated that he would have to discuss this issue with Provincial Headquarters before making any

decision. During a routine patrol following the station visit to Al Hadba DHQ, the PTT came upon the body of an apparent homicide victim in the street on a local route. The victim appeared to be a young adult male wearing a red shirt, black pants and was barefoot. He had what appeared to be a gunshot wound to the head

The jail contained seven prisoners. It was noted that the prisoner, [redacted] who had been in need of medical care, mentioned in the Al Hadba DSR dated 01JUN07, was still in custody for a period of 20 days. In following up on this matter, it was learned that he had seen a judge and was receiving medical care and that his bond was set at one million dinar with his next scheduled appearance before the Judge on 24JUN07.

The training officer for the Al Hadba DHQ, LTC [redacted], was given instructions pertaining to the topic of "police ethics", along with being provided written study aids in Arabic to assist him in training his personnel, along with establishing a permanent training file for the station in the future. In discussing the training with BG [redacted] he explained that he had requested 65 new policemen for his district, but had only been given 48. The 48 new recruits have begun "on the job" training at Al Hadba DHQ while waiting assignment to the academy. The 48 recruits will be divided into five groups of approximately 10 individuals, with only one group being sent at a time. The first group being sent to MPSA is leaving on this date 18Jun07.

(MN0008) Al Gizlani LPS: PTT met with MAJ [redacted] who advised that there have been no attacks on his station or any TCP in the past week. He advised that one of his patrols were fired upon when they were responding to assist a patrol from Al Hadba DHQ who was receiving small arms fire. He was asked if he had received any intelligence. He advised that he had gotten information that a leader of Al Qaeda in Mosul was killed along with two of his body guards. The man's name is [redacted]

MAJ [redacted] was asked about obtaining a list of supplies that he has requested and not received. He advised he would provide them next time PTT visits the station. He stated that three of his vehicles are not working. MAJ [redacted] was asked about obtaining an officer and five IP and doing a patrol in his area. He advised that he would be willing to provide them. He was advised that on the next visit we would set a date.

(MN0214) Al Wagaas LPS: The military unit was out with another PTT; therefore no station visit was conducted today.

(MN0045) Al Kazrag LPS: The military unit was out with another PTT; therefore no station visit was conducted today.

(MN0036) Al Dawasa LPS: The military unit was out with another PTT; therefore no station visit was conducted today.

(MN0022) Al Rabaein DHQ: This station was not visited due to the military standing down for a regularly scheduled maintenance day.

(MN0024) Al Sheak Fathi: This station was not visited due to the military standing down for a regularly scheduled maintenance day.

(MN0136) Al Ahrar LPS: The military portion of Al Ahrar PTT failed to inform IPLO's of a mission time change therefore the mission was not met..

(MN0030) Bab Shamas LPS: PTT met with MAJ [redacted] Station Commander, who said there had been no significant activity since the unit was there on 15Jun07. Presently there are four detainees being held in the jail. Two are charged with theft, one charged with pandering and a fourth with removing a child from the care of his mother. All but the last, who was arrested this date, have seen a magistrate.

Recently six mechanics began working on IP vehicles at DHQ, with services available to LPS in the district. PTT learned this program seems to be working very well and the station commander was satisfied with the level of repairs and maintenance being performed.

The LPS recently received training on Combat First Aid which was given to five IP with the intent that they would be "trainers" for other IP. An inquiry was made into training that they may have conducted and it was learned that there had been none. The Station Commander was then advised and mentored on the need for ongoing training during opportune moments at the LPS and ways that it might best be accomplished.

The Station Commander was informed that he could receive one-on-one computer training from officers at DHQ that had such expertise and had volunteered to supply their services. A computer was recently issued to the LPS, but it has not yet been put to use.

(MN0961) Al Shur/ LPS: The Station Commander told PTT there have been no new attacks on his IP as of this date. He told PTT that there were three patrols today without incident. PTT did not spend much time at this station but did discuss a foot patrol in the neighborhood to implement the Community Oriented Policing training. This foot patrol will be conducted this week and the training will be held in the field.. The Station Commander was very receptive to this idea and will cooperate.

(MN0023) Al Rashidyah LPS: PTT currently assigned to Badoush Prison.

(MN0076) Tall Afar DHQ: PTT met with OIC LTC [redacted] PTT commended LTC [redacted] on the fact that all of his IP were properly uniformed and wearing their station badge. IP assigned to checkpoints were equipped with AK-47 rifles as well as side arms and were wearing body armor and Kevlar helmets. LTC [redacted] states that he has several IP in the current academy class in Mosul and that upon their return; he would like PTT to assist him with providing them more advanced training. It is important to note that LTC [redacted] does not expect PTT to conduct the training but rather to mentor his training officers while they conduct the training.

PTT then traveled to the home of SGM [redacted] for a meeting with [redacted] [redacted] is the principal [redacted] in Tall Afar. [redacted] has concerns with the manner in which BG [redacted] is reassigning IP. [redacted] stated that he and some other sheiks in Tall Afar feel that BG [redacted] is attempting to keep members of certain tribes all stationed at the same IP stations. The sheiks feel that this could cause potential problems because although it may be all IP from a single tribe at an IP station, that particular tribe may not get along well with the tribe that is in that particular part of the city. [redacted] is also concerned that BG [redacted] may be playing favorites with members of certain tribes which is causing bitterness amongst many of the IP. PTT advised [redacted] that the team would meet with BG [redacted] in the near future to attempt to resolve these issues. PTT thanked [redacted] for encouraging the members of his tribe to continue to work with the IP and IA.

(MN0222) Rabiya DHQ: PTT did not visit station today. PTT conducted vehicle maintenance and other duties at the FOB.

(MN0140) Al Saad: PTT did not visit station today. PTT conducted vehicle maintenance and other duties at the FOB.

(MN0962) Al Salaam: PTT did not visit station today. PTT conducted vehicle maintenance and other duties at the FOB.

(MN0204) Al Tahadi: PTT did not visit station today. PTT conducted vehicle maintenance and other duties at the FOB.

(MN0020) Hassengoi: PTT is on an overnight mission in the city of Tall Afar. No information for reports is available at this time.

(TT0002) Alton Kupri Patrol Police Station: PTT met with COL [redacted]. There was no significant activity in the Station AO in the past 24 hours. COL [redacted] further stated that the force protection measures were continuing to be improved.

(TT0007) Daquq Patrol Police Station: PTT was to convoy to Daquq Police Station. IPLO's were advised by CF LT that our services were not required today.

Daquq JCC: PTT escorted a flat bed truck containing large Hesco barriers to Daquq JCC for use on their force protection of the compound. This was the second load delivered in as many days. PTT left after delivery and returned later in the afternoon.

PTT met with MAJ [redacted] after returning for the afternoon visit. MAJ [redacted] advised The PTT of an incident that took place on 17 Jun 07 at his station. He stated that he was visited by BG [redacted] and 50 of his men at his station on a surprise visit. BG [redacted] was not Iraqi Police or Iraqi Army but could possibly be Persh Merga or could work for a company that protects government buildings, electrical towers, and pipelines in Iraq. MAJ [redacted] stated BG [redacted] had two IA officers with him, identified as COL [redacted] from the Iraqi Army 2nd BN and COL [redacted] who is the Kirkuk JCC representative for Iraqi Army. BG [redacted] advised MAJ [redacted] that he wanted the building they are in, that this was an old Iraqi Army building and they wanted it back. MAJ [redacted] stated that the BG had all of his men come into his small office during this conversation. MAJ [redacted] felt the BG did this to intimidate him. The meeting lasted about twenty minutes and they left. They were going to go to Taza Police Station and do the same. MAJ [redacted] called his supervisor after they left and advised him of the situation.

(TT0009) Domies Patrol Police Station: PTT convoyed to the Domies Iraqi Police Station to gather IPSFR information and inventory all sniper rifles. Cordon training aids were also delivered to the station. While at the station a suspected insurgent was captured after he and his brother triggered a VBIED explosion. Together they were working on the device when it detonated. His brother was killed and he was captured and on the way to Baghdad for further questioning. Operations were being conducted with several IP detaining and interviewing a suspected insurgent.

(TT0018) Highway Patrol Tamin: PTT talked to a shift commander about the patrols activities in the last few days. The shift commander wants to use some undercover IP to collect intelligence. The station chief isn't receptive to the idea. An Azadi murder case was solved with the help of a highway patrol IP.

Multaka Local Police Station: PTT spoke with COL [redacted] about patrol procedures and found that Multaka has two shifts of ten IP for patrol duties in the area. PTT reviewed a map of the area served by the Multaka Station and COL [redacted] identified the north, south, east and west limits of his area. PTT made arrangements with COL [redacted] to observe an IP patrol and left the station with two IP pickup trucks and ten IP. PTT followed the patrol for approximately one and one half hours while they checked six villages in the area. PTT spoke with COL [redacted] on return to the station and advised him that the patrol needed to stop and speak with people in the communities while they were patrolling and build relationships with the public. COL [redacted] advised PTT that they regularly attended weddings and ceremonies in the villages and interacted with the public at those events. He also stated that he is in contact with the Muqtars in the villages who keep him informed of happenings in the individual neighborhoods. Overall the patrol function at the station was very good and is only in need of more vehicles in order to increase patrol capabilities.

(TT0026) Rahemawa Patrol Police Station: PTT verified weapons and ammunition counts in the armory. The team also got measurements for the weapons storage racks that will be built. PTT trained six IP's on proper tactical search techniques. Training also consisted of disengagement of the subject if things go bad during the search.

(TT0030) Saragan Patrol Police Station: Due to mechanical failure of one of the vehicles the trip to Saragan IP station took 3.5 hours and the meeting with COL [redacted] was missed. The PTT checked on the improvements to Force Protection and found it progressing according to schedule.

Irbil Training Center: PTT met at Irbil Training Center and discussed the Presentations and associated projects for the coming Summit 2007. PTT continued preparation of the appropriate digital productions for the coming Irbil Summit 2007. PTT addressed logistical issues in preparation for the Summit.

(MI0905) Airport Security Station: The PTT conducted a survey of the proposed Cargo Area Entrance and Temporary Construction Entrance Checkpoints. The PTT recommended both physical fortification of the checkpoints as well changes in staffing and checkpoint operational procedures. The PTT also surveyed terminal security operations. The current security plan must be revised to address the six new terminals that are planned to go into operation in January of 2007. The station commander concurred with the PTT and has requested that the PTT continue to refine the security plan as construction on the new terminals near completion.

(MI0031) Emergency Response Police HQ: PTT met with CPT [redacted] of the District Police HQ to discuss additional tactical training. The CPT was asking if PTT would agree to continue training for the remaining 100 plus IP. He expressed his gratitude for the weapons training that was completed last week and understands the difficulty to meet the tactical training needs on the region. CPT also indicated that he is in need of a gasoline generator to be used at one of his check points. He stated that this check point has no lighting capabilities and is difficult to manage at night time. PTT agreed to furnish his station with a new generator that was recently purchased for this purpose.

(MI0905) Airport Security Station: The PTT met with LT [redacted] on a second visit to validate documents that will allow PTT vehicles through the check point area. During this visit LT [redacted] requested that PTT advise and recommend how the police can move forward on additional specialized training. The LT is concerned that the development of the new airport will create additional security responsibilities that they currently have little experience in. PTT assured the LT that he concerned will be addressed in the on going assessment.

District Security Police HQ: PTT met with station commander [redacted] to discuss the progress be made on the building construction. [redacted] stated that the construction is moving forward but that the completion date and move in is unknown. [redacted] stated that they are operating their functions efficiently and welcomes any support offered by the PTT.

Sulaymaniyah

Sulaymaniyah Asaish HQ: PTT met with the Asaish check point guards. PTT conducted training with the Dokan check point officers. First aid, officer awareness and interview stance were instructed today.

(TS0010) Sulaymaniyah Traffic HQ: PTT traveled to the Border Patrol Academy where the 2nd day of Motorcycle training for the 4th consecutive class began. This class is doing very well with the riders well in advance of the daily expectations. They have great work ethics and are willing to work hard at developing the new concepts taught. As a result, they are exceeding standards. The student trainers continue to take on more and more of the instruction and hands on riding. They are working well one with another, complementing each other with their unique abilities.

(TS0024) Cham Chamal DHQ: PTT Investigations arrived at Cham chamal DHQ and continued the lesson on Crime Scene Evidence Collection. The topic of the class was "Bite Mark Collection and Processing". The class was involved in the discussion as well as practical exercises.

(TS0024) Cham Chamal DHQ: The PTT traveled to Chamchamal DHQ and conducted day five of a two week community policing training program. In today's session, the ten IP and the PTT met at the training center and conducted the second foot patrol of the class. During today's patrol, the group patrolled a neighborhood, two markets, and visited Chamchamal's only hospital. At the completion of the patrol, the IP were advised of the class meeting time for Tuesday, 19Jun07, and what to expect during the classroom session of day six. Once the PTT had brought the class up to speed on the next portion of the course to be covered, the PTT returned to Camp Tow.

(TS0275) Sulay PJCC: PTT met with BG [redacted] and MAJ [redacted] and discussed PJCC operation. [redacted] stated that there were no major disturbances last night. PTT discussed American JCC operations with [redacted] and [redacted]. They were very interested in the way American JCC's are set up as far as floor plan.

(TS0008) Sulaymaniyah Traffic PHQ: The first course of training was Force Continuum and Expandable Baton. Students were instructed on what the mind set should be when on duty. Officer Presence, Verbalization, and Restraining and Detaining: Includes display of authority as a peace officer and such non-verbal means of communication as body language, demeanor, and manner of approaching. Verbalization involves the direction, and commands given to the subject. Restraining and detaining includes an officer laying hands on a subject with the intention of gaining control of the subject. Examples include the use of a firm grip, escort position or grappling types of techniques designed to hold a subject down by using the weight of an officer's body. Also included in this level would be the application of temporary restraining devices such: as handcuffs and leg restraints. Compliance Techniques: Includes joint manipulations, pressure point applications, take-down type techniques and the use of intermediate weapons in control type configurations. Intermediate Force: use of upper body control holds such as the lateral vascular neck restraint; the use of impact weapons in an impact mode, and the use of personal weapons such as hands, feet, elbows and knees to strike a subject. Lethal Force: Includes the use of a firearm or any force which has a reasonable likelihood of causing death or serious physical harm.

(TS0004) Sulaymaniyah PHQ: The PTT continued the third week of the 30-day advanced accident investigations course today at the Sulaymaniyah Police Academy. This course is being conducted at the request of MG [redacted] to insure his police investigators have an understanding of accident investigation, as they have the duty under Iraqi Law to present the case to the Investigative Judges in fatality cases.

Today continued to focus on examination of actual tire marks on the roadway, preparation of field sketches of the scene. The students were again tasked with conducting measures of the scene and marks present. After which the students returned to the classroom were they were required to conduct various calculations, based on the scene measurements.

Overall the class continues to do well, and is developing a good understanding of the dynamics of vehicles involved in collisions, the data that is required to make any relevant determinations, and the basis to adequately interpret the physical evidence present at accident scenes. However, it continues to be necessary to adjust the class daily curriculum, primarily due to the students varying levels of education.

Dahuk

(MD0646) Zahko DHQ: The PTT met with the district commander this date to obtain IPSFR data and discuss the general situation of the station. This DHQ maintains a patrol/quick reaction force that is continuously on patrol and also available to respond as a back up force for any nearby station requesting assistance. They keep computerized and

hard copy records for the District and are preparing for the day when they will have a computer network available for all stations within the District. They definitely see the value and advantage of utilizing computers for their day to day business and are looking ahead. The radio communications is functioning very well throughout the District and this DHQ actually has an operational base station radio as well as one operational vehicle radio. He reports no dead areas of radio coverage within his area. The PTT noted that this District is the only one in the Province to have equipped their new patrol pickups with PKC mounts, bench seats in the back and a roof. The Commander advised that he had gathered monetary support from the Mayor and other sources within his area to fund this. The commander does not feel he gets sufficient fuel for his needs and has units within his District utilizing foot patrols and temporary vehicle checkpoints to try and help make up for the lack of patrol. The station conducts daily briefings in which tactical concerns such as response drills are done and or addressed. They also routinely discuss community relations as being important. The Commander advised that just this past week one citizen in his area was wounded when the Turkish military fired into the area. The commander states his personnel have developed no intelligence that would lead them to believe that Turkey is firing at legitimate PKK targets and it seems that the occasional shelling is more oriented to keeping civilians from resettling in villages near the border.

The PTT questioned why this District seems to be lagging behind other areas in supplying men carrying pistols with a full three magazines of ammunition. The logistics officer denied that he has been receiving requests from the stations regarding this and further advised that last time he checked with PHQ he was told there was no additional ammunition available and he had no extra on hand that could be issued. The logistics officer advised he would again make an ammunition request and keep the PTT advised of the response from PHQ. The station commander advised that he would like a large copier for the DHQ as they are obligated to handle such a high volume of paperwork. He also requests traffic cones as he can not obtain these from PHQ and with all the temporary checkpoints they set up in his area on a daily basis they are needed. The District has recently received a supply of refrigerators, underwear and flashlights from the PHQ which they are in the process of distributing to the stations.

Currently the only training being received by station personnel is PT, mind set and community relations. The District Commander expressed a strong desire to have one or two of his men trained as trainers so that they might conduct other more advanced skills training on their own.

(MD0653) Zahko Undercover Unit: The PTT met with the station commander this date to obtain SINV data and discuss the general situation of the station. This station is primarily responsible for investigating property crimes and fraud cases with the District. They also develop and maintain information on known or suspected criminals within the area, conduct surveillance and does some public crime prevention work with the area businesses. The unit has cleared seven burglary cases since last Saturday with the suspects either in custody or identified. They concentrate a lot of their patrol time on businesses during the night in order to prevent or interdict burglaries. The biggest frustration faced by the unit is a lack of crime scene processing equipment. They have some training in the use of such equipment but are unable to obtain any.

The commander advised he has one man who has been hired for four months and has yet to receive any pay. This problem is common in the area for new hires and the commander and PHQ personnel are working with the KMOI to correct it.

Station has 22 pistols assigned to it and only 390 rounds of ammunition. The commander advises his requests for more ammunition have gone unanswered. The PTT advised that

the requests need to be made in writing so that the team can follow up on any issues that may arise. The ammunition issue was addressed with DHQ immediately after this visit, refer to Zahko DHQ DSR this date. The unit is expected to respond to crime scenes and gather evidence but they are furnished no evidence collection equipment to do so. Some of the members of the unit have had some training in lifting fingerprints and collecting evidence and could make good use of such equipment. The men in this unit work in plain clothes and are provided neither clothing nor money for this.

Currently the only training being received by station personnel is PT, mind set and community relations. Due to their frequent chasing of burglars the commander would like to get defensive tactics and related training for his men. They would also like more evidence collection training but lack the equipment to utilize any of it.

(MD0648) Dalal LPS: Today, PTT met with LT [redacted], the station commander for Dalal LPS. During discussion, PTT learned that the station performs one patrol per day and one patrol per night at random times. The station also sets up a checkpoint somewhere every night. LT [redacted] advised that they were experiencing the same types of crimes as many other stations which include fighting and vehicle crashes.

While gathering information from the station, PTT recognized several logistical deficiencies. The station has 25 IP, but they only have fifteen AK-47, eight ballistic vests with plates, eight Kevlar helmets, three hand held radios and very little ammunition. Upon further discussion with the LT, PTT found out that no written requests had been made for any of these items. PTT explained the proper process the LT should use to attempt to get his needed items.

PTT discussed training issues with LT Nazar. PTT learned that only one IP had been to the Jordan Academy and only one IP had been to Sulaymaniyah for training. None of the other IP had any training. LT [redacted] seemed very interested in getting firearms training for his station.

(MD0650) Karez LPS: PTT met with LT [redacted] because MAJ [redacted] the station commander was not at the station. PTT discussed some of the station's duties. It was discovered that the station performs no patrols during the day, a two to three hour foot patrol at night (rotating through different neighborhoods,) and a nightly checkpoint that is moved on a nightly basis. The station deals mostly with fights, but has seen an increase in murders as of recent. LT [redacted] advised the Karez LPS had seen three murders in the last four months.

While gathering information from the station, PTT recognized several logistical deficiencies. PTT learned the station only had fifteen AK-47s, ten ballistic vests with plates, ten Kevlar, and four radios. PTT also learned that the station only gets about eight hours of city power per day and does not have a generator. Also upon further discussion, PTT learned that the station had a very poor water supply.

PTT discussed training issues with LT [redacted]. In discussion, PTT learned that only two IP had been to Sulaymaniyah and none had been to the Jordan academy for training. Only MAJ [redacted] the station commander had any specialized training. He had been to Abu Dhabi for a Criminal Investigation school. LT [redacted] advised PTT that he believed the Zacko area had more crime issues than anywhere else in the Dahuk Province. He added, for this reason, that the area needed SWAT training. He also seemed very interested in any type of firearms training the station could receive.
