1. **(U) INVESTIGATIVE ACTIONS.** Army senior leaders responded to the fatal events of February 2nd by immediately appointing investigations into the circumstances surrounding the attack on COP Grant – to date, there have been four Investigating Officers (IO) assigned to this case for varying reasons¹

a. (U) MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) XO 3-69 AR, was initially assigned to determine what caused the (b)(3), (b)(6), and an O (b)(3), (b)(6) 1-37 AR investigated the death of SPC McPeek. Within two days, MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) reported to his Chain of Command (COC) that an “unexplained explosion” killed PVT Zeimer on the rooftop. There were many RPG as well as mortar attacks reported that morning. Additionally, initial assessments from the TF 1-9 EOD team, which reviewed photos of the blast hole, assessed that the COP had been impacted by a round from a recoilless rifle. MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) initially concluded that one of these enemy weapon systems had caused PVT Zeimer’s death. A similar report was forwarded through 1-1 AD S-1 (personnel) channels for SPC McPeek’s death, was approved by the commander, and was reported as a hostile fire death to HRC.

b. (U) On 2 February, the pieces of metal found both on top of and below the impact on the roof were collected by Soldier (b)(3), (b)(6) 6th Engineers and forwarded through their chain of command. When MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) learned that these pieces had been recovered from the impact site, he sought to have the EOD Team chief confirm that they were consistent with fragmentation from a recoilless rifle round.² On the 8th of February, after examining the collected pieces of metal, and then comparing them to a round provided by 3-69 AR to the EOD team, EOD positively identified the pieces of metal as parts of a U.S. M830A1 HEAT (120mm) round.

c. (U) MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) reported this finding to his battalion and brigade leadership (1-3 ID), and his O (b)(3), (b)(6) informed him that he would be retained on this particular investigation, but that he was to change it from a hostile death investigation into a potential fratricide investigation. Although he did not receive his written appointment, he was informed that he should begin collecting additional evidence from the tank crews who fired that night.

d. (U) Suspecting fratricide and not comfortable with the conduct of the (b)(3), (b)(6) at that point, COL (b)(3), (b)(6) Commander of 1-1 AD, contacted MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) XO TF 1-9 IN, by telephone on 10 February and told him to begin an

¹ Additionally, the Commander, MNC-I, has appointed a separate investigation into the reporting of this accident and the processing of the preceding investigations. That investigation is separate from this report, but I note the actions of other investigative officers prior to my investigation to dispel concerns that these deaths were not initially investigated. investigation into this potential fratricide event. This appointment was followed up with a written appointment order (see attached).

e. (U) Both officers began their respective potential fratricide investigations and continued to do so until the 2th of February, when MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) was identified as the lead IO. Major (b)(3), (b)(6) then provided the evidence that (b)(3), (b)(6) gathered through his site visits to Grant and Eagles Nest to MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) to use in his investigation.

f. (U) On 3 April 2007, LTG Odierno, the MNC-I Commander, approved an interim finding that PVT (b)(3), (b)(6) and SPC McPeck were killed by a round fired by a U.S. tank, based upon MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6)'s investigation (TAB A, Odierno MFR). Nonetheless, he directed that a senior officer conduct additional investigation into the matter. On 5 April 2007 I was appointed to serve as the MNC-I lead 15-6 Investigating Officer. My charge was to "ascertain and consider the evidence on all sides of each issue, thoroughly and impartially, and to make findings and recommendations that are warranted by the facts" and to comply with a series of specific instructions in order to add additional insight and clarity to this event.

1) (U) The chronology of the investigative team is detailed at Tab A, Enclosure 2. However, an overview of investigative methodology is necessary here to assist in placing the remainder of the report in context.

2) (U) As an initial matter, (b)(3), (b)(6) all evidence collected as part of the initial investigation, the report of MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6), and the UAV footage. At the same time, I was provided a statement from the 1-1 AD commander (and attached documents), which called into question the initial findings. I determined that physical inspection of both Eagles Nest and Grant was necessary to gain an understanding of these events, and arranged to interview Soldiers from TF 1-9 and 3-69 who were involved in the fighting that night and who had observed the engagement. Additionally, as the 16 Engineer Battalion Soldiers and the tank crews had re-deployed to Germany, I arranged to conduct a follow-on trip to Germany to interview those Soldiers and their leadership. In order to focus the UAV coverage to critical times and events, I had my administrative support install a MovieMaker program which allowed me to view the video frame by frame. This permitted a more detailed analysis of flight trajectory and round velocity, and assisted me in identifying tank locations and activity at various times.

2. In your investigation, all witness statements will be sworn. Any witness that you determine could supply information to help in your investigation should be interviewed. Your investigation should focus on whether there is any evidence to show that OP Grant received incoming fire from M1A1 rounds located at or near COP Eagle's Nest on the early morning on 2 February 2007. You will examine all circumstances leading up to and surrounding the incident. Your investigation should at a minimum analysis the timeline leading up to the attack on OP Grant, the specific target location the M1A1 at COP Eagle's Nest was firing at and any UAV feeds that provided observation on the impacts of the fire.
3. This investigation is your primary duty and takes precedence over all other assigned duties. Prior to beginning your investigation, you should contact your legal advisor, CPT (b)(3), (b)(6) (b)(3), (b)(6) with any questions you have.
4. If at any time you suspect any person of criminal misconduct, you must advise that person of his or her Article 31 Fifth Amendment rights as appropriate. Document rights waivers by witnesses must be evidenced on a DA Form 3881.
5. Your findings and recommendations should be submitted on DA Form 1574. Submit your investigation to me in the following order:
 - a. DA Form 1574 with sufficient finding and recommendations;
 - b. This letter of appointment as Enclosure 1;
 - c. An executive summary of the facts as Enclosure 2;
 - d. An index of exhibits as the final numbered Enclosure; and
 - e. All exhibits labeled in successive order (A, B, C, etc.).

SUBJECT: Summary of actions and preliminary findings for the investigation concerning 2 x KIA
on 02 0155 FEB ivo COP GRANT

1. Purpose. To provide a summary of 15-6 IO investigation.

2. Summary:

On the night of 11 Feb, I was notified by my battalion commander, LTC (b)(3), (b)(6) that COL (b)(3), (b)(6) Commander, 1/1 AD, was going to appoint me as an AR 15-6 investigating officer in order to identify the cause of death of SPC McPeek of 16EN and PV2 Zeimer of 3-69AR at COP GRANT on 2 Feb.

The appointing officer had two concerns. The first was to determine if fratricide was involved between 1-9 IN and 1-37 AR. Both Task Forces had troops in contact simultaneously at the EAGLE'S NEST and COP GRANT respectively. Furthermore, the remains of a 120 mm M-PT round was found several days after the incident IVO of COP GRANT. The second concern was that in the event that fratricide was ruled out, the IO should determine what did cause the death of the Soldiers.

After receiving notification, I immediately coordinated with the 1-9 IN (C/2-37 AR) tank crews involved in order to conduct interviews and prepared to move to the EAGLE'S NEST to try to recreate the events of 2 Feb. C/3-69 AR had recently completed RIP with C/2-37 AR so their company commander provided two tanks to assist. At approximately 2300 on 11 Feb, we started movement to the EAGLE'S NEST. I was in a tank with SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) (C/2-37 AR, Blue 3, and the TC of the tanks that fired a main gun round on 2 Feb), SFC (b)(3), (b)(6) (C/3-69 AR, Red 4, PSG and tank master gunner). LT (b)(3), (b)(6) (C/2-37 AR, Blue 1, SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) s section leader on 2 Feb) was in the other tank. Upon arriving at the EAGLE'S NEST, SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) discussed the chain of events as described in his sworn statement. We positioned the tanks in the places they were located as told by both tank crews. I observed the target house and the range read "000" through the sight. The crew slewed the turret in the direction of OP GRANT. Although COP GRANT was visible through the sight, looking through the AGS showed that the gun was masked. I concluded that if the tank fired from the locations described, the only way they would have hit COP Grant would be to elevate the gun and input a range that would have let the round travel that far.

During the course of my investigation, I received video footage from MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) XO 3-69 AR who was also doing an investigation into the same incident. In the video, I observed an object traveling from East to West down FAROUK WAY. You cannot observe the launch or the impact of the round. On 14 February, I was notified by CPT (b)(3), (b)(6) 1/1 AD Asst SJA to halt my investigation and report any information I had. This info was to be used as an annex to MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) s investigation.

3. Findings. In my opinion, it is not conclusive that the object in the video is the object that caused the KIAs. In order to complete any findings in my investigation I would have to complete the following to come to any conclusion:

- a. Interview personnel who were present at COP GRANT on the night of the incident.
- b. Visit COP GRANT to identify where the KIA were located, conduct on-site post blast and determine if those effects could have been caused by a tank round. Check to make sure the location of the 120mm shrapnel that was found after the incident was located in a spot that co-relates to a round fired from vic EAGLE's NET.
- c. Analyze the video to check that the time of flight for the object in the video frames equals the time of flight for an MPAT round fired from EAGLE's NEST over that approximate distance at that range.
- d. Determine if more than one round was fired by the 1-9 IN tanks. Personnel at the BDE TOC and the BN TOC say they observed a separate SHADOW UAV feed showing that SSG(b)(3), (b)(6) engaged a building as described in his statement. On site witnesses at the EAGLE's NEST corroborate these statements. This must be explained. One possible explanation is that the tanks fired more than one round, or that some other type of munition (perhaps a rocket or recoilless rifle round is the object that is moving through the frame)
- e. Confirm that no other tanks fired that night. In addition to the object flying from east to west, the PIONEER video feed also shows what I believe to be a tank that fires from North to South, very close to COP GRANT. I would have confirmed that this engagement could have possibly been involved as well.

4. Lessons Learned/Recommendations.

- a. Recommend that the issues above be addressed as part of any investigation prior to conclusions being made.
- b. Recommend a new SOP in the BCT to save all ISR video feeds of tank engagements, missile strikes, and other large munition engagements. During the time of this incident, the primary video feed in the 1-9 IN TOC was SHADOW. This is the feed that the Brigade Battle CPT and the 1-9 IN S3 were watching when they state they observed the tank engagement on the target house in P10 as described by the tank crews and eyewitnesses from D/1-9 IN. This feed was saved but discarded after 24 hours. The investigation was not initiated until several days later and therefore the video was not available. After a search, the PIONEER feed was located, but it does not appear to have as good fidelity as the SHADOW feed.
- c. I request that the commander appoint a dis-interested Field Grade Officer to confirm any findings prior to their review by the appointing officer. Both IOs were involved. I am from 1-9 IN, the unit that allegedly committed the fratricide, and MAJ (b)(3), (b)(6) is from 3-69 AR, the unit that received the casualties.
