We got a verbal update during a meeting, after J4 asked again: individual is out of ICU, stable, doing well and in a hospital room. His girl friend also stated he is doing well enough to be a pain in the butt again.

That's all we have and suspect given the OSHA investigation, this maybe the last bit of information we get: with the investigation, all info and conversation is now held tight to the vest (right or wrong, a normal reaction: liability and culpability issues; people distancing themselves from the contractor involved).
