

- July and August reporting impacted by RIP between Phoenix VIII and IX forces and preparations for Afghan elections.



LEVEL	DESCRIPTION
CM 1	<p>The police unit, staff function or installation is capable of basic law and order operations, management or leadership tasks (appropriate for local circumstances). External assistance may be required for specific operations (i.e. counter-insurgency engagements or narcotics interdiction). Additionally, as the insurgency threat decreases and Justice Sector Reform takes place, IC assistance may be required to increase the professionalism of the police to a higher standard mandated by the GoA, in accordance with the aspirations of the people of the IRoA. An approximation of capability in terms of DOTMLPF or other applicable measure is $\geq 85\%$.</p>
CM 2	<p>The police unit, staff function or installation can conduct basic law and order operations, management or leadership tasks (appropriate for local circumstance) with occasional assistance from an IC advisor or Police Mentor Team. An approximation of capability in terms of DOTMLPF or other applicable measure is 70 - 84%.</p>
CM 3	<p>The police unit, staff function or installation can conduct basic law and order operations, management or leadership tasks (appropriate for local circumstance) with occasional assistance from an IC advisor or Police Mentor Team. An approximation of capability in terms of DOTMLPF or other applicable measure is 50-69%.</p>
CM 4	<p>The police unit, staff function or installation is formed but not yet capable of conducting basic law and order operations, management or leadership functions without significant external assistance from the International Community. An approximation of capability in terms of DOTMLPF or other applicable measure is $\leq 49\%$.</p>

RPAC-N COMMANDER'S OVERALL ASSESSMENT

- ANP – The ANP continues to stand up the OCC-R and OCC-Ps. The primary focus is on communication for both and the ability to understand the levels of security at the polling sites and what units are available for reinforcement should an incident occur. An additional 215 have been trained during the accelerated training process. The current training for FDD 8 districts is ongoing with 345 ANP in training.
- ABP – The ABP currently has 248 students in training at Shebrehghan. There are no PMTs covering the ABP; therefore, CEs for the ABP have not been completed.

FDD Phase VI – QPM Support

Issue: Unresolved issue on Way Ahead for support for Phase VI. With the expansion of FDD, PMTs will be limited in their ability to support Phase VI-QPM.

Fix: Phase VI-QPM change required. Need CSTC-A decision on Way Ahead.

Ghowrmach

Issue: Commander of highway Kandak informed mentors on 20090729 that Faryab PHQ is conducting initial screening of 18-20 recruits to begin rebuilding Ghowrmach FDD. Once initial screening is complete, delegation from MOI will come to Meymanah to complete hiring process. District is either, non-rated or CM 4 due to only 4 members of FDD remaining. FDD equipment is now in the hands of Faryab 500 highway Kandak.

Fix: What is MOI/CSTC-A guidance or intentions for this district? Is the PMT to continue to mentor this force?

OCC Manning

Issue: Shortage of NDS personnel for OCCs having an impact on their ability to achieve full operational capability. Continuing to conduct training and development with available personnel, but effectiveness of OCCs are significantly hampered. Need all personnel to conduct 24 hour operations.

Fix: NDS must identify and assign permanent personnel to OCCs as soon as possible in order to ensure proper training and development of these coordination centers.



- Shortage of personnel makes it extremely difficult to man checkpoints, operate the D.C. and conduct combat, supply and security missions.



- Attacks against AUP have increased in frequency and intensity as we get closer to elections. Since 11 JUN – 29 KIA, 30 WIA, 8 MIA (Includes Jalrez Cop who was killed by an IED).
- Former areas of HIG support (i.e.-Wardak, Logar, south/eastern Kapisa) continue to challenge the AUP's ability to provide Rule of Law. Traditional smuggling routes (Nuristan through western Kunar and northern Laghman, western Nangarhar through Sarobi) also present a significant challenge.
- During the election period, the AUP will be unable to react to enemy operations and maintain required election security at the same time.





- IDR recruiting Spring 08 was rushed due with fast arrival of 2/7 USMC. DART teams were not properly fielded and the previous PCoP Helmand, BG Andiwal, recruited where he could. No actual men from Now Zad, Vashir or Garmsir were recruited. Lashkar Gah gained most of extra grads.

RPAC SOUTH TOP ISSUES

- **Issue: Establish and maintain security at the polling sites in the south:**
 - **Fix: FDD8 was planned to produce approximately 3600 new ANP by 13 AUG 09. New police recruiting has fallen far short of target numbers. Working with the Regional Security Officer to develop a COA to account for less personnel.**
- **Issue: CM ratings are stagnant:** Lack of trained police in the districts in the south is the primary reason for ratings not improving. Additionally, lack of distribution of written policies down to the district level has kept districts from advancing in staff functions.
 - **Fix: Based on the current tashkil (before the uplift), attaining 85% or greater trained police in all districts would cause a CM1 rating in training in all districts. Assuming no PMT override this would result in 1 district advancing from CM2 to CM1 overall, 5 districts to advance from CM3 to CM2 overall, and 4 districts to advance from CM4 to CM3 overall. This is an improvement in 50% of the districts in the south that have gone through FDD. Sustained emphasis on training is required to compensate for the uplift in tashkil. 

RPAC-W COMMANDER'S OVERALL ASSESSMENT



- Adraskan remains at CM2 and remains at 100% on personnel Taskil allotment. The District is undermanned and should be considered for an increase from a medium to a large district. Basic facility infrastructure improvements are still required and will facilitate movement of the district to CM 1. Critical position training is scheduled for this month in property and logistics management and should considerably help with the logistics process.
- Shindand remains at CM2. District is currently at 66% fill on personnel and should immediately actively recruit to fill to 100% of Taskil. Several personnel were cross leveled to other districts (20 Pax) and should either be returned or moved off of Taskil and placed on the other Districts Taskil. Personnel shortages will inhibit the districts ability to meet CM1. Working with Herat PHQ and RHQ on cross leveling of personnel and the increase of recruitment.
- Bala Baluk continues to degrade and is assessed at CM4. Turnover and lack of leadership (CoP and NCOs) continue to hinder training and the overall effectiveness of the district ANP. District has been selected for FDD recycle. Working with PHQ on potential leadership change at the earliest opportunity for District.
- Bala Murghab is in need of additional personnel and District needs re-assessed for potential to become a large District with threat. District has shown slight improvement in its capabilities due mainly to a small increase in personnel. Will be working with PHQ to solve logistical issues. Remoteness of district significantly hampers logistics and communications. Continued improvements on security of Route Lithium would improve all of above issues.
- PMT in Ghor province continues to progress.
- Farah, Badghis and Herat Provinces are currently at training for FDD8P.

Personnel

District suffers from extremely high turn over rate. Issue needs to be controlled by MOI. There must be stabilization of the police force.

Equipment

100% accountability of equipment was concluded for PTRAT, Resupply of critical items continue to hinder and not encouraging the ANP in working through the supply system.

Facilities

Check points don't have water, sewage or power for heat

District HQ does not have a DFAC

ANP has no power or utilities in their defensive positions

Governance / Rule of Law

Corruption in this district has gone down considerably since we forcibly taken down static checkpoints in the AO and changed the way the police provide security in the district. So far the changes have had tremendous positive effects for the area, but the police do not yet buy into the concept of why not to accept bribes.

Personnel

Need to increase Tashkil to 200 due to BMG identified as Large District with threat. No adequate Personnel record keeping system in place (training files, rank reform, disciplinary actions, etc.). Critical shortage of a CID officer. No Electronic Funds Transfer available in Bala Murghab.

Training

The current focus for the PMT is helping the ANP improve the current checkpoints in anticipation of further attacks.

Equipment

ANP use a local repair shop to fix their vehicles. "No Lemon" resides in QeN and has no impact on Bala Murghab. MOI Form 14s are utilized for logistical requests but only through mentors, district does not have ability to send to PHQ/, however supplies rarely arrive to the district. Freedom of movement from the PHQ (QeN) to BMG district is non-existent, and all supplies that the district receives comes via local purchase or limited air assets. If critical equipment is lost in combat/training, it cannot be replaced. BMG is need support from PHQ to pay local mechanic for vehicle repairs.

Personnel

ANP undermanned due to size and population of district. ANP are unable to man all needed checkpoints and still provide adequate personnel coverage throughout Adraskan.

Need to increase Tashkil for Adraskan from medium to large district.

Equipment

New District center is under construction, project started over a year ago, current status worked stopped. ANP not currently maintaining weapons accountability for individual assigned weapons. PMT currently discovered additional, unregistered weapons in use. MOI 14 submitted and still have not received response or feedback from PHQ on the status on critical items such as fuel, desks, paper, computers and other basic office supplies.

Governance/Rule of Law

As observed by the PMT, the ANP seem to be following Rule of Law; while not to an American Standard this works for Afghanistan. Additionally, the PMT has observed the local population from all over the district working with the Police Chief, he seems to have built a good reputation with the public and they willing to work with him..

Personnel

Defective ID cards were sent to Shouz TNG facility and returned to CSTC-A and no replacements have been sent. Shortage of personnel drives the current rating.

Equipment

Critical equipment shortages are strictly communications equipment, MOI 14s submitted through PHQ for Man Packs and Hand held Radios.

Training

Critical position training is scheduled for the logistical section following NLT July 2009. Sustainment training is ongoing on Weapons, communications, Property Management, intelligence, and CSI. With the assistance of DynCorp Mentors.

Governance/Rule of Law

Anti Government sanctuaries with enabling government officials that sustain them diminishes citizen support.





RPAC WEST TOP ISSUES

- PMT/RPAC focus is on the mentoring of ANP on polling site security and overall security plan synchronization between ANP/ABP/NDS/ANA.
- Issue: Transportation to and from training sites continues to be an issue. Air is tough to get for the farther distance Districts and too dangerous to move by bus.
 - Fix: Continue to coordinate with RC-W, and utilize ANA RW as a valued asset. PMTs continue to mentor ANP at all levels on process to request timely transportation.
- Issue: Weapons for the 10k training plan were of poor quality. Several did not function and had sights broken. VZ-58 (7.62) rifles were issued vice the standard AK-47. Concerns from ANP and RTC is that this weapon will not hold up well in the field.
 - Fix: Recommend to have CSTC-A J4/RHQ G4 to work on a possible swap of weapons to AK-47 during time of final 5 week training and will work with ANP to redistribute weapons from within districts to get AK-47s to more vulnerable sites.
- Issue: A new Farah PHQ Chief has been directed to go to PHQ fixing a previous top issue.
 - Fix: Mentoring at the Regional Level to push MOI for a replacement helped to solve issue.
- Issue: Situation in Bala Baluk continues to deteriorate.
 - Fix: District has been selected for FDD9 and should help with this issue.
