



• **General 209th Corps Comments:** Manning and Equipment Readiness remain at CM 1 throughout the Corps. Sustained operations have a mixed effect between 1st and 2nd BDE. Focus will shift to improving 2nd BDE capability in AOR. Corps remains at CM4 in Equipment O/H due to shortfalls in Communication, Medical and additional miscellaneous equipment.

• **1st BDE HQ / GSU MES / 5/1/209th:** Assessment postponed UFN.

• **2nd BDE HQ:** Change in leadership has had mixed results. Re-evaluations over the next few months should result in a return to CM3.

• **3/2/209th :** Change of leadership resulted in immediate improvements in TNG and S&L. Increase in ammo improved EQ OH rating, but they are still having equipment accountability issues.

• **5/2/209th :** KDK is still living and working in a temporary tent area, which severely limits KDK's ability to train and improve.





203rd Corps Top Issues

- **Issue: AWOL Soldiers-** AWOL rates throughout the Bde's need improvement. Rates remain high in 1st and 3rd Brigades.
Fix: Increased partnering at the Coy/Kandak levels and the enforcement of training cycle management should help the overall reduction in AWOL rates. The inception of the RST and the use of TF Storm on Winterization issues should be effective in the reduction of these rates. Contract specific improvement in facilities and infrastructure will also go a long way toward AWOL reduction.
- **Issue: Infrastructure-** Infrastructure deficiencies threatens the morale of our ANA partners and contributes to their high AWOL rate.
Fix: Infrastructure is key to building the new force. Streamlining of the process will allow for the increase in rate of development.
- **Issue: Shoot - Weapons Inventories -** High OPTEMPO and dispersed units restrict ability to conduct 100% eyes-on accountability.
Fix: Emphasize hand-receipt accountability and arms room procedures to preclude weapon loss.



205th Corps Top Issues

Issue: The Corps suffers from a very low literacy rate.

Fix: The Corps leadership needs to maximize attendance within operational constraints. Additionally, placing the Phase I block within the training plan for initial entry would significantly raise the literacy rate.

Issue: The Corps lacks a combat support battalion. Without this battalion, the Corps cannot effectively allocate resources within its area of operations.

Fix: The kandak force generation model for the 205th Corps should include a combat support battalion. This modified model has been briefed at CSTC-A and MOD.

Issue: The Corps command group and staff must move from being a spectator or observer to a true partner in joint operations. The tendency is for the Corps to watch the process and never really “buy-in” to the concept. Therefore, they have no vested interest in the success or failure of the mission.

Fix: The Corps must have meaningful input into operations. Additionally, it must be held accountable for its tasks within that “partnered” operation.

CNIK TOP Issues



- **Issue:** Lack of Intelligence capabilities of the Kandak
Fix: The Kandak S2 has arrived at Nawa. The Kandak CDR has asked MOD that he be replaced due to his suspected involvement in the SVBIED at Camp Julien in JUN 2009 as well as activities in the last Helmand deployment with leaking critical mission essential information. However, MOD has not replaced him to date, Awaiting on MOD to replace current S-2. We require CSTC-A assistance and direction in this endeavor.
- **Issue:** The CNIK ETT has only temporary billets and no office space at Camp Julien/Coin Academy. This hinders the efficiency and effectiveness of the mentor team working with the CNIK.
Fix: Plan/program semi-permanent or permanent construction of billets, office space, and a motor pool for the CNIK ETT for FY2010.
- **Issue:** The CNIK does not have a dedicated higher HQ other than the MOD. This causes numerous administrative and logistical issues in Garrison and is only amplified once deployed for operations.
Fix: The CNIK needs to fall under a dedicated MOD section or one of the Corps HQs for support. Once deployed for operations they can be TACON to any unit but will still have ties to a dedicated Command HQ that knows their needs and shortfalls. This has been an issue for the past three operational deployments.
- **Issue:** The CNIK still does not have firm orders extending their temporary stay in Helmand
Fix: We require MOD to reissue new orders to the CNIK updating their deployment timeline. They will require a movement to Kabul to bring down the rest of their Conex's and personnel to make them fully mission capable.

- 207th Corps- Ongoing combat operations throughout the AO have improved overall capabilities of units. However, logistics and accountability remain a significant concern as there is a lack of CoC emphasis during planning and execution of operations. Implementation of a RAG cycle throughout will greatly improve readiness of all units.
- 1ST BDE - Planning and execution of winterization operations are ongoing; if executed well it will result in increased readiness for 1-1 and 3-1 KDKs. Combined with the implementation of the RYG will facilitate 1-1 and 3-1 refit and improved METL readiness for 2-1 KDK.
- 2ND BDE – Impending movement of HQ to the Farah garrison (no decision made on timeline) will impact readiness in the short term until they are able to re-establish their systems. Movement of 6-2 into the BDE AOR and out of a red cycle will facilitate 1-2 and 2-2 in establishing effective RYG cycles during the winter months.



207th Corps Top Issues

- **Issue:** Logistics is the Corps “Achilles heel”. Equipment and materials are not properly taken care of. Most Property Book Officers are AWOL and where available they are not up to the task. As a consequence, theft and corruption are rampant.

Fix: CoC must ensure Property Book officers are assigned and present for duty. CoC must ensure property books are managed appropriately. CoC must implement a reporting system to capture any suspicious or illegal activity. CoC must ensure that MOD-issued orders concerning the accountability of equipment are followed. Mentors conduct focused CSDP training with the G/S4 officers with a plan to have them train the subordinate commanders.

- **Issue:** Operational planning at all levels does not take into account proper logistics and the units required to push those capabilities. As a result, the CS and CSS KDKs are used extensively as maneuver units. This affects their ability to train their METL (which needs to focus on their intended mission) and mitigates their ability to enable the maneuver units.

Fix: CoC must ensure units are used appropriately. Corps CDR must put an emphasis on his CS and CSS KDKs. Corps CDR mentor and Corps staff mentors must focus effort on changing the paradigm. Corps CDR and staff need to be taught that logistics will cause operations to fail if not properly implemented.

Additionally, the ACCC is ineffective as an organization under the ANAAC G-3 due to the scope of command and control to support direct support missions for the 5 corps areas and general support missions for MoD.

Fix: Ensure ACCC manning document is quickly approved at MoD levels and support a tashkil modification to move the ACCC under the ANAAC/CC
