Subj: FRATRICIDE INCIDENT ON 2 FEB 07 AT COMBAT OUTPOST GRANT
WHICH RESULTED IN THE DEATHS OF PRIVATE MATTHEW ZEIMER
AND SPECIALIST ALAN MCPEAK

Ref: (a) AR 15-6

1. I have reviewed the subject investigation and find it to be in compliance with reference (a). Paragraph 4, subparagraph (b) is modified from Enclosure (20) to Enclosure (21) to reflect the appropriate source. I concur with the findings and recommendations of the Investigating Officer as endorsed by the Commander, 1st Brigade Combat Team. Specifically, I find that a US M830A1 HEAT-MP-T projectile fired from a US M1A1 tank struck COP Grant and caused the deaths of Private Matthew Zeimer and Specialist Alan McPeak.

2. As the investigation discloses, the battle on 2 February 2007 was fierce, chaotic, and prolonged. A well-organized and numerous enemy engaged coalition forces from multiple directions in a crowded neighborhood on a dark, smoke and dust obscured battlefield. The soldiers involved in this incident were combat experienced and familiar with the area and friendly positions. Nevertheless, they became disoriented relative to their own position and the targets they were engaging. Although Soldiers rigorously train to prepare for the constant uncertainty of the battlefield, their honest and concerted efforts can never fully eliminate the inevitable fog of war. Tragically, in this case it led to the mistake that claimed the lives of Private Matthew Zeimer and Specialist Alan McPeak.

3. The Commander, 1st Brigade Combat Team has undertaken significant measures to prevent these incidents in the future. In truth, the inherently chaotic nature of the modern urban battlefield prevents any combination of preventative measures from completely eliminating the possibility of tragic events like this. I am, however, completely confident that these measures will dramatically reduce the potential for future fratricide incidents.

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4. I offer my most sincere and heartfelt condolences to the families of Private Matthew Zeimer and Specialist Alan McPeak. Words cannot adequately convey the depth of the sorrow we feel for the loss of our friends and comrades in arms. Each of these fine young men fought bravely and selflessly during the fierce battle that raged that night and each gave his life honorably serving his country.

SUBJECT: Endorsement of Army Regulation 15-6 Investigation Pertaining to the Deaths of
Private Matthew Zeimer and Specialist Alan McPeak, Combat Outpost Grant, 2 February 2007

1. Enclosed is the Army Regulation (AR) 15-6 investigation into the deaths of Private Matthew Zeimer and Specialist Alan McPeak, at Combat Outpost (COP) Grant, Ar Ramadi, on 2 February 2007. The investigation was completed by Major (MAJ) (b)(3), (b)(6), endorsed by the Battalion Commander, Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) (b)(3), (b)(6) and reviewed by my Brigade Judge Advocate, MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6). I am satisfied that this investigation provides a sufficient description of what happened on 2 February 2007 and that no further investigation is needed.

2. I agree with MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6)'s conclusion that a US M830A1 HEAT-MP-T projectile fired from a US M1A1 tank struck COP Grant and caused the deaths of Private Zeimer and Specialist McPeak. I also agree with MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6)'s recommendations, and his conclusion that this incident was not the result of negligence, but was a tragic accident. All of the Soldiers involved acted reasonably in trying to ensure that friendly forces were not targeted during the engagement. Tragically, despite all of their efforts, the confusing and obscured nature of the battlefield resulted in the accident.

3. On the morning of 2 February 2007 the Soldiers at COP Grant and COP Eagle's Nest were engaged in an intense, complex, and prolonged battle with Anti-Iraqi Forces (AIF). The terrorists and insurgents simultaneously attacked the two COPs from several directions, employing a mixture of weapons systems. Because of the complexity and intensity of the attacks, the limited visibility, and the close proximity of the COPs, the battle was very chaotic and confusing. The units from 1st Brigade, 1st Armored Division, who owned the battle space, were experienced Soldiers and familiar with combat operations in Ar Ramadi. The units were following their tested procedures and communicated with their higher headquarters to ensure that only enemy forces were engaged. Unfortunately, as the Quick Reaction Force (QRF) entered the fight after the Guided Multiple Launch Rocket System (GMLRS) strike, the M1A1 crewmen became confused about their positioning and the targets they were engaging. This confusion is understandable, as almost every individual involved in the firing of the M830A1-HEAT-MP-T round was uncertain as to where the tanks were located and which building was being targeted. The Pioneer Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) video feed clearly shows that tanks B31 and B33 were facing West, down Farouk Way, and engaging targets in the direction of COP Grant. The Pioneer feed also establishes that the main tank round fired by the QRF was fired in the

direction of COP Grant. While the members of the QRF strongly assert that they did not engage targets in the direction of COP Grant, the Pioneer feed clearly refutes their recollections and establishes the confusing nature of the battlefield.

4. Since 1st Brigade, 3d Infantry Division has taken responsibility for operations in Ar Ramadi, we have conducted an extensive assessment of the force protection posture of each Coalition Force installation. I agree with MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6)'s recommendations and have taken several steps to dramatically reduce the potential for further fratricide incidents. I have mandated the installation of infrared marking devices for each installation and vehicle in the area of operations. I have directed that use of a main tank gun must first be approved by a field grade officer. I have directed that Tank or Bradley main gun fire will not be used between COPs Grant and Eagle's Nest without the approval of both Battalion Commanders. I have also stressed the importance of communication between units during all operations. As we are firmly emplaced in Ar Ramadi, there should be no question as to which unit occupies which installation and how units will communicate with each other.

5. I cannot state in strong enough terms, how sorry I am that this incident occurred. Although Private Zeimer had arrived on COP Grant only a few hours before his death, his actions on 2 February 2007 showed the bravery, valor, strength of character, and commitment to duty that give honor to our profession. The same holds true for the actions of Specialist McPeak. Despite having only a few days left on COP Grant, Specialist McPeak again responded to the enemy's fierce attack with bravery and selflessness. His commitment to his fellow Soldiers and the Iraqi people was inexhaustible. The life of every Soldier, Marine, Sailor, and Airman, is precious, and as commanders, it is our responsibility to safeguard these honorable and courageous individuals at all times. I take this responsibility very serious and will continuously work to protect all of the women and men with whom I serve.

1. I have reviewed the attached 15-6 Investigation and supporting documentation concerning the alleged fratricide, which occurred on 2 February 2007 involving Soldiers from C Company, 2-37 Armor, Task Force 1-9 Infantry, and B Company, Task Force 3-69 Armor.
2. I concur with the summary of findings, opinions, and recommendations of Major (b)(3), (b)(6) the Investigating Officer. I believe events occurred as described and that additional investigation is not required. However, I feel that additional interviews of 1st Lieutenant (3), (b) Staff Sergeant (b)(3), (b)(6), Sergeant (3), (b) Specialist (3), (b) and Captain (3), (b) would provide clarification.
3. It is incumbent upon every commander to take steps to prevent fratricide incidents. Although we have only been in theater for less than a month, we are implementing several measures to ensure that Soldiers stationed at the Combat Outposts can easily identify and communicate with friendly forces and locations.

SUBJECT: 15-6 Investigation of the Combat Outpost Grant Engagement: 2 February 2007

1. After reviewing the evidence collected in this investigation, I, the Investigating Officer, have concluded that on 2 February 2007 a round fired from an US tank impacted Combat Outpost (COP) Grant and caused the deaths of Private Matthew Zeimer and Specialist Alan McPeak. Additionally, I have concluded that firing of the main tank round that impacted COP Grant was accidental and not the result of negligence.

2. The events on the morning of 2 February 2007 are overlapping and confusing. The units at Combat Outposts (COP) Grant and Eagle's Nest were engaged in heavy, nighttime combat with Anti-Iraqi Forces (AIF) for almost one hour, and at least a half an hour before the Task Force (TF) 1-9 Infantry Quick Reaction Force (QRF) was authorized to use the main tank gun. Combat Outposts Grant and Eagle's Nest were attacked almost simultaneously, by numerous AIF from all directions. The AIF attacks were heavy from the outset, maintained their level of violence for an extended period of time, and utilized multiple weapons systems including small arms fire and rocket propelled grenades. In response, the Soldiers at each COP communicated with their higher headquarters, followed established procedures, and employed proportionate force. The ferocity, duration, and scope of the battle created a confusing battlefield and placed all of the Soldiers involved under great pressure. At one point during the battle, TF 1-9 fired a Guided Multiple Launch Rocket System (GMLRS) rocket, a precision-guided rocket, against a building be being used by AIF to attack COP Eagle's Nest. Although the GMLRS rocket missed its intended target, the rocket's detonation surely helped to obscure the battlefield with debris, dust, and smoke. On 2 February 2007 COP Grant did not have any infrared marking devices on its exterior. The intense and chaotic battle created confusion on the battlefield, and when coupled with the close proximity of COP Grant to COP Eagle's Nest, lead to the accidental firing upon COP Grant.

3. At the time of the attack, Area of Operations (AO) Topeka, which includes the city of Ramadi, was under the command of 1st Brigade Combat Team, 1st Armored Division (1-1AD). Some units from 1st Brigade Combat Team, 3d Infantry Division (1-3ID), were in AO Topeka, but 1-3ID had not yet assumed responsibility for the AO. On 2 February 2007 COP Grant was under the control of C Company, TF 1-37 Armor, and COP Eagle's Nest was under the control of D Company, TF 1-9 Infantry. Both TF 1-37 and TF 1-9 are experienced combat units that had occupied their respective COPs, and fought in AO Topeka for several months. On 1 February 2007 Soldiers from TF 3-69 Armor, 1-3ID, arrived at COP Grant and were conducting their transition with the C Company, TF 1-37 Soldiers. B Company, TF 3-69, was set to assume responsibility for COP Grant in a few days, and the transition with C Company, TF 1-37, had

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just begun. The battle procedures used during the 2 February engagement were the established and tested procedures of TF 1-37, TF 1-9, and 1-1 AD.

4. Summary of Events Pre-GMLRS Strike on Building 170, patrol sector L-5.

a. Combat Outpost Grant is located in Ramadi, Iraq, and occupies buildings 39 and 40 in patrol sector P5. Buildings 39 and 40 are located on the North side of Farouk Way. Farouk Way is a street that runs East-West and intersects to the East with Easy Street. At the intersection of Easy Street, Farouk Way changes its name to Al Milaab Road. Combat Outpost Eagle's Nest is located approximately 900m to the East of COP Grant, at the intersection of Easy Street and Al Milaab Road. Combat Outpost Eagle's Nest occupies the Northeastern corner of Easy Street and Al Milaab Road.

b. On 2 February 2007 an Unmanned Ariel Vehicle (UAV) (Pioneer UAV), observed the engagement and recorded its video feed (Enclosure 20). During the battle, the UAV did not focus exclusively on one COP, but rather, moved between COP Grant, COP Eagle's Nest, and other areas in the vicinity of the engagement.

c. On 2 February 2007 beginning at approximately 0055hrs, COP Grant was engaged by Anti-Iraqi Forces with small arms fire and rocket propelled grenades from numerous locations. Combat Outpost Grant declared troops in contact at 0100 (Enclosure 3). The TF 1-37 Duty Log states that rocket propelled grenade fire struck Tower 2 on COP Grant's Eastern wall at about 0115 (Enclosure 4). The Duty Log also states that at 0118 to 0125, small arms fire was reported from the South of COP Grant, and rocket propelled grenades were coming from buildings 12 and 35, in patrol sector P-8, and landing on the Tactical Operations Center (Enclosure 4). Reports also indicate that small arms fire was coming from building 128, in patrol sector L5.

d. At approximately 0059, COP Eagle's Nest was engaged with numerous rounds of rocket propelled grenades and small arms fire. Combat Outpost Eagle's Nest declared troops in contact at 0105. At approximately 0110, 10 rocket propelled grenade rounds, coming from building 117, patrol sector L6, and building 35, patrol sector P10, struck COP Eagle's Nest. Combat Outpost Eagle's Nest also reported receiving mortar rounds from building 91, patrol sector P10 (Enclosure 5).

e. At approximately 0115, the TF 1-9 QRF, left Camp Corregidor to support the engagement at COP Eagle's Nest. Camp Corregidor lies East of COP Eagle's Nest, at the intersection of Michigan and Canal. The QRF was comprised of two (2) M1A1 tanks, tanks B31 and B33. First Lieutenant (1LT) (b)(3), (b)(6) was the commander of tank B31, and Staff Sergeant (SSG) (b)(3), (b)(6) was the commander of tank B33. The QRF left Camp Corregidor and traveled West on Michigan, turned left onto Canal, and then turned right on to Al Milaab. The QRF

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traveled West on Al Milaab until they were approximately 50 to 100 meters to the East COP Eagle's Nest. The QRF stopped near COP Eagle's Nest at approximately 0125 hours, because a GMLRS strike was about to occur on building 170, patrol sector L-5. Building 170, patrol sector L5, is located in the Northwestern corner of patrol sector L5, and is East (across Easy Street) of COP Eagle's Nest. Statements from the members of the QRF do not describe the positioning of the tanks, as they awaited the GMLRS strike on Al Milaab. At 0133 hours, the C Company, TF 2-37 Log states that the GMLRS strike missed its target (C Company, TF 2-37, is located at Camp Corregidor).

6. Summary of Events Post-GMLRS Strike on Building 170, Sector L5:

a. According to the members of the QRF, after the GMLRS strike, tanks B31 and B33 moved West down Al Milaab towards Easy Street. As the tanks approached the intersection, they started receiving small arms fire from their South to Southwest (or from the Northeast corner of patrol sector P10) (Enclosures 6, 8, 9, 13, 23, 24, 25, 26). The QRF members, SPC(3), (b) Sergeant (SGT)(3), (b) and 1LT(3), (b) all state that they could positively identify small arms fire coming from a building in the Northeast corner of patrol sector P10 (Enclosures 6, 8, 24, 25). Specialist (3), (b) and SGT(3), (b) specifically identified building 39, patrol sector P10 (Enclosures 8, 25), but 1LT(3), (b) could not identify the building number, because his map was old (Enclosure 6). 1LT(3), (b) stated he fired tracer rounds to mark the building where the small arms fire was coming from (Enclosure 6).

b. According to the members of the QRF, tank B33 moved into the Southern portion of the Easy Street and Al Milaab intersection, and turned towards the Southwest corner of the intersection. Tank B33 turned to the Southwest to target the buildings where the small arms fire was coming from (Enclosures 6, 8, 9, 23 - 26).

c. Tank B31 moved West towards the Northeast corner of the Easy Street and Al Milaab intersection and faced West (Enclosures 6, 8, 9, 23 - 26).

d. Despite the statements of the QRF members, the Pioneer UAV feed does not show a tank occupying the Southern part of the Easy Street and Al Milaab intersection and oriented to the Southwest. The UAV video feed does show that:

(1) At 39:00 minutes, roughly 6 minutes after the GMLRS strike, two tanks are sitting single file, on the Southern side of Al Milaab Street, just East of COP Eagle's Nest. This is inconsistent with the statements of 1LT(3), (b), SSG b(3), (b)6, SGT(3), (b) or SPC(3), (b) who state that they were in the Easy Street and Al Milaab intersection around this time.

(2) At 40:26 minutes, a tank is near the Northeast corner of the Easy Street/Al Milaab intersection.

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(3) At 45:22 minutes, a tank is at the Northeast corner of Easy Street/Al Milaab, firing its coax at buildings to the West, down Farouk Way. The second tank is still on the Southern side of Al Milaab, just East of COP Eagle's Nest.

e. According to the QRF members, when tanks B31 and B33 entered the intersection of Easy Street and Al Milaab, they requested the use of the main gun to engage AIF in a building in patrol sector P10. However, there was confusion over which building to engage.

(1) First Lieutenant (3), (b) states that he requested the use of the main gun through D Company, TF 1-9. and D Company asked which building he wanted to engage (Enclosure 6). First Lieutenant (3), (b) states that he was unsure of the building's number, but the building was in the Northeast corner of patrol sector P10 (Enclosure 6). D Company asked 1LT (3), (b) if he was talking about building 170, patrol sector P10 (Enclosure 6). First Lieutenant (3), (b) responded that his map was outdated, but he would mark the target building with tracers (Enclosure 6). First Lieutenant (3), (b) states after marking the target, D Company confirmed the target, and authorized the use of one (1) main gun round (Enclosure 6).

(2) Captain (b)(3), (b)(6) the D Company Commander, states that 1LT (3), (b) asked to engage building 39, in patrol sector P10, with the main tank gun (Enclosure 28).

(3) The C Company, TF 2-37 Log states that Observation Post (OP) West was marking building 170, with steady fire, and that tank B31 was also engaging building 170.

(4) The TF 1-9 Log states that D Company requested the use of the main tank gun against building 161, Sector P10 (Enclosure 27).

(5) Specialist (3), (b) states that D Company called for a main gun round on building 170, patrol sector 10 (Enclosure 8).

(6) Staff Sergeant (b)(3), (b)(6) does not mention being engaged from a specific building in patrol sector P10. Staff Sergeant (b)(3), (b)(6) states after he pushed forward into the intersection of Easy Street and Al Milaab, he picked his target and told his gunner where to fire the main gun (Enclosure 9). In a telephonic interview, SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) stated that he marked his target with machine gun fire, which 1LT (3), (b) corroborates.

(7) At 0133 hours, the C Company, TF 2-37 Log states that tank B31 was requesting main gun use against building 137 (no sector identified). The Log then states that 0133 hours, tank B33 engaged building 170 (no sector identified), with the main tank gun.

(8) After personally examining the engagement site, I determined that building 170, patrol sector P10, cannot be marked by fire, because it is located on the fourth row of houses Southwest

of COP Eagle's Nest. Therefore, witnesses who state that building 170, patrol sector P10, was marked by machine gun fire are mistaken and incorrect.

f. The C Company, TF 2-37 Log states building 170 was engaged with a main tank gun by tank B33 at 0133 (Enclosure 5). The Pioneer UAV video feed did not capture this engagement. Major (MAJ) (b)(3), (b)(6), 1-1AD, states that he observed an M1A1 tank engage, with its main gun, a building to the Southwest in the vicinity of COP Eagle's Nest (Enclosure 13). Major (b)(3), (b)(6) also states that part of the round's impact was captured on UAV feed. However, the Pioneer UAV feed does not show the impact.

g. Captain (b)(3), (b)(6) D Company, TF 1-9, states his OP observed the tank round impact on a building in the Northeast corner of patrol sector P10, and that he felt the impact of the round because of its close proximity to COP Eagle's Nest (Enclosure 28). However, CPT (b)(3), (b)(6) did not identify the building in patrol sector P10 that was engaged (Enclosure 28).

h. First Lieutenant (b)(3), (b)(6) SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) and SGT (b)(3), (b)(6) state that at the time tank B33 fired its main gun, tank B33 was in front of tank B31 and facing Southwest towards the Northeast corner of patrol sector P10 (Enclosures 6, 9, 25).

(1) However, MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) states that the tank that engaged the target to the Southwest (tank B33), was facing directly West down Farouk Way, with its barrel pointed to the Southwest (Enclosure 13).

(2) At no time, does the Pioneer UAV feed show tank B33 to the Southwest and in front of tank B31. Every time tank B33 is scene on the Pioneer UAV feed, tank B33 is sitting on the Southside of Al Milaab, facing straight down Farouk Way. The Pioneer UAV feed corroborates MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6)'s placement of tank B33 as being on the Southside of Al Milaab and facing West down Farouk Way, which contradicts the statements of the ORF members.

i. Based on my personal observation of the engagement area, because tank B33 was positioned on the Southside of Al Milaab and facing West down Farouk Way (behind tank B31), tank B33 could have engaged COP GRANT with a clear gun target line.

j. Confusion over the building numbers in patrol sector P10 continued after the firing of the main tank gun.

(1) 1LT (b)(3), (b)(6) states he was unsure whether building 39 or 170 was engaged, because building 39 is almost completely damaged (Enclosure 6). However, 1LT (b)(3), (b)(6) states the impact from the main tank round was almost instantaneous with its firing (Enclosure 6). During my personal inspection of the engagement area, SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) identified building 39 as the building

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that he engaged in patrol sector P10. However, building 39 is not so demolished as to allow a tank round to pass through and engage building 170 (Enclosure 7).

(2) CPT (b)(3), (b)(6) states, "Approximately 45 minutes into the fire fight. LT (b)(3), (b)(6) reported seeing movement on the top of building 130 in Zone L6. Once again, I checked the SDZ to ensure that his fires would be 15 degrees north of COP Grant and after verifying this I gave him permission to fire. Around this time we received radio call that COP Grant had casualties on the roof and to cease fire to the West" (Enclosure 28). The C Company, TF 2-37 Log states that at 0138 "Dog 6 REPORTS BLUE I ENGAGED BUILDING 137 MAIN GUNS" (Enclosure 5). Captain Enos' statement, and the C Company, TF 2-37 Log indicate that tank B31 used its main gun to fire a round against building 137, patrol sector L6. Building 137, patrol sector L6, is located directly West of tank B31's position at the Northeast corner of the Easy Street and Al Milaab intersection.

k. Staff Sergeant (b)(3), (b)(6) states before he fired his main tank gun, he directed his gunner to manually input 200m in the firing computer, because the targeted building was so close (Enclosure 9, 26). If a tank gun is at a 0-degree elevation, manually inputting a range of 200m will allow a tank round to travel approximately 550m, before the round starts its downward trajectory (Enclosure 20). Laying the tank main gun on a target with an elevation greater than 0-degrees and inputting 200m manually into the computer will not automatically move the gun to a super elevation of 2.2 degrees, thus increasing the distance the round can fly (Enclosure 20).

7. Evidence collected at COP GRANT.

a. Statements from Soldiers on the roof of COP Grant state an explosion occurred on the Eastern wall of COP Grant.

b. During my on scene examination of the ordinance point of impact at COP GRANT, I shot an azimuth of 70 degrees. The 70-degree azimuth runs parallel with Farouk Way and tracks in close proximity to the projectile tracked on the Pioneer UAV film.

c. In his sworn statement, SGT (b)(3), (b)(6) states that he witnessed a "huge flash" coming from the East of COP Grant, West of Goat Street, where Baseline and Farouk Way meet (Enclosure 12). This location is consistent with an engagement originating along an azimuth of 70 degrees looking East. The 70-degree azimuth tracks in close proximity to the location of the projectile tracked on the UAV film (Enclosure 11).

d. After the battle was over, SGT (b)(3), (b)(6) and SGT (b)(3), (b)(6) A Company, 16th Engineer Battalion, collected shrapnel fragments from COP Grant and turned them over to the Battalion S2 (Enclosures 14 & 15). Sergeant (b)(3), (b)(6) states he found two fin pieces on the

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Eastern corner of COP Grant and some green colored shrapnel in the middle of COP Grant (Enclosure 14), which were given to the Explosive Ordnance Division (EOD) for analysis.

(1) The initial EOD report, based on crater analysis, concluded that two (2) 73mm OG-9 recoilless rifle rounds hit COP Grant (Enclosure 16). According to EOD, recoilless rounds could produce effects similar to mortar rounds (Enclosure 16).

(2) On 8 February, the shrapnel fragments collected from COP Grant were delivered to EOD. After reconstruction of the fragments, EOD positively concluded that an US M830A1 HEAT-MP-T projectile, for use in an M1A1 tank, had struck COP Grant (Enclosure 16). The EOD report determined the M830A1 HEAT-MP-T fragments were free of rust, oxidation, or other exposure from the elements (Enclosure 16). This lack of exposure indicates the fragments were recently created (Enclosure 16). The EOD report also determined the damage to COP Grant's roof was too extensive to have been caused by an RPG round, and the angle of impact eliminated the possibility of a mortar strike (Enclosure 16). The EOD report did not inquire as to which tank fired the M830A1 HEAT-MP-T round, as they would not be able to make such a determination.

8. The Pioneer UAV Feed: The final piece of evidence used to determine the events of 2 February 2007 is the Pioneer UAV feed. The Pioneer UAV feed provides the following information:

a. The exact location of both tanks B31 and B33 during the engagement. The Pioneer UAV feed shows the tanks in two locations: 1) in a single file line along the South side of Al Milaab; or 2) with tank B31 in the lead, at the Northeast corner of Easy Street and Al Milaab, and tank B33 trailing, along the Southside of Al Milaab. The location of the tanks, as shown by the Pioneer UAV feed, contradicts the locations described by 1LT (b)(3), (b)(6) and SGT (b)(3), (b)(6).

b. At minute 39:46, a projectile, moving from East to West along Farouk Way, in the direction of COP Grant.

c. First Lieutenant (b)(3), (b)(6) tank firing coax at a building. However, the building is not located in the Northeast corner of Sector P10, and 1LT (b)(3), (b)(6) tank is firing West, down Farouk Way, in the direction of COP Grant.

9. Conclusion:

a. It is my belief, that due to the fierce and chaotic engagement, and the obscured visibility on the battlefield, tanks B31 and B33 were confused about the direction they were facing and the

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building they were targeting. Unfortunately, a main tank round was fired that struck COP Grant. The evidence supporting my conclusion is as follows:

(1) Confusion on the part of the QRF members and other Soldiers involved in the fight is clear regarding the positions of the tanks and the buildings being targeted.

(2) The Pioneer UAV feed and MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6)'s statement establish the tanks were never in the positions as laid out in the statements of the QRF members.

(3) The Pioneer UAV feed clearly tracks a projectile, moving from East to West along Farouk Way and parallel to a 70-degree azimuth, that could have been fired by tank B33. A witness from COP Grant also saw a "huge flash" come from the East of COP Grant, before the COP was impacted.

(4) The EOD report concluded that an US M830A1 HEAT-MP-T round had recently struck the roof of COP Grant.

(5) The Pioneer UAV feed shows 1LT (b)(3), (b)(6) tank firing its machine gun after the tank round was fired. This footage is consistent with 1LT (b)(3), (b)(6)'s statement that he engaged AIF after the tank round was fired, but 1LT (b)(3), (b)(6) tank is firing West, down Farouk Way, in the direction of COP Grant.


b. I also conclude this tragic incident was an accident, and not the result of negligence. The battle on 2 February 2007 was fierce, chaotic, and extended. United States Soldiers battled numerous and organized AIF at night, in a crowded neighborhood, and on an obscured battlefield. COP Grant's exterior did not have any infrared or thermal markings on its exterior, to distinguish itself through the smoke, dust, and darkness. The Soldiers involved in this incident were experienced Soldiers, who were familiar with the area and the friendly positions. It may be difficult to imagine how experienced Soldiers could be so disoriented; but due to the limited visibility and the pressure of battle, it is easy for Soldiers to be confused as to their situation. Tragically, confusion on the battlefield does occur and can result in accidents amongst even the most experienced Soldiers.



2. The purpose of this investigation is to determine the facts surrounding the above mentioned incident. During your investigation, you should: 1) interview witnesses with knowledge of the events; 2) attempt to determine what type of ordnance killed Private Zeimer and Specialist McPeak; 3) whether Coalition Forces or hostile forces discharged the ordnance; and 4) the circumstances surrounding the discharge of the ordnance. At the conclusion of your investigation, you will make a report detailing your findings and make recommendations.
3. If in the course of your investigation you come to suspect that an individual(s) may have committed an act, which violates the UCMJ, you must advise the individual(s) of their rights under Article 31, UCMJ. In addition, you must provide them a Privacy Act statement before you solicit any (further) personal information. Contact the Brigade Judge Advocate prior to initiating your investigation for a briefing.
4. Submit your findings and recommendations in memorandum format to me within 3 days of the date of this memorandum. This is your priority mission, and all other missions will be suspended until your investigation is complete.

I am amending my previous sworn statement given on 9 FEB 07, when I wrote the statement I was at Camp Al Taggadam and did not have any maps or graphics to provide specific details. On the morning of 2 FEB 07, around 0200, SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) (Tank Commander for C33) and I responded to a TIC at OP Eagle's Nest, Dog 6 held to the east of Eagle's Nest on Malab Rd because of an incoming GMLRS strike on bldg 170 in the LG block. I had all hatches closed and so when the strike hit, I saw a flash to the West/NW, over in the LG, so I couldn't tell if it hit. We still kept receiving a lot of incoming enemy small arms, so I requested use of main gun through Dog company, and they asked which building number, I told them that it was hard to be exact, but it was the Northeast Corner of P10, they asked if it was Bldg 170, I told them that my map was outdated but I would mark it with traces. I marked with cross, and D/1-9 confirmed it was the correct house. Main gun use was approved, so C33 and my tank moved forward to CP 343. SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) was situated to my Southwest, oriented southwest, I was about 10-15 meters away, oriented west with hull, but gun/turret orientation was southwest. SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) reported he had main gun loaded and was ready to fire, I told him to confirm his SDZ was clear, which he did, and I doublechecked. I then called Dog 6 and told him that our SDZ was clear and were ready to fire main gun, he told us to send the round. I told SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) to fire and he did. The round went into bldg 39 or 170 - it was hard to tell because bldg 39 is almost completely demolished, and they both share the exact same gun target line. The flash to bang time difference was instantaneous, it looked like the main gun



Firing and the round impact were simultaneous, the impact was at the bldg 39/170, and then the target became obscured. I asked SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) to confirm round type so that our gun charts can be updated, and he told me it was OR. We continued to scout and engage ~~the~~ hostiles with small arms and we continued to receive small arms until Dog 6 told us that all weapons were on tight status. We then left Eagles Nest after 20 minutes, when Dog 6 released us.



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



I was the 1/1 AD Battle captain in the morning of 2 FEB 07. At approximately 0055 I received a phone call from the TF 1-9 Manchu Battle Captain declaring Troops in Contact at COP Eagle's Nest with SAF from buildings 170 (b)(2)High in zone L6, building 35 (b)(2)High and 161 (b)(2)High in zone P10, and building 91 (b)(2)High in zone L6 to the southwest. I immediately diverted the Shadow and Pioneer ISR assets to support TF 1-9 and requested aviation support. I then called TF 3-69 AR knowing that this was their first day in the lead, and informed them that Eagle's Nest was in contact and for COP Grant to "bunker down" in order to avoid any possible ricochet fire. We have had incidents in the past where small arms ricochet fire from either COP Eagle's Nest or COP Grant at targets on RTE Farouk has impacted on friendly COPs due to the placement and geometry of forces. The TF 3-69 Battle Captain acknowledged. Approximately five minutes later the TF 3-69 Battle Captain called back and declared a TIC at COP Grant. I specifically inquired whether this was fire being received from COP Eagle's Nest or whether it was from a separate target. I allocated the Pioneer UAV to support the TIC and requested additional FW or RW support. TF 3-69 stated contact was coming specifically from the L5 and J10 sectors N and NE of COP Grant. I contacted TF 1-9 and informed them to watch fires west to COP Grant as they were also in contact. TF 1-9 acknowledged. TF 1-9 called for a GMLRS strike on building 170 in the L6 Sector, which I gained approval for through the BDE XO. The strike executed. Shortly afterwards I observed an MIAI Tank engage IVO COP Eagle's Nest with a main gun round to the southwest to a POB unobserved by the UAV (cannot recall if Shadow or Pioneer, I believe Pioneer). The UAV did see building fragments flying from the impact within the UAV frame, which suggested an impact less than 200m from the tank. The tank hull was facing straight down RTE Farouk and the turret was approximately 20-30 degrees (10 o'clock-11 o'clock) over the left fender during the shot.

As a former tank company commander, whose company employed over 40 main gun rounds in combat, I can state with confidence that the engagement was conducted at short range and the turret was at an angle inconsistent with impacts at COP Grant. A HEAT round ballistic solution input for a 200m engagement (system minimum) would have been unable to impact COP Grant 1000m away and would have grounded out. A qualified master gunner could confirm the ballistic properties required to shoot at that range. In my professional judgement it would have been nearly impossible for C-2-37's round to impact COP Grant based off of the angle fired, ballistics, and explosions observed by the UAV.

The firefight lasted for a while we received one RPG and 2 mortars to a house just to the south of Op Grant. About an hour and some minutes into the fight, there was a loud explosion and everyone on the roof was on the ground. Soon after, SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) had told everyone to get back off the roof. I went back into my tower and continued to pull the rest of my guard shift while still having heavy enemy fire. soon after the shunting died out, Spc Mcpeck and Pv2 Ziemer were found on top of the roof blown away from the impact hole. I was relieved around 0500 and came back on at 0800 to the same tower. As I pulled guard with 3-69 soldiers, Sgt (b)(3), (b)(6) came and asked me to come help him out with picking up body pieces off of the roof. After that, we started to pick up what was left of what we thought was a rocket of some type. we pick up tail fins and small pieces of shrapnel off the roof. After we picked up those pieces, i went directly downstairs and outside the tanker building, thats were I found the biggest piece of the rocket and turned it in to Cobra main





5. EOD Procedures Performed: Fragmentation found at the site of the blast was brought to EOD at approximately 1045 on 08 Feb 2007. The fragmentation was brought to EOD by (b)(1)1.4a EOD was told that the fragmentation was found on the roof and below the building on COP Grant. EOD reconstructed the tail assembly out of the fragmentation and compared it to a similar round obtained from the unit and made a positive identification of the fragmentation. The round was positively identified as a U.S. M830A1 HEAT-MP-T projectile for use in a M1A1.

6. Final Disposition: Fragmentation was maintained by EOD as evidence for forthcoming investigations.


7. Conclusion: Fragmentation brought to EOD was aluminum construction fin fragments and heavy steel fragmentation. No oxidation or rust existed on any of the fragments indicating that the fragmentation was very recent and had not been exposed to the elements for any period of time. EOD believes the Battalion S-2 was tasked with identifying what type of round impacted the COP and the fragmentation was collected by the investigating officer. From the pictures provided to EOD by the unit we can determine that the angle of impact was on a trajectory traveling low to high when the round detonated causing the damage to the rooftop and casualties. Damage to the rooftop is too extensive to be a RPG round and the angle of fire eliminates the possibility of a mortar strike. EOD believes this damage to be consistent with the impact of a U.S. M830A1 HEAT-MP-T projectile fired by a M1A1 Tank. EOD has not conducted analysis at the site of the incident and only conducted analysis on the fragmentation at the units insistence. A Power Point slide show is being constructed by EOD to supplement this IR.

After conducting an end for end test with a gunner's quadrant on the HQ66, 3-69 ARMOR M1A1 tank, I selected MPAT/OR on the ammunition select switch and manually indexed 200 meters in the Computer Control Panel while the palm switches on the gunner's power control handles were engaged and centered. The tank was parked on relatively flat ground. I then placed the quadrant on the quadrant pads on top of the breech and adjusted the quadrant to level the bubble. The reading was 2.2 degrees. According to the FT-120-D-2, this would give the MPAT round a maximum range of 550 meters if fired with the power control handles centered and the vehicle was on relatively flat ground. I spoke with an instructor at the Armor Center Master Gunner School in Ft. Knox, KY, and confirmed that if the elevation of the gun tube is raised, the distance the round would travel would increase, regardless of the range input into the Fire Control System. Without using a gunner's quadrant to find the elevation of the gun tube at the time of firing, the maximum distance the round would travel is impossible to judge.





 I, (b)(3), (b)(6), WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:
 At approximately 0100 on 02 February 2007, third platoon and I came under heavy enemy fire while securing the Eagle's Nest in the Malaab District of Ar Ramadi. Our positions were engaged with small arms fire to include PKC and AK-47. The Eagle's Nest was also struck by at least 10 RPGs and 2 or 3 rounds of 60mm Mortars. A majority of the fire was coming from P10 and L6. OP West positively identified enemy personnel in Building 170 of L6 which was then confirmed by ISR through the 1-9 IN Battalion TOC. I requested a GMLRS strike on this building and ordered OP West to suppress the building to prevent the enemy from exiting the backside of the building prior to the GMLRS strike. The GMLRS impacted the building which was confirmed by LT (3), (b) who moved to OP West. Also, I requested the heavy QRF to move to our location to support with 2 M1 tanks. Blue 1, 1LT(3), (b) and Blue 3 arrived at the Eagle's Nest shortly after my request was approved by LTC (3), (b). At the time we were also receiving heavy fire from the Northeast corner of P10, which ISR confirmed with movement IVO building 35 in P10. 1LT(3), (b) reported that he was receiving fire from Building 39 in P10 at his position on Malaab Road just east of Easy St. He requested to use main gun on the building to destroy the enemy in that building. I verified the SDZ to ensure that COP Grant would not receive any effects of the round and requested permission to fire 1 main gun round at Building 39 in P10. LTC(3), (b) gave permission to engage and Blue 3 engaged with 1 round of 120mm HEAT. My OPs reported seeing the tank round impact in the Northeast corner of P10 and I could feel the impact of the round in the Eagle's Nest TOC because of it's proximity. Approximately 45 minutes into the fire fight, LT(3), (b) reported seeing movement on the top of building 130 in Zone L6. Once again, I checked the SDZ to ensure that his fires would be 15 degrees north of COP Grant and after verifying this I gave him permission to fire. Around this time we received a radio call that COP Grant had casualties on the roof and to cease fire to the West. I placed the tanks in a watch and shoot mode and only gave them permission to engage if their tank was in danger of being destroyed. We made positive comms with COP Grant who stated they were in the middle of a CASEVAC for their 6 injured soldiers and we maintained a watch and shoot posture throughout the night. I do not recall any more significant contact from the enemy after that point.
