AND KEY SUPPORTING TASKS

Forward

The purpose of this document is to standardize the Mission Essential Tasks List (METL) that Iraqi Security Forces (ISF) will use to help develop independent counterinsurgency (COIN) capability. The application of this METL during the train – operate – refit – train cycle will serve as the foundation for the ISF validation model training readiness metric. The METL and key supporting tasks contained therein provide a guide for training activities of Iraqi forces. This list is not exhaustive, and trainers at all levels are encouraged to add to them according to their particular circumstances. It is understood that the most important metric in assessing the training readiness of Iraqi forces is the Commander's Assessment and the key judgment in the process. It is also recognized that limited training resources will require prioritization of essential tasks training within a given Iraqi formation. This document is not prescriptive and trainers in the field have the liberty to adjust from this list in order to build capable Iraqi forces that can take the lead for counterinsurgency operations.

The primary doctrinal framework that underpins this effort is US Army Field Manual 7-1, Battle Focused Training and FM 7-15, The Army Universal Task List. Other coalition doctrine was also used, notably UK Army Field Manual Volume 1, Part 10, Counterinsurgency Operations, and Australian logistics doctrine.

This METL includes Iraqi Army units, the Iraqi Support Command MSCs, the Department of Border Enforcement and Iraqi Police.

Periodic reviews will be scheduled to modify the task list based on changing force structure or the operating environment.

## **ICDC BASIC SKILLS TRAINING PLAN**

**Mission Statement:** The new Iraqi Army Basic Skills Training will be taught in a round robin training forum at the Marine Corps Compound. The objective of the selected training classes is to give the soldiers refresher training regarding the routine duties and operations that are incorporated into daily operations within the Baghdad area. These classes do not have a standardized POI, due to the complexity of changing situations

**Intent:** Teach the material in a round robin small group format to better enhance the teacher to student ratio. Evaluate retain ability of presented material through squad battle drills.

The following is a list of classes taught by the ICDC Cadre in a round robin setting.

### **1. FOB Security**

- a. General Orders/Special Orders
- b. Chain of Command
- c. Challenge/Password

### **2. Act as part of a QRF**

- a. Duties of the QRF
- b. Code word acknowledgement
- c. QRF Battle Drills

### **3. Convoy Security**

\*This Block of Instruction will be taught at Unit. (Part of unit integration training phase)

### **4. Outer Cordon during Consequence Management Operations**

\* This Block of instruction will be taught at Unit. (Part of unit integration training phase)

### **5. React to Contact**

- a. Take Cover
- b. Immediately send a contact report while simultaneously securing your area.
- c. Take aimed shots and return fire only if you can see where the fire is coming from.
- d. Move ASAP to a rally point
- e. Conduct a Battle Damage Assessment and report to higher

### **6. Cordon and Search Operations**

- a. Inner and outer cordon procedures
- b. **Outer Cordon:** Forces established in the vicinity of objective area and are positioned to block, fix, interdict, or turn enemy/neutral/friendly forces in the vicinity of objective area.
- c. **Inner Cordon:** Positioned to place suppressive fires on the objective. Established and prepared to attack by fire, suppress, neutralize, fix, or destroy enemy forces.
- d. Clear/Search operations. (CQC/Stackman concept)

As required, organize into breach, assault, clearing, search, and EPW teams. Secure search area prior to search and establish by-pass area. Due to the very nature of a CQC encounter, engagements will be very close (within 10 meters) and very fast (target exposed for only a few seconds). Most close quarter engagements are won by he who hits first and puts the enemy down. It is more important to knock a man down ASAP than it is to kill him. In order to win at close quarter engagement, soldiers must make quick, accurate shots by mere reflex. This is accomplished by **Reflexive Firing Training (RFT)**.

- e. **RFT:** Is comprised of several techniques that make up the total CQC fighting soldier.

### **6-1 Stance:**

Feet are shoulder width apart, with the toes pointed straight to the front (direction of movement). The firing side foot is slightly staggered to the rear of the non-firing foot. Knees are slightly bent. The upper body leans slightly forward. Shoulders are not rolled or slouched. The weapon is held with the butt stock in the pocket of the shoulder. The firing side elbow is kept in, against the body. The stance should be modified to ensure that the shoulder maintains a comfortable boxer stance.

- f. **Low Carry Technique.**  
Weapon is carried/held in a modified port arms position, however the barrel of the weapon is pointed toward the ground
- g. **High Carry Technique**  
Weapon is carried with the butt of weapon in the pocket of the shoulder

### **6-2 AIM:**

- a. **Slow Aim Fire:** Most accurate technique. It Consists of taking up a good sight picture and using the four basic fundamentals of rifle marksmanship when time permits. Technique is used for distant engagements. 1. Aim 2.Steady Position 3.Breath Control 4.Trigger Squeeze.
- b. **Rapid Aim Fire:** (flash sight picture) This technique features an imperfect sight picture where windage is critical and elevation is of lesser importance. When the front sight post is in line with the target, squeeze the trigger. Method is utilized from short distances 0-25 meters.
- c. **Burst Fire:** Is an effective technique used for violence of action when superiority is needed to gain entry. The same

fundamentals are used as in rapid fire, aimed quick kill, or instinctive fire. Soldiers must be carefully trained on manipulation of the safety/ selector lever due to the extended range of travel from safe to burst.

## **7. Establish Deliberate TCP's**

### **Selection of search area:**

- a. Select a well-lit area
- b. Standoff from neighborhood structures
- c. Establish enough area to accommodate a number of search teams
- d. Establish warning signs with sufficient distance to allow drivers to react.
  1. "SLOW, US CHECKPOINT"
  2. "STOP, TAKE ORDERS FROM SOLDIERS"
- e. Use physical barriers to force vehicles to slow down
- f. Every TCP will have a warning area and alert area to provide maximum standoff for oncoming traffic
- g. Prepare barriers to block movement of vehicles attempting to continue through search area
- h. Soldiers should fire into vehicle engine blocks before engaging driver

### **7-1 Search procedures:**

- a. Establish overwatch and blocking positions
- b. Establish the search area
- c. Each search team maintains 360 degree security

### **7-2 Individual Search**

- a. With metal detector (wand)
- b. Without metal detector (male and female)

ICDC recruits will not conduct missions alongside Coalition forces until full integration training is conducted.**
