Even though the USACE handles job site accidents internally, both CENTCOM and Wing Safety MUST be notified. The government team needs to be notified.

We've received word via MacDill Emergency responders , through our security force, that there was a serious injury yesterday: a worker fell off the roof.

Please keep us abreast of this and all incidences, immediately. We, intern, have a requirement to brief senior staff: this is a CENTCOM building being constructed, not a Corps of Engineers Building and the news outlets key in on "CENTCOM", not the Corps. Lack of information puts CENTCOM staff at an embarrassing disadvantage.

That said: what happened and what is the individuals current condition.

What is being done to prevent this situation from happening again.
