

Issue: The Corps is losing soldiers at an alarming rate. This attrition is a result of soldiers working in a very difficult environment, corrupt leaders failing to provide for basic needs of soldiers, and a lack of red, amber green cycles.

Fix: Efforts need to be made at MOD level and below to address the complex situation facing ANA soldiers fighting in RCS. Proposals such as hazardous duty pay, transportation to and from leave, and improved living arrangements could help mitigate these issues.

Issue: The Corps must move away from the “culture of dependency” to a “culture of ownership.” This will require a concerted effort on the part of the mentors and partners to avoid providing the Corps with the “dependency” drug.

Fix: Mentors and partners need to allow and force in some cases the ANA to solve their own problems. Many in the ANA do not work hard to find solutions to problems as they know the mentors will fix them. Often times it is easier for the mentors and partners to fix a problem themselves rather than push and coach the ANA to do it for themselves. This culture needs to be changed on both sides.

Issue: Poor driving skills of ANA drivers has become a concern across the 205th Corps. Numerous accidents have injured and killed numerous soldiers the past few months and seem to be getting worse. The change from an 8 week course to a 3 week course is making the issue even worse.

Fix: This training must be enhanced and increased back to the 8 week course. Most of these drivers have never driven before making it impossible to train them in 3 weeks to drive under combat conditions. More Civilian trainers must be contracted to improve this issue.



207th Corps Top Issues

- Issue : Lack of discipline throughout the Corps. Officers have shown reluctance to discipline soldiers and NCOs.
- Fix: Mentors have to influence Corps leadership to follow and apply appropriate regulations. Developing and implementing a training program on discipline and appropriate regulations may be useful.
- Issue : Training is not properly tracked by training sections. School quotas often are not filled and opportunities for training are not communicated down to the lowest level.
- Fix : Mentors and ANA G/S3 chiefs have to create an appropriate system IOT identify suitable personnel for courses and program them for training prior to the training event.
- Issue : The lack of a central training authority at the Corps level has created confusion and caused an inefficient use of training resources.
- Fix : Identify a Regional level training authority to assist in coordinating local, regional, and national level training for the Corps.



RC-WEST COMMANDER'S OVERALL ASSESSMENT

- ANP in the Western Region continue to show improvements as enemy activity has increased over the past month. ANP are conducting independent and joint operations with other ANSF forces and in conjunction with BSO forces.
- While they are still weak at staff planning and sustainment, direct mentor action at the staff level is helping to improve these areas.
- Corruption in the ANP appears to be an issue. Mentor teams have received reports of corruption at different levels within the ANP organization and are monitoring the situation to determine its validity.
- Monthly inventories and reporting requirements for the inventories are having a negative impact on overall mentoring as activity increases. In addition, the lack of an effective ANP logistics systems hampers effective reporting.

New District center is under construction, project was started over a year ago, but currently no work is occurring. District states they have not received feedback from Herat on Mol 14 requests. Need more Codan radios to communicate with outlying check points.

Governance/Rule of Law (no change)

As observed by the PMT, the ANP seem to be following Rule of Law. Although not to an American Standard, it is working. Additionally, the PMT has observed the local population from all over the district working with the Police Chief. He seems to have built a good reputation with the public and they are willing to work with him.

Personnel

PMT is coordinating with MOI to resolve defective ID card issues. MOI emphasis must be placed on recruiting to fill Tashkil – 13% on NCO fill, 68% on patrolmen. Still short 65 pax that were used for elections elsewhere. Unit is currently working on an NCO promotion system to promote deserving ANP to the NCO Corps. This will help the unit to recover from the loss of 50 NCO's and to promote recruitment necessity for patrolman.

Equipment

All MOI 14s have been submitted through PHQ for Man Packs and Handheld Radios to fill critical communications shortages. 10 x Rangers used for elections still have not been returned.

Training

Sustainment training is ongoing for weapons, communications, property management, intelligence, and CSI with the assistance of DynCorp Mentors. Many collective training and rehearsal events conducted this month

Governance/Rule of Law

Police chief promised pay to locals for providing security at polling sites and locals were not paid. This has strained relations between locals and ANP.

Air Corps Top Issues

- PAS Squadron Commander relieved of command as a result of recent aircraft accident at Zaranj
- **Issue:** The Air Corps Command Center training program continues to lag due to low manning. Only 18 of 41 tashkil positions have been filled. MG Dawran is currently working a manning solution with MoD. Additionally, the ACCC is ineffective as an organization under the ANAAC G-3 due to the scope of command and control to support direct support missions for the 5 corps areas and general support missions for MoD.
Fix: Ensure ACCC manning document is quickly approved at MoD levels and support a tashkil modification to move the ACCC under the ANAAC/CC
- **Issue: (Communication)** Recent national mission taskings for Kandahar to support Mol requested through ISAF disrupted due to local ANA Corps commander unaware of Mol tasking.
Fix: Ensure national mission requests for wings and detachments outside of Kabul are disseminated throughout MoD--top to bottom and across the ministries to prevent conflict with mentors and ANAAC/ANA leadership with an ultimate goal of Air Corps controlling/prioritizing its own aircraft
- **Issue: (C2)** Command and control relationships of Air Corps detachments with respect to ground corps is not clearly defined. This ambiguity results in conflict between detachment commanders and the ground corps commander regarding appropriate tasking authority

Commando Brigade Top Issues

•**Issue: Construction for 7th CDO KDK** – Construction at Shorabak (Tombstone) is behind schedule. Winter weather may be an impact to completing on the scheduled 09 Feb 10 estimate. This will impact movement of 7th CDO Kandak after it graduates the Kandak Qualification Course on 21 Jan 10.

•**Fix** – The CDO Brigade, CJSOTF-A, and TF Morehead (NTM-A CJ7) are developing contingency plans.

•**Issue: ANATC integration**– MoD is issuing an order to shift the Commando Training Element (CTE) from the Commando Brigade to the ANA Training Command tashkil. This is a premature action taken without any formal staff analysis that disrupts a program in the peak of its Commando production. Commando are keenly interested in proper integration with ANATC, however this will require careful staff analysis to preserve training integrity.

•**Fix** – CFSOCC-A, as proponent to the Commando Program, is working with MoD GSG-3 to rapidly conduct proper staff analysis to comply with MoD orders while preserving Commando Program success.
