





CM 3	<p>The police unit, staff function or installation can conduct basic law and order operations, management or leadership tasks (appropriate for local circumstance) with occasional assistance from an IC advisor or Police Mentor Team. An approximation of capability in terms of DOTMLPF or other applicable measure is 50-69%.</p>
CM 4	<p>The police unit, staff function or installation is formed but not yet capable of conducting basic law and order operations, management or leadership functions without significant external assistance from the International Community. An approximation of capability in terms of DOTMLPF or other applicable measure is $\leq 49\%$.</p>



RPAC NORTH TOP ISSUES

Ghowrmach

Issue: The district will continue to need additional support from CSTC-A as the PMT in conjunction with the Provincial Police Chief rebuilds the district Police. The equipment of the FDD is in the possession of the Commander of Highway Kandak; however, he has assured the PMT that all equipment of the FDD will be returned as recruiting builds the police force. District will likely remain at a CM level 4 due to the lack of trained policemen.

Fix: Need assistance for the district to fill available seats in the 8 week basic course as they become available. Ensure that personnel who are recruited are not “repeat attendees” coming back to the course. Restart the contract process to have the building for the DHQ completed in a timely manner.

Weapons Inventory

Issue: Requirement to conduct 100% weapons inventory of non-FDD districts by the PMTs and the FDD districts. Requirement of 100% inventory every month on a PMT covering a FDD district is not feasible.

Fix: Allow inventory of PHQs and RHQs weapons to be conducted in another manner. Suggest mobile team with the ability and flexibility to conduct inventories while the PMTs focus all their efforts on the FDDs.



Currently **CM 2** Assessment as of Aug 08

•Personnel

- 108 persons assigned/208 authorized
- Shortage of personnel makes it extremely difficult to man checkpoints, operate the D.C. and conduct combat, supply and security missions.
- This is easily the largest problem in the Zormat District.

•Training

- Due to lack of personnel several recruits are put at the checkpoints until an FDD training slot is available.
- Recent training list shows that just over 50% of the personnel are certified.

•Equipment

- Soldiers have basic equipment for day to day operations, CODAN Tower and Radio are operational
- It was recently discovered at one of the checkpoints the patrolmen did not have uniforms, this is in the process of being resolved.
- Vehicle repairs are still being taken care of out of pocket from the soldiers and need to be better supported by PHQ.
- Chief indicates fuel requests are being shorted at the PHQ level.
- The district still has 8-10 weapons that need to be repaired or exchanged, but need better coordination with PHQ.

- ANP work well with ANA despite the mistrust between the two. The ANP are always more prepared/eager to go on missions than the local ANA.
- ANP have completed many missions with maximum effectiveness. This to include 3 confirmed kills of ACF with information and one detainee.

- Operations Officer is still not being paid for advance training and is still in temporary assignment which appears to be part of the problem.

•**Facilities** : Repairs to the DC (plumbing and front gate) still need to be completed. These were originally set up by the PRT, but not yet initiated.

•**Governance / Rule of Law**: No judicial representatives in Zormat.



RPAC-C COMMANDER'S OVERALL ASSESSMENT

- Attacks against AUP continue to be a problem with frequency and intensity increasing as the year progresses. This continues to be an issue due to the training the Police receive during RTC, i.e. trained as a law enforcement force and not a paramilitary group.
- Weapons accountability is not being completed in a timely manner and ANP search for reasons not to conduct inventory. Regional HQs track but no indication of MOI having a system to ensure compliance.
 - Fix - MOI must give Regional Commanders the authority to ensure/enforce compliance.
 - MOI must demonstrate ability to track compliance in order to reinforce program.
- During the election period, the AUP will be able to react to enemy operations and maintain required election security at the same time.





- Nad Ali was issued 16 vehicles post FDD despite 26 authorized on the Tashkil. Since then, 4 have been destroyed by IEDs. This large District with a high threat is operating with only 12 vehicles.
- Sangin remains a very kinetic environment, manning is still under 49% with severe problems in recruiting locals.

- IDR recruiting Spring 08 was rushed due with fast arrival of 2/7 USMC. DART teams were not properly fielded and the previous PCoP Helmand, BG Andiwal, recruited where he could. No actual men from Now Zad, Vashir or Garmsir were recruited. Lashkar Gah gained most of extra grads.
- Musa Qaleh recently switched from a USMC to a TFH(UK) PMT. Musa Qaleh met recruiting targets with good candidates and the DCoP, Cdr Koka, going to training. Kajaki grads ended up deployed to Musa Qaleh as re-insertion was not practical given the sit in Kajaki.
- Now Zad while having had a USMC coy(+) for 12 months, has no ANSF presence and few LNs in district. MEB-A has been working plans to clear / hold the district followed by re-introduction of AUP.
- Vashir has little population, no ANSF or Coalition other than the bases of Shorabak, Bastion and transiting along Hwy 1. MEB-A has no plans to clear and re-introduce AUP in Vashir.
- Bakwa has continued to send some AUP to FDD-S, with mentoring by MEB-A.
- Need to clarify final status of IDR districts. The districts listed as "N/E" are recommended for full FDD.

Personnel

Minimal personnel records in place. FDD grads were not issued any ID cards upon graduation from FDD, so there is none to take when relieved from duty. No bank for direct deposit

Equipment

Ammunition is critically low, Dist chief has received some resupply but amount is unknown to PMT at this time. Dist log officer is very effective at his task, has established an accurate fuel log, submits MOI 14s when reaches 50%. ANP have real interest in conducting vehicle PMCS. No DFAC, but there is a cook assigned to DHQ and each CP has ANP assigned to prepare food.

Training

Training records have not been received after FDD graduation. Illiteracy rate is very detrimental, not possible for ANP to document arrests, collect statements, etc. No training plan is present other than what the PMT has implemented.

Governance/Rule of Law

2IC has a good relationship w/ most friendly militia CC's and is clear in their roles. Other militias haven't been seen w/ weapons since the 2IC has cracked down on them. 2IC is very effective at talking with people. Attitude toward district is positive towards ANP.



RPAC SOUTH TOP ISSUES

- **Issue: Major RIP with 4/82 in the upcoming 30 days. There is a possibility of losing ground on mentoring mission if proper attention is not given:**
 - **Fix: Conduct thorough LS/RS, paying special attention to turnover of mentorship and continuing mutually beneficial relationships.**
- **Issue: Tracking of 3 week FDD8 graduates:** All graduates of FDD8 have been distributed back to the districts/provinces. Getting all the students that have completed only 3 weeks of training back for the following 5 week course will be a challenge.
 - **Fix: Keep close liaison with ANP personnel officer to track 3 week graduates. Plan early to get these students to complete the final 5 weeks of training.**



RPAC-W COMMANDER'S OVERALL ASSESSMENT

- Adraskan: RPAC has engaged contracting and a new contract is being negotiated. The DHQ facility will be completed in approximately one month. The Tashkil needs to be increased to provide enough patrolmen to operate check points and provide the security needed for a large district.
- Shindand: District has many strengths including training and equipping. RHQ/PHQ must focus on recruitment to fill to 100 percent of authorizations. Mentoring focus will be correcting ID Card issue, logistics/supply issues, and recruitment to 100 percent. Threat continues to increase in Zerko Valley area and must be addressed for increased security in district.
- Bala Boluk has been selected for FDD 9 Sustainment Training. Sustainment Training will significantly help the district progress. RPAC will coordinate with RHQ to allocate adequate NCOs to fill critical shortages. 10k plus up will help with strength and district must focus on recruiting effort to fill new authorizations. RPAC will coordinate with RHQ on senior leadership changes to impact corruption and attrition related issues.
- Bala Murghab: Recent increase in Taskil will greatly improve Security of District with more manpower added. Will focus DHQ, PHQ, and RHQ to emphasize recruitment of additional ANP. Coordination to improve "Lines of Communications/Transportation" is required at the highest levels. Due to remote location of district, lack of logistics and communications will continue to impede progress of the district.
- PMT in Ghor province continues to progress.
- Farah, Badghis and Herat Provinces have graduated training for FDD8P.

Need to increase Tashkil to 200 due to BMG identified as Large District with threat. No adequate Personnel record keeping system in place (training files, rank reform, disciplinary actions, etc.). Critical shortage of a CID officer. No Electronic Funds Transfer available in Bala Murghab.

Training

The current focus for the PMT is helping the ANP improve the current checkpoints in anticipation of further attacks.

Equipment

ANP use a local repair shop to fix their vehicles. "No Lemon" resides in QeN and has no impact on Bala Murghab. Supply issues continue to impact operations. PMT will focus mentoring on additional training for ANP supply personnel. Freedom of movement disrupts supply delivery. Air resupply efforts are critical until ground supply routes are secured. BMG needs support from PHQ to pay local mechanic for vehicle repairs.

Personnel

At current manning level, ANP are unable to operate needed checkpoints and provide adequate personnel coverage throughout Adraskan for effective policing. Issue can be resolved by increasing Tashkil from medium to large district.

Equipment

New District center is under construction, project started over a year ago, current status worked stopped. ANP not currently maintaining weapons accountability for individual assigned weapons. PMT currently discovered additional, unregistered weapons in use. PMT will continue to mentor and train basic supply tasks in order for district to reduce supply shortages.

Governance/Rule of Law

As observed by the PMT, the ANP seem to be following Rule of Law; while not to an American Standard this works for Afghanistan. Additionally, the PMT has observed the local population from all over the district working with the Police Chief, he seems to have built a good reputation with the public and they willing to work with him..

PMT focus will be training for the logistical section to ensure flow of critical supplies has positive impact on operations. Sustainment training is ongoing on Weapons, communications, Property Management, intelligence, and CSI. With the assistance of DynCorp Mentors.

Governance/Rule of Law

Sub Governor prohibits initiatives by the CoP that will improve the security within Shindand district.





RPAC WEST TOP ISSUES

- Issue: Corruption continues to be an issue throughout numerous areas.
 - Fix: RPAC Developing a Detailed Plan focusing mentoring effort to address corruption at all levels.
- Issue: Logistics process being addressed at all levels to fix the greatest systemic problem for ANP in West Region.
 - Fix: Emphasize logistics mentoring and monthly “checks and balances” system being put into place along with new MOI directives for requesting fuel and reporting consumption will help eliminate shortages.
- Issue: 10k training phase II training critical to ensure continued ANP Development.
 - Fix: Coordinating with CSTC-A CJ-7 to schedule patrolmen.
