




- **3/2/209th:** Change of leadership resulted in improvements in TNG and S&L. They are still having equipment accountability issues.
- **5/2/209th:** KDK is still living and working in a temporary tent area, which severely limits KDK's ability to train and improve.
- **VTT:** US personnel not available to conduct validations or assessments NET than March 2010. 5/1/209 has been CM 2 for over 2 years. Corps HQ 1st BDE HQ and 2 KDKs have been CM 1 for over 1 year.

209 Corps HQ	1	Corps' focus will be on training / fielding NATO weapons and establishing 3rd BDE
1ST BDE HQ	3	Training assessment: Planning training the Brigad HQ in TOC duties and TOC SOP. Training comments: Training section has obvious administrative disadvantages due to problems of delegating and from getting tasked things that should be G1 or maintenance issues. Planning problems due to lack of orders in time from corps and lack of will to take initiative to plan ahead. Training section is more administrative then planning at this point.
MeS GSU	2	Progress continues to be made in areas of training (physical training, marksmanship, ECP procedures, camp & ECP defense), C2, and logistic accountability. Facility maintenance training is in process. GSU is only support element for organization and conducting Kandak/BDE training. GSU provide functional training for its own staff members (according the Corps Annual Training Guidance). Mentoring process continues, and relationships among mentors and ANA officers and NCOs are correct and professional. So many people delegated to other duties and units have had serious influence on GSU daily activities and base security.
1/1 KANDAK	2	1. KDK will conduct a new full scale rotation between all rifle companies in near future. 1.Coy will then stay in training (amber) cycle for 6 weeks. Relocation sequentially by companies to MES.
2/1 KANDAK	1	At the moment there is a pretty high rate of AWOL soldiers, due to the lack of leave before conducting the new operations. 2nd Kdk has been in operations since April. The XO deployed to 2nd BDE and his successor is still unclear. The S3 from 2nd Kdk will be deployed as the XO to 1st Kdk, 1.BDE. The S3 officer of 2nd Kdk was one of the strongest leaders of 2nd Kdk. His work was very successful and he was very open to new ideas from the OMLT and he was totally accepted by soldiers of 2nd Kdk. His leadership during missions and in normal service is very strong. At the moment the OMLT can't identify anyone in 2nd Kdk who is able to fill this gap when he is missing. The commander of 2nd Kdk is very weak, he has a lack of leadership. He needs a good and very well trained staff who will help to compensate his weak results of leadership. After losing the Kdk XO and S3 officers, the OMLT is concerned if the Kdk Staff will be able to compensate for the lack of leadership by the Kdk Commander.
3/1 KANDAK	3	KDK main effort in November - December has been the operation in Balkh province (BLAWR) and training. KDK shows improvement in training. Relocation sequentially by companies to MES.

4/1 KANDAK	2	(OCT comments) Kandak has made some significant progress on increasing individual and crew-level training proficiency at the company level since last month. In accordance with the Kandak's Annual Training Guidance and Quarterly Training Guidance, the Engineer Company conducted excellent training on operator level skills (e.g. excavator operations); both the Recon Company and the Engineer Company conducted individual weapons firing. The Kandak Commander left this month, and his replacement from Kandahar has not yet assumed command. The current XO and staff are awaiting his arrival and assumption of command before moving forward on other reforms such as staff meetings and training meetings.
5/1 KANDAK	2	5th Kandak is still in its training cycle. It has been through its assessment and preparing for their new assessment, tbd due to the current LOGSTAT. The Kandak is conducting weapons and vehicle maintenance training in preparation to conduct more maintenance in the BDE. Also in the specific logistic task the logistic personnel need logistic training courses.
2ND BDE HQ	3	In the evaluated period the EID religious holiday has had a determinative effect on the daily life of the BDE staff and on their activities as well. Low OPS characterized the activities of the BDE staff. During the holiday the BDE staff organized its activities more effectively than during the RAMADAN. From each section there was at least one designated responsible officer or NCO present, who was able to manage the different daily issues. But after their holiday it took a long time for them to reach the same rev than before.

1/2 KANDAK	4	No report
2/2 KANDAK	2	This Kandak will need a lot of Trg before recovering its original operational level.
3/2 KANDAK	4	Kandak has been on sustained operations since OMLT Transfer of Authority in AUG 09. It has been difficult to impossible to manage an effective training program with the Kandak as a result. Kandak also has an average of 40% AWOL rate which also makes training difficult. Kandak junior leadership at company level and below is nearly ineffective and many soldiers are able to skip formations and training and hide in the barracks and nobody ever comes to get them. Kandak had a small platoon size element in a major firefight along with OMLT and the ANA soldiers took cover and refused to fight due to ineffective leadership and training.
5/2 KANDAK	4	The Kandak develops a training schedule on a Basis of weekly meetings with S3 and CoyCdrs. All Coys have to report NLT 15th of the Month what they are going to do the next month. Due to the bad living conditions, there was not very much training during the last 4 weeks. The main effort for the Kandak is right now to build und run the Winter tents for CSS as well as for GSU. There are still ca. 80 Soldiers/day planned for the security, this has a bad influence on the training. Changes are expected when Garrison Kandak arrives in the new Camp.

Challenges in 2nd BDE units is being addressed by the Corps leadership:

- AWOL TT headed by the DCOM have established its work plan for short term action and is working on a long term plan that will cover the next solaryear
- 2nd BDE Mentors will increase focus on training together with MPRI
- Winterization
- 2 units in 1st and 2nd BDE will relocation (1st KDK /2nd BDE from BADAQSHAN to KDZ; 2nd KDK / 2nd BDE from KDZ to BADAQSHAN; 1st Kdk 1st Bde from FARYAB to MES; 3rd Kdk 1st Bde from MES to FARYB). This may hamper the ability to conduct Ops until the relocation is completed.

Long term positioning and fielding of 3rd BDE units:

- Yet to be formally decided. Formal decision should be taken in the near future iot support construction, manning and preparations for the planned fielding (spring 2010 and onwards). Nevertheless a working group has been established under the lead of the Corps G1 facing this issue.

203rd Corps Top Issues

- **Issue: AWOL Soldiers-** AWOL rates throughout the Corps require continued improvements, even though the Corps shows a 5% decrease this month (Some units increased in AWOL rates)
Fix:. Increased partnering at the Coy/Kandak levels and the enforcement of training cycle management should help the overall reduction in AWOL rates. Partner will assess those units with pay and leave problems to assist in progress. The inception of the RST and the use of TF Storm on Winterization issues should be effective in the reduction of these rates. Contract specific improvement in facilities and infrastructure will also go a long way toward AWOL reduction.
- **Issue: Infrastructure-** Deficiencies threatens the morale of our ANA partners and contributes to their high AWOL rate.
Fix: Infrastructure is key to building the new force. Streamlining of the process will allow for the increase in rate of development and Soldier quality of life.
- **Issue: Shoot - Weapons Inventories -** Past High OPTEMPO and current dispersion of some units restrict ability to conduct 100% eyes-on accountability.
Fix: Emphasize hand-receipt accountability and arms room procedures to preclude weapon loss. Some units lack basic documentation in which partnerships can provide support. ANA leadership involvement is a must.

205th Corps Top Issues

Issue: High operational tempo and inability to implement Managed Readiness Cycle (MRC) are the main impediments to ANA development and are directly correlated with retention issues/high AWOL rates.

Fix:

- RC(S) – Realign 16 x coys after Phase 2, IOT facilitate MRC implementation at coy level.
- RC(S) – Investment of partnering effort and resources to support expansion of 205 Corps and 215 Corps and further develop and enable ANA, with priority to 215 Corps .
- MOD/ISAF – generate 4th Bde for Kandahar/205 Corps.
- MOD/ISAF - support Managed Readiness Cycle through development and regularization of movement plan in sp of leave.

Issue: Retention and AWOL..

Fix – The operational environment/tempo are particularly challenging in the south, a factor that needs to better reflected in the context of hazardous duty pay. More emphasis on incentive for re-contracting is required, as is greater emphasis on retention in general.

Issue: Poor driving skills and lack of qualified and experienced drivers.

Fix: Driver training must be enhanced and increased back to the 8 week course. However, increased throughput is also required. More Civilian trainers must be contracted to improve this issue.

- 207th Corps - last month 207 Corps started to plan future operations for the next 12-18 months IAW OMAID (HOPE) OPORD. The corps G3 has demonstrated excellent planning capabilities and the ability to give the corps a clear task and purpose. The G2 continued to train the younger officers IOT have them better prepared to manage INTEL info and disseminate critical information to subordinate units. Logistic planning and execution are definitely sub-standard and logistic requirements are more often than not underestimated. Units reported major delays in routine re-supply of main items that affect ongoing operations.

- 1ST BDE is involved in various training activities. Last month, units started to perform focused training such as NATO Weapons familiarization, UAH driving, and EOD training. The main problem has been coordinating all training activities and pushing subordinate units to fill all required quotas. No large scale operations have been conducted in this period.

- The new location of the 2 Bde HQ, 2/2, and 5/2 allows their personnel to conduct better quality training, since many classrooms and facilities are now available. The deployment of 2/2 kandak in Kafir Qala FOB gives the 2 Bde a better platform to project combat power in Farah.

- The RCC is performing the last part of training required to be declared FOC. Specialized equipment is still lacking.

• Issue :

Evidence of corruption remains prevalent. There is a high rate of drug addiction and gambling. There is an overall basic lack of knowledge and application of the ANA system of rewards and punishments. Although usually cooperative, soldiers are poorly disciplined when their actions warrant discipline.

Fix :

Mentors need to stress/educate ANA leadership regarding the rewards and punishment system and ensure the system's enforcement. Possibly readdress/clarify the policy to follow after a positive THC test and consider more severe consequences after the first positive test. A more robust system of "rewards" (promotion, etc.) needs to be codified and instituted for the soldiers who deserve it.

• Issue :

Commanders at all levels are greatly reluctant to spend allocated funds, relying instead on MOD-provided items/services. On the other hand, garrison units have no budget for small repairs and maintenance.

Fix :

MOD should disburse funds only when there are specific requests from the Corps level. Corps will consider options such as initiating small budgets at each garrison to spend as needed for local items, repairs, etc., while MOD would still allocate funding for high dollar figure items, emergencies, etc.

• Issue :

RCC equipment is still not being assigned to the Corps. The unit needs this equipment IOT complete the training and reach FOC.

Fix :

MOD needs to send this equipment ASAP.

Commando Brigade Top Issues

•**Issue: Construction for 7th CDO KDK** – Construction at Shorabak (Tombstone) remains a concern. Winter weather may be an impact to completing on schedule. This will impact movement of 7th CDO Kandak after it graduates the Kandak Qualification Course on 21 Jan 10.

Fix – The CDO Brigade, CJSOTF-A, and TF Morehead (NTM-A CJ7) are developing contingency plans. We have options that are being refined for a suitable solution.

•**Issue: ANATC integration**– MoD issued an order to shift the Commando School from the Commando Brigade to the ANA Training Command tashkil. This was a premature action taken without any formal staff analysis. It is disrupting a program that is stressed while executing aggressive growth plans. The Commando Program approached ANATC, but has regretted the contact since. The Program is very interested in proper integration with ANATC, however this will require careful staff analysis to preserve training integrity.

Fix – CFSOCC-A is working with the Mod GSG3 to minimize the impact to the program. Our recommendation is to postpone the integration until an intelligently phased plan can be established that is based on demonstrated capability by ANATC that they do not yet possess.
