(U) SUBJECT: Operationalize the Regional Reconstruction Operations Centers (RROC)

(U) REFERENCE: MNF-I FRAMEWORK OPORD 22 Mar 05

1. (U) **SITUATION. Change.** (U) The Reconstruction Operations Center (ROC) provides a focal point for all agencies, both military and civilian, involved in the reconstruction program. It coordinates the reconstruction effort, disseminates threat warning information, and tracks convoys. The ROC operates through subordinate Regional Reconstruction Operations Centers (RROC) embedded in each MNC-I major subordinate command (MSC). RROCs are linked to the ROC by commercial communication systems. This arrangement provides parallel monitoring and reporting for reconstruction issues to the ROC and information to coalition forces at all levels. The effectiveness of the ROC relies on integration of RROCs with the MSCs.

2. (U) **MISSION.** No Change.

3. (U) **EXECUTION.** No Change.

3.A. (U) **CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS. Change.** Multi-National Corps-Iraq (MNC-I) will integrate the RROCs into MSC operation centers and provide them with intelligence to pass on (once cleared) to relevant agencies. RROCs will pass information and intelligence gathered by their sources to coalition forces and act as a conduit for communication with the ROC.

3.B. (U) **TASKS TO SUBORDINATE UNITS. Change.**

3.B.1. (U) **MNC-I.**

3.B.1.A. (U) Integrate the RROCs into MSC operations centers and share relevant classified information (once it is cleared for release).

3.B.1.B. (U) Maintain visibility of all Iraqi Reconstruction Relief Funded (IRRF) convoy movements by facilitating coordination between the ROC Logistics Management Coordination Center (LMCC) and MNC-I's Movement Control Battalion (MCB). The LMCC will coordinate with the MCB for convoy clearance and provide information on all moves, to include transponder numbers. Convoys with transponders are tracked on the Tapestry (real time tracking system) and can also be tracked by MNC-I using BCS3. Whenever possible, provide QRF coverage and MEDEVAC support to all reconstruction convoys registered with the LMCC.

3.B.1.C. (U) Provide CENTRIXS and SIPRNET access to RROC personnel with proper security clearances, where available.

3.B.1.D. (U) Ensure civilian and coalition force communications systems complement one another and provide the most effective coverage. Co-locate and share systems, when appropriate. Provide the RROCs one DSN phone line.

3.B.1.E. (U) Provide the ROC with a comprehensive CERP Project report on the 5th and 20th of every month.

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3.B.1.F. (U) Provide one point of contact (POC) for each MSC to the ROC (this POC will also cover both PCO and GRD).

3.B.2. (U) **MNF-I, DCS INTEL.**

3.B.2.A. (U) Provide timely threat intelligence support to the ROC.

3.B.3 (U) **MNF-I, CIS**

3.B.3.A. (U) Migrate the ROC incident database to the CIDNE/FUSIONNET architecture and ensure cross flow of information from reconstruction organizations to coalition forces.

3.C. (U) **COORDINATING INSTRUCTIONS. Change.**
