**Facts About Ramadan**

Each year, Muslims spend the ninth month of the Islamic calendar observing a community-wide fast. The annual fast of Ramadan is considered one of the five "pillars" of Islam. Muslims who are physically able are required to fast each day of the entire month, from sunrise to sunset. The evenings are spent enjoying family and community meals, engaging in prayer and spiritual reflection, and reading from the Qu'ran. Muslims all over the world abstain from food, drink, and other physical needs during the daylight hours. As a time to purify the soul, refocus attention on God, and practice self-sacrifice, Ramadan is, therefore, much more than just not eating and drinking.

**General Rules of Abstention**

Muslims are called upon to use this month to re-evaluate their lives in light of Islamic guidance. Muslims are to make peace with those who have wronged them, strengthen ties with family and friends, do away with bad habits -- essentially to clean up their lives, thoughts, and feelings. The Arabic word for "fasting" (*sawm*) literally means "to refrain" - and it means not only refraining from food and drink, but from evil actions, thoughts, and words.

During Ramadan, every part of the body must be restrained. The tongue must be restrained from backbiting and gossip. The eyes must restrain themselves from looking at unlawful things. The hand must not touch or take anything that does not belong to it. The ears must refrain from listening to idle talk or obscene words. The feet must refrain from going to sinful places. In such a way, every part of the body observes the fast.

Therefore, fasting is not merely physical, but is rather the total commitment of the person's body and soul to the spirit of the fast. Ramadan is a time to practice self-restraint; a time to cleanse the body and soul from impurities and re-focus one's self on the worship of God.

**Exceptions to Fasting**

There are several ways in which a person can be legitimately be exempted from fasting: Young Children (normally 12 and younger); persons in poor health; pregnant women; nursing women; menstruating women; and, Travelers, if the distance traveled is great (normally, over 40 miles);

However, these exemptions are normally only delays given by having the person "making up days of fasting" later in the year for most of these groups; The intent is that the total days of fasting are the same for all Muslims. It is also possible for individuals to feed a set number of the poor (normally 30, but sometimes as high as sixty) to make up for missed days (this CAN be done by those in too poor health to fast who can also afford to do so). Although it is possible for almost anyone to be totally excused of fasting by "serving the poor and needy" in this way, this is done very rarely. Feeding thirty poor people each day is a technical excuse for avoiding the fast which everyone must observe, but it is rare for a rich person to actually use this exemption. It is looked upon very, very badly by the rest of the community and the rich person would probably lose much too much respect for it to be worthwhile.

The status of children is actually mixed. The youngest are not expected to fast, but as they get older they gradually begin fasting for more and more of the day until they are able to go the entire day without food or water without endangering one's health. There are schools of thought in the Islamic world that believe fasting should be discouraged in children to allow them to grow healthier and study better, and have them begin fasting later. However, the onset of puberty or age 12 is generally the standard for starting the path of Ramadan fasting.

Although travelers and menstruating women can be exempted from fasting, they are nevertheless expected to make up the same number of missed days some time later in the year after Ramadan. Thus, they fast the same number of days as everyone else, but not at the same time. With the advent of modern travel methods, the guideline of 40 miles constituting "travel" is being questioned by some (40 miles riding on animals being very different than an hour in a car or plane, for example).

(U) **Impacts of Summer Weather and Altitude on Rotary Wing Air Support:** All stations need to be aware that the altitudes encountered in Afghanistan leave for very thin air, which places many rotary wing aircraft on the margins of their performance. High summer temperatures further thin the air, and may render many aircraft either unable to fly certain missions, or to perform them at noticeably reduced performance. For cargo missions, helicopters may be able to move significantly less loads and/or passengers.

According to a survey conducted by Integrity Watch Afghanistan, corruption within the country has doubled since 2006. The non-profit watchdog organization stated Afghan citizens pay upwards of a billion USD a year to receive basic public services and to protect their livelihood. Of those polled, a majority felt that the Ministry of Interior, Ministry of Justice and the intelligence services were the most corrupt. Citizens feel corruption builds inequality and damages the reconstruction attempts by the international community. ## **H. (U) Terror War Strategy Needs to be Changed: ISI Chief (Source: Screaming Eagle; Dawn.com)**

The ISI chief briefed the 18-member committee on Thursday on the overall security situation with reference to reports of external interferences creating political instability in the country. The committee headed by Senator Raza Rabbani was also briefed by the defense secretary on the military operation and law and order situation. According to sources, Gen Pasha said some foreign forces were creating disturbances in various parts of the country, adding the ISI was keeping an eye on their activities. He was of the opinion that Pakistan should consider making changes in its strategy because of changes in US policy about dealing with terrorists in Afghanistan and the Afghan government's focus on finding an indigenous solution to the problem. Gen Pasha said intelligence agencies were aware of requirements of national security in view of the US and Indian strategic moves in the region. Mr. Rabbani told reporters after the meeting the committee had discussed in its four meetings the overall security situation in the region with reference to the changing scenario because of proposed changes in American and Afghan strategies. He said the committee would start preparing its recommendations on August 4 after briefings by the ministries of interior, foreign affairs and defense on Aug 2, 3 and 4. Answering a question, Mr Rabbani said only the government could decide whether to launch a military operation in North Waziristan and the decision would not be taken under dictates of any country.
