> we had 4...one per squad.

> We had at or around 10 bottles of the iodine tablet...which is probably about 9 more than the average platoon had. You just couldn't get them over there. I had always been looking/hoarding bottles of iodine tablets. The medic had the majority...he too would grab them up when he could. I would take 2 tablets to make one canteen. There really was no SOP on them because you just couldn't get them. I liked having them around because I was always worried about running out of water.

> Again just like I have said before. This emergency water filters/iodine was meant for patrols. We should have never been to the point to use them. There was no SOP or plan other than what I came up with for use of emergency water supply equipment.

> The trucks were Hilux trucks. I added a pic I found online of what the typical Afghan Hilux truck looked like.
